

Gulf Shores School Board addresses non-resident enrollment policy, hires financial officer

Non-resident students who currently attend Gulf Shores schools as part of the Baldwin County system could be given a chance to stay with the city if there is space, Superintendent Matt Akin (bottom) said. Tuition is expected to be a part of that policy.

The board addressed non-resident policy at a March 7 work session. During a special called meeting before the work session the board hired Chad Green (top) as the Chief Schools Financial

Officer.



"There is the clause in there that gives priority to students who do have logistical hardships," Akin said. "A specific example would be a student who lives in Fort Morgan who has to come all the way through Gulf Shores could apply under that part of it. That would be the most extreme example because they are the furthest distance from any school. To the west is a unique situation and that's what we're trying to address."

Their options could be limited, however, by availability classroom space. And, positions will be made available only after any full-time staffers who live outside the city's children are placed.

"At the end of the day it's still going to depend on ca-pacity and in what grade level will we have

room," Akin said.

First in line, he said will be those teachers and staff members.

"We really tried to be as fair as possible and that's why we went the route of setting priorities," Akin said "Really the number one priority is going to take care of those full-time employees, full-time teachers who live out of district and whose kids come to school here. We certainly want them to be allowed to bring their kids."

Any 2019 incoming 10th, 11th and 12th graders who live out of district are covered by the separation agreement, Akin said. They will be able to attend and finish at Gulf Shores High School and not pay out-of-district tuition.

Questions have arisen about year-to-year capacities and if out-of-district students would lose their classroom spot as the in-district student population grows.

"The latest concern that had come up was if I enroll out of district can you guarantee my child will be there for the remainder of his K-12 career?" Akin said. "So, if I enroll as a third grader

is he going to be accepted again as a fourth

grader?

"That's a difficult question to answer not knowing how capacity is going to look. What we changed or what we added was a priority if you're enrolled out of district, you would have to reapply every year but you would have first priority if they have space."

The proposed policy, available as part of the agenda on the city's website, mentions tuition several times but what the cost has yet to be set.

"It says we can charge tuition," Akin said. "When they approve the policy that would be the next step to decide. It hasn't been approved so I can't say yes, we're charging it. But I'm confident that we will charge it for this coming school vear."

Financial Officer Hire

Green took over at Satsuma for Jean Mc-Cutcheon who was the CSFO when Satsuma separated from the Mobile County system. McCutcheon served as consultant for Gulf Shores during separation negotiations with Baldwin

"She was retiring and she brought him in and trained him," Akin said. "He's been there for the last year and a half. That's certainly an advantage. He's got experience in a very similar size system and all though he didn't start it up he's trained by the person who started it. We're really excited about Chad."

Green is a graduate of Huntingdon College where he attended on a full academic scholarship. He previously worked for Hartmann, Blackmon & Kilgore in Fairhope from 2014-17 as a senior auditor and at Draffin & Tucker, in Albany, Ga., from 2012-14 as an associate I and II



History of St. Patrick's Day

Born in Roman Britain in the late 4th century, St. Patrick, patron saint of Ireland, was kidnapped at the age of 16 and taken to Ireland as a slave. He escaped but returned about 432 to convert the Irish to Christianity. By the time of his death on March 17, 461, he had established monasteries, churches, and schools. Many legends grew up around him-for example, that he drove the snakes out of Ireland and used the shamrock to explain the Trinity. Ireland came to celebrate his day with religious services and feasts.

