Gulf State Park golf course will close for good on Dec. 2.

Due to a saturation of golf courses in the region and the opportunity to provide new nature-based recreational opportunities at Gulf State Park, the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (ALDCNR) officials announced this week that the Gulf State Park's golf course will close in December.

The course has been losing money for several years and closing the course will allow GSP to save money while opening up that property for other outdoor experiences, according to Chris Blankenship, commissioner of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

"The decision to close the Gulf State Park course was not made lightly," he said. "ALDCNR also engaged a third-party that specializes in studying golf courses and developing plans to identify how to make the best use of the facility." The Gulf State Park Master Plan can be found at mygulfstatepark.com.

"There are more than a half-dozen other golf courses in the region, and that saturation means the prognosis for profitability of our course is not good," said State Parks Director Greg Lein. "We can't afford to continue operating in the red year after year. That not only negatively impacts Gulf State Park, but our system as a whole."

The good news, he said, is that several courses in the area have agreed to offer special rates for Gulf State Park's campground and lodge guests from December 3rd through February 28. For example, Craft Farms in Gulf Shores will offer a play anytime rate of \$46.50, Peninsula Golf Club in Gulf Shores will offer \$51.50 and Rock Creek in Fairhope will offer \$34.83. Each of the three courses will offer an early-bird (before 9 a.m.) rate of \$39, and all will charge \$24 for a nine-hole round after 3 p.m., plus other special rates as well. Park guests will have to present a receipt from the park to qualify for these exclusive rates.

Gulf State Park is considered the "crown jewel" of Alabama's state parks system.



Wreaths Across America Ceremony Dec. 15 at Barrancas Big Lagoon Kiwanians accepting donations through Nov. 30

The Kiwanis Club of Big Lagoon is again spearheading the local effort to participate in the Wreaths Across America program to remember and honor our fallen veterans. The club is taking orders for wreaths specifically for Barrancas National Cemetery at NAS Pensacola through Nov. 30.

This year's Wreaths Across America ceremony and placement of wreaths at Barrancas will be on December 15 beginning at 9 a.m. Wreath sponsorships start at \$15 and payment can be made online with credit card or by check using the downloadable mail-in order form. The Big Lagoon Kiwanis, with help from the Bailey Middle School Builder's Club and the K-Kids Club, along with several other local area non-profits (pictured below), will place the wreaths at veterans' head stones to honor veter-

ans and provide an excellent opportunity to teach younger generations about the value of their freedoms and the importance of honoring those who sacrificed so much to protect those freedoms.

Approximately 11,000 wreaths will be placed at Barrancas. This is an inspiring sight, but it still leaves many grave sites unadorned.

In 1992, 5,000 wreaths were donated by Morrill Worcester and Worcester WreathCo. Years later, in 2005, an iconic photo of these wreaths in snow (pictured above) became a viral sensation. Finally, in 2007, Wreaths Across America is formed as a nonprofit governed by a Board of Directors. Their day-to-day operations are overseen by Executive Director Karen Worcester.

WAA's mission is carried out by coordinating ceremonies at Arlington, as well as veterans' cemeteries in all 50 states. The organization has since expanded to include over 1,000 local charity groups that represent more than 800 cemeteries, military memorials, and other locations. In 2008, and each year since, Congress has issued a proclamation officially recognizing "Wreaths Across America Day" each December.

ALDOT approves funding for third Pleasure Island Bridge across Intracoastal Waterway

Local officials and business leaders were incredulous that anyone could be opposed to the state's plan to build a third bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway just west of the Foley Beach Express toll bridge.

"We have no other option, it's not coming out of

our pocket and it's the best opportunity we'll ever have," Gulf Shores Mayor Robert Craft said. "We cannot let this pass."

A standing-room-only crowd gathered at the Gulf Shores Activity Center on Nov. 15 to express their views on the project to Alabama Department of Transportation officials and local officials as well. Most in the crowd were in favor of the project but there is also a contingent hoping to shut the project down, even though state funding for the entire project is already in place.

One who was not in favor was State Auditor Jim Zeigler who says he's asked for documents about the project several times since April and has yet to receive a response from ALDOT.

"I have more questions than answers about the proposed additional bridge," Zeigler said. "I hope to solve that with my specific requests for public records. We need to make sure that this \$30 to \$87 million-dollar project is the best use of our limited funds."

One of the most vocal residents against the build has been Joe Emerson who started a Facebook page against the bridge.

"Our traffic problems in and around this area can be vastly improved by one build alone, a project that has been in the conception phase for over a decade," Emerson said of a road through the park. "I recognize we desperately need a cross-island corridor."

Craft says there's no question in his mind this project is the right thing for his city.

