



## Gulf Shores & Orange Beach will consider two percent lodging tax increase

"Transportation improvements are needed to solve challenges affecting us all. Investing in our infrastructure will help to ensure the sustainability of our vital tourism economy and improve the quality of life of our residents," said Gulf Shores Mayor Craft. Mayor Kennon of Orange Beach adds, "As it becomes more difficult to obtain federal and state infrastructure dollars, it has become apparent to us that matching monies are needed. Hurricane Harvey has just shown us that a storm can pop up very quickly in the Gulf with devastating effects, thus reinforcing the need for evacuation infrastructure for the beaches of Alabama."

Lodging tax in the Cities of Gulf Shores and Orange Beach is currently set at a total of 11%. This is equal to or lower than other coastal destinations on the Upper Gulf Coast. In 2016, over 6.1 million visitors chose the Alabama Gulf Coast as their family beach destination. This record growth brings its own challenges related to demands placed on traffic and infrastructure affecting everyone in Baldwin County. According to both mayors, this initiative

will be discussed in upcoming city council meetings, respectively.





JJ will also speak at a Gulf Shores High School pep rally on Sept. 29 and host a meet-n-greet at halftime of the Gulf Shores High football game vs. Faith Academy later that evening at Mickey Blackwell Stadium. JJ will be the honorary captain for the game.

A remarkable blend of medical challenges and magnetic charm, JJ is usually dressed in black and gold. That's what happens when you're a small boy with a big personality, you're in need of an organ donor to save your life, and the New Orleans Saints have basically adopted you and transformed you into a media star. Several weeks into his life, JJ was diagnosed with biliary atresia, a life-threatening disease of the liver and

bile ducts.

There were many ups and downs, including multiple surgeries, during the initial stages of his life. Then things got really bad. JJ's parents, Jordy Robertson and Patricia Hoyal, could only watch and pray as he was listed for a life-saving transplant and eventually got a new liver soon after his first birthday.

There were more complications. JJ caught pneumonia. His lungs collapsed. He was placed on a respirator. And his breathing issues were only part of his struggles. Doctors at Children's Hospital of New Orleans eventually had to induce a coma – and JJ remained unconscious for close to a year.

"Five, six times we were told he wasn't going to make it," JJ's mom recalled last week. "Then they told us for the seventh time. He was still on the respirator." "We didn't want to see him suffer no more," JJ's dad said. "So we finally signed the papers to let him go ... papers to remove the respirator and let him go." The respirator was taken away. But JJ was not ready to stop fighting. He started to breathe on his own. Doctors couldn't really offer much of an explanation. "It was a miracle – nothing but God," said his mom.

## 250-foot surveying vessel 20 miles south of beach will be Alabama's next dive site

The contract has been signed, sealed and delivered. That means sometime this fall or early winter, Alabama will have a new diving destination about 20 miles south of Orange Beach.

New Venture, a 250-foot surveying vessel, is currently being prepped for deployment and will be towed to a predetermined spot and sunk as soon as the prep work is completed and the weather allows, according to Craig Newton, Alabama Marine Resources Division's (MRD) Artifi-

"Right now, they're in the preparation stage," Newton said. "All the tanks have been cleaned. The vessel is free of any hydrocarbons in the form of diesel fuel, oil, lube or hy-

cial Reefs Coordinator.

draulic fluid. Now it will be moved to another shipyard to clean out the inside. That means cleaning out insulation, wiring, glass, wood, generators and drive

train." Newton said New Venture was once used to perform different types of surveying with big spools that released cable into the water to find possible mineral and oil resources.

"There's a lot of complexity to this vessel, compared to a cargo ship of similar size," Newton said. "It has a lot higher sides than most cargo ships. There are a lot of different levels. It has more decks than a typical ship. So, we're excited about it and the dive possibilities.

Newton said New Venture will be reefed 20 miles south of Orange Beach in 120 feet of water. The top of the structure will be between 55 and 60 feet below the surface. Any deployed reefs must have a minimum of 50 feet clearance from the

"When we look for reef sites, we look for coarse sand bottoms that are not too close to adjacent reefs," he said. "We try to place them in spots that help maintain the production potential of the reefs nearby without creating a negative competitive interaction among the critters from one reef to the next reef. The

preferred distance between reefs is about 200 meters."