It was emigrants, particularly to the United States, who transformed St. Patrick's Day into a largely secular holiday of revelry and celebration of things Irish. Cities with large numbers of Irish immigrants, who often wielded political power, staged the most extensive celebrations, which included elaborate parades. Boston held its first St. Patrick's Day parade in 1737, followed by New York City in 1762. Since 1962 Chicago has coloured its river green to mark the holiday. (Although blue was the colour traditionally associated with St. Patrick, green is now commonly connected with the day.) Irish and non-Irish alike commonly participate in the "wearing of the green"—sporting an item of green clothing or a shamrock, the Irish national plant, in the lapel. Corned beef and

cabbage are associated with the holiday, and even beer is sometimes dyed green to celebrate the day. Although some of these practices eventually were adopted by the Irish themselves, they did so largely for the benefit of tourists. (From Encylpaedia Brittan-



Fun times for McGinnes & company on March 17

Å bagpiping contingency led by the nephew (Neil McGinnes) of St. Patrick's Day Walking Parade grand marshall Bill McGinnes will lead the annual Gulf Shores St. Patrick's Day Walking Parade, which will depart from the Papa Rocco's deck at around 9:30 a.m. on Sunday, March 17 for an annual song filled stroll to various downtown Gulf Shores watering holes.

Sponsored by McGinnes, owner of Papa Rocco's (one block north of the beach on Hwy. 59), the parade of pubs will also feature Kevin Wisehart, Michael Wood and James Stewart playing pipes when the time comes to call the troops together and move the party from Papa Rocco's to The Flying Harpoon to Mudbugs to The Steamer to Desoto's & Crazy Donut to The Hangout to The Pink Pony to Gulf Island Grille to Hooters.

The crawl ends around 2 p.m. at Mikee's. But by then most of the

crowd will have been left behind to eat a meal or sip an extra libation at one of the other stops.

The Dublin Down Irish Band will be at Papa Rocco's from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. and The Hangout will have live music from three bands (Kilted Kings, Magic Johnsons and Pop Fiction) beginning at 10 a.m. Desoto's will offer corned beef & cabbage on the menu that day.

"This started as a way to give the local restaurants a jump on the season," McGinnes said. "It's gotten a lot bigger since then. But I'm expecting the biggest crowd yet with it being on the weekend. I've already had a lot of calls.

"People come from all over Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana. Our snowbirds love it. And we get some spring breakers. We even have grandkids of some of the originals coming out with us," McGinnes added.

Butch Nichols and Lindy Harris are the original parade flag carriers, a job they proudly held even before McGinnes took over as grand marshall in 1989. Others have picked up the flags in recent years.

McGinnes continues to proudly carry the lead stick and even applies

for an official parade permit from Gulf Shores City Hall every year (ordinance 367. Section 5).

"We want to make sure the police know what we are doing. But we are not sure what we are doing besides having fun," McGinnes said.

The Green Horde is easy to find, as The crowd takes over the grounds at every stop.

The 2019 parade will be the second since the passing of original parade bagpiper, Jocko McClain.

Jocko, who passed away in August of 2017 at his home in Canada, and his legacy as the parade's pied piper goes back to the 1970's.

His spirit will always be at the heart of the event and remains as much a part of the parade's fabric as cold beer, green hats and Jameson's, McGinnes said.

"We met at the American Legion and we immediately sat down and killed off a bottle of Irish whiskey between us," McGinnes said. "We started talking about Scotland and The Rangers and it was like we had known each other for years."

McGinnes said he has learned to pace himself over the years.

"There were a couple of years when I hitched a ride back to Papa Roccos,

but I don't do that anymore," he said. Vince Murphy founded the walking parade and was first to carry the grand marshal baton, with Jocko beside him playing his pipes, in the mid-1970's.

Murphy, who at that time owned The Pink Pony, passed the baton to local character John Kelliher, who led the swarm behind Jocko into Papa Rocco's just after McGinnes opened his restaurant in 1984.

Kelliher, The Colonel to his friends, deemed McGinnes worthy of the grand marshal's position in 1989.

Ron David has been gathering friends to participate in the parade for more than 20 years.

The Orange Beach resident, a retired Colonel with two tours of Vietnam behind him, parades with members of his carnival krewe, The Treasures of the Isle.

"It's a great way to put on something green and march together and drink together with my TOI friends. "Bill does a great job. It brings in people from all over the world. It's come a long way since we moved here, and it just keeps getting bigger," David said.



