## 25th Annual Flora-Bama Chili Cook-Off Feb. 2

Let the chopping begin. The 25th Annual Flora-Bama Super Bowl Chili Cook-Off is set for Feb. 2, Super Bowl Saturday. Teams of three can register to work their chili wizardry to win with their version of the best chili and win cash prizes in several divisions. If you don't want to cook, come by, sample the wide variety of dishes and help raise funds for The American Cancer Society and Relay for Life. Cooking begins at 10 a.m., and all you can eat tasting tickets will be sold for \$20. The tasting begins at noon.

Participants must cook at least 4 gallons of chili and supply all cooking utensils, pots, burners, and ingredients. Teams must be willing to eat their own chili, be over 21 and pay the \$25 entry fee - a deal considering the goodie bags include event t-shirts and party favors. Plus, draft beer is free for cooks. The cook-off winner will earn a perpetual trophy and \$100. People's Choice winner earns a perpetual trophy and \$99. There are also cash prizes for second (\$75) and third place (\$50) finishers.

The cook-off usually attracts around 25 teams and last year's event featured 25 teams cooking such delicious varieties as alligator chili, white

chicken chili and Irish green chili.

The American Cancer Society received a check for \$10,500 from the Flora-Bama following the 2018 event. Since the event's inception, the Super Chili Bowl Cook Off has raised more than \$70,000 for ACS.

"The Flora-Bama has strived to give something back to the community that helped them grow and prosper over the last 50 years," said Pat McClellan, co-owner of the Flora-Bama. "We currently raise more than \$150,000 annually through special events we host or sponsor. Often, we target youth groups, but we always keep it local."

#### Power Squadron Boating Safety class set for Feb. 2 in Lillian

Perdido Bay Power Squadron is offering its Boating Knowledge and Safety Class on Saturday, February 2 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Lillian Recreation Park, 33914 Widell Ave., in Lillian. For additional information, call Richard Carson at (251) 980-1536.

Certified instructors from the Perdido Bay Power Squadron provide instruction as a courtesy to advance recreational boating knowledge. The course includes information on getting started, what is needed, required and recommended safety equipment, boating rules to live by, navigation chart overview, and related topics.

The cost is \$50 for student materials and lunch. Student materials include a student manual, graduation certificate, and copies of federal and state rules. Two persons in the same household may share a single book. For those sharing a book, there is an \$8 charge for the additional lunch.

Classes are limited to 16 students. Minimum age is 12, and an adult must accompany anyone under 16. Walk-ins are welcome if space is available. Successful completion of the course meets the basic boating knowledge requirements of most states and territories. Education on Alabama boating law is included in the course and comprehension assessed as part of the course final examination.



Join us for Gulf Shore's newest tradition, Fat Tuesday Pancake Day! Come enjoy pancakes, sausage, hot coffee and great fun. At some point the French decided to call it Mardi Gras which means Fat Tuesday, but pancakes were still the food of choice. The first Mardi Gras celebration in America was in Mobile, in 1703. # Middle and high school principals will remain in Gulf Shores

## Baldwin Co. offered same positions in O.B. to Veazy, McCartney

There was an audible gasp from teachers and other Gulf Shores school staff when they heard who the new principals would be in Orange Beach's new school.

During the Gulf Shores Board of Education meeting to vote for and sign the separation agreement with the Baldwin County Board of Education word came from Bay Minette. Gulf Shores High School Principal Chris Veazy and Gulf Shores Middle School Principal Kyle McCartney would be transferred to Orange Beach.

But not so fast.

On Jan. 28, Gulf Shores Superintendent Matt Akin in a specially called meeting recommended that his board also hire Veazey and Mc-Cartney for the same positions in the new city system.

Gulf Shores School Board President Kevin Corcoran said the pair will be officially hired at the next board meeting, and Akin confirmed that the terms of their contracts would be approved at that meeting.

Baldwin County Superintendent Eddie Tyler said both principals were aware that he was recommending them for these two positions, adding that 42 candidates applied for the middle school job and 39 for the high school job in Orange Beach.

"The newly appointed principals, as of Feb. 1, will be tasked with planning and developing the school from the ground up," Tyler said. "That includes but is not limited to recommending personnel for hire, designing the master schedule, planning extracurricular and athletic activities and events, designing print materials for students, staff and parents, planning and scheduling parent meetings and student orientation, preparing for professional development of staff, and building community partnerships."

