

### Effort being made to find funds for South Baldwin animal shelter

Ideally the shelter would partner with Auburn Veterinary Referral Center and its students

Å trap, neuter, return program for feral cats in Orange Beach has blossomed into a regional effort to find funding for a new South Baldwin animal shelter, with representatives from Orange Beach, Gulf Shores and Foley are meeting to come up with ideas about how to make that happen.

"There is a serious initiative underway for an all-inclusive animal campus to serve the tri-city area of Foley, Gulf Shores and Orange Beach," read a post in the The Orange Beach Animal Care & Control Facebook page urging followers to contact their local government officials in support of the plan.

Tom Conerly, Orange Beach's animal control officer and volunteer for the OBACCP, said the group is seeking a top-notch shelter and hopes to work with staff and students at Auburn's new educational building on the Foley Beach Express and Gateway Boulevard, formerly County Rd. 8.

"The proposed multi-phase, state-of-the-art campus would be centrally located in close proximity to the new Auburn Veterinary Referral Center," Conerly said. "It would include a true open-admit animal shelter, a centralized stray-hold facility for the three municipalities, overflow stray-hold and sheltering for the South Baldwin County area, a pre-constructed and designated pet evacuation center, an animal clinic and surgery suite to support the campus and the community cat TNR programs in the area, and other companion animal related support facilities."

Gayle McMillan, a volunteer with the Gulf Shores Animal Care and Control Program, said ideally the shelter would partner with the Auburn facility and its students.

"We have been in touch with Auburn to work in conjunction with us so that their techs and those in training can actually have a hands-on opportunity at the shelter," McMillan said. "There' some places where tech students actually live on campus so there might be an opportunity there with dormitory space for the Auburn students to come live with the animals."

Another part of the shelter program would take in animals whose owners die or are no longer able to take care of them.

"To keep old people from having to have their pets euthanized we'd like to offer them a retirement type of attitude for pets," McMillan said. "So, it's really kind of a modern concept that we'd like to build on gradually. We'll start small but have the physical space to expand as this idea gets fully developed.

"We're meeting on the 16th of January to try to determine where the money for the project will come from," McMillan added. "That seems to be the only obstacle. Everybody that Tom and I have contacted, everybody's on board, everyone has a humane attitude toward animals and they realize that this impacts the quality of life if we have dead or roaming animals. We haven't encountered any opposition."

Gulf Shores City Administrator Steve Griffin said the shelter recently taken over by the county in Summerdale is overflowing and another facility is needed

"The animal shelter the county operates now is often at capacity and needs more room for animals," Griffin said. "As we're growing down here we're seeing more local regional needs in South Baldwin County. That's what's been talked about. We just met yesterday and looked at a shelter in Escambia County."

GSACCP President Tobi Waters said the Gulf Shores program got a boost and advice from Orange Beach when it wanted to start its own program in August. Both city councils provided seed money to buy traps and other supplies. Both groups are donation driven and staffed by volunteers.

Since September of 2017, Orange Beach has captured and released about 150 cats. Since starting in October Gulf Shores has neutered 32 cats, two dogs and adopted out 13 cats.

### Six story mixed-use development approved for Surf Style building at Public Beach

City officials are excited that a new development planned for the main beachfront could be the beginnings of a walking district with retail and rental units. The current Surf Style directly west of the Hangout will be torn down and replaced with a sixstory building.

"This creates a retail development on the ground floor that's adjacent to the street and really visually is very appealing," Councilman Jason Dyken said. "With that retail space it gives an activation to the street that I think will set the stage for a walking district down there that will be active and enjoyable to see along with what we've done with the public beachfront and the sidewalks."

Councilman Philip Harris said the building will be constructed with expensive waterproof technology so it doesn't have to be raised above the flood plain.

It is a technique to make a building water tight to floods, therefore reducing the required minimum FEMA Flood Zone building height requirement so a

building can be constructed at grade level," City Planner Andy Bauer said.

Beach road has been a busy place in Gulf Shores for more than a year with new medians, traffic signals, sidewalks and bicycle lanes being developed.

Beach road has been a busy place in Gulf Shores for more than a year with new medians, traffic signals, sidewalks and bicycle lanes being developed. The Alabama Department of Transportation also plans to resurface State Route 182 from Gulf State Park to West Lagoon this year.

Gulf Shores recently completed refurbishing the Gulf Place beachfront

from West Second Street to East First Street in the same area. Work is currently underway on a previously undeveloped lot owned by the city east of the Phoenix All-Suites Hotel. Parking, restrooms, a boardwalk, a police substation and other amenities are planned there with a completion date this spring.

