Capt. Krietemeyer truly represents the USCG Academy motto

The Mobile Bay Area Veterans Day Commission has selected Captain George Krietemeyer as the 2017 Veteran of the Year. Capt. Krietemeyer retired from the United States Coast Guard where he logged over 5,000 hours as a pilot and commanded Mobile's Aviation Training Center.

Prior to serving as Chief of the Training and Education Division for the entire Coast Guard in Coast Guard Headquarters, Capt. Krietemeyer, a graduate of the United States Coast Guard Academy, also commanded the Aviation Technical Training Center,



Elizabeth City, NC. He was awarded four Meritorious Service Medals and numerous other decorations. He has also received the Coast Guard's Distinguished Public Service Award for his contributions after retirement

As Director of Organizational Development for the City of Mobile for 10 years, his efforts were instrumental in improving the efficiency and effectiveness of government operations. He has been a trustee on the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation Board for 20 years and was a Commissioner for the Battleship ALABAMA. He led the successful fundraising campaign to build a

monument at Battleship Park to honor Coast Guard personnel who lost their lives in Alabama while performing operational missions. Capt. Krietemeyer will be recognized during the commission's Veterans Day on Nov. 10 at Fort Whiting Armory. Battleship Memorial Park will be host to a Veterans Celebration and Parade of Flags at 3 pm and the Mobile Symphonic Pops Band concert beginning at 7 p.m.

I first met George when I arrived, and he was a paid employee of the NAVAIR Museum - Membership & Public Relations. One claim to fame was giving NFL Hall of Famer Emmitt Smith a mu-

Recent Naval Air Museum initiatives sheparded by George, include the 100th Anniversary of Coast Guard Aviation as a featured event at the NAS Naval Symposium; the unveiling of only the second Coast Guard stamp in history, establishing Hanger Bay One in the museum's Coast Guard Wing (his uniform is one of three displayed), and the planned HH-3F Helicopter Exhibit. He was also instrumental in earning Mobile the Congressionally approved designation as a Coast Guard City, the third in the nation. He was instrumental in honoring both Mobile Bay Area, and the Coast Guard by bringing Admiral Thad Allen here, on Veterans Day 2015. He is also writing a boo Tnhe Guardians of the Gulf - The 200 Yar History of USCG in Mobile. In his spare time, George and wife Barbara visit their six grandchildren, scattered around the Southeast, and he admits trying to recruit them into

Additionally, several Alabama state parks were built with help from the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), which employed many World War I veterans during the Great Depression. Structures built by the CCC in the 1930s are still cornerstones of the Alabama State Parks system.

Public contributions to Alabama's

Parks for Patriots program will be accepted for any dollar amount and will be used only to fund free entry for veterans from any branch of the U.S. military.



The Final Table, a competition for \$100,000 among all the WFC winners has in the past been held on the final day of the WFC. "It's the same process that is used at the World Series of Poker, which exploded when its Final Table was televised live for the first time," said Mike McCloud, President & CEO of WFC.

While pointing out last month that details about the new streaming deal can't be revealed yet, McCloud said the main process for the 2017 championship will occur as originally planned.

"The key difference now is that once we crown our 10 category champions on Nov 11th and 12th, every one can go home or simply enjoy The Wharf and Orange Beach for a few extra days for some much needed downtime," he said.

For WFC and its champions, however, the downtime will be short lived. Based on the new Final Table strategy, the 10 champions will go into prep mode almost immediately as PR, planning and media training kick in during the holidays.

WHAT'S HAPPENING

34 citizens apply for positions on Gulf Shores School Board

Interviews of the 34 applicants for the new Gulf Shores School Board will begin soon and Mayor Robert Craft said he and the city council face a tough task ahead.

"It's going to be phenomenally difficult to boil that down to five, but we have to start that process," Craft said at Monday's council work session.

The city council heard the update on the school board and discussed continuing the spring break alcohol ban, reversing the Christmas parade route and the safety of the Mardi Gras parade. Several members of the Gulf Shores High Band were injured in an accident at the start of the 2017 Mardi Gras parade, some seriously. Craft expressed concerns about continuing the parade.

Gulf Shores will vote on the alcohol ban and assembly permits for the parades and other upcoming events at the next council meeting on Nov. 13.

