Spring season at Blue Moon Farm starts Feb. 17

Music series on Cathe Steele's Silverhill farm has dedicated following

The spring Sunday afternoon concert series at The Frog Pond at Blue Moon Farm starts Feb. 13 at Cathe Steele's family farm in

Part of the Folk Alliance, the series has a list of alumni that includes many of the country's best singer songwriters and a local following that borders on fanatical. Shows usually feature four songwriters taking turns playing orginal songs "in the round."

Set on an outdoor stage under a 200 year old cedar tree, the concerts are hosted by Steele's songwriter friend Grayson Capps. The concerts bring musicians and serious listeners together in an informal but respectful setting. The focus is firmly on the music and there is a palpable community built each Sunday between the artists and listeners. A bring-your-best pot luck is part of each Sunday's event.

"It's a magical place where music is brought back to its roots in a true listening venue where songwriters and musicians alike come together to wood shed and network," Steele said. "Artists have the opportunity to play with others that they would not normally have the opportunity to perform with while sharing fan bases & introducing their music to new ears."

Patrons bring their own chairs and beverages. Patrons must be on the guest list to attend, but securing an invite is as easy as making contact beforehand through the frog pondatblue moonfarm.com or facebook. All proceeds from the concerts go to the performing songwriters.




Fat Tuesday is GSUMC Pancake Day before Gulf Shores parade

Join us for Gulf Shore's newest tradition, Fat Tuesday Pancake Day! Come enjoy pancakes, sausage, hot coffee and great fun. After you enjoy the food, music and fellowship, walk outside with your lawn chairs and enjoy Gulf Shore's fantastic Mardi Gras Parade. Pancake day began in Europe as Shrove Tuesday, a time of confession the day before Lent begins. Lent is observed as a time of self examination, repentance and fasting. The day before Lent was a day to stuff yourself with food in preparation for the days of fasting ahead. Poor people usually had an abundance of milk, eggs and butter on hand (the ingredients for pancakes) so it made sense to eat their fill of pancakes. At some point the French decided to call it Mardi Gras which means Fat Tuesday, but pancakes were still the food of choice. The first Mardi Gras celebration in America was in Mobile, in 1703. Celebrate this tradition Gulf Shores style and join us for the 3rd Annual Fat Tuesday Pancake Day from 7-10 am on March 5th, Gulf Shores United Methodist Church auditorium. G.S. will spend \$284K to study Canal Rd. traffic improvements

Gulf Shores voted to spend just more than \$284,000 to study traffic improvements coming to Canal Road to be paid for with Restore Act

"This proposal is for a comprehensive corridor study to perform this preliminary design work, including coordination with state and federal agencies, analysis of design alternatives, costing and budget development, public outreach, and feasibility studies," Environmental and Grants Coordinator Dan Bond said in a report to the city council. "This preliminary design work will inform and refine the final design work proposal, which will be presented for council consideration once the corridor study is complete."

While the city will pay for the study, design and engineering on the project, Bond said, Restore Act funds will contribute \$21.7 million for improvements on Canal Road all the way to Alabama 161 in Orange Beach.

"This 100 percent grant that will be provided by the Restore Act," City Administrator Steve Griffin said. "The only thing not provided are these soft costs. But this gets us out in front of that project design and have us be the lead."

Volkert will be hired to complete the study and develop a plan to improve capacity on the road concentrating on the portion from East Second Street to where the state's new intracoastal waterway bridge will land on Canal Road between Gulf Shores and Orange Beach.

"Due to the complex nature of many project components, ALDOT has requested that the City manage the engineering and design process, including traffic studies, technical design development, and consideration of environmental, social, and economic impacts," Bond said.

What that final product will look like, Bond said, will be determined by the study.

"The intent of the Restore project is to improve the capacity of that corridor from Highway 59 to Orange Beach, basically," Bond said. "How that happens is what we will get into with this corridor study. There's a lot of things to get into the details on to try to figure out the most efficient and best design from the city's perspective."

On the Orange Beach side, the plan is already in place to four-lane the road from the new bridge all the way to Alabama 161 in the heart of the city. There's been talk of four lanes on the Gulf Shores portion but Mayor Robert Craft isn't sure the roadway can be that wide.

