



Red light at the state line should ease traffic congestion at Bama

As anyone trying to triverse from the two lanes of Perdido Key Dr. in Florida to the four laned Perdido Beach Blvd. in Orange Beach knows, traffic can back up in the vicinity of the Flora-Bama in part because of pedestrians crossing Perdido Key Dr. to go from the complex's parking lots on Ole River to the famed

A significant traffic improvement will be the installation of a full traffic signal at or near the current crosswalk at the Flora-Bama.

According to the Perdido Key Assn. newsletter, work will begin this month on a new traffic light that will include a green pedestrian walk indication for pedestrians to cross Perdido Key Dr. Vehicular traffic will be halted with a red indication on the signal when pedestrians are allowed to cross. When vehicles get the green indication, pedestrians will have a red hand indication. The project, in addition to a dedicated left turning lane for eastbound traffic, minor access modifications to the Flora-Bama property and removal of the traffic signal currently installed just over the state line in Alabama.

"This will hopefully improve both safety and traffic flow at that location," said PKA President Charles Krupnick.

Foley High grad dies after fleeing DUI stop on West Beach Blvd.

A 2004 Foley High School graduate, Russell Mallette (pictured), is dead after fleeing a suspicion of DUI traffic stop by a Gulf Shores police on West Beach Blvd. about 4 a.m. on Sept. 9. The suspect's current address is in Nevada, and it is

believed he was in town visiting friends and family.

The suspect fled into a nearby condo complex after being stopped by GSPD, and ultimately jumped or fell from one of the highest floors of Ocean House II Condo, a nine-story building.

Shots were fired during Mallette's getaway attempt, but Police did not state

whether or not Mallette suffered any gunshot wounds. No GSPD officers were injured.

A GSPD officer located Mallette on the 5th floor of Ocean House II Condominiums, where according to Gulf Shores Police Mallette attacked the officer and a fight ensued. A responding officer arrived as back up and reportedly witnessed the suspect shooting at the officer.

According to GSPD, Mallette then made his way up to the 8th or 9th floor during the time that officers with GSPD were setting up a perimeter. During that time, Mallette went over the balcony. His facebook page states that Mallette is a 2009 graduate of South Alabama. He moved to Colorado in 2013 and eventually to Sparks, Nevada in 2019.

According to Baldwin County District Attorney Bob Wilters, a gun was obtained by Mallette from the responding officer.

Speaking at a press conference the following day, Sgt. Jason Woodruff with GSPD said Mallette ran into a condo stairwell and was followed by a Gulf Shores officer. Officials say that when he found the suspect on the fifth floor the two struggled and police believe he got the officer's weapon and fired at the officer. Two other officers also responded.

"Our officers made contact with the suspect on the fifth floor and at that time what I would characterize as an attack occurred," Sgt. Woodruff said. "The suspect attacked the officer and a fight ensued. You had some responding officers who responded to back that officer up. The first officer arrived to see the suspect shooting at the original officer. That officer fired at the suspect who ultimately retreated further east into the building into a stairwell where he encountered another officer from Gulf Shores PD who fired at him."

When the suspect fled higher in the staircase, the officers began setting up a perimeter.

"The suspect made his way up to the eighth or ninth floor at that point and ultimately they had lost contact with him for a short while," Woodruff said. "At that point, we were setting up a perimeter and making sure residents and citizens that were staying there were back in their rooms when the suspect ultimately went over the balcony on the eighth or ninth floor."

No officers were on the same floor at the time Mallette went over the balcony. "He either fell or jumped," District Attorney Bob Wilters said. "At this point in time we don't know.

Wilters said it's too early in the investigation to make much more information available to the public.


"At this time, we will not be able to release any video or witness statements while the investigation is ongoing," Wilters said.

"That's still under investigation as to how many shots were fired and how many officers were involved. It was one officer during the attack and then other officers arrived shortly after and set up a perimeter. We are happy that our officers were not injured during this attack and we do send our sympathy and condolences to Mr. Mallette's family."

Wilters said part of the ongoing investigation is to determine why Mallette ran from police in the first place.

"Our understanding was he was in this area to see family and friends," Wilters said. "We do not have any outstanding warrants in Alabama that I'm aware of. There may have been some warrants outstanding somewhere else but as far as this area we don't have any outstanding warrants. He's been here in the past but that's been years ago."