The new Orange Beach school won't be finished until the fall of 2020 but the county plans on opening portable village across the street from Orange Beach Elementary School to house

seventh through 10th graders. Also, any students outside of Gulf Shores city limits in grades K through nine will attend school in Orange Beach.

All students who will be 11th and 12th graders in the fall living outside the city limits will be allowed to attend Gulf Shores until graduation. Students in the 10th grade starting this fall have a choice to attend in either Orange Beach or stay at Gulf Shores. Their parents must notify the state superintendent's office by Feb. 1 which option their 10th-grade students will choose.

Gulf Shores Superintendent Matt Akin said he has received more than 30 applications for the three principal openings at newly formed Gulf Shores schools. He could not reveal the names.

"If you're interested in working for Gulf Shores City Schools you can send me your information in an email today," Akin told the educators in the meeting. In addition to the three principal positions, Gulf Shores is taking applications for a schools financial officer.

While Gulf Shores voted for and signed the separation agreement, the Baldwin County Board of Education instead passed a resolution authorizing Tyler to file a lawsuit over part of the separation agreement that gives Gulf Shores \$7 million for the months of June through September of this year. Gulf Shores becomes an independent system on June 1.

"Our disagreement is over money, which belongs to the Baldwin County taxpayers and not Gulf Shores," Tyler said.

Akin said the disagreement is between the state and Baldwin County.

"At this point, I think the dispute is between Baldwin County and the state superintendent, so I think the state superintendent will determine how that works out," Akin said.





## City amps up funding for schools; separation agreement heads to court

Even as controversy swirls over the allocation of funds in the school split between Gulf Shores and Baldwin County, funding from the city for the school system continues to flow.

At the Jan. 28 meeting the city council OK'd nearly half a million dollars to operate the school system from Jan. 1 through March 31. The city will spend at least \$574,000 more during the remainder of 2019 after spending about \$519,000 to help the

new system get started in 2018.

"You have the school board's second request for our fiscal year which began in October," Superintendent Dr. Matt Akin told the council. "You can see in January and February our expenditures are pretty common but we have to start ramping soon."

That will begin in March, Akin said, when the payroll increases through added personnel and the system will

spend \$250,000 on a variety of computer systems. "The reason you see the request goes way up because that's when we'll start bringing on additional staff, administrators," Akin said. "And also, there's

a big expense in technology. We have to buy financial software, student administration software,

computers and that kind of thing."

Meanwhile, the separation agreement is likely headed to court. The Baldwin County Board of Education balked at voting on and passing the separation agreement and instead will file a lawsuit questioning Mackey's move on the money. Gulf Shores' board passed and signed the agreement on

Jan. 1

"The question is still around money, sales tax, ad valorem tax and September payroll," Akin told the city council. "There's disagreement as to how much that is. We think it's a lot lower than the \$7 million amount Baldwin County has suggested."

In published reports, Mackey said he believed the conflict can be resolved. Tyler, however, said the county wants a judge to hear both sides and make

a ruling.

"We are glad to know that the superintendent agrees with us that foundation funds from this school year cannot be provided to a school system which has no students enrolled, but we don't believe that further clarifications from the superintendent are going to solve the disagreement between the parties at this point," Tyler said. "We believe that the better and more expeditious resolution is to take this matter to court, where the parties can continue their negotiations and/or clarifications under the supervision of a judge."

Gulf Shores School Board President Kevin Corcoran said part of Mackey's final draft includes the new system collecting its share of sales taxes earmarked for schools beginning on June 1. He said the amount collected for schools would be about \$40 million June through September with about \$15 million collected at Gulf Shores businesses. The city system is due about \$2 million from that amount, he said.

"The \$2 million is about 11 percent of our total budget," Corcoran said. "For Baldwin County schools that is about .6 percent of their budget."

Tyler believes Gulf Shores is not entitled to the collections.

"There are a lot of issues to disagree with in (Mackey's) letter, but the most glaring is that the state superintendent directs some \$7 million in Baldwin County revenue from this school year to a school system that has no students enrolled for this school year - while also directing us to pay all of the expenses through the end of this school year,"

Tyler said. "Our disagreement is over money, which belongs to the Baldwin County taxpayers and not Gulf Shores."

