

Gulf State Park Pier shark fishing season reopens March 31

The Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources' permitted, managed shark fishing season at the Gulf State Park Pier reopens this Sunday. The first two managed shark fishing events will take place on the south end of the pier – called the octagon – from 7 p.m. Sunday, March 31, until 7 a.m. Monday, April 1, and from 7 p.m. Tuesday, April 2, until 7 a.m. Wednesday, April 3. The remaining events take place on most Sundays and Tuesdays from April through September. A complete list of dates is online at alapark.com/shark-fishing. The angler registration process has been improved to provide both primary and alternate selection date options.

The octagon will close to routine use 30 minutes prior to these events and reopen to routine use 30 minutes following them. During the events, the octagon area of the pier will be designated for the exclusive use of the participating shark anglers and their designated assistants. The remainder of the pier will be open to anglers and other pier guests as normal. The managed shark-fishing events will allow for 15 anglers per occasion, with no more than one rod and reel per angler in use. Each angler may have one assistant. This allows for a maximum of 30 individuals on the octagon area during each event. Anglers are encouraged to

assist one another while fishing.



Énjoy Elberta's famous German sausage and sauerkraut, plus continuous entertainment, and 250 arts & crafts booths.







Gulf Shores & Baldwin County finalize terms of school split

Although it was often acrimonious to the point of being baffling when you consider how many precedents have been set (71 city school systems) in the state, The City of Gulf Shores and the Baldwin County School District have finalized all matters to complete Gulf Shores' transition to an independent school system beginning June 1. Gulf Shores City Council voted to take charge of its schools back in September of 2017.

State Senator Chris Elliott and Gulf Shores Mayor Robert Craft led negotiations between the parties since the filing of a lawsuit by Baldwin County following a ruling from State Superintendent Eric Mackey. Baldwin County will withdraw its lawsuit and Mackey will rescind his ruling.

"We settle things better here among ourselves than we do in Montgomery. That was part of the problem. It was time for the state superintendent to step back. There were politics getting caught up in this that did not need to be involved in the conversations," Elliott said.

The BCSD claimed Mackey's original ruling was unprecedented, forcing Baldwin County to pay \$7 million in start up costs to Gulf Shores, according to the BCSD.

The County maintained that Mackey's ruling would not only wreck havoc with its 2019-2020 budget, but encourage more breakaways around the state.

"The money would have been taken away from what was already budgeted in the 2019 fiscal year," BCSD Superintendent Eddie Tyler said.

"What would we have to do, as a school system of close to 32,000 students, had we had to handle proration in the middle of the school year. That was a concern. Through the settlement, it is not a concern," he added.

In an attempt to keep the State of Alabama out of the fray, Mackey had originally implored the two sides to independently build consensus on the specifics of the split by October, 2018.

"After meeting with the parties on December 2018 there was still no amicable solution," Mackey said in a statement. "I even hired a third-party mediator, but unfortunately the parties again failed to execute an agreement."

Mackey added that since both school boards and superintendents have finally signed off on terms of the separation, he was withdrawing the final order he issued on Feb. 5.

"With the impending need for the community to know when and where school will begin next year, moving ahead with the business of educating children is a huge step in the right direction," he stated.

Final Terms of Gulf Shores - Baldwin Co. School Split

Below are the final terms of the Gulf Shores City Board of Education and Baldwin County Board of Education agreement to settle the pending lawsuit and complete Gulf Shores' transition to an independent city school system on June 1, 2019.

Separation Agreement Terms

- The County will continue to pay all existing debt obligations associated with Gulf Shores Schools until December 1, 2024 estimated at \$2.85 million
- The County will receive all countywide sales taxes until October 1, 2019 estimated at \$1.8 million.
- The County will pay all payroll obligations for positions assigned to Gulf Shores Schools through the end of the current contract period, not later than until September 1, 2019.
- Both systems will transport their respective students.
- Both systems agree to cooperate to resolve any personnel matters fairly and equitably.
- All equipment, materials, supplies, and other personal property will remain in Gulf Shores Schools.