At the end of Monday's meeting Craft heaped praise on the 34 who are seeking spots on the new school board.

"We were delighted to receive 34 completed applications for board participation," he said. "An extraordinary list of applicants. It's a wonderful group of community-involved citizens with a lot of expertise and a lot of abilities to help us with our schools. I couldn't have been more excited to see the turnout, the number of people, the quality of people and the folks that are willing to give their time to create a special school for our community and our kids."

The city announced on its website the five selected for the panel will be named at the Nov. 27 council meeting. Among the 34 are current Baldwin County School Board member Angie Swiger, Island Task Force for Education Chairman Kevin Corcoran and Orange Beach City Clerk Renee Eberly.

"We will be working on that and scheduling interviews and work toward that conclusion," Craft said. "You should be really proud of the citizens in your community who filled out their forms and are willing to donate their time for this worthy cause."

ALCOHOL BAN

Police Chief Ed Delmore asked the council to continue a spring break beach alcohol ban from March 3 through April 8 in 2018. An unruly beach crowd in 2016 prompted the first ban in the early days of spring break that year.

"The first few days in 2016 of spring break, probably the result of a lot of other Gulf Coast communities tamping down on spring break issues, we had significant issues here on the beach," Delmore said. "As a result, the council called an emergency meeting and we banned alcohol on the beach for the remaining period of spring break for '16. The results were immediate, the results were wonderful. It worked."

The ban returned in 2017 to the same type of success, Delmore said.

"We had a good mixture of spring breakers and families on the beach," he said. "The exact atmosphere that we're looking for. In light of that success, we're asking that the council once again pass that temporary limited ban on alcohol during spring break."

Craft asked Bill Brett of Brett-Robinson, one of the largest vacation rental companies on the island, how the ban affected his company. Brett is also chairman of the board of Gulf Shores and Orange Beach Tourism.

"We cannot measure any adverse effects from our business," Brett said. "It makes the beach nicer for everyone."

PARADE PERMITS

The city's recreation department is already planning the upcoming Christmas parade for Dec. 1 and the Fat Tuesday Mardi Gras parade set for Feb. 13 in 2018. Craft threw his full support behind the Christmas parade but expressed reservations about Mardi Gras.

A Ford Expedition ran into the back of the Gulf Shores High School Band at the start of the 2017 parade injuring 12 students ranging in ages from 12-17.

"I support completely the Christmas parade," Craft said. "It's an important event for our community and has been for a long time. This one has a less degree of importance to me. I question whether this is something is worth the risk of us doing again."

Councilman Jason Dyken's son was a band member during last year's parade but wasn't one of the injured. He supported continuing the parade to foster healing from the accident.

"Having a son that was in the band during that event last year, and seeing the band and the homecoming parade over there, it was really a healing opportunity for everybody involved," Dyken said. "Not only for the band members but the teachers, students, the first responders, the community. You can't control the world and I think it continues the healing process the community goes through."

Resident Tony Diliberto said he'd like to see the parade continue. "Things happen in this world," Diliberto said." We can't control our surroundings and it's a fabulous community activity. It's something us local people get to do in this town."

Swiger said even though it was a terrible incident, it was an isolated incident. She called for safer practices to prevent accidents in future parades.

"I think it's a great community event," she said. "I think it brings a lot of visitors in. To me, it's a real feel-good event. The kids work really hard all year to do this and it's a privilege to them."

Councilman Gary Sinak said he was in favor of keeping both parades in town as well.

The council also discussed:

- The proposed Marsh Landing Mobile Vendor Court on Alabama 59 just north of Windmill Ridge on the east side of the road. The court would straddle a canal there and have 10 mobile food trucks on the north side and parking on the south side. A pedestrian bridge over the canal from the parking area is also part of the proposal.
- Rezoning a 200-acre parcel at the southwest corner of County Road 8 and the Foley Beach Express from Agricultural to Education. The city has in recent years expressed interest in an educational campus on the site with a new high school and even some college presence there. The new Auburn University complex is under construction just north of this 200-acre parcel.
- Assembly permits for the Kaiser Half Marathon on Nov. 25 in Gulf State Park and the fourth annual Zydeco and Crawfish Festival in the Waterway Village District on April 14.
- A liquor license for the Crazy Cajun which will be located in the former Mojo's building near the Alabama Gulf Coast Zoo.





