



#### Nov. 15 meeting addresses new bridge over Intracoastal

Review project info and sign up to speak to ADOT representatives

The Alabama Department of Transportation will host a public meeting to review project information concerning a proposed bridge connecting Canal Rd. near the border of Orange Beach and Gulf Shores with the Foley Beach Expressway on Thursday, November 15 from 5-7 p.m. at the Gulf Shores Activity Center, located at 260 Clubhouse Dr. in Gulf Shores.

Orange Beach is already proceeding with plans to build a bridge across the waterway at Orange Beach Blvd. (County Rd. 161) using money collected from bed taxes. The proposed bridge west of the Foley Beach Express, projected to cost \$87 million, will be funded by the State of Alabama.

The meeting format will be formal, where the public may review project information and exhibits on display and will also have an opportunity to publicly speak. People wishing to provide comments during the public hearing should register at the sign-in table. There is a two minute time limit for each person to speak. Representatives of the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) will be available to answer questions throughout the meeting. A court recorder will be present to record public comments. Comment sheets will be provided, and citizens can also comment through e-mail at swinfo@dot.state.al, fax at (251) 473-3624 or by mail: Vincent E. 

More than 200 acclaimed songwriters will perform some of the biggest hits in modern music during the 34th Annual Frank Brown International Songwriters Festival, scheduled Nov. 8-18 on the Florida/Alabama Gulf Coast.

While the Flora-Bama Lounge is the base for the festival, performers also will perform original works in intimate settings at 30 other venues in Gulf Shores, Orange Beach, Bon Secour, and Josephine as well as Perdido Key and Pensacola.

Each location will host a diverse lineup, with writers often sharing the stage and swapping songs, turning some sets into spellbinding jam sessions.

Flora-Bama co-owner Joe Gilchrist founded the FBISF in 1984 as a way to celebrate the end of the season with local artists, visiting Nashcats and other musical friends. Gilchrist was sponsoring his songwriting friends for shows at the Flora-Bama in the off-season prior to 1984. But the first official FBISF was held at The

Saenger Theatre in Pensacola. Gilchrist said he lost \$10,000 on the venture.

"After that, I figured if I was going to lose that kind of money, I might as well have it at my own place," he said.

The festival thrived at the Flora-Bama with 11 nights of non-stop music - usually ending with Gilchrist buying a round for the diehards at 2 a.m. - until 1994, when event director Brucie Glassell spearheaded an effort to share the musical wealth throughout the community.

The festival is fluid by nature, meaning the schedule is subject to change. Even if you have a printed schedule, it is best to check FrankBrownSongwriters.com every day for updated information.

"We are nice people who are respectful,' said Gilchrist. "Quite frequently, these writers are unappreciated even within the music business. We're glad to provide a listening environment where they can play, and it's not background music. It's living music that professes emotions and feelings that all of us have, but very few of us know how to express."

Jason Aldean and Thompson Square are among Nashville stars that played the festival before their careers took off. Both Billboard and American Songwriters magazines have recognized the granddaddy of songwriter festivals, and it's been called one of the Top 20 Events by the Southeast Tourism Society.

Dean Dillon, who has written 50 songs performed by the legendary George Strait, is a member of the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame, will again participate this

Songwriting guests also include Jim McBride, whose songs have been hits for Alan Jackson, Conway Twitty and Tammy Cochran, and Austin Church, whose songs have been recorded by Jimmy Buffett and Lyle Lovett.

The festival is named after the late Frank Brown, who was night watchman at the Flora-Bama for 28 years before retir-

#### Spectacular Lodge at Gulf State Park throws open its doors

The pride among the assembled dignitaries, including Gov. Kay Ivey, was palpable when the ribbon was finally slashed and the \$140 million RESTORE Act funded Lodge at Gulf State Park was officially opened for business on Nov. 2.

Gulf Shores Mayor Robert Craft talked about how his mother used to take him to GSP when he was a child and the responsibility he and other elected officials have as stewards of Pleasure Island's beautiful beaches.

Vigor grad Orange Beach Mayor Tony Kennon mentioned childhood family vacations to GSP and waking his father before dawn so he and his brother could fish at Lake Shelby and the GSP Pier.

"It was always torture when the drawbridge was up and we had to wait," he said. "Now I get to live here and raise my family here."

