
35th New Year's Day Polar Bear Dip at The Flora-Bama

Coastal Ballet's Kingdom of Sweets Gala a new holiday tradition at Coastal Arts Center

Madame Rio of Coastal Ballet opened her first Baldwin studio in Orange Beach 20 years ago

It is fitting that the initial Kingdom of Sweets Gala, a fundraiser held earlier this month for Rio Cordy's Coastal Ballet Company, was presented to a welcoming community in Orange Beach.

The Coastal Art Center of Orange Beach is located less than a mile from where Madame Rio first established a teaching academy in South Baldwin County 20 years

Currently located in Foley, Madame Rio has been putting young ballet students on stage by producing The Nutcracker at her academy every Christmas season since then, with appearances this year in Foley, Bon Secour and Gulf Shores, in addition to the gala at the Coastal Arts Center of Orange Beach.

"This is my 20th year, and we are as busy as we've ever been," she said. "I pursue this very hard in support of all (dance) schools. We are happy to teach good training where children learn good things. From etiquette to how to move, to self esteem. All the while helping them build healthy bodies.

"Orange Beach gave me my start when I moved here," Madame Rio added. "This community has always been a very special place. Everybody here has been so supportive of me."

Coastal Academy's first footprint in Orange Beach was in borrowed space at (current Orange Beach Mayor)

Tony Kennon's physical fitness business imprint at the Medical Arts Building on Orange Beach Blvd.

"She had no place to set up her academy and I wanted my daughter (Bailey) in ballet," Mayor Kennon said. "We moved the equipment and laid down some linoleum over the floor so the kids could move around, and Rio held ballet classes there two nights a week."

The mayor added that he still sees Madame Rio's influence on Bailey in regards to how to be gracious and poised when she is on stage.

Bailey has represented Baldwin County in Miss Alabama pageants and regularly sings and plays music for audiences all over the state.

Another of Madame Rio's Pleasure Island students, Lauren Bradford, was named Miss Alabama's Outstanding Teen 2017 and was named winner of the 2019 Miss Auburn University Scholarship Pageant.

"I have taught hundreds of students, some of them who are still with me," Madame Rio said. "Lauren and Bailey have both done so much fabulous pageant work. Others have gone to New York for auditions or continued to dance in college. Some have danced professionally. I grow them up."

Madame Rio added that she was very thankful to Desiree Blackwell (CAC director) and her staff for their hospitality. The gala is already on the CAC schedule for 2019.

Next for the ballerina/teacher who trained at the Royal Academy of Dance in London is a collaboration with classical guitarist Peter Fletcher on a production incorporating original music and interpretative dancing that will debut this February. She is also planning to produce a brand new ballet at her academy.

Madame Rio spent time at Juilliard and was a soloist with The Miami Ballet and The Alabama Ballet. She still performs, but Madame Rio's passion is teaching. (She owned two schools of dance while in Birmingham.) She still works with students of all ages who love dancing to classical ballet and jazz.

"I am so happy that I get to do what I love to do," she said. "I'm driven and inspired by those little children. They allow me to look at the world through their eyes. And it is a world that is very colorful and full of vitality."

Madame Rio Cordy's dedication to her students is evident, as is her desire to create for her students a dance experience that develops mind, body and spirit.

The end result is hopefully a deep love of dance, music, art, and learning, in addition to joyful memories that last a lifetime.

"I am in good heath. I still feel creative and I still love to dance," Madame Rio said. "I get to surround myself with great people. I am always getting big hugs from beautiful children that are so honest and true. What could be better than that? I am blessed."







Gulf Shores passes \$70 million budget

Capital improvements total \$22.5 million, include beach parking & streetscapes

Gulf Shores passed its budget for 2019 at the Nov. 26 council meeting and it projects more than \$70.5 million in the overall budget for revenues with expenses set at \$70.2 million.

In the General Fund budget for 2019 – the main operating budget for city services – comes in at \$43.5 million for revenues with \$42.8 million in

expenses.

"We have a constantly improving, dynamic city budget," Finance Director Cindy King told the council during a Nov. 19 work session. "We continue to hone in and focus on the Vision 2025 core values. The bulk of those are directed at continuing to improve transportation, education, health care and ensuring the city's beaches are safe and

inviting."

Also, during the meeting, the council accepted a bid for a new fishing pier and walkways at Little Lagoon Park on West Beach Boulevard (See story on page 46).

King said the budget includes several capital improvement projects and the hiring of 10 new full-time employees and one part-timer. The bulk of those are six for the fire department after the addition of station earlier this year.

"The positions are one police officer, six fire-fighter-EMTs — those are funded with the SAFER grant and they've already been approved by the council," King said. "One Director

of Community and Planning Development, one building and environmental inspector 1 and one traffic technician."

The grant is from the Department of Homeland Security and stands Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response (SAFER). During the three years of the grant, the city will provide 25 percent of the cost to hire six firemen the first two years and 65 percent in the third year. After the third year, the city completely takes over the pay and benefits for the new firemen. The total cost to the city will be about \$394,500 and the federal share will be about \$640,000.