Gulf Shores will revamp traffic flow for start of its first school year

During a recent meeting that has been described in the media as a "lovefest' in front of more than 400 parents, Gulf Shores School Board members and Superintendent Matt Akin presented on campus improvements that will be in place when Gulf Shores officially opens for business when classes resume this August.

In addition to moving a total of five current portable classrooms and eliminating three others, the city will make major changes to the traffic routes parents use when dropping off and picking up children. T



hose plans include a traffic circle that will loop south of the elementary school. Elementary traffic will use the East 16th Ave. entrance to the campus while middle school traffic will enter and exit from East 15th Ave. It is hoped that the new traffic patterns will eliminate traffic buildups on East 2nd St.

Bus traffic for the Gulf Shores elementary, middle and high schools will enter and exit on Dolphin Ave. By the time classes start, 95 parking spaces will be added at the high school and a new teacher parking lot will be built on the site of the elementary school playground. The playground will be moved into the interior of the campus.

New security measures at the campus will include walls and fencing at the elementary school which will limit access to the campus. Additional security cameras (monitored by the Gulf Shores Police Dept.) are will also be installed.

In addition, the city will give a new look to its entry ways (new logo pictured) that will incorporate its new logo and slogan - "Makin' Waves."

The city will also install rain canopys at its drop-off stations. A majority of work is expected to be completed before August and cost between \$5 million to \$7 million.

As reported earlier, Chad Green, the former chief financial officer at Satsuma City Schools, will begin serving in a similar capacity in Gulf Shores on April 1 and Gulf Shores High School Principal Cindy Veazey and Gulf Shores Middle School Principal Kyle McCartney will remain in those positions. The city is in the midst of interviewing applicants for the elementary school principal's position.

The City also introduced the Dolphin Foundation for Education and Arts as a community fundraising arm

similar to the Makos Academics, Arts and Athletics Club recently formed in Orange Beach.

"It's really nice as a superintendent to see how excited the community is," said Akin. "It's an exciting time for us."

Options For Fort Morgan students

The new Orange Beach school won't be finished until the fall of 2020 but the county plans on opening a portable village across the street from Orange Beach Elementary School to house seventh through 10th graders. Any students outside of Gulf Shores city limits in grades K through nine will attend school in Orange Beach.

All students who will be 11th and 12th graders in the fall living outside the city limits will be allowed to attend Gulf Shores until graduation. Students in the 10th grade starting this fall have a choice to attend in either Orange Beach or stay at Gulf Shores.

Students from Fort Morgan, who would otherwise have to travel through Gulf Shores to Orange Beach to attend a county school, will be able to attend Gulf Shores schools on a space available case.

"We set the policy and we set tuition. It will be \$1,500 for the first student and \$1,000 for subsequent students within the same family," said Akin, adding that the amount was based on county revenue which will Gulf Shores will not receive from its students living outside

"When I say county revenue I mean county property tax," Akin said. "If a person lives in Fort Morgan, his parents would pay \$1,000 in property taxes, approximately, that would go to the county which we'll never see in Gulf Shores. That was the starting point for how much tuition do we charge."

"These two endeavors at the University of South Alabama are the kinds of investment in the future that we envisioned when we created the Science of Conservation, and we are excited about what they will produce."

The University of South Alabama's Marine Science Student Benefit Fund helps cover expenses encountered by graduate students as they travel for their research and attend/present at conferences, as well as other costs associated with work necessary for their advanced degrees.

"It allows us to fund a diversity of thesis and dissertation topics, from basic oceanography to fisheries ecology," said Dr. Sean Powers, Chair, USA Marine Sciences. "The fund gives a tremendous return on investment. From modest grants of \$1,000 to \$3,000, graduate projects can be completed and careers made."

CCA Alabama's donation to the cobia tagging program will help fill in the blanks on cobia migration routes to and from the Central Gulf of Mexico, as well as their discard mortality when caught and released. The project will use MiniPAT Tags that are a combination of archival and ARGOS satellite technology. It will allow researchers to track the movements and behavior of a fish that does not spend enough time at the surface to allow for use of real-time ARGOS satellite tags. Updates on the findings will be made available to the public as the data becomes available.