Just across the street to the northwest site work is already underway for an \$85 million Embassy Suites hotel which will have 229 rooms, meeting spaces, retail shops and a rooftop pool and bar overlooking Gulf Place.

The new development for the Surf Style location (pictured) was approved in January of 2018 with a zoning setback variance allowing the new building's footprint to cover 95 percent of the lot. Hangout developer Shaul Zislin asked for and received a conditional use permit for a remote parking lot across the street and to the east of the planned building at the Jan. 14 council meeting.

"I know there have been several variances along the way but in the end, we've got a much better project and a much lower height than what's allowed in there," Harris said.

During the meeting, the council also approved the purchase of a command unit for the police depart-

ment for about \$181,000.

On the new Surf Style building, Zislin said construction is expected to start this year. Hangout Hospitality, which owns three restaurants in Gulf Shores and one in Orange Beach, is also planning on renovating the former Blond John's skateboard shop into Big Blue Pizza. Zislin said there are no definite plans on when they will start. The pizza place also already has approval to use the remote parking lot across the street. Bauer said the lot exceeds the number of spaces required for the condos and the pizza place.

"There will be no parking on their site because they are basically developing their entire piece of property they own which is why the off-site parking being built across the street is important and required to make this project work," Mayor Robert Craft said. "It is a great addition to our community and we have encouraged this to go forward."

Surf Style will have a 10,000-square-foot retail space on the ground floor of the new building and 12 condominiums on floors two through four. Bauer nine of the condos will have three bedrooms and three will have four bedrooms. The top two floors will contain amenities including a rooftop pool and garden and meeting spaces.

Command Unit

Police Chief Edward Delmore said his department has outgrown its current command trailer and with the number of outdoor events hosted by the city he needs a larger and more versatile unit.

"In 2012 we recognized that we needed some type of command post vehicle and we were able to obtain and use a 20-foot tow behind trailer that served us adequately for a period of time," Delmore told the council. "We've outgrown that vehicle and have been searching for a replacement that would be more self-contained, larger and more appropriate for the many events that we host and operate for in the city."

After an exhaustive search, Delmore said one for sale was located in Conroe, Texas, for about \$195,000. He said the price was negotiated down to \$181,000 which includes a new floor in the vehicle and some rearranging of dispatch stations inside.

"The really good news about this particular vehicle is we can purchase this with accumulated federal asset forfeiture funds that we have on hand," Delmore said. "It will not come out of the general fund. We'll get many, many years of good service out of this."

Delmore said the department will keep the trailer and turn it over for use by the dive and special response teams.

In other business the council:

• Agreed to pay Christie Strategy Group \$10,000 per quarter in 2019, plus expenses, for lobbying services in Montgomery.

• Ratified an agreement with Resicum International which will move its headquarters to Jack Edwards National Airport. The company will operate out of the Gulf Air Center but plans to build a 22,000-square-foot facility at the airport. Resicum will pay the city 2 percent of gross revenues provided at or on the airport. Resicum is an aerospace company that works on military aircraft.

• Ratified an agreement with Magniflight for aircraft flight instruction sales at Jack Edwards National Airport. In return, Magniflight will pay the city 2 percent of its gross revenues from flight lessons and one-tenth of a percent of gross revenues from aircraft sales.

• Ratified an agreement with Intensive Air Care Charter Air for air ambulance and air charter services at Jack Edwards National Airport.

• Issued a conditional use permit it Veterinarians Adam and Niesje Langston to put an animal hospital in an existing building at 6642 State Route 59. Adam Langston is the head veterinarian at the Alabama Gulf Coast Zoo and this property backs up to the property where the new zoo is being built.

• Agreed to accept four roads in Martyn Woods Phase II subdivision and rights-of-way improve-

• Adopted a memorandum of understanding with the CoachSafely Foundation to provide all athletic personnel with an annual injury prevention course as required by a new state law passed in 2018.

• Issued an assembly permit for the Big Beach Marathon from 6 a.m.-4 p.m. on Jan. 27. Most of the race is on the Backcountry Trail system and but it will start and end at the Hangout.

• Isued two assembly permits to the Gulf Coast Arts Alliance, one for the Ballyhoo Festival on Oct. 10 in the Waterway Village District and six art markets throughout 2019 at the Gulf Shores First Presbyterian Church and Waterway Village District.

• OK'd a liquor license transfer from One Club Gulf Shores to BAR 45.



