

Al. adds Aug. 31 & Sept. 1 to private snapper season

After completing a review of the 2019 private angler red snapper season through August 5, the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources has determined two additional days can be added to the private angler recreational season. The additional days will begin 12:01 a.m. on Saturday, August 31, 2019, and run until midnight on Sunday, September 1, 2019.

Landing estimates are derived from manda-

tory angler reports submitted through Alabama's Snapper Check Program. Anglers are reminded that greater amberjack is available for voluntary reporting through the Snapper Check app.

Detailed red snapper landing information from the 2018 and 2019 seasons is available at outdooralabama.com.

Tacky Jacks action-track beach chair program allows veterans to increase their mobility and quality of life

When Tacky Jacks owner Buddy Skipper found out people liked to have their pictures made with the big blue marlin hanging up at his three locations an idea was born.

"He said we ought to try and raise some money with that," CFO Ken Kichler said. "We put a donation box and originally it was for different charities. We've done several different charities over the years. Whatever money our customers drop into the boxes we match that money and make charitable arrangements around that.

"The last five years it's been with action-track chairs or beach chairs."

And, those have gone to veterans with a goal of increasing their mobility and quality of life. The

latest recipient is Jorge Tabares who has a scooter-like wheelchair but was looking to expand his horizons.

"He used to be a very outdoorsy person, until due to the injuries he sustained while on active duty, he fell and broke his neck," Tacky Jacks Director of Marketing Susan Sizemore said. "He does have some movement in his hands and legs, but just not much. We are looking forward to Jorge becoming an outdoorsy person once again."

In the past two years, community groups have joined in to help with the effort. This is the second year for the Treasures of the Isle Mardi Gras krewe presented a check for the program and this year the South Alabama Parrotheads also made a contribution. Tacky Jacks matched both contribu-

tions.

Tacky Jacks has been involved with six all-terrain or beach buggy type wheelchairs and five of those have been given to disabled veterans. A sixth one was bought from Beach 'n' Buggy owners and manufacturers Chance Blaker and Marie Palmer.

"So, if a veteran comes to the beach and wants rent a wheelchair and this one is available they get to rent it for free," Kichler said. "In the summertime, it's hard to get because every week someone wants it."



There is no charge for the seminar, and it is open to everyone, but pre-registration is requsted to ensure there is enough material. The seminar is suited for both children and parents.



Capt. Bobby Walker puts angler on record setting amberjack

3rd generation charter captain sees record that stood for 38 years fall

It's no real surprise that it was Orange Beach native Bobby Walker's charter boat that carried what turned out to be a state record setting amberjack back to Zeke's Marina earlier this month.

With 55 years experience fishing local waters, Walker is, at the very least, part of any conversation about who is the best salt water fisherman in the state.

What is remarkable is that the record stood for 38 years, longer than the record setting angler, Brian Andrews, fishing with a group of hardware business pals, has been alive. Andrews' 132-pound, 12.8-ounce fish topped the previous record for jack by a whopping five pounds.

This is the third 100 plus lb. amberjack that Walker has put onboard the Summer Breeze II. Both of the other jacks weighed 109 lbs. and were caught about 10 years ago on the same day and spot.

"I've caught plenty of big amberjacks during my day, but that was crazy," Walker said.

Marcus Kennedy of Mobile held the state amberjack record for almost four decades for a fish he caught on June 19, 1981. Andrews, a Citronelle resident, broke that record on August 23.

Even though he had a scholarship offer to play football at Livingston University in hand, upon graduating from Foley High School in 1969, Bobby decided to follow a family tradition that dates back to the beginning of the charter fishing industry in Orange Beach.

One of Bobby's forbearers, Lemuel Walker Sr., settled on Pleasure Island around 1865.

When his son Lemuel Jr. moved here to take care of his aging father in the 1890s, the Walker family's lineage began to flourish. The Walkers were also instrumental in the delivery of mail in the area.



The Walker and Callaway families, specifically Bobby's grandfather, Rufus Walker, Sr., his Uncle Roland and Emel Callaway, were pioneers of the charter boat fishing industry on the Alabama Coast.

