





City buys Oyster Bay-Hugger's Landing Fire House on County Rd. 6

SAFER grant will help pay for six firefighters to work out of the station

Call it good timing.

The City of Gulf Shores is acquiring a new station in the northern part of the city and recently announced a new federal grant to help staff it.

"Oyster Bay is a volunteer department and it was hard for them to get people to respond during the day so we did a mutual aid agreement. We're going to put people in your station and respond to the calls in your area along with ours."

Gulf Shores Fire Department was awarded a Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER) and is awarded by the Department of Homeland Security. During the three years of the grant, the city will provide 25 percent of the cost to hire six firemen the first two years and 65 percent in the third year. After the third year the city completely takes over the pay and benefits for the new firemen.

The total cost to the city will be about \$394,500 and the federal share will be about \$640,000.

At the same time, the city is buying the Oyster Bay-Huggers landing station on County Road 6 west of Alabama 59. The city will pay \$190,000 for the building according the city documents.

"Buying that station up there is going to tie into this because we need those individuals to staff that station full time," Deputy Fire Chief Keith Martin said.

Gulf Shores already has two men stationed at the

Oyster Bay-Hugger's Landing facility in a mutual aid agreement with the volunteer department.

One, it was helping the citizens up in that north Gulf Shores in the County Road 6 area," Martin said. "Oyster Bay is a volunteer department and it was hard for them to get people to respond during the day so we did a mutual aid agreement. We're going to put people in your station and respond to the calls in your area along with ours. Their response area is within our police jurisdiction. It's nothing we're doing extra."

Chief Hartly Brokenshaw said a recent annexation of the area were the station is location also played a part in buying the station.

"It cut their need for that station and we were already running mutual aid with them so they saw they really didn't need that station anymore," Brokenshaw said. "Right now, we're in it anyway and we're functioning right now. when becomes our station, of course, we can do improvements on it within the next couple of years."

The station and adding the firemen is needed to keep up with growth in Gulf Shores and to be able to provide services when the town is full of tourists in the busy season.

"Our long-term plan was to do this and the city council was aware and knew we needed new staff," Martin said. "We're getting bigger and we were going to try to hire at least two people a year over the next couple of years so that we can meet this growing demand. But we needed the people now. Having this grant allows us to basically jump ahead three years, four years even, and have what we need now instead of having to build to it. It's really good timing for this grant."

And, all of the stations will be fully staffed.

"As it was we had two people at that station and now we're going to have three at that station at all times," Brokenshaw said. "All of our stations now will have at least three people."

This is the third SAFER grant used by the city to add

firemen. The city added 12 to the department in both 2005 and 2007 with the grant totals each more than

The department currently has a station in downtown, west beach, to the west on Fort Morgan Road and now at Oyster Bay-Huggers Landing.

In other business, the council also:

- OK'd a liquor license for the The Lodge at Gulf State Park a Hilton Hotel for the operator Valor Beverage Management.
- Declared certain items surplus and donated 25 bicycles to the Christian Service Center. Among the items in the fall surplus are five automobiles, there all-terrain vehicles, a kayak and a 70-inch TV. Items will be auctioned through govdeals.com beginning Oct. 15 and ending on Oct. 29.
- Transferred ownership of three surplus Ford buses to the Lee-Russell Council of Governments. Since the city acquired busses through an ALDOT Grant in 2007 with an 80-20 match the Alabama Department of Transportation had to approve the transfer. The state agency recently approved the surplus and transfer of
- Approved a conditional use permit for 50 private parking spaces on West Beach Boulevard between Ike's Beach Service on the east and Pier 33 Grocery on the west. Ike's and surrounding condos would have access to the site and it would not be for public use.
- Approved an addition to the zoning ordinance with a new R-1-5A to address a large difference between R-1-4 zoning with an 11,000 square foot lot size minimum and R-1-5 zoning which has a 6,000 minimum. The new R-1-5A will require an 8,000 square foot limit.
- Awarded a bid for new Christmas decorations and enhancements to current decorations to Mosca Design on a per piece price. Mosca had the lowest bid at about



There will also be a bake sale with all kinds of home-made cakes, pies, cookies, breads, and candies.



Nashville hitmaker John Scott Sherrill at Flora-Bama Oct. 18

Wes Loper will introduce his friend to local audiences during afternoon gig

Nashville based songwriter John Scott Sherrill (pictured), who has scored 11 no. 1 hits, will join Gulf join his friend Wes Loper on stage for an afternoon of music at the famed Flora-Bama Lounge main room stage on Thursday, Oct. 18 from 2-6 p.m. The 'Bama is located on the Gulf of Mexico at the Al-Fl state line.