When New Venture is ready, only the stripped hull of the ship will go to the bottom of the Gulf of Mexico.

"We will have them cut holes in the sides of the ship to create passthroughs and add complexity to the structure," Newton said. "This will increase the habitat quality. It will start holding fish within the first several of months. Maximum productivity will take several years. There's a lot of substrate for what I call bioengineers - corals, bryozoans and sponges and things like that that will grow on the side of the ship and create complexity at a much smaller level. Those organisms will provide some rugosity to the shipwreck so things like different types of crabs, shrimp, blennies, gobies and damselfish can seek

> shelter. "There will be bigger fish hanging around it within the first few months. Fairly quickly, red snapper, amberjack and blue runners (hardtails) will be swimming

around the shipwreck, as wells as tomtates, gray snapper and trigger-

Newton said this shipwreck will provide excellent opportunities for divers with a wide range of skill

"The top of the superstructure will be just 60 feet below the surface, so divers with less experience can go down and see the superstructure and swim in the shallower portions of the shipwreck and stay within their dive limits," he said. "But it's also going to have opportunities for technical divers, divers with more experience, to gain some dive time as well. The dive will be right at 120 feet. With the penetrations and holes we're going to cut into the ship, the technical divers will be able to swim into the shipwreck.

"But we will have somewhat limited access to prevent divers from getting too far into the shipwreck. We're taking precautions to make the dive site as safe as possible and providing opportunities for divers

with a wide range of experience." The money to create the shipwreck came from oil spill funds through a grant from the National Fish and





Wildlife Foundation.

"This deployment is just one component of a larger plan we've been working on the past couple of years," Newton said. "Last year, we spent a little more than \$3.5 million on artificial reefs. We're working on about the same budget this year. The total money allotted for artificial reefs is \$11.8 million. Once that funding is exhausted, we'll have a much more connected ecosystem. We'll have artificial reefs within the 9-mile state waters boundary. We'll

enhance the structures that are offshore, and we'll have a much more productive inshore reef system as well.

"It's important to focus on each one of those areas because of

the level of connectivity between inshore and nearshore habitats. Things like red drum (redfish), flounder and mangrove (gray) snapper grow up in estuaries and migrate to the nearshore waters for spawning. This money is helping to provide habitat where it has been a limiting factor.'

New Venture will be deployed near The LuLu, a 271-foot coastal freighter that was deployed in 2013 with great fanfare. The Alabama Gulf Coast Reef and Restoration

Foundation (AGCRRF) spearheaded a fundraising drive to be able to sink The LuLu, named after famed entertainer Jimmy Buffet's sister, Lucy Buffet.

"It's going to provide ecotourism opportunities," Newton said. "It should be a better draw for people in north Alabama and Georgia who like to dive. They are more likely to come to the Alabama coast and boost the economy here rather than going to

"Right now, our dive shops are running trips to The LuLu and making two dives on the same ship," said Wright, who also serves as AGCRRF secretary. "By having a second ship, you do one dive on The LuLu and come back and dive New Venture on the same trip.

"Another perspective on that is as we get more operators running dive trips, if the Down Under (dive shop) is tied up to one of them, the other operator can unload their divers on the other shipwreck. And then at

some point, they can swap.

Wright said diving multiple times on a new wreck is especially rewarding

"When the wreck comes down, it's clean with nothing on it," she said. "Over time you can watch it develop with corals and sponges. It won't take long for the fish to show up. It's fun to see that development."

Wright said the main challenge for the Alabama Gulf Coast will be development of the businesses that serve the dive community.

"We have a limited number of dive operators," she said. "Down Under Dive Shop can carry about 20 divers at a time. We have two or three dive charters that have six-pack (passenger) boats. I think as we get more wrecks, we'll get more divers, and I think we'll see increased capacity in dive operations.