"Cobia are amazing fish, and their great ability to migrate coupled with their very rapid growth make it a wonderful, but challenging species to study," said Dr. Powers. "With the assistance of CCA Alabama, we will be able to tag five fish with tags that will give us information on migration and discard mortality."

CCA Alabama's conservation efforts are funded in part by local chapter banquets across the state and from proceeds from the Saltwater Fishing CCA AL license plate sales. "We couldn't have done this without the hard work and dedication of our members from across the state," said Blakeley Ellis, CCA Alabama Executive Director. "Projects like these are exactly what CCA Alabama is all about."



G.S. awards 10-year franchise to bring fiber networks to homes beginning with Craft Farms North

In the past, companies wanting to bring in internet or fiber service to Gulf Shores had their eyes on the bigger prizes for business.

"I know in the past we've had providers that wanted to come into the community and they make a lot of promises but then they focus their attention on the high-intensity beach condo developments because that's where they get the most bang for their buck," Councilman Jason Dyken said. "Then the single-family residents are kind of left out in the dark."

A new company seeking a franchise with the city will come with a different viewpoint, Economic Development Coordinator Blake Phelps told the city council on March 18.

"Condos or the beach has not come up at all in any of our conservations over the last eight to 12 months," Phelps said. "They have been solely focused on residential. They see a niche, they see an opportunity and quite frankly a little bit of a void in the market."

On March 27 the council voted to give Point Broadband a 10-year franchise to bring fiber to homes to Point Broadband. The city will receive 5 percent of the company's gross receipts to operate in the city.

"Point Broadband is one of those providers we've worked with over the past couple of months and they are prepared to come in to provide fiber to the home and residential internet service," Phelps said "That will be their number one priority. They also have the desire to expand within some business areas as they grow as well."

Phelps said the company will not be involved in cable or phone service, just offering up to one gig of service for internet only.

"What they are offering are speeds up to one gig and their plan between \$70 and \$150 a month with no contract. It's very competitive pricing and very competitive speeds," Phelps said. "What this will do is actually provide fiber all the way to the home which will increase the bandwidth, increases the speeds they offer and the reliability of the service. We're really excited about."

Uniti will provide the "backbone" of the network, Phelps said, and Point Broadband will lease from them with a plan to get it into Gulf Shores homes and businesses. According to the Uniti.com website, fiber cable is in the ground along the major roads in Orange Beach including Perdido Beach Boulevard, Canal Road, Orange Beach Boulevard and Marina Road. The beach road fiber extends all the way through Gulf Shores to just past Little Lagoon Pass. Alabama 59 has Uniti fiber from the beach to Foley and points beyond and all the way down Fort Morgan Road to just short of the fort.

"We've got some other providers who have a fiber backbone but it's actually co-ax cable going into the home," Phelps said.

"When they bring fiber into the home it doesn't matter what the co-ax network is, it can't keep up and they know that. They see an opportunity specifically in the residential side because of the way our community is growing with residential and we're seeing this throughout Baldwin County."

One of the first areas the company plans to look at is Craft Farms North, an already established neighborhood.

"There's been a significant amount of construction out there obviously but the city is also continuously receiving complaints from residents out there not being able to get service in as timely a matter as they would like," Phelps said. "The fiber optic network isn't already in the ground out there. This will actually provide an opportunity for them to come in and provide service in those areas in an efficient way."


Phelps said Point Broadband will use an installation technique perfected by Google Fiber for its network called micro-trenching. And, the city will keep the company posted about new construction being planned. Several large subdivisions are on the drawing board north of the Intracoastal Waterway.

"Ideally, with new construction, when the developers are going into these areas and putting roadways in they would go ahead and put their conduit in and run everything all at the same time," Phelps said. "That's the perfect scenario."