U.S. Congressman Bradley Byrne and Dept. of Conservation Commissioner Chris Blankenship, South Alabama natives both, also referenced childhood memories when speaking to the large gathering. Speaker of the House Mac Mc-

Cutcheon, raised "in the redneck cotton fields" of North Alabama, said one of his favorite memories as a parent was taking his children to Gulf State Park so they could feel the waves wash over their toes.

"Now we want to make sure people from North Alabama can get here and not sit on Hwy. 65 for several hours," he said.

It was Herb Malone, president of Gulf Shores and Orange Beach Tourism, who provided the best reference to Gulf State Park's connection to so many in Alabama, relaying how his father, as part of the W.P.A., worked at Gulf State Park "gathering up alligators" ahead of construction crews amidst the mosquitos along the original Powerline Rd. in the 1930s.

Originally established in 1974, the hotel at GSP served as a hub of community activity for 30 years before being irreparably damaged by Hurricane Ivan in 2004.

The new lodge was rebuilt as a model of resilient, environmentally-friendly coastal development with a focus on sustainable tourism. It is designed to be an international benchmark for environmental and economic sustainability with facilities earmarked for outdoor recreation, education, and hospitable accommodations.

To demonstrate its commitment to protecting the environment, Lodge architects targeted three of the most rigorous sustainability goals in the hospitality industry.

The Lodge will be the only hotel in the world with all three of those highly sought after certifications in energy efficiency and fortified construction, said John Koshivos, Hilton's vice president for franchise development.

Guests of the 350-room (20 of them suites), beachfront hotel will enjoy stunning views of the Gulf of Mexico or Lake Shelby with direct access to the emerald green waters of the Gulf and over 6,150 acres of trails and activities within the Park. Rooms will rent for somewhere in the \$200 range, depending on the season.

Offering a wide array of indoor

and outdoor event space, the lodge is designed for conferences, special occasions and gatherings of any size.

"This is not just a premium hotel on the beach," said Gary Ellis, GSP's director of Community Relations. "The entire entity of Gulf State Park including The Lodge, Living Campus, the Interpretive Center, the new trails - will be a game-changer for the state. The new lodge should draw not only from Alabama but all over the United States. We'll also be appealing to international visitation. The work and strategic thinking that have gone into this will put us in a different playing field other than just a resort hotel on the beach."

Under the management of Valor Hospitality Partners, the new Lodge operates with a focused commitment to the sustainability and preservation of the coastline, environment, wildlife and fauna of the Park and the region.

Hilton will handle The Lodge booking.

The Lodge will accommodate up to 1,000 people for conferences and conventions. The beach-view ballroom is 12,160 square feet with an adjacent 7,500-square-foot outdoor terrace. Several other smaller meeting and conference rooms are available.

A Gulf-front pool will have a pool bar and grill, while a Gulf-front restaurant will have terrace seating and a private dining room that will serve house-prepared dishes sourced from regional suppliers, including fresh Alabama Gulf Seafood.

Sensitively designed by Lake-Flato and Rabun Architects



with a native landscape by Sasaki Associates. the building footprint was reduced by nearly one-third. It sits back 200-225 feet from the Gulf to allow for greater dune restoration and natural dune movement. The buildings are positioned to take advantage of gulf breezes and natural lighting. This design reduces energy use by 32 percent and interior water use by 35 percent.

The interior design, inspired by the hotel's surrounding environment and its local history, incorporates color, texture, and contrast to create comforting spaces that seamlessly transition from outdoor to indoor while maintaining high levels of energy efficiency and environmental sustainability.

"We look forward to welcoming guests to our unique property where nature is at your doorstep at every turn," said Bill Bennett, general manager.

"There is not a more beautiful place than our Gulf Coast, with its white sands and sparkling waters," Gov. Ivey added. "This facility is our way to show a piece of Alabama to the world."

The project was financed first with \$29 million from early BP oil spill settlement funds under former Gov. Robert Bentley, with approval from the NRDA trustees. The remaining building funds came from Alabama's cut of the RESTORE Act pushed through by Alabama's legislators.

As part of a settlements with the New Orleans based Gulf Restoration Network, Alabama will spend \$65.1 million over 15 years to maintain public amenities at GSP.