"There are folks out there that don't want to see that happen and it is in our best interest and in Orange Beach's best interest," Craft said. "They are supporting this. Whoever is against it is against it for reasons unrelated to what is best for these two communities in my opinion.

"If this doesn't happen I don't know what our options are. We really have no other options that are reasonable and successful. If they expand the toll bridge and people go around it we're going to be

right back where we are."

Southwest Engineer Vince Calametti of ALDOT told the crowd trying to fix Alabama 59 is a much more disruptive and costlier proposition and the new bridge can help alleviate traffic there.

Craft said past and recent studies reveal that 22 percent of the daily traffic heading over the Alabama 59 bridge in Gulf Shores is ultimately headed to Orange Beach, many dodging the Foley Beach Express toll bridge.

"This bridge will be funded by ALDOT because it's cheaper for them to solve the problem on 59 that way than it is to try and fix 59 all the way to Bay Minette," Craft said. "That roadway is overcrowded, too. This allows the shift of a lot of the traffic to the beach express."

Orange Beach Mayor Tony Kennon said plans also include widening Canal Road from Tacky Jacks in Gulf Shores to Alabama 161 in Orange Beach. The only bridge serving that area would be the two-lane toll bridge.

"We're fixing to have four lanes north and south of the bridge and two lanes north and south and that makes no sense," Kennon said. "If there's a barge incident with the bridge, if it takes out the Orange Beach Bridge or the Gulf Shores bridge could y'all imagine the chaos. It's a no brainer."

Gulf Shores City Administrator Steve Griffin said the new bridge helps safety issues with emergency vehicles and would be another hurricane evacuation route.

"We just dodged a bullet with Hurricane Michael and a bridge like this would be critical for evacuation purposes," Griffin said.

Wynell Bell who has a home on Canal Road just east of Sixth Street said she fears her property may be taken if a proposed widening and rerouting of that road takes place.

"If Canal Road east of The Wharf to your proposed new bridge and road is five lane then please explain to me how you can flow traffic from five lanes into two lanes on my section of Canal Road and not have a horrendous bottleneck," Bell said. "Common sense tells me you cannot build a bridge west of the beach express, install roundabouts, pour thousands of more vehicles on Canal Road with no direct route to the beach and hope to solve this problem."


Tina Perrault, who says she lost her home and property to eminent domain for the roadway north of the canal, said she understands new infrastructure will help but it hasn't lessened her

"These people may be here to look after the safety but they're not here to look after you and your home and what you lose," Perrault said. "Today, officially, the state has taken my home and my property away."



26 mph speed limit set through Gulf State Park

An oddly new speed limit has been set for State Hwy.135 through Gulf State Park.

"We believe the unusual

speed limit on the signs will

help drivers take note and slow down," said Gulf Shores Chief of Police Ed Delmore. "The new limit of 26 miles an hour emphasizes that something is different." "This route is an entrance to our beautiful Gulf State Park, not just another state road," said Chris Blankenship, Commissioner of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

With the opening of The Lodge at Gulf State Park, even more traffic is expected to use the 2.138-mile Alabama 135 to get to the park and its new 350-room hotel and conference center. Gulf Shores and parks officials agreed lowering the speed limit in advance of the opening would be beneficial to park guests.

The approximately 6,500acre Gulf State Park includes three miles of white sand beaches, with restored sand dunes, the Gulf of Mexico's longest fishing pier and 28 miles of walking and biking trails. The park is made up of nine ecosystems.

In Gulf Shores it was rumored that some opposition was being raised in the neighborhood about noise the Flying Harpoon had live music. The city received either letters or emails stating opposition.

Then the Harpoon army flew into action.

"Even on Facebook," Nancy said. "We had over 2,200 signatures off a petition and they got it in three or four days. The little introduction people would write before signing the petition brought me to tears. There were a number of letters written to the city council and the mayor, too."

And, while no opposition showed up to contest the license on Nov. 13 and the council voted 6-0 to approve it, the Harpoon army packed the chamber led by an emotional fan, Melanie Tremaine.

"I've been living here for 15 or 16 years and we've found a home at the Flying Harpoon because it's a place for us locals to go," Tremaine said. "They've been on national TV and brought great exposure to our town that we never would've experienced if it weren't for that little place. And I want it to stay here so we have a place to go."

Ira Allen is retired from the U.S. Army and a single parent. He likes to spend time at the Harpoon with fellow vets to relax and visit.

"I needed a place, too, where I could

just go and socialize and the Flying Harpoon has been that place," Allen said.

Nancy said all the support made her realize she had created the special place she had hoped for when she opened.

"The whole experience was so humbling it brought me to tears more than once," Nancy said. "But it's exactly what I had in mind when I started it. There's that part, too, knowing that I accomplished that goal. That social aspect."