The Baldwin County Major Crimes Unit has been called in to conduct the investigation which is standard procedure for officer-related shootings or deaths. Three officers are now on administrative leave until the investigation is complete. Wilters said the case will eventually be presented to a grand jury.





Galvez Boat Landing upgrade coming in 2020

The Galvez Landing boat ramp off Innerarity Point Road will be renovated in 2020 to provide longer parking spaces and easier and safer access, according to Robert Turpin, manager for the Escambia County Marine Resources Division

The new boat ramp will, like the ramp it will replace, will accommodate two boats, but it will be moved to the end of Cruzat Way to allow more forward and backup distance.

Renovations at Galvez Landing will also include a new park with a play area and the county's first handicap-accessible swim area. The park area will also feature additional parking. The swimming area at the new park will be physically separated from the boat ramp.

The design work will likely be complete in early 2020, and at the point, the county will begin filing for permits from the Army Corp of Engineers and other agencies before it can begin construction, according to Turpin.



O.B.'s bridge build could stall over property procurement

Army Corps of Engineers is still processing a permit for the project

A breakdown in negotiations between the City of Orange Beach and property owner George Barber has put the proposed Wolf Bay bridge's status in

"We're just going to put it on hold until he reevaluates and, in his reevaluation, decides that he can work with us on what we need to make it a possibility. We need all of his property to come into Orange Beach and that's no secret."

Barber is a major landowner where the northern footing of the bridge will land and is also the owner of the massive Barber Marina just east of that landing site. The Barber family is also

the owner of Barber's Dairy based out of Birm-

ingham for many years.

"There's no bad faith or ill will with Mr. Barber it's just that there's differencing of opinions on what's best for each of us," Kennon said.

The other major property owner vital to the project is David Lawrenz and his property is already in the city limits, Kennon said. According to tax records, the Century Plaza Company is listed as the owner of several parcels as well.

Kennon says his city will still pursue the bridge but wants to make sure it's a good investment.

"It's important for Orange Beach to have a deal that benefits us and justifies building a \$70 million bridge," Kennon said.

"It's not to say that Mr. Barber is right or wrong or we're right or wrong. It's just that at this point we don't feel like we have a deal that is in our best interest and justifies it. We're going to put it on hold and continue and negotiate and see if maybe in the future something can happen. But right now it's on hold."

Kennon said the background work on the bridge will continue including the design which is about three-quarters done and already paid for. The Army Corps of Engineers is still processing a permit for the project.

"They told us nine to 12 months every nine to 12 months," Kennon said. "I guess when the Corps does it the Corps does it. I don't know what to expect but they keep saying nine to 12 months. It rebridge that you need and you can't get the Corps to get the permit done. It's really ridiculous."

City Suplemeting Fiber Optic Options

During the Aug. 20 regular council meeting the city council voted unanimously to give \$350,000 to Island Fiber to hire additional crews and speed up the process to get it beyond the handful of homes currently served. It was also announced at the meeting the city would have a townhall session at the Orange Beach Event Center on Oct. 1.

"The agreement that the city is willing to work with Island Fiber that will help him stand up additional crews in order to build out Orange Beach

within the timeframe we are talking about," Councilman Jerry Johnson said. "It's an economic development plan to where he can build out every neighborhood in Orange Beach by December of 2020. Whatever neighborhood you're in he's coming eventually."

The city will also pay Island Fiber \$1,000 for the first 1,200 homes hooked up to the service.

Island Fiber's current plan is to head east from Burkhart on the south side of Canal Road and go all the way to Bear Point. Once there it will turn its attention to Bear Point itself where Franco estimates he can the 1,200 to 1,400 homes and lots done within about 90 days.

The additional crews will be deployed along State Route 161 and its adjoining neighborhoods and also on Canal Road west of 161 and the its neighborhoods. There are three packages available with 100 megabytes a second costing \$65 a month, 200 MB at \$99 a month and 300 MB at \$150 a month. Custom packages pulling up to a full gig will also be available.