Flood Risk Open House scheduled Nov. 9 at Foley Civic Center

Representatives from Orange Beach, Baldwin County, FEMA, the OWR, and their mapping partners will be on hand to answer questions related to the proposed FIRM floodplain and flood insurance on Thursday, Nov. 9 from 4-6 p.m. at the Foley Civic Center, located at 407 E. Laurel Ave.

There will be no formal presentation. Residents can come any time during the scheduled hours. In order to properly assist you, residents and property owners should plan to bring a copy of the elevation certificate and flood insurance policy for their property, if available. Officials are also encouraged to attend to provide a local perspective on the information their residents will receive.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region IV Office and the Alabama Office of Water Resources (OWR) have partnered with Baldwin County to inform residents of the flood risks shown on the preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) by hosting a Flood Risk Open House meeting.

As a result of these preliminary map changes, some properties in Baldwin County, may, for the first time, be included in a highrisk flood zone known as the Special Flood Hazard Area. This may result in those affected homeowners being required to purchase flood insurance. Flooding is the number one natural disaster in the United States. It is vital that property owners understand their current flood risk and take advantage of tools or programs available to make their property and community safer and stronger against future flood risk.

The Open House will provide residents with the opportunity to meet with experts one-on-one to learn more about their flood risk, get information on potential changes to flood insurance rates or requirements, and learn tips on how to mitigate and prepare for future floods.





Former resident has lots of family living in South Baldwin County

Greg West, Jr., an aspiring Olympian with numerous connections to South Baldwin County, is currently in the #2 position of Team USA's World Cup Skeleton team with a real chance of representing the USA in the Olympic Skeleton competition.

Greg's following encompasses many local friends and family, including his mom Tammie Franz, stepdad Joe Franz, grandparents Robert Epperson & Mildred Whitaker, grandparents Norman & Jeanne Franz, sister Rianna West and nephew Mason West - all living in the Gulf Shores/Foley community.

"We are extremely proud of our son," said Tammie Franz. "It is a very exciting time for all of us, especially a young boy that grew up in a small town trying to do what most only dream of, representing the United States on the World Cup tour with a very real chance of competing in the Winter Olympics."

Greg grew up in Rogersville, Missouri, where father Greg West Sr. lives. After graduating from Baker University in Kansas, he moved to South Baldwin, where he worked in marketing. While watching the 2010 Winter Olympics with friends, he saw an advertisement that invited anyone having interest in skeleton to fill out a survey.

On a whim and off the cuff, he filled out the survey and was invited to a skeleton sliding school in Lake Placid. Greg proved to be a natural and was soon asked to move to Lake Placid to train full time.

With ceaseless determination, steely drive and monumental hard work, Greg has been able to continue to train towards his goal of competing in this February's Winter Olympics in South Korea.

In 2014, Greg missed a position on the World Cup team by a mere two one-hundredths of a second. Entering this year's competition, Greg holds the second of three positions on the World Cup team, just one one-hundredth of a second behind the top sledder. He will begin his fight for a position on the USA Olympic Skeleton Team during World Cup races Nov. 10-11 in Lake Placid and Nov. 17-18 in Park City,. Cooler weather will make Fishing at GSP Pier even better

One of the tradeoffs for being able to live in the paradise we call the Alabama Gulf Coast is we are forced to reason with hurricane season. Anglers who love to fish the Gulf State Park Pier during the fall will hopefully only have a short delay in the fishing because of tropical weather.

When Hurricane Ivan destroyed the previous pier in 2004, the new



pier was built with such conditions in mind. The new pier is bigger and wider but to deal with storms it also has removable floor panels that will let the large waves crash through the gaps to keep from destroying the pier itself.

After the storm passes and the floor panels are replaced, fishing will resume. In most cases, the fishing is phenomenal after a storm. The storm has churned up the ocean floor and created a bounty for those fish who live on crustaceans and other bottomdwelling animals. This leads to a feeding frenzy for most species that are encountered

around the pier.

Although we still remain in mostly a summer pattern because of the water temperatures, when the weather starts to cool, the Spanish mackerel and king mackerel will start their migrations back to the east as they make their way toward the wintering grounds in south Florida. The Spanish tend to hang around a little longer than

The pier anglers are targeting Spanish by using bubble rigs, Looney jigs, small alewives and Gotcha plugs. Frozen cigar minnows and live alewives caught using live bait rigs work best on the kings.