"Fire and rescue, we're seeing more and more increase in calls coming out of Station 4 which is the

Oyster Bay station," City Administrator Steve Griffin said. The council voted to buy the station from the Oyster Bay Volunteer Fire Department in October for about \$190,000.

Griffin said the new planning department position is needed to help marshal making and updating future plans and improvements in the city.

"Planning and zoning when we adopted our Vision plan in 2014 and have done two-year updates to the strategic plan and added a land-use plan," Griffin said. "We just finished the land-use plan and we're in the process of doing the transportation plan. We wanted to pull all those plans together and have a full-time person to do that work and basically take on the responsibility of longrange planning, updates to our zoning ordinances and community redevelopment opportunities down at the beach area and in the Waterway district."

Capital improvements for the city in the 2019 budget total \$22.5 million. Some of the highlights of those are \$800,000 for street resurfacing, \$15,000 for the dog park expansion, \$1.4 million for Business and Aviation Park development, \$500,000 for the Fort Morgan Trail phase three, Coastal Gateway Boulevard improvements of \$6.6 million, walking district parking and streetscapes for \$2.7 million and Gulf Place phase three \$2.6 million.

"The 2019 budget also includes 2 percent for a wage index assessment and merit increases of 1.5 percent for above average to 2.5 percent for the highest performers based on their annual performance reviews," King said.

King said the city has been working for years to build up a reserve and has nearly \$30 million which is 70 percent of the General Fund budget.

"That's unheard of, really," Mayor Robert Craft said. "Orange Beach is like us and they have the opportunity to do something similar but most cities have nowhere close to that. A lot of cities don't have the exposure we have to natural occurrences and events that can cause us to need that money."

King also announced the Finance Department has received more awards for its budget process.

"The city has won for the past eight years since 2011 the distinguished budget presentation award from the Government Finance Officers Association or the GFOA," King said. "The city has worked very hard to prepare the budget book and each year we go back and look over what the GFOA has recommended and the departments have done a great job of linking their departments' goals and outcomes to the council's Vision 2025 key strategies and priorities."

The council adopted the Vision 2025 Plan for Sustainability in 2014 and sets out goals for the city in the areas of better health care, education, Waterway Village District, Gulf State Park Lodge restoration and improvements in the Gulf Beach District.

Also, during the meeting, the council:

- Issued public assembly permits for the Zydeco Crawfish Festival in the Waterway Village District and the associated 5K and one-mile runs which will kick off at 8 a.m. This year's event is set for April 20.
- Issued a public assembly for the Bloody Mary 5K run at Tacky Jacks on Aug. 31, also in the Waterway Village District and same course as the Zydeco race.
- Passed an ordinance giving a nonexclusive franchise to mobile containers company Bin There Dump That to provide collection and disposal of construction and demolition debris in the City.



Gulf Shores close to completing fishing pier/walkway project at Little Lagoon Pass

Gulf Shores awarded a bid to Asphalt Services for \$150,000 to complete a project to build a new fishing pier and add walkways at Little Lagoon Park on West Beach Boulevard that the city has been working to get going for the past few years.

"Several budgets ago we actually started on this project but given the time and duration it takes now to achieve permitting through the Corps of Engineers and the environmental agencies we have just recently received our Corps permit to proceed with this project," Public Works Director Mark Acreman said. "As soon as it was in hand it went out to bid and we were able to receive several competitive bids to construct a brand-new pier."

The actual bid came in at about \$139,000, Acreman said, and the city is not the only contributor to the project.

"This project is going to be funded by multiple sources one of which primarily is an ACAMP grant that will provide \$50,000 in funding," Acreman said. "There's going to be approximately \$70,000 that will be provided through the General Fund. And we'll have \$30,000 provided through the deferred sidewalk account."

ACAMP stands for Alabama Coastal Area Management Program and it is administered through the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. The sidewalk account is generated by developers and builders who contribute to fund in lieu of building sidewalks with their projects.

"They can give us a dollar amount equitable to the cost of building that sidewalk," Acreman said. "We put that into an account so when we have the opportunity to do a communitywide improvement project we'll draw on those funds."

A new sidewalk will be built along Little Lagoon at the new pier site and will connect eastward to a new cottage development currently underway. It will connect to West Lagoon Avenue as well as West Beach Boulevard, Acreman said.

There will be a 16 by 40 deck with seating. The pier itself will start as a five-foot walkway but widen to eight feet after it clears the wetland area on the shore. It will go out 200 feet

Asphalt Services did the improvements at the Waterway Village District in 2013, is currently working on resurfacing city roads and doing work in Gulf State Park.



Baldwin County first hoped to open

the school in the later part of 2019 but

only got one bid from interested contractors. And it was about \$20 million over what the county was expecting to pay. In November the board found a more palatable bid from Sharp, Inc., for \$26 million with a completion date set for August of 2020.

Things Will Smooth Out In A Year

That development threw a lot of things into flux. It's anticipated there will be a portable village on city property across the street from Orange Beach Elementary School to house seventh through ninth grades. Rising 10th through 12th graders are expected to finish at Gulf Shores.