Lodge Highlights:

40,000 square feet of flexible indoor and outdoor meeting space; direct Gulf of Mexico views from every room; regionally inspired menus curated from locally sourced purveyors; Fifteen percent of building materials are recycled materials and 70-75 percent of construction waste was recycled; Condensation from the HVAC system is collected and recycled to replace water in the pool; rainwater is collected and directed to a restored wetland on site; lighting is designed with local wildlife in mind; air conditioning units include sensors that cut off the unit if balcony doors or windows are left open or ajar; native species landscaping; a commitment to recycling trash and cooking oil.

### Orange Beach middle/high school opening delayed 'til fall of 2020

#### Some grades to use portables at OBES; others will go to Gulf Shores

Construction of the new Baldwin County School District high school and middle school on land donated by Orange Beach adjacent to the Orange Beach Sportsplex has been pushed back 12 months after the lone bid for the project came in almost \$20 million over expected cost projections.

Thrash Contractors' \$42.7 million bid was so far removed from the school system's \$25 million initial es-

timate for the project that the School Board had little choice but to unanimously vote to table the issue until it meets later this month.

"We didn't expect to have only one bidder or for the bid to come in twice as much as we thought it might be," said BCSD Superintendent Eddie Tyler.

"This is a building that will serve generations of students, so we will go through the process in a methodical manner," he added. "It should be noted that we are repeatedly being told that steel prices, combined with contractors competing to do work on the Gulf Coast following the hurricane isn't helping us at all in lowering the price."

Orange Beach Mayor Tony Kennon said a tight construction timeline in a

tight labor market, especially with the Florida Panhandle rebuilding after Hurricane Michael, more than the unique architectural design led to the lone high bid.

The Baldwin County Board of Education is going to extend the timeline for completed construction until June 1, 2020 and re-bid the project on December 4, according to Mayor Kennon.

"I don't think the problem was the design," Kennon said. "The reason we only had one bid was more because of the timeline. The design of the building is not out of line with normal construction. It is not something that a contractor would run or cringe from. All of the contractors said the timeline was an issue, and a lot of it was because of the hurricane over in Panama City."

Four contractors pulled out of the bid process because they are involved in Hurricane Michael reconstruction efforts.

The independent school system in Gulf Shores starts in August of 2019. The city has already appointed a school board and hired a superintendent.

"The question has been asked: will this affect our negotiations with Gulf Shores? It will not change the August 2019 separation date nor our unwavering passion to be guided by what is best for our students," Tyler said.

"(Gulf Shores) Mayor Craft has reached out and said

he will help in any way he could, and we are probably going to have to take him up on that," Kennon said. "We are also looking at portables for some of the grades. So it will probably be a combination. I have a meeting with the county this week to look at the options and put a plan in place."

Kennon said he will present that plan to the community when it is in place, but he fully expects some grades to stay in Orange Beach and others to be sent to Gulf Shores.

"We will continue to do everything in our power to be wise stewards of the taxpayers' money and that starts with taking a hard look at the project in its entirety so that we make good, intelligent, well-thought-out decisions," Tyler said.

Before the unexpected bid results, Superintendent Tyler met with Mayor Kennon, District 5 Baldwin County School Board member Norma Lynch and O.B. City Council member Annette Mitchell to share thoughts on the new school.

Tyler said the plan for the new school is to use the second floor for middle school students and the first floor for high school students. Each will have its own principal.

Covering 130,000 square feet, the school will include 28 classrooms, two special needs classrooms, two middle school science labs, four high school science labs, a competition gym seating 736, a band room for 100 students, a choral room, a families and consumers sciences lab, a drivers education lab, an indoor dining cafeteria seating 300 and an outside pavilion/dining area seating 300.

The school's performing arts hall, funded by the City of Orange Beach, will seat 700.

Kennon and Mitchell said Orange Beach will fully support the new school in any way that it can. Tyler said he welcomes that partnership, which began with the city donating the property for the new school.

"It's a beautiful site," Tyler said. "There's a lot of talk around the state when I go to meetings about different things about the look of the building and the excitement, so we're just going to keep that up."

As required by state law, BCSD already had a backup plan if there was a delay in construction.

Meeting an August 2019 deadline for construction of the school was always going to be a tight window, Tyler said.

"There's going to be a portable village," Tyler said in September. "It will have to be architected and engineered and the state building commission has to bless it. It will be on the site of Orange Beach Elementary. It's going to be worked where there's not going to be any interaction with the elementary school.