"In fact, a new shop, the High Pressure Dive Shop, opened in Robertsdale after The LuLu went down. They run a six-pack out of Flora-Bama Marina. Îf people are driving down Highway 59 on the way to the beach, they may not even know we have scuba diving until they see that big dive flag on the way down."



As a Mobile Big Game Fishing Club board member, Vines was a key member of the Orange Beach Billfish Classic, an all release billfish tournament that was The Billfish Foundation's top U.S. all release billfish tournament (in donor scales) for three consecutive years.

Vines also founded The Elberta German Sausage Festival, a twice -ayear fundraiser for the Elberta Volunteer Fire Department, and the Orange Beach Seafood Festival, a major fundraiser for youth sports in Orange Beach. Vines died the evening prior to the 2011 Orange Beach Seafood Fest.

"Kenny knew more people than anybody else I've ever known," Howard said. "He was just a great friend."

KV was described in the Billfish Foundation website obituary as "a passionate, high energy man with a great sense of humor who was passionate about family, community, sportfishing & billfish conservation. He's greatly missed, his generous spirit will continue to live on through his many philanthropic community efforts."



#### Al. Marine Resources announces changes to crab regulations

Effective September 24, there will be several changes to the Alabama crab regulations that apply to both commercial and recreational crabbing.

The changes include the following:

- The possession of egg-bearing female crabs, otherwise known as gravid, berried or sponge crabs, will be prohibited and must be immediately returned to the water. There will be an exception from January 15 through May 15 each year.
- All crab traps must contain at least two unobstructed escape rings with a minimum inside diameter of 2 5/16 inches located on vertical surfaces. There must be one ring per chamber. Catchers will have until March 1, 2018 to have the escape rings in-
- From April 1 through September 30, a licensed crab catcher may obstruct or remove the escape rings after obtaining a free permit from the Marine Resources Division, for the purpose of catching pre-molt crabs, otherwise known as "busters" or "peelers."

The closure line in the northeast corner of Mobile Bay in the Blakeley River running from Blakeley Channel marker 18 to the southern tip of Big Island will be removed. Crab traps may be placed up to the eastbound lane of Interstate-10 at the Blakeley

During the first and second day of each calendar month, a validly licensed crab catcher may recover traps that are unidentified and derelict or abandoned. The catcher must make a report to AMRD with the number of traps, the location and any additional information required by AMRD. These reports must be made by close of the next business day (excludes holidays and weekends).

Enforcement officers with AMRD will be making efforts to educate commercial and recreational crab catchers about the regulation changes.

# WHAT'S BITING BY DAVID RAINER

### The Stealthy Flounder

Alabama coastal waters are blessed with more than one species of flounder. The Gulf flounder is found mainly along the beaches where the water is salty and the bottom is sandy. The mottled patterns and colors on the Gulf flounder are defined with distinct patterns. The second species is the southern flounder, which gets significantly larger than the Gulf flounder and has a much less-defined color pattern.

Both species are especially adept at camouflaging themselves. Flounders are able to change colors to adapt to their surroundings, and they can also become partially buried in soft bottoms and sand bottoms.

Stealth is what makes them such effective ambush predators and gives anglers along the Alabama Gulf Coast a chance to hook one of these flat-fish, which are prized for their delicate, light flesh.

Flounder spend the winter months in the Gulf of Mexico, where both species spawn. That means as that the coastal waters cool this fall, the

flounder will begin their fall migration toward the

Gulf.

Unlike other popular inshore fish, flounder tend to follow similar routes to the Gulf each year. They concentrate in the channels and passes leading to the Gulf. With no cold front on the immediate horizon, the migration will likely start out slowly and then end in a solid stream of flounder once a significant weather shift occurs.

Flounder will concentrate in areas with baitfish and small crustaceans, which means anglers can find one spot and put multiple fish in the ice chest without moving the boat. Only the adult, spawning-

age flounder migrate to the Gulf, so it's a great chance to catch those flounder large enough for my favorite flounder dish – stuffed flounder.