Uniti, Mediacom, CenturyLink and Harbor Communications all have fiber infrastructure in Gulf Shores but none offer fiber-to-the-home services, Phelps said. Uniti and Harbor both offer fiber optic service for commercial/business customers.

During the meeting the council also:

- Approved paying Volkert Associates no more than \$118,900 for design and engineering services for improvements in the school zone with addition of a box culvert at west 20th Avenue and West First Street and adding a right-turn lane onto East 16th Avenue and Fort Morgan Road. Funding will come from a city line of credit established for school improvements.
- Approved spending nearly \$90,000 for repairs to tennis courts at the Meyer Tennis Center in Sims Park and about \$20,000 for repairs to the basketball courts both Sims and Meyer parks.
- Approved a franchise agreement with Eastern Shore Co. to replace coin-operated, metered telescopes at Gulf Shores beach pavilions and boardwalk. The company removed the telescopes during the city's redevelopment of the area. The new franchise agreement is for two years and Eastern Shore will pay the city 40 percent of its gross receipts.
- Approved a structure fire automatic-aid agreement between the Gulf Shores Fire Department of Foley Fire Department.
- Approved an assembly permit for the Good Life Ride on May 11 starting from The Lodge at Gulf State Park.
- Approved the annexation of a lot and home owned by Mr. and Mrs. James Nelson in the Oyster Bay subdivision on White Lane on Plash Island.
- Approved the annexation of a lot and home owned by Jenny Lynn Price on County Road 6.



Pavement for Powerline Rd.; new gym for Rec Cen-

The City of Orange Beach is moving forward with plans to pave a small portion the north end of Powerline Road as soon as a lawsuit over the acquisition of the land is settled in court.

"The question now becomes what is the value of the land in the court and hopefully it will be resolved in about 30 days," City Administrator Ken Grimes said.

Big plans are in the works for the strip of road from Canal Road south to Sewer Plant Road. Orange Beach is hiring Sawgrass Consulting for about \$175,000 to design the roadway and bring some other city roadways between Powerline Road and the Sportsplex up to code.

The contract was awarded during the regular session of the city council on March 19. During the following work session, the council announced bids would be opened soon on the new gymnasium at the Recreation Center complex.

Sewer Plant Road is an east-west road that connects from the back to the soccer fields and down to Powerline Road north of the sewer plant. That road exists and it's paved but it doesn't meet standards as a city street at this point, Grimes said.

"It'll have to be improved and widened a little bit to get two lanes and striped," Grimes said. "Now it's just mainly a road for people to get to the sewer plant and for big trucks and dump their load. And then we also included the entrance to the Sportsplex and that side road that goes down toward the soccer field and improve it with two lanes."

Powerline Road has existed for years and was even once the only north-south route to the beach. It has turned into a controversial road of late with elected officials saying it would be a traffic fix to have the road operational again. But a clause in a lawsuit over the building of the state park lodge and convention center prohibits new roads in the park for 20

"On the Powerline Road side that im-

provement will be a little bit wider with the ability to hopefully expand and create drainage on each side," Grimes said. "That's in preparation for when the final hearing happens with the condemnation with the Georgine Connor property then we'll be able to move and start construction."

Once the roadway improvements the city will then start to work in earnest on getting the Public Works complex moved from William Silvers Parkway to the east side of Powerline Road.

"That triggers the dominoes that everything begins to happen and you'll see the bids and things related to Public Works," Grimes said. "We're going to design and rebuild Public Works on the site, the land we're going to get from the Connors."

The land where Public Works now sits will become an important addition to the new high school and middle school being built on the same property to the west.

"When (the new Public Works) gets built and we demolish and raze everything that's at Public Works today." Grimes said. "In the future that's where the goal of the football field would be for the high school."

Bids were scheduled to be opened on March 26 for the new gymnasium and Grimes said the city would like to see it opened this fall. The bid will likely be awarded at the April 2 council meeting, city clerk Renee Eberly said.

"We have a seven-month target of getting it completed and the goal is by basketball season," Grimes said. "If they can get moving quickly hopefully by the end of the year, we can be playing basketball in there."