City will establish areas for people who like to use pop-up tents for shade Signal may be added at East Second St. with access to new Gulf Place addition

Gulf Shores is going to study whether a traffic light will be needed at East Second Street and the entrance to the new Gulf Place project directly across from it.

Beachfront development and new rules for city beaches was a big topic at the March 11 city council meeting including designating an area for pop-up tents at Gulf Place.

"A couple of months back the city purchased this 100foot wide piece of property which is due south of East Second Street on the beach highway," Public Works Director Mark Acreman said. "It is contiguous to where our Gulf Place Project phase three is under construction. What this allows us to do is actually modify the existing project and provide a turnout that will actually align with East Second Street."

Gulf Shores hired traffic engineering firm Skipper Consulting to study patterns there to see if there would be enough traffic flow to justify a signal.

"When you add a turnout to an intersection it's my advice that we perform a warrant analysis to see if a signal will be required at this intersection," Acreman said. "This warrant analysis will not only identify the traffic impacts at this intersection but the proposed pedestrian impacts as well."

Acreman said the new beach access area will attract residents and vacationers on the streets north of the intersection behind Gulf Island Grill and Hooters.

"There's a large number of residential rental homes north of this area and now with the public beach being available with restroom facilities, the police precinct and additional parking we expect the pedestrian demands at this intersection to increase substantially as well as the traffic demands," he said. "If it does meet warrant at a later date, I can propose to you guys a professional services agreement to design the actual sig-

Results of the study will be presented to the Alabama Department of Transportation which must give final permission for a new light since beach road is a state

"ALDOT makes us do these warrant analyses in order to justify the light," City Administrator Steve Griffin said. "Not just for the vehicles but the pedestrians as well. It was very fortuitous for the council to authorize the acquisition of this property because it does line up with East Second Street.'

Before the extra property was bought the only entrance to the new phase was on the west end and was a right-in and right-out only access.

Even to have it without the traffic signal to have that exit there is going to be important," Mayor Robert Craft said. "If it doesn't warrant out initially it will later as it gets busier on our beach areas. It's a good addition to the city and we're excited about it.'

Beach Tents

With the addition of the 100-foot lot to Gulf Place as a whole, Director of Recreation and Cultural Affairs Grant Brown said the ordinance regarding regulations there will have to be rewritten to include the new acauisition.

"The current ordinance calls out the entire Gulf Place but does not include that additional 100 feet," Brown told the council. "That's important because there are certain regulations that pertain to Gulf Place."

One of those involves pop-up tents people like to use for shade. They are currently not allowed on any of the city-owned public beaches. A new proposal would allow the tents in areas to the far east and west of Gulf Place so they won't block the view of the Gulf from the boardwalks and restaurants there including the Hangout.

"We feel like since we do have a tent line established throughout our high-density condominium district that does allow those 10-by10 shade canopies its confusing to the people who come to the public beach areas," Brown said. "When they get there the shade is set up and unfortunately, we have to have them take it down. Now we can say you can't have it here but you can take it there."

Craft said he would like to see a trial run on the tents before fully committing to change the ordinance.

"Is it possible for us to do this as a one-year test and then revisit this next year?" Craft asked. "Let you get through a year and see if it creates more problems than it solves. I think it would be wise for us to approach it that way and make sure we don't go back to the problems we had in the past."

Another change included making glass illegal on the beach everywhere in the city on the sand. Currently, it is only banned on public beaches. Others include allowing dogs on leashes at Gulf Place but not on the beach itself, banning tobacco and e-cigarettes from all beaches in the city, allow for ADA motorized vehicles and establishing a tent line throughout the city using the city's recycling and trash can stations.

During the meeting, the council also:

• Awarded a contract worth \$42,300 to Slavin Management Consultants from Norcross, Ga., to study the city's current job classifications and compensation. Craft said with a dwindling workforce the city needs to be more competitive to attract better candidates when hiring for openings or adding staff.