In the late 1950's, Bobby's father, Captain Bob Walker, was active in getting the first Alabama artificial reef program approved. Alabama now has the largest artificial reef zone on the Gulf Coast.

"As a child, I was fortunate to see the first barge of artificial reef materials as it was deployed off the coast of Alabama," Bobby said.

Before he was even old enough to vote, Bobby was leading charters from the helm of The Thelma Ann, a six passenger boat he eventually inherited from his father. This was way before Loran, back when captains used compasses and shore points to navigate.

"Eventually GPS came along and now everybody's a fisherman," Bobby said.

In 1983, Bobby built the Summer Breeze, one of the first multi-passenger boats to offer overnight off-shore fishing in Orange Beach. Ten years later, he built his current boat, The Summer Breeze II.

Robby, Walker, one of Bobby's three children (He has six grandchildren.) is also a charter captain.

And his grandson, Chandler, has been getting sea time deckhanding with his dad all summer. Robby expects that his son will be the fifth generation of his family to earn his charter captains' license this winter.

"Chandler has a lot of choices, and he also loves his surfing and skateboarding," Robby said. "But except for owning a gym on the beach, this is all I ever wanted to do. It's always been my passion."

When Andrews set his hook, he wasn't even sure there was an amberjack on the other end of the line. He had caught a 70-pounder earlier in his fishing career, and Bobby's spot has long been productive for the species. But this fish was different.

"I was trying to be positive, but several people were telling me it was a shark," Andrews told David Rainer. "He was pulling like a shark, but you never know. He made at least three big runs. It took at least 30 minutes to get him in. When he makes a run, all you can do is hold the rod and watch him go. When he starts peeling drag, you just hold on. When he stops peeling drag, you have to start taking some of the line back."

Bobby was also worried that Andrews was wrestling one of the big bull sharks that were hanging out in the same vicinity.

"We had already caught two or three good jacks off that hole and broke off a couple. I was just hoping we weren't wasting time reeling up a big shark," he said.

When Andrews finally reeled the big fish to the surface, deckhand Paul Resmondo set the gaff and led the team trying to get the jack onboard. It measured 65 inches from the tip of its snout to the fork of its tail and sported a 40-inch girth.

"When that fish hit the deck, his mouth flopped open, and he looked like he could swallow a basketball," Bobby said. "His head was huge. I told them I'd lay money that the fish was at least 100 lbs. I didn't think any more about it."

Back at Zeke's Marina, Walker was filing paperwork



when he heard a commotion that got his attention.

"People were hollering and raising Cain and I wondered what was going on," he said. "They had hauled the fish up on the scales. When I saw it, I said, 'Whoa.' Tom Ard (captain of Fairwater II Charters) looked at me and said, 'Bobby, you've got a state record."

Obviously, when you spend 50 plus years putting customers on top of fish in the Gulf, you are going to bring plenty of lunkers back to the dock.

Walker said amberjack are usually around some kind of structure – wrecks, petroleum rigs or big rocks on natural bottom – and can be anywhere from 50 feet to 300 feet down. He said it's easy to distinguish between the different snappers and the amberjack. He marks AJs on his bottom machine and tells his anglers how far to drop.

Although a lot of anglers will use big jigs for amberjack, Bobby prefers live bait. "Hardtails (blue runners) are probably the best bait," he said. "Jigs used to work great, but AJs are just not as plentiful and are harder to catch. We just like to drop a big, live bait down and see what's down there.

"The secret to catching a big AJ is having the right tackle. You've got to go pretty heavy. You can't catch one like that on light tackle. First, you've got to get him away from the wreck or the rocks. You've got to have some pretty strong tackle to do that. If you can get him away from the structure, you've got a good chance of catching him."

Walker said amberjack fishing has been a little slow so far, but he knows fishing success is cyclical.


"One year it's great, and the next year you're wondering where the AJs went," he said. "This has started out like one of those years that's down a little."

Walker said the demand to catch amberjack doesn't compare with red snapper. He fished 55 of the 62-day charter boat snapper season.

"People like to catch amberjacks, but it's nothing like the bookings we get for snapper," he said. "I've got some more 12-hour trips coming up. I'm probably going back to that amberjack hole. I want to see if lightning strikes twice in the same spot."
