All of these contingencies are still at the mercy of the final separation agreement between Gulf Shores and the Baldwin County Board of Education. Those talks began 11 months ago. A meeting was scheduled for Dec. 17 and State Superintendent Eric Mackey has said he wants an agreement before the fall term ends which is Dec. 19.

Kennon says the longer the agreement is delayed the more negative impact it will have on students in his city.

G.S. Dysfunction Affects O.B.

"We, the City of Orange Beach have pretty much stayed out of the negotiations Kennon said. "But now it's dragging on to the point where it's starting to affect us, it's starting to affect our parents and our children. Enough's enough.

"I don't get why there's a spitting match going on between the county and the city. There shouldn't be. I don't know who's at fault and I don't care. But it's time for them to get this thing settled and let's move on. Time is ticking away."

Lacking an agreement means a lot of the questions parents can't be answered right now. Both parties have been ordered not to talk about the negotiations by Mackey. But Kennon wanted to go ahead and gather a list of concerns and questions from parents.

"We're just fielding all their questions, all their thoughts," Kennon said. "Then what we're going to do is come back and answer the ones we can but at the same time package everything we can and send it to Eddie Tyler so that he can look over it. He's coming back in January with his staff and address those. Hopefully, we'll have a separation agreement by then and he'll be able to address a lot more."

Tab For Arts Center: \$10 Mil

One thing Kennon made clear was he wants the new school and the existing elementary to compete statewide and the city is willing to spend money to help make that happen. Orange Beach donated the land for the school and is going to spend about \$10 million for a performing arts center on the campus.

"The council has been on board 100 percent on anything from a financial position to spend whatever we need to spend to achieve excellence," Kennon said. "Bottom line is the city, Orange Beach, will have about \$23 million in this school by the time it's over with. We'll have as much as the county has in it."

City Wants A Say For Its \$23 Mil

In return, Kennon and other city leaders expect to be involved in making county schools in Orange Beach among the best in Alabama.

"I don't think there's anybody in the state doing a 50-50 match on a school," Kennon said. "I expect to be treated differently, I expect them to listen to our community. The school that we're building is a gem for them to show off."

Playing on the city's afterschool Expect Excellence program, Kennon says the wants exactly that in the schools themselves. And Orange Beach willing to help the county make that happen.

Best In State

"I am not comparing Orange Beach schools to the county," Kennon said.
"I'm comparing Orange Beach schools to the best in the state. If we can't be the best in the state then we have underachieved. Because we have the ability, the financial wherewithal to be the best in the state. No one can hold us back.

"We have to as a community expect excellence, hold our kids to it and hold other parents to it. If we don't demand excellence, if we don't demand that we are the best in the state then we're not going to get it." 968-2000







Sweet Potato Pie

Pastry for single-crust pie

1 Tbsp. granulated sugar

3/4 tsp. cinnamon (divided)

2 Tbsp. butter, melted

3/4 cup eggnog

1 egg

1 Tbsp. brandy or eggnog

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup brown sugar, packed

1/2 tsp. vanilla

2 cups cooked, mashed sweet potatoes

Prepare pastry as directed. Combine the 1 Tbsp. granulated sugar and 1/4 teaspoon of the cinnamon; sprinkle in pastry shell. Bake in a 400 degree oven for 5 minutes. Remove to wire rack. Reduce oven temperature to 350 degrees.

With electric mixer, beat butter, the 3/4 cup eggnog, egg, brandy or eggnog, remaining sugars, remaining cinnamon, and vanilla into potatoes; pour into pastry.

Bake for 50 minutes or until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool. Cover; chill to store. If desired, serve with whipped cream and sprinkle with nutmeg. Makes 10 servings.







NOAA to increase catch limits for Gulf Red Snapper fishery

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has proposed a new rule to increase the annual catch limits and annual catch targets for the Red Snapper fishery in the Gulf of Mexico.

Under the proposed rule, the total catch limit for recreational Red Snapper fishing in the Gulf of Mexico would increase from 6.7 million pounds to 7.4 million pounds.

In 2017, Alabama Congressman Bradley Byrne worked with Senator Richard Shelby and other Gulf Coast congressmen to secure a full Red Snapper season for Alabama's recreational fishermen.

Although total catch limits were reached before the end of the season this year, the full 47 day season has already been approved by the National Marine Fisheries Service for 2019.

Through Jan. 3 2019, the NOAA Fisheries is requesting public comment on the proposed rule. Comments may be submitted online or by mail to Peter Hood, Southeast Regional Office, NMFS, 263 13th Avenue South, St. Petersburg, FL 33701.

"This increase shows exactly what those of us on the Gulf Coast have known for years: the health of the Red Snapper fishery is incredibly strong," Byrne said. "These latest numbers will further drive us to continue fighting for greater state control over the Red Snapper fishery and a full and adequate Red Snapper fishing season." s

Byrne said the extended season is huge for our local fishermen and Alabama's coastal communities.

Our coastal communities will benefit from increased revenue. It is a win-win situation for coastal Alabama. This is how government should work," Byrne