Akin said most of the money – he doesn't believe the total amount is \$7 million – will be to pay teachers who will be working for Gulf Shores.

"We don't know the exact amount because we don't know exactly how many teachers we will have," Akin said. "Whatever that number is, the state department will determine it and say 'Gulf Shores, here's your money to pay the teachers who were employed last school year and are now employed with you.

"But it is in Dr. Mackey's hands to see how that moves forward. I know he knows the urgency of the situation so hopefully, it will be sooner rather than

later."

In other business the council:

- Approved a line of credit with Bancorp South for nearly \$10 million to be used to help jumpstart city projects.
- Passed a resolution to allow aerospace company Resicum a kiosk in the Airport Administration Building for \$250 a month.
- Ratified contract with Wings and Wheels aircraft detailers to operate at the airport for 12 months and paying the city 2 percent of gross revenues.
- Ratified a contract with Long Bay Charters to operate out of the airport at a cost of \$1.15 per 1,000 pounds of maximum certified landing weight of their planes.
- OK'd the surplus of items owned by Gulf Shores Utilities to be auctioned on govdeals.com.
- Voted to reappoint George Harris to a three-year term on the Board of Zoning Adjustment and move Craig Olmstead from his supernumerary position to a regular member of the Board of Zoning Adjustment. Olmstead will replace Richard Schwartz, longtime owner of Doc's Seafood Shack and Oyster Bar and other restaurants, who is leaving the board after serving 27 years.
- OK'd the transfer of ownership of retired K-9 officer Taz to his handler, officer Shawn Andrews.
- OK'd an assembly permit for the Docs Hot Trot for ARC 5K and one-mile run at LuLu's on June 15.

## Free, walk-in memory loss testing in Orange Beach, Foley & Gulf Shores this month

Free memory screenings and balance testing is being offered in Gulf Shores, Orange Beach this month. The program, with the help and guidance of the Alzheimer's Foundation of America, was started locally in 2015 when 60 volunteers based at GlenLakes Golf Club, organized and began offering TESTING 1, 2, 3 services to anyone who wishes to be tested.

Over 93 percent of those tested have never had a memory test. When the vast majority finds out their memory loss is normal age related memory loss, they are relieved.

During balance testing, seniors are shown simple exercises they can do at home to improve their balance.

Volunteers are all are trained for and experienced in running vents. A Steering Committee oversees every event. That committee includes Debbie Albritton, Lucy Douty, Karen Foster, Paula Long, Carol Rausch, Joan States-Davidson, Sam Strite and Rhonda Vickers.

In addition to holding major events in the Fall (primarily for locals) and in February (primarily for Snowbirds), TESTING 1, 2, 3 will come to any organization which works with seniors and offer its services.

There is never a cost associated with these events and if an organization wants to hold a private event for its residents, members, etc. TESTING 1, 2, 3 will be glad to work with





His recovery went horribly wrong and he spent two months in the NICUS at UAB and USACW. After six months, Clayton began to develop severe scoliosis, and could only receive treatment for that after a few years.

Clayton has continued maintenance treatment for cancer, routine kidney procedures for blockages, and because his scoliosis/kyphosis creates a second curve after his first halo traction and surgery, he had to do a second one this year.

"She truly was a special cat and my heart was stolen from the sound of her very first chuff. Every animal we lose affects me deeply, but Salt's passing has left me completely heartbroken."

Salt was frequently featured, along with Pepper, on the Animal Planet documentary series, The Little Zoo That Could, about the Alabama Gulf Coast Zoo's hurricane survival story. Viewers witnessed Johnson's extraordinary bond with these two beautiful tigers and how integral they were in bringing much needed attention to the zoo's comeback after its destruction by Hurricane Ivan. The first large animals a visitor would see upon entering the zoo grounds, these sisters became known for their outgoing personalities, humorous bickering, and playful antics, attracting fans of every age.

"It's a very difficult time when you

lose a loved one. For almost 17 years I had the privilege of Salt's guardianship," said former longtime Zoo Director Patti Hall, now Director Emeritus.

"From the day she and her sister Pepper arrived, they had everyone's heart. They also became stars on our TV series and people came from all over the world to see them. It was really mind-blowing how much they were adored. Cyndi did an exemplary job in rearing "The Sisters" and Salt will never be forgotten by the millions of zoo fans who experienced this wonderful tiger, nor by the zookeepers who were dedicated to her care."