Čity officials will be visiting with residents and business owners in the Downtown Beach District this fall to discuss changes coming in the form of a \$4.4 million vitalization project.

On Aug. 26, the council voted to pay Volkert \$424,000 to design the construction engineering and inspection, get the necessary state and environmental permitting and doing geotechnical testing on the areas affected. The project will be in the areas from beach road north two blocks to Second Avenue and will spread east to west from East Second Street to West Second Street.

"Once we get a final map drawn and analyzed and we believe its what we want to build – we did the same on Highway 59 – we will go down and go door to door and talk to everybody about what we're doing and why we're doing it," Mayor Robert Craft said. "We'll take input to make sure we can take their considerations into play. That worked really for us on Highway 59 when we modified all those turn-ins and outs and talked to every person affected."

The entire project will include reworking roadways in the area and utilizing city rights of way to add space for parking. Craft says this is to encourage business growth in the area of town that was first platted for residential use.

"When we look at trying to do some kind of walking district allow for some development these are just really small lots," Craft said. "And a really small lot to build something that requires parking. It's very limited to what they can build and park."

With this project, the city will essentially provide the parking for them.

"With us doing this with city money we are conceptually discussing allowing them to buy down their parking, pay us to build more parking in lieu of building parking on their property. Therefore, they've got the full lot that they have the opportunity to develop on."

Public Works Director Mark Acreman said there are about 214 city parking spots in the district now and plans are to increase that to 324. That number could change, Acreman said, if there are unforeseen obstacles like utility placement.

"This is a conceptual plan and it is subject to change," Acreman said. "It does show the basic intent as well as the volume of parking we hope to add to this whole the beach downtown area and walking district. We can have people that can come down and park and enjoy the existing businesses and we hope to see new businesses come to this area as a result of these improvements."

Another part of the project that will help is the implementation of a stormwater master plan to handle runoff from heavy rains. With that in place, new businesses won't have to plan for retention ponds to collect the water giving them more room to develop on the available space.

"We had a master stormwater plan that was completed last year and will be implemented as part of this project," Acreman said. "That will allow for more urbanized development in the beachfront district."

Gulf Shores is taking advantage of two grants and some cash from the Embassy Suites hotel partnership to pay for about \$2 million of the project, Acreman said.

"We've been awarded an \$800,000 TAP grant for the sidewalk components," Acreman said. "We received a \$60,000 ACAMP grant for the master planning for the stormwater system. Then there is the \$1.2 million payment for parking improvements that will be provided through the Embassy Suites development agreement."

The rest will part of the Public Works request in the 2020 budget year. The design phase is expected to take about 90 days or so with the bid letting period to follow.

"We would likely not start this type of construction project until next year," Acreman said. "It's going to have to be carefully scheduled and organized through the summer season as well as the construction phase of the Embassy Suites."

This new project comes on the heels of the \$15 million Gulf Place Revitalization Project which revamped a portion of Gulf Place and put parking and a public safety building on city-owned Gulf front west of the Regatta Condominiums.





Canal Road Corridor plan coming soon

Kyan Shamburger at Big Beach Brewing Co.'s business sits a few 100 feet from the 90-degree intersection at Canal Road and East Second Street in Gulf Shores.

Volkert engineering firm is trying to find an alternative to the turn and is doing a study for the city on easing this bottleneck.

"I get asked often when (the city) might give us an update for the Canal Corridor Project," Shamburger said during a recent council meeting.

He got what Public Works Director Mark Acreman believes is good news.

"We were able to achieve routing that traffic around the community and not through the community," Acreman said. "We're getting some final blessings on some of those alignments now. I'm hoping maybe within the next 30 days and no more than 60 we can have something back to you guys to see again just to show you the progress we've made."

But it's not without some hurdles to overcome with government permitting. Gulf Shores must deal with the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and the Army Corps of Engineering.

One route might cross a smidgen of Gulf State Park and both may affect wetlands in the area. The city is looking to go south of the neighborhood bordered by Canal Road on the north and East Second Street on the west.