When you find one of those migration routes, there are several ways to entice flounder into biting. When you can get them, bull minnows work like a champ for flounder. The minnows are hardy and stay on the hook very well. The one thing about the bull minnow is you need to give the flounder a little time to swallow the minnow before you set the hook. Flounder will also take live shrimp and minnow-shaped grubs that are hopped along the bottom. A strip of belly off the first flounder you catch gives a significant added enticement for the next flounder that sees your bait.

When the north winds finally move in, the shallow waters along the beach become a perfect place for gigging flounder. Of course, you don't want a howling north wind, just a gentle breeze with a rising tide. The rising tide allows the flounder to come within feet of the beach as they settle into the bottom and wait for minnows or shrimp to swim past.

You'll need a good flounder light to be able to spot the fish, which are extremely well camouflaged. When you spot the outline of a flounder, keep the light on the fish and approach slowly. When you're ready to thrust the gig, aim low. The refraction of the water will make the fish appear to be farther than it really is. If your aim is good, keep your gig stuck in the sand while the fish thrashes. If you try to pick up the gig too early, you'll likely lose the fish.

The flounder bag limit in Alabama is 10 fish per person with a 12-inch size minimum. A saltwater fishing license is required.

Speaking of stuffed flounder, take a 16-inch or larger flounder and scrape off the fine scales on both sides of the fish, remove the head and entrails and run a filet knife down the back from top to bottom. Slowly slice the flesh outward until you've made a large cavity that will hold the stuffing. I make simple stuffing with crabmeat, bread crumbs, butter and a dash of Tony Chachere's seasoning. Use Old Bay if you prefer. Cram as much stuffing as you desire into the flounder cavity. I drizzle enough olive oil to coat the fish and the bottom of a cookie sheet. Pop the fish into a preheated oven and bake for 25 to 30 minutes. What comes out of the oven is one of the best meals you'll experience on the Gulf Coast.

### Former Southern Miss coach Jeff Bower will address GCAC Sept. 25







## Black Belt business teaches long range shooting skills

Al. Dept. of Conser. & Nat. Resources Instead of the stillness of the usual August day in Alabama, the wind provided relief from the oppressive heat, and it made James Eagleman happy.

"Got a little wind to contend

with today," I said.

"Yeah, that makes it fun," Eagleman said at the new Barbour Creek Shooting Academy near Eufaula. "If there's no wind, it's too easy."

The "it" is long-range shooting out to 1,000 yards in the midst of the abundant peanut, soybean and cotton fields in Bar-

bour County.

Do what? Hitting targets at 1,000 yards is easy? I'll admit I was skeptical. By the end of the event, sponsored by Alabama Black Belt Adventures and Bergara Rifles, I was a believer as long as I adhered to Eagleman's instructions.

A former U.S. Army sniper and instructor, Eagleman teamed with Mark Simpson, a longtime outdoorsman who wanted to share his affinity for long-range hunting with the public, to establish the shooting academy that caters to a wide variety of shooting activities, from basic firearms training for novices to long-range shooting for hunters.

Simpson, who was in the automobile business for 35 years in Florida, hunted near Eufaula

for years and decided to start looking

for retirement property in Barbour County. "When I came into town to get supplies for the hunting camp, I always saw Eufaula as a beautiful

city," Simpson said. "I thought when I retired I would buy something up here. I found this farm and decided to build a long-range facility for myself. I had been long-range hunting around the world and love it. I decided to open a facility to the public. I have been very successful in my long-range hunting with the training I received from James Eagleman at Gunwerks. I called James, and he came to Alabama to open Barbour Creek Shooting Academy."

Eagleman said the offer to partner with Simpson in the shooting academy was easy because nothing like it is avail-

able in the region.

"We're long-range hunters," Eagleman said. "We're training people to be hunters with terminal-performance shot placement and bullet selection and performance. Shooting at 200 yards is different than shooting at 800 or 1,000."