"On the south side it's hard for me to imagine that will be a four-lane area," Craft said. "With the corridor, we have hopefully we can create a

two-lane road with center turn lanes and some pedestrian access on either side. With the right of way we have, it's not wide enough functionally for a four-lane road. Once again, that's to be determined and we'll be back in here talking about

The Canal Road project is just one of several funded by the Restore Act coming to Gulf Shores totaling about \$41 million. Others are \$9.7 million for the Gulf Coast Center for Ecotourism & Sustainability to be built on city land abutting Gulf State Park, \$4.4 million for the Fort Morgan Trail extension and \$5.9 million for the Little Lagoon Restoration Project.

With the government shutdown slowing down disbursement of the money, Craft said getting the corridor study done now will have the city poised to move forward when it is released.

"There will be significant changes on how that works so for us to get our portion of the \$21.7 million is a crucial traffic improvement program," Craft said. "It's imperative that we begin the design process for when the money's available. With Washington's shutdown everything's been stalled but with the Department of Justice is back work and is evaluating projects. We should be getting information about how to proceed quickly so we need to be prepared. This is an important first step in that process."

There will also be improvements to roadways on the north side of the intracoastal waterway and some of that, Craft said, could possibly be four-laned and will connect to the road leading up to the bridge on that side of the waterway.

During the meeting the council also:

 Accepted a master plan for the recreation department put together by Assistant Director of Recreation and Cultural Affairs Matt Young.

- Reappointed Councilman Jason Dyken to another six-year term on the Airport Authority. His current term expired on Jan. 14.
- Agreed to give \$1,000 to the Gulf Coast Arts Alliance to help put on the group's monthly art
- Approved an assembly permit for UAB beach volleyball for a tournament at Gulf Place "March to May" on March 8-10 a preliminary tournament to the NCAA Sand Volleyball National Championships coming to town May 2-4.
- Approved two annexations into the city, one on Skiff Lane and another on County Road 8 or Coastal Gateway Boulevard.
- Approved making Erin Kaiser a member of the Board of Zoning Adjustments replacing Geoff Gaberino who recently moved to Fairhope.


Pictured: G.S. ALDOT road project map.



iginal Downtown Orange Beach gets historical marker



Bay Circle: The Original Downtown

"This area, located along the southern shore of Wolf Bay, was the original 'DOWNTOWN' of Orange Beach. Beginning in the 1870's, the two schooners of James C. Callaway were anchored near here in the deep-water Boat Basin. The schooners were used for importing supplies or exporting products like oranges, shingles, or turpentine sap. They later service the lighthouse beacons in the Gulf of Mexico.

"In 1909, D.R. Peteet bought 3,254 acres here that he called Gulf Bay Tract. He built a shingle mill near the community's vital wharf. The 1920 Schoolhouse was also located here and was used on alternating Sunday's by the Baptist and Presbyterians. In 1953 both built their own churches nearby. The Schoolhouse also served as a community meeting place and a place for the annual Community Picnic put on by the Home Demonstration club. The Club raised enough money to buy the land for a Community Center now located one mile east of here."

Bay Circle: First Orange Beach Post Office

"Elsie E. Diehl was the Postmaster of the first Orange Beach Post Office in 1901, and at a second location in 1921. Just to the west, the Orange Beach Hotel was built in 1923 by Hilda Callaway Dietz. She operated the hotel until the war began in 1941 when the coast was essentially closed to tourists and fishing.

"Just east of here, Captain Dan Callaway's c. 1907 home and summer kitchen are still in use. The kitchen was a store in the 1930s, operated by Emmons Brown. It had gas pumps serving boats and the few cars in the area. In 1937, this became the third post office with Minnie Lee Callaway Brown as Postmaster.

"In 1971, Capt. Dan's home became the retirement home of David DeJarnette, Father of Alabama Archaeology. The Orange Beach Hotel was demolished in 2015 with a new building of similar design built in its place to operate as the Coastal Arts Center of Orange Beach."

The City of Orange Beach unveiled its sixth historical marker during a recent ceremony at the corner of Bay Circle and Canal Road, near Orange Beach Waterfront Park. The Bay Circle marker is the sixth of 10 historical markers that will be part of the city's historical trail (see sidebar). The project is presented in conjunction with the city's participation in Alabama's Bicentennial Celebration.