"We actually met with some of the governmental bodies that will have a major say in the alignment last week," Acreman. "Those discussions I felt were very positive and so we should be coming back in the very near future with a new corridor."

Acreman said a minimal amount of tweaks were suggested by the officials at the meeting.

"When we presented this a couple of months back, we knew we had to get some government buy-ins from the DCR, the Corps of Engineers," Acreman said. "We've met with a lot of those groups and it has changed the alignment a little bit."

The two routes in question would have traffic turn south onto East 10th Street and connect with a new road that will have a westward turn until it heads west to connect to Dolphin Avenue. There's a light at Dolphin and East Second Street which will give traffic access to the ICW bridge by going straight or to the beach by turning left and catching State Route 59 there.

Gulf Shores officials hope this change will make pedestrian traffic going from the Waterway Village District on the west side of Second Street East at West 24th Avenue to the neighborhood where Shamburger's brewery, Meyer Park and residential housing are located.

During the Sept. 16 regular session, Gulf Shores City Council:

- Annexed 13 acres of property at 5584 County Road 6 (pictured) owned by Mr. & Mrs. Billy Childers. Currently, there is a 30-unit RV Park and the property is contiguous the City Limits of Gulf Shores. If annexed it will be zoned residential but the RV park will be grandfathered in. The applicants are requesting annexation so their grandchildren can attend Gulf Shores City Schools.
- Annexed two lots from the Taylor's Riverview Subdivision owned by Jeannine Perry. The annexation is due to the formation of the Gulf Shores City School system.
- OK'd an application for a \$400,000 grant from the FAA with the Gulf Shores Airport Authority matching about \$20,000 to receive the grant. It will be used to rehabilitate lighting on three of the airport's taxiways.
- OK'd helping the Gulf United Metro Business Organization with \$10,000 to help with the group's Oct. 16-18 Tourism Economic Development Summit for its members, the Baldwin County legislative delegation, tourism executives, and state officials. Other cities are also being asked to contribute to the conference.
- Authorized staff to pursue a \$15,000 grant funding from the Gulf Coast Resource Conservation Development Council to establish a tree-planting program with Gulf Shores schools, the Gulf Coast Center for Ecotourism and Sustainability and the Beautification Board.
- Accepted South Alabama Purchasing Association bid award to Davison Fuels for gasoline, diesel, and lubricants as budgeted within each department. The contract is for one year with an option for two additional years. SAPA has held the contract since 2008.
- Granted the Family Dollar Store in the former Winn Dixie shopping center on Alabama 59 and The Sloop restaurant in the former Delta Blues location a liquor license.

County expected to take ownership of Perdido Key Dr.

Florida would take control of Beulah Dr. as part of land swap

Escambia County Commissioners are expected to approve legislation to take control of Perdido Key Dr. and transfer part of Beulah Dr. to the State of Florida at its Sept. 5 meeting. According to a Jim Little story in the Pensacola News Journal, the transfer will allow the state to pay for a new Interstate 10 exit at Beulah Rd. and allow Escambia County to make traffic improvements on Perdido Key Dr. Under the proposed agreement, 2.5 miles of Beulah Road from Mobile Highway to Isaacs Lane would transfer to state control, opening up state dollars to expand and improve the road, and Perdido Key Drive would transfer to county control.

Commissioner Jeff Bergosh, who represents the Beulah area, said the county doesn't have the money to add an interstate interchange there. The Beulah Road I-10 exit is also key to the county's long-range sector plan, which calls for a new connector from Beulah Rd. to U.S. 29 in Cantonment, according to the News-Journal. "I think everyone recognizes it's the most important project in the county," Bergosh said.

Commissioner Doug Underhill, who represents Perdido Key, told the News Journal when the county takes over Perdido Key Dr., it will immediately begin installing better pedestrian crossings and implement changes to improve traffic slowdowns at the state line. The Flora-Bama has been paying the full cost of hiring Escambia County deputies to work as crossing guards at the state line for many years.

Underhill also told the News Journal that the county could persue a traffic circle or traffic light at the intersection of Johnson Beach Rd. and Perdido Key Dr and FDOT will keep its funding in place for the planned bike path along Perdido Key Dr.