- Award bids to three companies for vehicle emergency equipment. None of the companies met the bid specifications for all three items so it was decided to bid out to the three individual companies on certain items on which they met bid specifications. Dana Safety Supply was the winner in a \$21,000 bid, Emergency Lighting by Haynes for \$2,600 and Richard Communications for \$10,500.
- Agreed to hire Southern Engineering Solutions to inspect bridges and box culverts in the city for \$10,000. The Alabama Department of Transportation requires these inspections every two years.
- Awarded a contract for a new roof on City Hall to Amerson Roofing from Atmore at a low bid of about
- Awarded an assembly permit for the South Baldwin Women's Club for a Gulf Shores Goes Pink event at Fire Station One on Oct. 1.
- · Awarded an assembly permit of the Gulf Shores and Orange Beach Tourism Sports Commission and the city for the return of the NCAA Sand Volleyball National Championships on May 2-5 at Gulf Place. Set up will begin on April 28.
- Appointed Richard Lamar and David Stewart to fill the open supernumerary positions on the Board of Zonings and Adjustments to replace Erin Kaiser and Craig Olmstead who were both appointed to regular positions on the board.
- Appointed Edgar McKee to a six-year term on Airport Authority to replace Randy McKinney, who chose not
- Reappointed Linda Bender to a three-year on the Beautification board. Her current term expires on April 9 and she has agreed to serve another term.
- Reappointed Randy Kaiser to a three-year term on the Personnel Board. His current term will expire March 27 and he has agreed to serve another term.

Another Dollar General store coming

If history is much of a teacher – and very recent history – then Orange Beach is about to get its fourth Dollar General store and the second on Canal Road.

"They don't label it as a Dollar General," Orange Beach Director of Community Development Kit Alexander said. "It's a retail store by the Broadway Group."

The Broadway Group is on the Orange Beach Planning Commission agenda for March 11 asking for site plan approval for a 9,100-square-foot store at 26763 Canal Road.

Every new Dollar General store in Orange Beach – three new ones – and the new one in Gulf Shores all had the same inauspicious beginning. The Broadway Group, a real estate company headquartered in Huntsville, would apply for a site plan approval for a "retail store" and when all was said and done a Dollar General was sitting there.

"You could possibly say that a retail store has been submitted by the group that has historically built Dollar Generals in Orange Beach," Alexander said.

The property owned by the Broadway Group is due west of Bear Point Plaza and across the street from The Keg Bar and Grill. It is bounded on the north by Magnolia Avenue. Alexander said the city will likely require no interaction with Magnolia from the new store.

"Staff is recommending that there be no access to the residential street to the north," she said. "We don't want any trucks causing a problem for those residents. And were' going to be asking for a fence along that whole northern property line to prevent impacts to that residential neighborhood. We don't want them to have that negative impact on that street."

In July of 2017, the city council balked at the latest Dollar General built just north of the city hall complex on Alabama 161. The developers were asked to come up with a more coastal design for the exterior. Several council members also expressed concerns about the traffic and closeness to a neighborhood. It was tabled in the meeting.

The store finally gained approval and the council's traffic concerns were assuaged. In August of 2018, the council OK'd a liquor license for the new location. It replaced the Dollar General in the WalMart shopping center. A Souvenir City recently opened in that old location.

Other Dollar General stores are located on the north side of beach road on the west side of town and on Canal Road across from J&M.



Drilling begins for new Orange Beach bridge

Barge-mounted drill rigs are being deployed from Barber Marina to begin drilling for geotechnical assessment in the locations of the proposed Wolf Bay Bridge support piles. Drilling commenced on the north side of the Bay on Feb. 27 and will be operational 24 hours a day on weekdays only. Drilling is anticipated to continue for approximately one month. As the drill rigs move to the southern shore of Wolf Bay, noise impacts will be assessed and the activity limited to daylight hours, if necessary.

The City of Orange Beach will use bed tax funds to pay for a free bridge over Wolf Bay. Projected revenue from a two percent increase in the lodging tax is expected to generate \$5-\$6 million per year from the city's condo row. Those funds will also pay for other road and traffic congestion improvements in the city, as well as beach renourishment (\$20M) and ongoing Perdido Pass dredging (\$5M) projects. The estimated cost of the Wolf Bay Bridge is \$40 to \$60 million. It is scheduled for completion in 2020.