There was an outpouring of love on Facebook posts as people weighed in on their affection for the Harpoon.

"A source of comfort, kindness, connection...nourishment...body soul... love you, Nancy," Shea Wilson wrote.

"I feel it safe to say this is a home away from home," Faith Morley wrote. "I made lifelong friends there ... family. We must fight to keep this beautiful community together."

While the council gave its unanimous consent, it didn't come without an admonition of sorts from Mayor Robert Craft.

"There are issues here that need to be addressed," Craft said. "You've got to keep the parking on the site. You can't have parking on the right of way and you cannot park on other people's property. That is a limitation that will not restrict this license from being renewed but you will be ticketed and we are having to moni-

tor that. Everyone who visits the place has to know there are rules that have to be followed. Your actions there could change the possibility of this continuing."

Nancy anticipates the Gulf Shores location to be open soon and has taken the down time to deep clean and repaint the walls.

"I'm going to get a little gathering of people together to help me put the pictures and dollar bills back up," she said. "We're pretty much ready we've just got to hang everything back up on the walls."

Orange Beach may take a while and may see some renovations. The kitchen is downstairs and to get food upstairs servers have to use a staircase that is outside.

"The wind and the cold elements affect us," Nancy said. "We'll probably close down in December in Orange Beach. I'm going to put in a dumbwaiter. I'm waiting for estimates so I hope I can afford it. I've wanted one of those since I got this building."






IMPACT 100 GRANT RECIPIENTS SELECTED: At its Annual Meeting held at the Daphne Civic Center on November 1, Impact 100 Baldwin County selected five Baldwin County nonprofit organizations to receive \$455,000 in grants. Each of the five nonprofits received \$91,000 grants, one in each of Impact's five focus groups: Arts and Culture; Education; Environment, Preservation and Recreation; Family; and Health and Wellness. The five organizations were selected from a very competitive group of applicants and vetted by a comprehensive review process by Impact members, including site visits and in-depth discussions about each of the projects. The five 2018 grant award winners were announced. This year's grantees are: Baldwin County Youth Orchestra - Project: Baldwin Strings Academy - This grant will pay for additional string instruments that will allow for the expansion of the Baldwin County Youth Orchestra after-school strings program. Children in elementary schools in Elberta, Foley and Summerdale will now have access to this musical enrichment. A brand-new program for middle school students in Robertsdale is included in this project. Grant funds will also be used to cover instructor fees at all schools. Fairhope Point Clear Rotary Youth Programs, Inc. - Creating a Healthier Academic Environment - This grant will be used to restore, enhance and improve the Rotary Youth club gymnasium, which houses a library, tech classroom and teen room. The enhancements will help them meet current safety standards, be energy efficient and made usable for the needs of children pre-K through high school, as well as the community. The Miracle League of Coastal Alabama - All Inclusive Recreational Park. This grant will provide special playground equipment for the new all-inclusive park in Summerdale designed to enable persons with special needs to play sideby-side with their family and friends. The special equipment being purchased will include a sensory/music station, a "ŻipKrooz" zip line with a chair, spinners, a wheelchair glider and swing set, ramps and more. Light of the City/Volunteers of America - Light the Way Family Initiative. Grant funds will provide for improvements and upgrades to the former Douglasville High School Campus, including construction of a 24' x 24' event and community gathering pavilion, resurfacing the gymnasium floor, creation of a 1/10-mile walking track, and the development of a community garden area. **Big Fish Ministries** - Facilitating Change, Championing Freedom, Fostering Hope. This grant will expand Big Fish Ministries' residential treatment program to include women, allowing them to purchase the property currently housing the men's program and convert it to a much-needed women's facility. Since its inception, Impact 100 Baldwin County has awarded 32 grants, totaling over \$3 million to nonprofit organizations serving Baldwin County. The early bird gets the whiting when it comes to surf fishing

The pre-dawn light was sufficient for safe passage from the parking lot over a boardwalk to a beautiful stretch of beach on the Fort Morgan peninsula.

The early arrival guaranteed our party, led by guide Matt Isbell, would get to pick the spot where our surffishing adventure would have the best chance of success.

Isbell, better known as the Bama Beach Bum to all his YouTube followers, has developed a niche among fishing guides on the Alabama Gulf Coast. He has tried fishing from boats and piers, but he prefers the sandy beaches and surf where whiting and pompano roam.

The Wetumpka native moved to Gulf Shores for an

insurance job, but his surffishing success led to a full-time guide business in March of this year.

"I started uploading YouTube videos in October last year and started guiding in December," Isbell said. "I didn't really plan on guiding. I started hosting online content just because I loved it, and I wanted to kind of see where it went.