Skeptics on social media have questioned whether the county would have the funds to rebuild Perdido Key Dr. after the next major storm, according to the News Journal. Underhill told the newspaper Escamabia County could use reserve funds to repair the road and then seek reimbursement from the Federal Highway Administration and FEMA.

Perdidio resident Randy Cudd is one of the social media skeptics. "Escambia County is broke. It can't keep up with the roads it has now," he said. "They will never spend the kind of money necessary to make Perdido Key Dr. a functional road. Even though the county can make road changes easier than the State of Florida, it can't afford to."

The Perdido Key Assn. supports the land swap as a way to jump start movement on the Perdido Key Master Plan, which includes a major modification to the Perdido Key Drive/Johnson Beach Road intersection.

"We support the proposal to change control of Perdido Key Drive from the State of Florida to Escambia County, an arrangement that should improve both vehicular and pedestrian/bicycle safety and perhaps facilitate fulfillment of the Perdido Key Master Plan," said president Charles Krupnick.



He liked playing video poker with his pals at the Undertow and visiting around town just about every day when he was able. For the past year, he has been battling a variety of ailments.

Local retailer joins 500 vendors at CBD 2019 in Miami

Lots of conflicting and confusing info circulating about CBD & hemp

More than 500 venders of CBD products (edibles, tinctures, sublingual drops, pain salves, beauty products, coffee, pet products, etc.) recentliy gathered at the Miami Beach Convention Center for CBD 2019, the country's largest CBD expo.

The expo included 49 Keynote demonstrations on topics like legalities, cultivation, packaging and delivery systems. The speakers included researchers, authors, legal experts and CBD company CEO's. According to worldwide studies of CBD usage, the main reasons peo-

ple take it is for pain, sleep, inflammation, anxiety and stress. Older people (50 and above) use it primarily for pain. Males are more likely to use CBD for relaxation.

Sublingual Tinctures are the best seller in all countries. At this time, the U.K. spends more money on it than any other country. Israel does the most research on both Marijuana and Hemp CBD. The number one challenge in countries is figuring out the correct dosage. The people in all countries surveyed agreed that they prefer CBD over phar-

The main concern people have when buying CBD is finding a trustworthy retailer with employees that are knowledgeable and can help assist them find answers to their questions

Is CBD right for me?

There is an amazing amount of conflicting or confusing information out there. It's only been five years since former President Obama made it legal to sell CBD in the U.S. Then president Trump signed the farm bill this year which legalizes growing hemp (CBD is extracted from the Hemp plant, not the Marijuana plant).

Hemp vs. Marijuana

The cannabis plant has two subtypes. The marijuana plant which contains the intoxicating compound THC (tetrahydrocannabinol) and the hemp plant, which has been used for thousands of years.

In the 1600's colonists in Virginia were cultivating it to make rope, ship sails, and clothing. The hemp plant has negligible amounts of THC so you do not get an intoxicating effect.

Both marijuana and hemp plants contain hundreds of compounds called cannabinoids, of which THC is the one we have heard about the most. It has both intoxicating and therapeutic effects.

Another one of the cannabinoids is CBD (or cannabidoil) It has therapeutic effects without the intoxicating "high." There must be .3 percent or less THC to be considered legal in all 50 states.

The Cannabinoids

Cannabinoids are chemical compounds that act on receptors found in your brain and your body. They can effect the regulation of inflammation, mood, appetite, and pain. Your body produces similar compounds on its own called endocannabinoids. CB1 receptors are found throughout your body but are concentrated in your brain. These receptors involve movement and coordination, appetite, memories and emotions, and thinking (THC attaches to CB1 receptors, hence the munchies.)

CB2 receptors are found in the immune system and are involved with pain and inflammation. Scientists used to believe that CBD attached to these CB2 receptors, but recemt research indicates that CBD instead allows your body to use more of its own naturally produced

What to look for in buying CBD?

1: Be sure the CBD is extracted from the hemp plant naturally. A CO2 extraction is reccomended over a chemical extraction.

2: A full spectrum or broad spectrum CBD is recommended over an isolate. The isolate does not have terpenes or flavonoids. There is some indication that all of these things work together which is known as "the entourage effect.