The bridge will cross the Intracoastal Canal directly north of Hwy. 161 and cut through parcels of land owned by the Lorenz and Barber families. It will connect to County Rd. 95, where traffic can either proceed north to Hwy. 98 or west to the Foley Beach Express. The State of Alabama is planning to build a bridge about a mile and a half west of the Foley Beach Express Bridge, also with a 2020 target completion date.

While the Orange Beach schools do receive funding from Baldwin County for athletics and band, those dollars are earmarked for transportation. Funding for programs beyond these needs must be raised within the community.

"We understand that most of the funding for our new schools' extracurricular programs would be provided by the community. Because of that, we wanted to get an as early start as possible," said Ryan Long, MAAAC president.

"Because the new middle and high schools are actually the first in Orange Beach, the extracurricular programs are starting from scratch which is large undertaking on its own," he added. "The City of Orange Beach has been and is committed to play a vital part in our children's success. Not only has the City of Orange Beach created the Expect Excellence Program, which is one of kind, but they have also committed to matching every dollar MAAAC raises up to \$150,000, which is unprecedented."

MÁAAC Arts and Band Representative Jessica Langston said wonderful plans are in the works.

"We're so excited to form this organization," she said. "We want our students to start out with firm financial support for extra-curriculars. We want to show equal attention to academic clubs, arts and sports so that our children have every opportunity for a well-rounded school career and a culturally-enriched life."

Fisher's on Southern Living's top 10 restaurants in South list

Describing the Orange Beach restaurant as a "dockside treasure," Southern Living Magazine placed Fisher's at Orange Beach Marina in the No. 10 slot of its recently released list of The South's Top 10 Restaurants.

Fisher's was the only Alabama restaurant on the list, which included New Orleans' institution

"I often describe Fisher's as a house where Upstairs is the nice, fancy dining room and Dockside is the kitchen with kids running around with wet bathing suits, and everyone feels comfortable just as they are."

Commander's Palace in the top slot for the third time.

"I was just doing a count of the other restaurants on the list and Commander's, Joe's Stone Crab and Berns (Steak House) represent 308 years of being open as restaurants between them. We are going into

our 7th summer." said Fisher's owner Johnny Fisher. "That's hard to fathom. Pretty amazing."

The magazine relied on its South's Best survey to compile the list. "The results prove that our readers are the most passionate about restaurants that speak to a sense of place not just in the dishes listed on the menu but in the ambiance of the space, the attention to detail, and the sourcing of ingredients," wrote Hannah

Hayes in her introduction to the

Fisher said it is the fourth time his restaurant has been on a Southern Living "Best" list in the past six years, earning spots on the magazine's top 100, top 50 and top 35 lists previously. This is the second year Southern Living has pared the list to 10.

"Top restaurant lists are a dime a dozen, but this is pretty cool because it's from a prestigious magazine and it was based on a readers' poll," he said.

Fisher said he hit a homerun when he made Chef Bill Briand his first hire, but this was s team award.

"Bill was my first hire and the keystone to it all," he said about the three time James Beard award nominee. "How often does that happen? I know I got lucky there. But this was more of a team thing. The whole ambiance we create plays into it between dockside and upstairs. Rather than just the food, I think it's about the overall vibe."

About Fisher's, Southern Living stated: "While there is a time and place for a beachside basket full of fried shrimp and overdressed coleslaw, the treasures of the Gulf find a home benefitting their glory at Fisher's. The upstairs-downstairs setup here might imply pomp above and party below, but executive chef Bill Briand lends complexity to the casual dockside dishes downstairs and expert simplicity to the specialties served in the dining room upstairs (like hyper-local Bon Secour oysters that sail over garlic-leek butter). Either floor makes for a dreamy cocktail-sipping perch, where you can gaze out on the secluded but bustling Orange Beach Marina."