"I had multiple people continually asking me to take them fishing. I did that initially. Then it got to be more and more to

the point it was taking away from my regular job." Isbell decided to see if anyone would pay for his services. He learned there is a growing market for his kind of fishing.

"It kind of snowballed from there and really started picking up," he said.

Isbell soon found out his guide business appeals to a wide variety of customers.

"Most of my clients are out-of-towners, a lot from the Midwest but from all over the country," he said. "I've had a group from Guam that wanted to fish. They saw me on YouTube. Right now, I'm the only one uploading surf-fishing content to the internet, so that's how some people find me.

"I get people of all ages and sizes, ethnicities, all the above."

Isbell's surf fishing started in earnest six years ago when he moved to the Alabama Gulf Coast.

"When I first started surf fishing, I was just trying to figure out what to do," he said. "Like a lot of people in Alabama, I grew up bass and crappie fishing. When I came down here, I just tried to figure out the fishing. I fished a lot of different ways – from boats, piers, canals, wherever I could access the water.

"Then I started surf fishing and I fell in love with it. I just enjoyed being on the beach and being able to bring home dinner."

Isbell has refined his surf-fishing techniques in the last six years. Although he has learned to judge the surf and which areas produce fish, it's really not a technique that infrequent visitors should tackle. He said learning to read the beach takes time, that most people find it difficult to pick up on the nuances that might lead to better fishing unless a lot of time is

spent on the beach.

"The biggest thing I tell people to do is to stagger your baits," he said. "Make sure you cover a lot of water and try to locate the zone those fish are running in. Especially when you're surf fishing, these fish are not hanging in one area like they do on a reef or pier or jetty. The fish in the surf are always moving, looking for food. But they are going to hang in a particular depth. That's why you stagger your baits to try to find out what depth those fish are favoring. But it can change daily or week to week. You always have to recalibrate to find the fish.

"If you know how to look for cuts, holes and bars in the surf, that can help, but most people have a hard time with it. But anybody can get out there and put baits in different spots and figure it out using that system."

Isbell said a dedicated surf angler will need a variety of tackle to target the species that happen to inhabit the surf at any given time because different fish come to the beaches at different times.

"What we're targeting is going to determine what tackle we use," he said. "But the most popular way is what we are doing, using pompano rigs with bits of shrimp and Fish Bites. We'll use sand fleas (mole crabs) when they present themselves, and we can scoop them up (look for a sand flea rake at the local tackle shop). We had some really good colonies of sand fleas show up this year. It's a great bait and it's free."

On our trip, Isbell used 10-foot surf rods with 4000-and 5000-series spinning reels spooled with 20-pound-test braided line. Of the five rigs we used during our outing, we had a drop-hook rig with the 2- to 3-ounce weight tied to the bottom on three rods, while the other two were rigged with cut bait hooked below the weight (Carolina rig) to try to catch a redfish or blue-fish. He uses 1/0 to 2/0 circle hooks most of the time.

"You don't have to use 10-foot rods, but you can still fish on rough days," he said. "You can keep a 3- or 4-ounce lead out. I make my own pompano rigs. You can buy them with two or three drops. I prefer one-drop

rigs. It's more discreet and easier to manage."

Isbell said probably his hardest job is teaching clients what to look for to indicate a bite. A rhythmic motion of the rod tip indicates wave action. A steady pull or erratic action means some species of fish is taking the bait.

Although our party, which included Jay Hirschberg and Wayne Carman, was fishing on a neap tide, we managed to reel in bluefish, whiting (sometimes called southern or Gulf kingfish), a rodeo-worthy ladyfish and the ubiquitous hardhead catfish to the beach. Isbell said the heat has caused the pompano to vacate the surf until the weather and water cools.

Cooler weather will also bring another desirable species close to the beach.

^a"We get a good run of bull redfish in the fall," Isbell said. "We will use a lot of cut bait. I'm transitioning now to using cut bait on Carolina rigs. If I'm fishing for bull reds, I'll move up to a 4/0 hook. They will hit pompano rigs, and that's definitely worth doing because the pompano fishing is only going to improve as the weather cools.

"You can catch whiting all year, but it does get better in the winter. That is the main species we target when it gets cold. Whiting get bigger (pushing 2 pounds) and more plentiful in the winter months. Sometimes in the winter, we'll get a run of what we call 'big uglies,' the big black drum. Those are a lot of fun to catch, too."


For those who specifically target pompano in the surf, Isbell said the best fishing occurs in the spring.

"March, April and May – those are the three months to catch pompano," he said. "That's go time for pompano. You can still catch them in June and July, but it's definitely better in the spring."

Isbell said certain conditions provide an opportunity to catch speckled trout in the surf as well.

"We catch trout mainly in the summer months," he said. "It's usually after a big rain and fresh water moves the fish out to the beaches, looking for that higher salinity."