Eagleman admits his training strays from traditional hunting techniques. He teaches to place the butt of the stock in the middle of your pectoral muscle instead of the shoulder pocket. He uses the pad of the trigger finger to depress the trigger, which is held firmly rearward throughout the shot sequence. And he stresses to keep your head down on the stock at all

Not keeping my head down was the only mistake I made, which resulted in my only missed target at 1,000 yards. In less than an hour, I hit the vital zone on a deer target every time at 600 yards.

"My dad was a Green Beret in Vietnam," Eagleman said. "When I came home from sniper

During last week's event, Bergara provided both the B-14, a rifle produced entirely in Spain, and Premiere, a rifle built in its Georgia facility with

barrels manufactured in Spain. The ammo was factory Hornady Precision Hunter in 6.5 Creedmoor. The day at the range was just a peek at the instruction available during the academy's two-day courses.

Simpson said the long-range hunting courses are held yearround with Level 1 and Level 2 instruction.

"We love working with the public," Simpson said. "In Level 1 you learn to shoot to 1,000 yards. You have classroom instruction for half a day. Then you go to the range for the rest of the day. The next day it's almost all range time. You will become comfortable shooting at 800 to 1,000 yards. You learn a little about ballistics. You learn how to hold a rifle. You learn follow-through. You learn how to dial your scope for the right distance. You learn ranging. In Level 2, you learn a lot about ballistics and shooting positions. It's way more advanced. We go through simulated hunting scenarios.

"In LA, Lower Alabama, we have a lot of open fields. I would often see a deer at 500 to 600 vards walking a trail or on the edge of a field. I didn't feel like I could take that shot. After going through the training, I feel like a 500-yard shot is a chip shot.

"We teach you how to read the mirage and the wind. We teach you how to get set up for a shot. You will feel comfortable at taking that shot. It's all about feeling confident and bullet placement. If you can't do it, you need to move closer. If you're not comfortable, don't take the shot. But, after taking the class, if you see a deer at 300 yards, you won't even hesitate. We teach you how to take an ethical shot and kill the animal instantly."

Simpson said the 7mm Remington Magnum is his favorite round for most long-range hunting but alternatives are avail-

"The 6.5 Creedmoor is the hottest round for long-range shooting right now," he said. "It's good if you have the right kind of bullet that expands properly and you have good shot placement."

Although long-range hunting has been very popular out West,





in states like Texas, Wyoming and Montana, it's just now starting to get the attention of hunters in the South.

"I think it's gaining momentum in Alabama," Simpson said. "We went to the last two hunting shows in Alabama this summer, and we had crowds all around the booth. People don't realize you can hunt at those distances. I had to learn myself, but we make it really simple with the instruction provided."

Eagleman said correctly assessing the wind is the most important aspect of long-range

hunting.

"You can dial in your scope for elevation, but the wind is the common denominator that separates the men from the boys in long-range hunting," Eagleman said. "Another important factor in long-range hunting is shot placement and bullet construction. The best thing about longrange hunting is that if you become comfortable with an 800-yard shot, a 400-yard shot is easy. You're not going to ask yourself, 'Should I take this shot.' You're going to say, 'When can I take this shot.' The best thing about learning long-range hunting is you'll get so much confidence at 400 yards, you'll never think twice about it.

"In our Level 2 instruction, we have mock blinds to shoot out of. We don't shoot off the bench in Level 2. We have prone shooting, tripod shooting, bag shooting, shooting from a fence and shooting from a blind. What you have to do is make sure you have a good, solid support up front and then the buttstock

shooting sticks and put them on the buttstock. When you do that, you've built yourself a bench. You're going to need a good rangefinder. I prefer a ballistic rangefinder so there's no guessing.

Eagleman said a long-range scope must have a target turret, a side focus/parallax adjustment and a reticle with stadia lines for precision wind-drift al-

"We hold right or left for wind," he said. "The reason we don't dial the wind in for long-range hunting is you'll get all set up on a shot and the wind changes Now you have to lift your head up and adjust the scope and hope you can get back on the animal. If you hold for wind drift, you never take your eye off the animal and just hold right or left. You send the round down-range, and you go retrieve the animal.

"We're hunters, and that's what we focus on. We teach good, ethical hunting."