## "We are very excited about how we can have this beautiful facility & still protect our environment."

The fanfare that accompanied the official opening of The Lodge at Gulf State Park was unprecedented, a fact affirmed by a pair of experts in the field of lodging and hospitality. With Governor Kay Ivey headlining a long list of dignitaries at the grand opening in October and her return for her inaugural celebration two months later, the buzz surroudning the facility located only steps from the white-sand beaches of the Gulf of Mexico has not abated.

"I asked the head gentleman from Valor Hospitality and the head gentlemen of Hilton Hotels if they had ever been to a ribbon-cutting where there was this much passion, love and energy behind a project," said Malone, Gulf Coast Convention and Visitors Bureau CEO. "They both said never, ever have they seen anything like this."

"I grew up in Gulf Shores. We went to the State Park a lot growing up. So, we were really excited about the completion. I think it's going to be great for Alabama," said Jon Hand, CEO of Electric Cities of Alabama, a group that represents municipally owned utilities that serve about 1 million customers in Alabama.

"To my knowledge, we were the first group to sign a contract with the resort," added Hand. "And, we were the first to sign a multi-year contract. Whenever we can do business in Alabama, we like to do so. Our 35th anniversary will be our first conference at The Lodge."

The Lodge accommodate up to 1,000 people for conferences and conventions with a 350-room hotel that includes 20 suites. The beachview ballroom is 12,160 square feet

with an adjacent 7,500-square-foot outdoor terrace. Several other smaller meeting and conference rooms are available. A Gulf-front infinity pool will have a pool bar and grill. Meanwhile, a Gulf-front restaurant features terrace seating and a private dining room that will serve house-prepared dishes sourced from regional suppliers, including fresh Alabama Gulf Seafood.

The Lodge has been constructed under LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) protocols. The Interpretive Center is pursuing certification under the Living Building Challenge, a designation currently afforded to only 16 buildings in the world.

"We are caretakers of this creation," said Chris Blankenship, Commissioner of the Alabama Department of Conservation. "The sustainable construction and the environmentally friendly management of The Lodge show how serious we are about that responsibility. We are very excited about how we can have this beautiful facility and still protect our environment."

Most of the dignitaries who spoke at the Lodge's grand openin ceremony were able to share memories of cherished family time spent at previous versions of the Gulf State Park Lodge.

"Did you see the suite with the separate room with bunk beds and a TV?" AL Congressman Byrne asked. "I wish they had had those when we used to stay at the park when my children were small. We definitely would have taken advantage of that."

age of that. State Representative Steve McMil-



lan said there were numerous hurdles that had to be overcome to rebuild the lodge after Hurricane Ivan destroyed it in 2004.

"It's better than I ever envisioned that it might be. And one thing most people don't realize is that we came within three days of having to shut down construction while we waited on a court ruling," Rep. McMillan said. "The judge finally ruled in our favor, and here we are today. I never had any idea we would have anything like this. It's just unbelievable."

The resort facilities at Gulf State Park will factor into the economic well-being of the rest of the Alabama State Parks System, said Alabama Speaker of the House Mac McCutcheon.

"When we came for a tour of the construction site, we walked out on the dunes, and I remember my children being there on the edge of the water when they were very, very little. Deb and I made a trip down here, and we stayed at the lodge that was here at the time. That was the first time my children got to feel the sand between their toes and feel the waves wash up on them. We built sandcastles. That was the first time for children who were raised in red land cotton fields to see what it was like to stand on the side of the Gulf of Mexico. That's a great memory."

Ğovernor Ivey echoed the sentiment that the opening of The Lodge has been a study in perseverance.

"There's just no more beautiful place than Alabama's Gulf Coast with the white sand and sparkling waters. That's why I made it my mission to protect this part of the state and grow it," said Governor Ivey. "In 2004, Hurricane Ivan came through and damaged parts of our great state. It also destroyed a very special spot on the Gulf Coast – the lodge. However, in the resilient spirit of Alabama, we find a way to make good out of a bad situation.

"This will be a centerpiece for this area but also for the great state of Alabama. We're located on the doorstep of the Gulf, and this will be a way to show a piece of Alabama to the world."

Ivey said The Lodge's partners, Valor Hospitality and Hilton Hotels, will help make The Lodge at Gulf State Park a world-class destination.

"There is so much to love about this state," Governor Ivey said. "In this area, it's our beautiful natural resources, especially our people. I really want to thank the locals in this area, who year-round, continually welcome visitors to our great state.

Governor Ivey said that more than

20 years ago Mercedes became the game-changer for our automotive industry, and she expects the same impact from The Lodge at Gulf State Park.