Sherrill's arrival in Nashville, during a trip from his New Hampshire home to California in 1975, is a story that can probably be told by countless refugees. It's what he did once he arrived that's worth noting. His songs have been covered by John Anderson, Patty Loveless, Josh Turner, Steve Wariner, Brooks & Dunn, George Strait, Alison Krauss, Jimmy Buffett, Peter Wolf, Mindy Smith, and Mick Jagger. His credits include cowrites with such legends as Michael McDonald, Steve Cropper, Peter Frampton and Dave Loggins. Over the past three decades, Sherrill has earned a reputation for his lyrics about love, loss and the human condition. His breakthrough hit was Johnny Lee's "When You Fall In Love," which he co-wrote with his friend, Steve Earle. This was also Earle's first songwriting hit.

His new album, Mr. Honky Tonk, reflects an everyman-sophistication, not only with the songwriting and production, but also through Sherrill's

honest and authentic voice.

In addition to a few covers of songs written for country stars Wariner ("Some Fools Never Learn"), Anderson ("Wild and Blue"), Loveless ("Nothin' But The Wheel") and Turner ("Would You Go With Me"), Sherrill introduces such gems as "Sweeter Than Sugar Cane," "Before the Going Gets Rough," "Itty Bitty Fiddle," and the title cut, "Mr. Honky Tonk."






Nov. 15 Honours Golf Charity Classic raises funds for CSC

Other scrumptious foods will include German-style filled cabbage, potato salad, goulash, red beans and rice, hamburgers, hot dogs, BBQ sandwiches, ice cream, popcorn, peanuts and homemade baked goods. The Bellview Stumpfiddle Band will perform with the North End Stompers and other cloggers. There will also be polka, country and German music.

Spearheaded by Elberta's Volunteer Fire Department since 1978, festival proceeds are used for improving not only the fire department, but the town as well. Additionally, local non-profits benefit from the festival through proceeds from their booth sales and parking lot fees. The festival is held twice a year - on the last Saturday of March and the last Saturday of October. Orange Beach taking 'parallel track' on ambulance service

Even as MedStar tries to find solutions to problems with response times in Orange Beach the city is going to continue exploring starting an ambulance service if its own.

"We want to start a parallel track," Mayor Tony Kennon said. "They may bring something that changes or turns all of our heads then that would be wonderful. If not, we'll move forward with our plan. But we'll start that parallel track."

Kennon's comments came during a joint city council session on Oct. 2 with the regular session first followed by a work session. The council also discussed subsidizing an increase in health insurance for employees coming in 2019.

"There was a meeting today with Med-Star and they are to come back with any possible solutions for solving our problem and what we expect for our citizens," Kennon said.

On Sept. 18 Fire Chief Justin Pearce told the council preliminary studies were being done on what it will take for the city to run its own ambulance service. In the Oct. 2 meeting, Kennon discussed going ahead with plans for new staff to man the new ambulances.

"What I would like to ask if we're going to have to add nine firemen to backfill the seasoned firemen and paramedics going into the ambulance service," Kennon said. "We don't want to bring in nine on Jan. 1 and start training them all at the same time. We'd like to go ahead and start that process now with four and then four more in a month or six weeks so we will have the newbies seasoned on the firetrucks when the seasoned guys come off. We won't be training nine at

Finance Director Ford Handley told the council medical costs for city employees were going to rise 9.3 percent beginning in 2019.

Typical for insurance because we all know insurance prices are rising and will continue to rise," Handley said. "Working with the finance committee we came out with a couple of solutions to subsidize that increase. The main goal of this was to not increase the monthly premiums on the employees and that's what we recommend the council do for 2019."

According to a memo from Handley, the savings will come from modifying the prescription network for a 5 percent savings and increasing the deductible for copays for urgent care visits for a savings of 4 percent. The out-of-pocket max for employees was raised but the city is still below the statewide benchmark for health insurance for local governments.

"If an employee or their family go to an urgent care that is not Southern Rapid Care, the copay will go from \$35 to \$75," the memo states. "This does not affect primary care physicians or specialist visits."

In August, the city announced it was going to move primary care for employ-

ees from the Symbol Clinic to Southern Rapid Care in The Commons shopping center on Canal Road on Jan. 1. Handley said this move should also save the city and employees on health care costs.

During regular session, council also:

- Passed a resolution accepting the donation of a piano from the Friends of the Arts to be housed at the Coastal Arts Center of Orange Beach.
- Approved a retail common carrier liquor license application by Paradise Parasail, Inc., for Cetacean Cruises, at The Wharf.

Snapper anglers encouraged to offer input at Gulf Council meeting

Gulf Council meets Oct. 22-25 at the Renaissance Battle House in downtown Mobile

Gulf anglers who are dedicated to catching Alabama's most popular reef fish species – red snapper – will have an opportunity to share their opinions with the policy makers at the Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council meeting in Mobile later this month. During the meeting, members of the Gulf Council will continue discussions on a change in red snapper management that would give the individual Gulf States more flexibility in establishing the length of the fishing season within each state.