"So there is going to be a village there, maybe 15 portables - something like that. And then we'll transition them to the new high school. I know portables is a bad word sometimes, especially depends on what part of the county you live in, but we're doing this for a purpose."

Concerning the ongoing school system separation negotiations with Gulf Shores, Tyler shared the following on Wednesday, September 26:

"I will tell you that it's been the board's position from the time we started talking, that juniors and seniors could basically remain in Gulf Shores High School. That's our position. That's been out there publically, 6-8 months, 10 months, you know. If you're going to be a rising sophomore and junior, you're going to be a junior and senior next fall at Gulf Shores High School because there's not going to be anything here that can really be offered to you based on what you are doing right now, whether it's a large band or it's some of those junior- or senior-level courses or it's athletics that you're competing in that you've been competing in for several years. So it just makes sense to leave those students alone. It's all about children. We're excited for them, we just want to make sure the start is good and whatever children are there, that the children are taken care of."

### Invasive beach vitex working its way back into Florida

By Charles Krupnick

Beach vitex (Vitex rotundifolia) is an invasive species that can crowd out native plants such as sea oats. It has been a particular problem in beach areas of the Carolinas and is now working its way into Florida.

Beach vitex has been identified on several properties on Pensacola Beach and in recent months on at least one property on Perdido Key. While not prohibited, the plant is not recommended and once established can be difficult and costly to eradicate.

As with many invasive species, the most effective means of eradication is to get it early. Beach vitex has woody runners, purple flowers and is spread by long-lasting seeds that can float to new locations.





#### There are steps that we can take to stem toxic red tide

Toxic red tide is a harmful algae bloom that can be fed by the nutrients in pollution, especially agricultural pollution, such as fertilizer run-off. It is caused by naturally occurring algae and fertilizer run-off from farms and lawns. Toxic red tide could be exacerbated by global climate change.

Toxic red tide has many effects. It kills fish, sea turtles, marine mammals and birds. It stinks. It causes sore throats and coughing in people. It impacts the income of commercial fishermen and fishing guides. Toxic red tide also impacts the local economy by hurting tourism.

What can be done? Farms can use less fertilizer. Farms can use compost. New farmland can be zoned farther away from waterways that eventually empty into oceans or the Gulf. Farms can create larger retention ponds. People can have lawns that do not need fertilizer at all. They can also buy organic fruits and veg-

## Recyclables from Orange Beach and Gulf Shores will be handled at the Gulf Shores Public Works facility

À little operation started in an empty lot and housed in temporary fencing across from the beach to recycle abandoned beach chairs, tents and remove trash will grow in 2019 to cover both Gulf Shores and Orange Beach.

If an agreement is passed on Nov. 13 by

Gulf Shores City Council, recyclables from both cities will be handled at the Gulf Shores Public Works facility north of the Intracoastal Waterway on 36th Avenue West.

"In 2016 we were just behind Alvin's Island trying to figure it out and we've evolved to where we are now which is pretty significant," Assistant Public

Works Director Noel Hand said. Orange Beach will pay Gulf Shores \$4,000 a month to process its recyclables, payable in a lump sum of \$48,000.

"Republic Services does their waste hauling and our waste hauling and recycling and they'll bring it to our shop," Hand said. "Technically, island-wide it's going to come to us. Orange Beach is going to have more skin in the game. Otherwise, they are just giving their problem to us. We have gone back and forth on that and that was the fair price we thought we could be at."

Orange Beach will also add glass collection

receptacles at its city collection sites and bring what it collects to the Gulf Shores center.

"This is strictly drop off," Hand said. "Orange Beach will have remote drop-off area and Orange Beach will bring their glass to us separate from Republic Services. You can't put glass in your recycle bin because it gets contaminated with the single-stream recycling."

Hand has led the Gulf Shores recycling effort beginning with the Leave Only Footprints program in 2016 and has expanded the program through grants from the Alabama Department of Environmental Management, especially the glass program.

"We got a glass pulverizer that's about an \$80,000 ticket item we got from ADEM," Hand said. "Then we got a surge hopper that goes on top of it that we can dump large amounts of glass in it. That was probably a \$40,000 item that was an attachment to that piece of equipment. Now we can dump it in with a tractor front-end loader instead of individual trash cans."