It will be slightly bigger than the current gym but will be split to make small courts for the younger basketball

"If you picture the current gym and you're looking at the basketball court and added four feet on each side and probably 20 feet on each baseline, that would be the walls." Grimes said. "We did that so it would fit on the site because when we used that court it's mainly going to be the little, little kids on the eight-foot goals. But we wanted the full-size courts in it so if had tournaments in the future that gives us another option for high school and middle school basketball."

The work there will also include a refurbishment of the entire look on the recreation center.

"The outside is going to be a little bit different and then we'll probably repaint the entire rec center to match up with the newness of it because the rec center kind of gotten dated as far as the paint color," Grimes said. "The roof is definitely in bad shape as far as fading. You'll see improvements to the whole property."

During regular session the council also: Approved a liquor license for the Blind Tiger which is scheduled to open in The Wharf in the former Bayes Southern Bar and Grill location in the Springhill Suites by Marriot.

Approved a liquor license for Desmond's Taste of Jamaica going into the old Buns in the Sun and Grape Escape location on Loop Road.

During work session council discussed:

- Resolutions opposing current legislation being proposed in the Alabama Legislature, the first being an effort led by State Sen. Chris Elliott, R-Daphne, to do away with police jurisdictions beyond city limits. The second would eliminate lodging taxes for tents, recreational vehicles or marine slips.
- A resolution awarding the bid for a Police Department video system.
- A resolution awarding the bid for selfcontained breathing apparatus for the Fire Department.
- A resolution declaring the "Back-to-School" Sales Tax Holiday July 19-21.
- A resolution appropriating funds for the Expect Excellence Program for Fiscal Year 2019 in an amount not to exceed \$270,000.
- A resolution paying Olsen Associates to perform engineered beach annual moni-

Public bird banding sessions return to Ft. Morgan April 16-20

Public bird banding returns to historic Fort Morgan April 16-20, courtesy of Birmingham Audubon and its partners. The public is invited to join the Audubon team on April 16 from noon - 3 p.m., April 17-19 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. and April 20 from 8 a.m. to noon.

Reviving the bird banding program originally championed by the late Bob Sargent and his wife, Martha, this event provides an invaluable look at spring migrants traveling across the Coastal Alabama section of the Mississippi Flyway. Throughout the week, participants enjoy unparalleled access to the researchers and the work, with up-close-and-personal views of some amazing birds.

In 2018, guest and staff researchers banded a total of 562 birds,



with an additional 74 recaptures that were banded in previous years. That included 41 different species, with the top five most common including Indigo Buntings, Gray Catbirds, Wood Thrushes, Ruby-throated Hummingbirds, and Red-eyed Vireos. April 20, 2018 was the busiest day, with a total of 257 birds banded and a total of 27 species.

"We're excited to see what migrants will be passing through in 2019! Remember

to bring water, bug spray, sunscreen, and perhaps an outdoor chair; restrooms and concessions are available next to the ferry, and all ages are welcome to attend," said Sarah Randolph, Outreach & Communications Director for Birmingham Audubon.

While the Coastal Alabama Bird Banding Project is free, there is an admission fee to enter the park. For up-to-date pricing, visit fort-morgan.org.

SAN DIEGO BAR'S FLORA-BAMA WALL PROVES A BIG HIT: When Ty Hauter has bands flown in from Nashville and Texas to his Moonshine Beach music venue in San Diego, the up-and-coming artists flock to the club's Flora-Bama wall to take pictures. "So, when bands come into town they always get their picture taken by it just like the owner did," Hauter said. "It's become this special wall that everybody gravitates to for selfies and what not before they take off out of town

Hauter has visited the world-famous Flora-Bama once he came away enamored with the place. "I adore it," he said. "I think it's a great place. I grew up in smaller towns in the Midwest and places like that, that's what we dreamed about as kids." When he was putting together ideas for Moonshine Beach, a 1,500-seat venue and bar that does ticketed shows as well as host cover bands, his thoughts went back to the special place he visited on the Florida-Alabama line.