Scott Bannon and MRD Chief Biologist Kevin Anson urge all anglers who want to see the individual states manage the reef fish fishery to become a part of the process when the Gulf Council meets Oct. 22-25 at the Renaissance Battle House in downtown Mobile.

The Reef Fish Committee meets at 8:30 a.m., Tuesday. Oct. 23, to discuss Amendment 50, which deals with state management of red snapper. The segment of the Gulf Council meeting Bannon and Anson highlight as the

chance for the public to participate in the process is the comment period from 1:30-4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 24.

"In this particular Council meeting, we really need to

make some decisions on the state management plans that could come into effect after 2019," Bannon said.

Alabama's 2019 red snapper season remains under the exempted fishing permit (EFP) that NOAA Fisheries granted for the 2018-2019 seasons. That EFP allowed the individual states to set seasons that would allow harvest of a specific number of pounds of red snapper as long as it did not exceed the overall quota.

Alabama anglers showed a renewed enthusiasm for red snapper fishing this past summer, and MRD officials were forced to close the snapper season early. The Marine Resources Division based its proposed 47day 2018 season on the data gathered from the 2017 snapper season. That data included daily catch rate, size of the fish and the amount of angler effort (mandays fishing for snapper).

Alabama closely monitors the red snapper harvest through its red snapper reporting program, known as Snapper Check. After the data came in on July 8, MRD realized that red snapper fishermen had taken advantage of near-ideal conditions to catch fish at such a rate that the quota of 984,291 pounds of red snapper would be exceeded unless the season was

closed after 28 days.

"Everything that you would be concerned about as an angler wasn't a concern," Anson said, explaining why angler participation and harvest rates skyrocketed in 2018. "When you go offshore, you have to make sure you have enough money to pay for fuel and sup-

plies. The economy is good. They didn't have to worry about the weather, as winds and seas were great this year during the snapper season days for the most part. And, the fish are there and they're easy to

Although the 2019 snapper season will still fall under the EFP, no plan is in place for 2020 and beyond. Without a new plan, the private recreational angler would revert to a federal season, which was ridiculously short before the EFP was granted.

"If we go back to a federal season, that may not work out very well for private recreational anglers," Bannon said. "There will be a lot of discussion on Amendment 50 at this Council meeting."

Anson, who is MRD's representative on the Gulf Council, said Amendment 50 is an alternative to the traditional federal form of fisheries management. "Basically, it's a form of management that apportions a percentage of the recreational quota to each state. Then the states set their seasons based on those available pounds," Anson said.

"Amendment 50 states that the Gulf states have a portion of the total recreational allocation, which may or may not include federal charter boats," Anson said.

Alabama's charter-for-hire fleet opted to abide by traditional federal management for the 2018 season, which gave them a 51-day season, fishing straight through from June 1 through July 21.

Anson said charter-for-hire vessels are included in Amendment 50, although there is discussion to exclude them from the amendment.

Anson said several options are on the table in Amendment 50 to determine what each state's apportionment would be, including traditional harvest data and a biomass estimate.

The biomass (number of red snapper in the Gulf) estimate may not bode well for Alabama's share.

"The assessment estimates that the majority of red snapper are west of the Mississippi River," Anson said. "That would be Louisiana and Texas. The proportion

of red snapper for the other three states is lower. Compared to historical landings data, our allocation of fish would go down in that situation."

Anson said if Amendment 50 is passed and goes into effect, it will give states as much control over the fishery as federal law allows through the Magnuson-Stevens Act. Congress must amend Magnuson-Stevens to give states more control than what is currently being considered under Amendment 50, Anson

"Under this amendment, states could set their seasons," Bannon said. "The seasons will be set under a total allowable catch for the entire Gulf. Probably the number one topic for Amendment 50 is can the states agree on the allocation percentage for each state and vote that forward so that everything will be done in time for the 2020 season.

"The other topic has to do with the federal for-hire boats. Do they totally come out of the amendment? Two states are fighting very hard to keep the for-hire boats in the amendment, and the federal for-hire folks in the other three states would not like to see that. They want to keep the federal season. The meeting in Mobile is a chance for the owners of federal for-hire vessels to express that to the Council."

Bannon said historically the private recreational anglers have been reluctant for whatever reasons to provide public testimony and participate in the process. He hopes that will change later this month.

"Red snapper fishing in Alabama is a huge deal," Bannon said. "This Gulf Council meeting is being held in Mobile. I want to encourage people from Alabama who consider this to be very important to come and provide public comment during the process. My take is that if you can take a day off to go fishing, then you can take a day off to come to the meeting and be a part of the solution for 2020 and beyond. We get a lot of people whose response is 'The process is stupid' or 'It doesn't work,' when they don't know how it works. This is their opportunity to see how the Council process works.