ADEM grants have also bought balers for cardboard, collection bins for drop-off centers, larger bins for remote drop-off areas and tilt trailers for easier unloading of materials collected from the beach and brought to the center.

"We can actually dump the material onto the conveyor belts," Hand said. "That has helped streamline the process."

Hand said the more automated the process becomes the more the program can save on labor costs. And, like many private businesses on the island, finding workers to man the center has been a struggle.

"But you have to make investments with the equipment to make that happen," Hand said. "You won't see that investment turned around in a year but it does help when you don't have to have the labor to be able to sort. We have specific equipment and conveyor belts to be able to things a person can do. It's becoming more difficult when the economy keeps getting stronger. The way it is it's hard to find the labor pool because everybody's got a job.

"But we're evolving. The more we can streamline this process of doing it more mechanically instead of the hand sorting, it will get better."

The program runs at a loss but is making back about 30 percent of the cost by selling the materials collected. The pulverized glass is used by Public Works to fill potholes

"Let me put it this way: We make money but if this was a private business we may be bankrupt," Hand said. "On the big scale of things on doing what we're doing and changing perspective and trying to do the right thing, it's working. It keeps the material out of the landfill. On top of it, we're collecting at the beach and that's a cost, the Leave Only Footprints, that's a cost. There's a lot of things in the program we would never get money back for that anyway. Maybe there'll be more aluminum in Orange Beach and we can make up for it."

Councilman Gary Sinak said he believes in expanding the program.

"I think it's good we're taking care of the environment and I think it's important we tried to get involved as much as we can," Sinak said.

In other business, the council discussed a fourth budget amendment, liquor licenses for the Flying Harpoon and Woodside Restaurant in Gulf State Park and paying the county for use of voting machines for municipal elections.

The council also agreed to set a date for a public hearing on rewriting the zoning ordinance on beach access for properties on the north side of West Beach Boulevard.





# Ft. Morgan or bust! Dentons complete Alabama Scenic River Trail

Adventure apparently has no time constraints for cousins Will and John Denton, who decided to make the 650-mile journey along the Alabama Scenic River Trail recently after answering two questions.

"John was just finishing up hiking the Appalachian Trail, so he had the camping experience," said 79-year-old Will. "But, he didn't know if he could paddle that far. I've been kayaking for about 40 years, so I knew I could do the paddling. But I

didn't know if I could sleep on the ground."

Even though John was not an experienced paddler, he was considering a trip down the Mississippi River before Will found a better idea.

"I allowed I had given that some thought, and I might be interested in doing that with him," said Will of the trip down the mighty Mississippi. "About the same time, I found out about the Alabama Scenic River Trail (ASRT), and I suggested we try that first."

The two decided to combine their skills to start the paddle about 4 miles from the Alabama line in Georgia.

The fact that Will's home on Lake Martin wouldn't be that far away should something go awry also contributed to the

decision. Will had only paddled a few miles of the ASRT, Moccasin Gap just below Jordan Dam to Wetumpka, and had no idea what to expect on the rest of the trail.

"Except for Moccasin Gap, it was all new to both of us," Will

Will loaded up his trusty kayak with supplies for the trip while John, 66, opted for a Verlen Kruger vessel, kayak-canoe hybrid. They paddled across the state line and headed down through the six lakes on the Coosa system.

"It took us five or six days to kind of hit a rhythm and find a pace that was comfortable," Will said. "We could paddle about 3 miles an hour with no more exertion than if you were walking. We were comfortable paddling at about the same speed."

The paddlers saw a variety of wildlife during the trip, although Will admitted that John was more inclined to notice because of his passion for hunting.

"John is a big turkey hunter," Will said. "He spent more time looking for stuff along the bank. He would call my attention to some things. Sometimes we paddled side by side. Sometimes we were on opposite sides of the river. We were looking for eagles quite a bit.

"On our (Coosa) lakes part of the trip, we averaged seeing about an eagle a day. By the time we got to Wetumpka and Montgomery, we didn't see any more from there south."

Will said the biggest interest from friends and family he's told about the trip, which began September 1, is the numbers of snakes the duo encountered.

"I saw one cottonmouth and John didn't see any," Will said. "He saw six alligators when we got to the Mobile-Tensaw Delta. He pointed two of those out to me. He saw a bobcat. We heard a bunch of hogs at night. We saw deer, and we saw a lot of fish-eating water birds. Interestingly, we saw more of those in the upper end."