"Southern California doesn't really have a country music scene," Hauter said. "It just started evolving a few years ago and now it's expanding. I was trying to bring in more flavor from the Gulf Coast and the South. I've been living in Nashville for a couple of years now and I was trying to think of items that would resonate and somehow set a tone. In my mind, (the Flora-Bama is) one of the motherships of vibe and what it's all about. That's how it ended up on that wall."

Long-time Flora-Bama owner Joe Gilchrist stopped by to see the wall on a trip to San Diego and wants to bring a group from the Bama out for a visit. "I think we ought to do a home-and-home party," Gilchrist said. "Get a bunch of people to go out there and a bunch of people from out there to come here. I'm all for it."

.Hauter said he is planning to bring a group to the Flora-Bama this summer which would be just his second visit to the legendary roadhouse. "It's probably 20 feet long and six or seven feet high," he said. "We have one wall that says Dixie Beer five cents and one wall that's Jim Beam and another wall that says Fender guitars. The Flora-Bama thing is the only one that's on a wall that's really pushing another





Plan is to make NCAA Beach Volleyball Championships best yet Volleyball rules during May 2-5 event at Gulf Shores Public Beach

Planning is underway to make the 2019 National Collegiate Beach Volleyball Championship, scheduled May 2-5 at Gulf Shores Public Beach, the most fan friendly tourney to date.

Rightfully promoted as the premier opportunity to see the best

collegiate beach volleyball competition in the country, the tourney will include activities such as autograph sessions with all eight participating teams and the championship fan zone, where fans can buy official championship merchandise and interact with other beach volleyball fans.

Cornhole and giant jenga will be on the beach throughout the championship near court no. 3. There will also be a games area for near court 3, with buckets and shovels available to play with. A junior

beach volleyball tourney, with more than 100 participating teams, will also be held in conjunction with the championship. More events will be added.

Weekend VIP (\$225), courtside seating (\$80) and general admission (\$50) tickets are now on sale at eventbrite.com. Single day tickets will go on sale in early April.

The top eight teams in the country, which as of March 14 included Florida State, LSU and Florida International (see sidebar), will vie for the national championship in Gulf Shores, and LSU's top duo, Claire Coppola and Kristen Nuss (pictured) were claimed AVCA Pair of the Week Honors following a 4-0 performance at the GCU Beach Tournament in Arizona, marking the first time that a pair from LSU has been named the national pair of the week.

The National Collegiate Beach Volleyball Championship was named the NCAA's 90th and national championship in 2016, with Southern Cal winning the historic first title in Gulf Shores and then repeating in 2017, before UCLA prevailed last May. The event is under contract to return through 2022, and ESPN will provide live whip-around coverage of every match throughout the tournament and will televise the championship match live. Beach volleyball is the fastest-growing NCAA sport, with 1,000 student-athletes across the country playing the sport.



DENNEY WINS FINAL WATER STAMP ART CONTEST: Jim Denney of Alexander City is the winner of this year's Alabama Waterfowl Stamp Art Contest with his painting of a pair of Northern Pintails. This artwork will be used as the design for the 2020-21 Alabama Waterfowl Stamp, which is required when hunting waterfowl in Alabama. Funds generated by the sales of waterfowl stamps at both the state and federal levels are used for conservation of waterfowl habitat. The win makes Denney the only four-time contest winner, having previously won the 2016-17, 2012-13 and 2008-09 contests. Denney estimates the acrylic painting took him 25-30 hours over the course of a month to complete. "I selected Pintails because they are one of my favorite species and I have a mounted pintail that I harvested in Oklahoma, which is great for reference. I had originally selected Cinnamon Teal as the species to use, but I thought the Pintails might have more regional appeal to the judges," he said. 2020-21 will be the last time Alabama produces a physical waterfowl stamp. The state implemented a lifetime waterfowl stamp and added a waterfowl stamp privilege section to the regular hunting license. Waterfowl hunters will still be required to have either an annual or lifetime state waterfowl hunting privilege designated on their license.