When the water temperature finally gets below 70 degrees, the fall transition begins and the fishing for numerous inshore species improves dramatically.

Fishing for whiting, redfish and flounder will really gain momentum, and pompano will likely be biting, too. Cooler weather will make the fishing even better.

Several anglers, including noted pier fisherman David Thornton, have been catching loads of slot (16 to 26 inches) redfish in the surf with a combination of chartreuse-tailed grubs and dead shrimp.

Whiting and pompano can be caught on pieces of fresh cut shrimp with a relatively small hook with light line. If you can find live bull minnows, that will be the ticket for flounder and redfish. Sand fleas, whether they come frozen from the bait shop or dig your own in the surf line, are great for redfish and pompano.

When you head out on Gulf State Park Pier, match your tackle with the targeted fish species. If you're headed to the octagon on the end of the pier, you're probably going to want a long, medium-heavy rod with a reel that can hold about 300 yards of 15- to 20-pound test line. If you head to the octagon in the middle or nearer the shore, downsize your tackle to your typical gear for speckled trout with a 7 ½-foot rod and reel that can hold up to 150 yards of 12-pound test line.

The great thing about the current pier is there is room for everybody to fish in some form or fashion with a length of 1,540 feet and fishing space of 2,448 feet. Fishing and pier licenses are required on Gulf State Park Pier. Visit their website for more information.



Loop Current is Gulf fishing's driving force

It's amazing to think about a natural force, located hundreds of miles away as being the driving force for fishing in the Gulf of Mexico. It makes much more of an impact than any boat, captain, crew, lure or bait. It's between one hundred and two hundred miles wide, 2,600 hundred feet deep and nearly invisible to the naked eye. It's the Loop Current and you may not even realize how it helped you catch a fish or kept you from catching one.

Tom Hilton of the popular Hilton's Realtime-Navigator, an offshore satellite fishing forecasting service predicted back in the spring that this year might be a challenge to find blue water with-

out making very long runs to do so.

He was right! The 'pretty water' remained far offshore all summer and never provided much of a chance to fish the normal in close spots around the hundred fathom curve.

The Loop Current is the driving factor that determines the currents in the Gulf of Mexico. This year it spent most of the year abnormally far south until recently returning to its more normal position. "The Loop Current is a huge downwelling cyclone, which is constantly pulling nutrient-rich water and currents downward in a clock-wise pattern. This creates an environment devoid of the essentials needed for marine life," said Hilton. "But for every action, there is an opposing reaction. As the Loop Current pulls the nutrient-rich water down, that water and current have to go somewhere and that somewhere is where you want to be fishing!"

Warm water, counter clock-wise eddies are spun off the Loop Current creating upwelling cyclones that are continually bringing that nutrient-rich water to the surface. Those waters create the very beginning of the offshore food chain, from microscopic organisms all

the way up to the apex predators of the Gulf.

It would be nearly impossible to gather that information without the use of satellites, that's why so many of us rely on services such as Hilton's when planning an offshore trip. Hiltons provides an altimetry map, which shows where the upwelling (nutrient-rich) and downwelling current (nutrient-poor) areas are located. Altimetry is the first piece of information I consider when heading offshore, as it not only gives me an insight on where to go but just as importantly, the areas to avoid.

Right now there are two two upwelling cyclones in the Gulf that are producing very favorable fishing conditions. One is located way down around Independence Hub, about 130 nautical miles from Perdido Pass, but the other one I have my eye on is much more reachable for most of us on a fall fishing day trip. "A little Southwest of the Elbow is a beautiful eddy which should make the rigs like Beer Can, Petronius and Ram Powell all very fishy," according to Hilton.

Hilton says we should also see better water than we have seen all summer all the way up to places like the Nipple and 131 Hole. "The water may not be cobalt blue there like it is at some of the rigs, but it will be blue-ish green and plenty fishable. Another important part of the offshore equation is current. Right now, there is a good, strong current up there which is needed to spur on the bite." said Hilton.

Pelagic species like tuna, wahoo, dolphin and billfish are always on the move to find their desired conditions. They know instinctively where to go, whereas we may need a little more guidance to find those same conditions, like using today's satellite technology.