Margaret Childress-Long, a member of the Baldwin County Historic Commission, led the ceremony and wrote the copy for all 10 markers. She said the project will be completed by early summer and a brochure/map is being composed as a guide for self guided historical tours.

Orange Beach residents Merle Harms and Sally DeJarnette were asked to unveil the plaque. Harms' grandfather, Dan Callaway, and DeJarnette's father, David DeJarnette, are mentioned in the Bay Circle marker.

Before the automobile industry took hold, the bayfront was the city's main thoroughfare, and the Bay Circle area was the original downtown Orange Beach.

"I want to thank my parents for having the good judgement to retire here and find us a wonderful place to come," said DeJarnette. "When they passed away, Jim and I said well, maybe we better just go on down and take care of the home place. So we did."

Following the ceremony, DeJarnette generously presented copies of a book she published using her father's photographs and journal from World War II.

Harms shared a heart warming story about her family history and her ties to Orange Beach. "My father came with one of the dredges that dredged the canal," she said. "And my great aunt who owned the hotel at that time had a party. And he and some of the other workers were staying at the hotel and my mother who lived over here [on Bay Circle] went over there and they ended up getting married. So if it hadn't been for that hotel, I don't know who my father would've been."

School Board unveils design for portable village on OBES campus

Tyler says Gulf Shores reversed its position by retaining principals

Baldwin County Public Schools Superintendent Eddie Tyler, speaking at a school information meeting at the Orange Beach Community Center, said he was surprised when Gulf Shores High School Principal Cindy Veazey and Gulf Shores Middle School Principal Kyle

"Dr. Mackey said, What about contract principals? What do you want to do?' Gulf Shores said, 'They [the county] can have the principals.' I said, 'We'll take them."

McCartney informed him they decided to leave the Baldwin County school system and join the new Gulf Shores city school system.

Veazey and **McCartney** were slated to be the new principals of Or-

ange Beach High School and Orange Beach Middle School, respectively, on February 1. Tyler said he would now dive back into the roughly 100 applications he received for the principal positions with the aim of having a recommendation in front of the Baldwin County Board of Education at its Feb. 21 meeting.

After 43 years of being an educator/administrator, Tyler said, "I can't tell you how disappointed I was when I got those calls last night."

He said there is "no excuse for what is going on."

In his presentation, Tyler showed the language in a proposal that was written by Gulf Shores City Schools as part of the split agreement and submitted to Alabama State Superintendent Ed Mackey.

It reads in part, "Any employment contract involving principals employed as

of the date of this agreement shall be honored by the county board consistent with all of the terms and conditions in said contracts. The city board shall be responsible to select and contract with its own principals."

"To jump on top of that," Tyler said, "We sat in Montgomery with Dr. Mackey right before Christmas. Gulf Shores and their attorneys on one side and myself and some of our folks on the other side. The conversation of principals came up. Dr. Mackey said, 'What about contract principals? What do you want to do?' Gulf Shores said, 'They [the county] can have the principals.' I said, 'We'll take them."

Orange Beach Mayor Tony Kennon said the current situation would not have happened if the roles were reversed. He said a Meet the Parents night was already being planned for the new principals.

"It reveals more of their character than missteps on our part," Kennon said.

Despite the unexpected changes this week, Tyler expressed his steadfast excitement for the new school and the majority of the meeting focused on the county's committment to students in Orange Beach schools with the full support of the city.

The 130,000-square-foot Orange Beach Middle/High School on Canal Road is scheduled to officially open in Fall of 2020. For the coming 2019-2020 school year, the superintendent revealed plans



for the temporary "portable village" that will be a new enclosed modular design that will have hallways and bathrooms. There will be two modular layouts with a seventh and eighth grade building next to the Orange Beach Elementary School, and across the street - on the current green space - a building will be set up for ninth and 10th grade. The building will be fenced and secure and Mayor Kennon said School Resource Officers will be on site.

An official Facebook page for the new school has been set up by Baldwin County Public Schools and future updates will be posted there.




Gulf Shores Fire Rescue earns **Culture of Excellence Rating**