Will, a former public health administrator, and John, a re-

tired farmer from the Mississippi Delta, had only a couple of episodes of difficult paddling during the adventure.

"Really, we had one day on Logan Martin when we had an afternoon trying to get to School Bus Island," Will said. "We paddled into a strong headwind for two or three hours to get to the island, which was a wonderful campsite. It was about our only option to camp on the lower end of the lake because it is all developed down there. Until we got to Mobile Bay, that was the hardest day of paddling.

"When I look back at the pictures I took on the way, the water was as slick and calm as it could be. The water conditions were wonderful."

During the time on the Coosa section, rainstorms popped up all around them, but they encountered only a couple of light showers. It turned out to be the calm before the storm.

"We didn't hardly get the tents wet until we got into the Alabama River," Will said. "We were below Montgomery when we got caught in a storm. The people who had invited us to stay with them that night saw the storm coming and came out in a pontoon boat and towed us back to their house.

The other significant storm the Dentons weathered was during a stay above Claiborne Lock and Dam at the Isaac Creek Campground lock. Fortunately, they had their tents up when the rain started about 4:30 that afternoon.

"It rained hard until about 10:30 that night," Will said.
"When we got up the next morning to go through the lock, that lock drop is usually about 30 feet. But the drop that morning was only 15 feet because the river was already up 15 feet below the dam. We had that extra push all the way until we ran into some tidal situations in the Delta. We made much better time than we normally would have.

"And I really didn't have a problem sleeping on the ground. I guess part of it was we were pretty tired at the end of the day."

The Dentons' routine was to paddle all day and get camp set up in time to eat and be in the tents before the mosquitoes came out in force at dusk.

"We really didn't have a major mosquito problem like John is used to in the Mississippi Delta," Will said. "One time early in the trip, we couldn't find a place to camp on the upper end of Lay Lake. We finally found a creek and went way back up the creek. We finally did find a place and got

our camp set up. The mosquitoes weren't bad at all.

would said the ASRT has identified a significant number of campsites on their website at alabamascenicrivertrail.com that paddlers can take advantage of, including those on the

Bartram Canoe Trail (alabamacanoetrails.com ) in the Mobile-Tensaw Delta.

"One of the things that stands out to me is the Alabama Scenic River Trail Association has what they call river angels, like the Appalachian Trail," he said. "Their names and phone numbers are listed on the website. When we started

working on this trip, some of the ASRT people contacted

some of the trail angels along the way."

Denton said two couples on the Alabama River sent word that they wanted the paddlers to stay overnight with a hot shower, supper and bed at their disposal.

"These couples could not have been nicer," Will said. "The visits were delightful. One lady in Fairhope moved one of our trucks for us, twice. The couple from Selma drove one of our trucks to Fairhope so it would be there when we got there. These are people with knowledge and interest in the trail. It really was one of the neatest things about the trip."

After a rather leisurely paddle on most of the trip, the Dentons didn't realize how they would be tested once they hit Mobile Bay.

"Probably the only uncomfortable moments we had were when we were paddling in the bay," Will said. "Going from Fairhope to the Nelson Shipyard in Bon Secour, we had a dead headwind. I keep my phone on a lanyard around my neck. I got two or three texts that I couldn't answer. If I had stopped paddling to check the texts, I would have been going backwards. I paddled for all I was worth for about three hours. I slept well that night.

"There were a lot of things that I will remember. The difficulty of the last two days was memorable. The only whitewater we had was at Moccasin Gap, but we had whitecaps on Mobile Bay."

On the 34th day of the trip, the Dentons paddled from Oyster Bay to Fort Morgan to complete the adventure. Will said he is proud of the accomplishment, but he doesn't want people to focus on his age.

"I really don't think my age has any bearing on it," he said. "It's a function of what kind of condition you're in. I've got friends older than I am that are in better shape than I am. Some folks tend to slow down when they get to some magic number and don't stay as active. I just paddled 650 miles, so, yeah, I feel good about that. Being gone 34 days, if my wife (Charlotte) had not been supportive, I probably wouldn't have done it. I'm glad I did it. I feel good I did it.

"I would tell anybody who thinks they want to do this trip that they can't do it any younger than they are right now."