3: There should be testing from a third party lab on every batch. Soon the government will require a QR code square on every CBD product. **4:** Nano-emulsifies. Nano particles are so small they do not need to be broken down by the stomach. They enter almost immediately into your

bloodstream. Cannabinoids are not water soluble. Nanotechnology allows the size reduced molecules to pass through the body's various fil-



Miracle League of Coastal Alabama breaks ground in Summerdale

Playground & field for special needs kids project of Pleasure Isle's Lions Clubs

The Pleasure Island based founders of Miracle League of Coastal Alabama (MLCA) did not have to go far from the island where the non-profit was hatched to find a home.

A joint legacy project of the Gulf Shores and Orange Beach Lions Clubs under the direction of chairman Bruce White, MLCA recently broke ground on a beautiful 10 acre slate of land just 20 miles north of the Gulf of Mexico near downtown Summerdale.

Summerdale Mayor David Wilson said he and his town council had attempted to bring a Miracle League field to their town even before he was approached by MLCA.

"The Mayor and Town Council have responded quickly to our every need," White said. "They have been 100 percent behind the project from the start."

The Miracle League Field is a facility that is tailored specifically for special needs children. The park accommodates wheelchairs, walkers, and other assistive devices while helping to prevent injuries.

First hatched in 2004, the MLCA gained momentum when Pleasure Island's two Lions Clubs became involved.

"Because our annual duck race was so successful, we were able to donate \$1,030 to the Miracle League," said Orange Beach Lions Club President Margaret Long. "We hope to give more next year."

Maybe not so coincidentally, Long's son Wesley, through his business at Alligator Alley, is also a major fundraiser for MLCA through the Alligators & Ales fundraiser.

Gulf Shores Lions Pat and Madeline Avinger are the parents of a special needs daughter, Celie, who was a huge inspiration for White to take the lead on the legacy project.

"It started with The Gulf Shores and Orange Beach Lions Clubs," White said. "It was their commitment to the project that allowed us to move forward in the first place."

Work has already started on the MLCA infrastructure. Next will be the completion of an all-inclusive playground and finally the Miracle League baseball field. The project buildout is estimated to be 18 months.

The amount of money needed to build the park envisioned by the two Lions Club is tremendous more than \$2.5 million, including in-kind services.

"I know it's a lot of money. We just take it day by day and step by step," White said. "We are still in the process of conquering the \$2.5 million price tag."

As of August 1, the MLCA had collected \$618,000 in monetary donations and an additional \$500,000 in service commitments.

"We still need to raise a lot of money," White said at the groundbreaking, "close to \$1.5 million to complete the project."

The MLCA development team includes seven committees and hundreds of volunteers. White said their dedication to the project has been unwavering.

"None of these volunteers are retired, and this is an extremely time-consuming project," White said. "It cuts into their work and family time. As tough as it is, all of them are relentlessly working to get this park built."

Larry Thompson, President of the Miracle League of Pensacola, was also at the groundbreaking and has provided direction, guidance and advice to the

"There will be a monument honoring Ed in the park," MLCA Chairman Bruce White said.

"We had beautiful set of construction drawings, but the one thing we lacked was the ability to read and understand them." White said. "Ken joined our development team as the general contractor and from that point forward, things have moved quickly and smoothly."

In addition to Pleasure Island state representative Steve McMillan, dignitaries at the groundbreaking included Baldwin County Commissioners, and reps from all five

Baldwin County Chambers.

The Lower Alabama Young Professionals not only showed up, they brought a \$1,200 donation check with them.

"Most importantly, in attendance are several of our special needs residents and their families," White said. "We are all excited you are here. It's amazing how few of Baldwin County's special needs families are even aware of this

project. We're hoping exposure from today's groundbreaking will remedy that situation."

MLCA includes a committee that will coordinate with special needs teachers throughout Baldwin County to bring awareness to the project and recruit special needs families to work with MLCA.

"If anyone would like to join our team, I promise you, we can use all the help we can get," White said. "We've been working hard and we will continue to work just as hard as we move closer to making "Dreams Come True" for our special needs residents and their families."