"Gulf State Park will be a worldclass place to visit, and it will be the crown jewel of tourism," said Governor Ivey, who presented Gulf State Park Project Manager Tye Warren with a certificate of commendation.

After he was presented with the certificate from Governor Ivey, Warren's young daughter jumped into his arms at the grand opening.

"As I hold my daughter, I will tell you there have been a lot of people who helped raise this place," Warren said. "Thursday night, I listened to Valor Hospitality's CEO talk to 200 employees, and the feelings I had were closure and complete comfort in what this is going to be. And I hope when my daughter marries that I have the same feeling on that day. I feel great about where this is going."

"People from around the world will want to come experience what we have in Alabama," Gov. Ivey said. "I look forward to continued growth in the tourism industry."

### Gulf State Park named Alabama Attraction of the Year

It promises to be a special year for Gulf State Park and its brand new lodge.

Rrecently named Attraction of the Year by the Alabama Tourism Department, The Lodge at Gulf State Park, a Hilton Hotel, opened in November 2018 and just last weekend hosted Governor Kay Ivey's Gulf Coast Inaugural Celebration featuring country music star Neal McCoy.

Conservation Commissioner

Chris Blankenship says the Attraction of the Year designation is a high honor. "One reason the Alabama Tourism Department made this designation is the environmental sustainability the park is embracing," Blankenship said. "Restored sand dunes, a rainwater recycling system and lighting favorable to wildlife are just some of the things that make the park ecofriendly."

The park's 600,000-plus annual visitors have access to an array of recreational opportunities throughout the park's 6,150 acres. Other lodging available includes 11 cottages, 20 cabins and 500 campsites.

In addition to direct access to more than 2 miles of pristine beach, the GSP guest experience includes 28 miles of hiking and biking trails, a nature center, programs about local wildlife, a saltwater fishing pier and a new interpretive center.

Gary Ellis, Director of Community Relations and Administration at GSP, said The Lodge opening is not the end of improvements at Gulf State Park. A Learning Campus is currently under construction and will open later this year.

"The park's many different habitats, such as forest, wetlands, dunes, freshwater and saltwater provide a unique opportunity to provide more educational programs," he said. "The Learning Campus will



host camps and retreats, educational conferences and workshops for all types of groups. Longer term, plans are underway to expand trails and group camping sites."

Gulf State Park consistently receives high reviews on the visitor experience website TripAdvisor.com. Because the park received Certificate of Excellence ratings five years in a row, it was awarded Hall of Fame recognition in 2018.

#### Perdido condo assn. sues to prevent public beach access

Seafarer Condos owners are asking the Escambia County Circuit Court to stop Escambia County from opening new public beach access on Perdido Key, according to a Jan. 3 story in the Pensacola News Journal penned by Jim Little.

The Seafarer Owners Association filed a petition asking the court to reverse the Escambia County Board of Adjustment's decision to approve conditional use of property near the condos for a public beach access site. Thge suit states the County only considered the public access use for the property and not the habitat conservation required for

"They're throwing the kitchen sink at it, but none of it is going to hold any water," Commissioner Jeff Bergosh told the News Journal.

The county bought the land next to the Crab Trap restaurant in 2014 for \$3.1 million, with \$2.3 million funded from a federal grant for habitat conservation for the beach mouse and for public access.

Bergosh told the News Journal he only wants to open the beach property for the residents of Escambia County.

"That's what we voted to do," Bergosh said. "That's what we funded to do, and we've done nothing. And that's been a very comfortable status quo for the residents in that area. They get to enjoy the beach but the rest of us can't. That is going to change.'

He conceded that the county has not done what it said it would do in preserving the habi-

"The only people that are interested in this staying closed are people that are self-interested, Bergosh said. "They're interested in maintaining this area as their own private beach. They don't care about the mouse. That's my opinion. I care about the mouse. I care about the habitat. But I do care about the public access."

Bergosh told the News Journal he believes the property will be open around the Fourth of July.

'We're going to throw a giant party out there the day we open it," Bergosh said. "It's going to be big, and we'll invite the condo owners, too. We'll invite them to come, although I think they'll be pretty upset. They won't want to attend it."

- 1 can (7 oz.) white or shoepeg corn, drained
- 1 tsp. Creole seasoning
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 2 lbs. peeled and deveined cooked small shrimp 3 oz. cream cheese, cubed

In a small skillet, saute onion in butter until tender. In a 5-qt. slow cooker, combine the onion, milk, soups, corn, Creole seasoning and garlic powder. Cover and cook on low for 3 hours. Stir in shrimp and cream cheese. Cook 30 min. longer or until shrimp are heated through and cheese is melted. Stir to blend.