Pizza restaurant opening in Lester's building; Sept. 17 public hearing for 58 cottages between 3 parcels

During the August 20 regular session, Gulf Shores City Council approved a liquor license for Sauced, a restaurant going into the old Hogfish Grill location which also housed Lester's for many years. One of the owners, Brent Sexton, said they are planning a full-service pizza restaurant and have plenty of televisions for sporting events. It will include hand-made crust, house-made cheeses, full menu including houseground burgers and sandwiches and craft cocktails. They are shooting for a late-September or early-October opening. Sexton and his wife Erica Duff also own Beach House Kitchen and Cocktails in Gulf Shores on West Beach.

During the meeting, council also:

 Passed a resolution authorizing the execution of a professional services agreement with Gunn & Associates and accepting their proposal for electrical engineering services for baseball field lights at the Orange Beach Sportsplex in an amount not to exceed \$14,625.

 Passed a resolution adopting a City of Orange Beach FY2020 Transportation Plan to meet the eligibility requirements of HB2 Rebuild Ala-

bama Gas Tax Funds.

The council adiscussed:

• The sole source purchase and installation of additional vertical lane delineators on State Highway 161 in front of McDonald's restaurant.

 A resolution authorizing the execution of a GOMESA grant agreement with the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (ADCNR) to mitigate marine debris and waterborne trash in the amount of about \$1.3 million. This grant would fund the program for five years and crews would work year-round. Currently, the city funds the program but only part of the year for the past six years.

• A resolution authorizing the execution of a task order with Davis Architects to provide professional architectural and engineering services for a new adult fitness center in an amount not to exceed \$236,000. The center will be built near the Camp Sunshine building on the recreation complex and be a 24-hour gym for members.

 A resolution authorizing the execution of a task order with Davis Architects to provide professional architectural and engineering services for baseball/softball field renovations at the Orange Beach Sportsplex in an amount not to exceed \$109,500. These improvements will make one of the fields an official college baseball facility and be used by Orange Beach High School.

• A resolution authorizing the execution of a task order with Davis Architects to provide professional architectural and engineering services for a new field house and practice facility for the Orange Beach High School in an amount not to exceed \$356,288.

 A resolution authorizing a franchise for Gulf Limousine to operate a limousine service within the city limits and police jurisdiction of the City of Orange Beach.

 Setting a public hearing date of Sept. 17 for Cotton Bayou Cottages to build a 34-cottage development near Cotton's Restaurant.

• Setting a public hearing date of Sept. 17 for The Bluffs of Orange Beach, a 10-cottage development planned for an empty lot in front of Wal-

• Setting a public hearing date of Sept. 17 for Robinson Grove just off of Canal Road and Walker Key Boulevard across the street from the Orange Beach Community Center. Developers are planning for 14 cottage lots.

Revenues running ahead of 2019 projections

New lodging tax exemption after 90 days for marina boat slips, recreational vehicles & campsites

Gulf Shores announced an increase in expected revenues of about \$5 million and Financial and Administration Director Cindy King offered a third 2019 budget amendment to address it.

Also, during the Sept. 9 city council meeting, the council discussed a lodging tax exemption for marina boat slips, recreational vehicles and campsites.

King said the city's total revenue exceeds expenses by \$160,376 for this third budget amendment and exceeds \$776,850 for the entire year.

"In sales taxes, use taxes, lodging taxes and even business licenses, those are significantly up from last year," King told the city council. "That increase will probably continue but in order to budget conservatively we're just adding in the year-todate plus what it ended up doing through the end of last year."

Sales taxes led the way with a \$1.7 million increase followed by lodging taxes which are \$1.5 million ahead of budget projections. Others include a \$380,000 increase in use taxes, a \$300,000 increase in building permits, a \$150,000 increase in business licenses and a \$100,000 increase in the business license for Baldwin EMC.

The bulk of the \$5 million or \$3.1 million will be transferred to the debt service fund which includes \$2.25 million for the purchase of a parcel on the Gulf next to East Gulf Place and \$870,000 for Gulf Shores City Schools' fourth quarter expenses. Gulf Shores City Schools will also get \$1.4 million for 2018 appropriation not used. King said some of that would be repaid to the city when the system starts getting revenue in December from taxes earmarked for schools.

Other expenses to be covered by the overage are \$134,000 for public relations and events advertising, \$77,000 for fire department overtime and \$12,000 for police department repairs and maintenance.

Councilman Jason Dyken, chairman of the city's Finance Committee said his committee gave the budget amendment an in-depth study.

"The expenses we incurred were totally expected including the school system expense," Dyken said. "In fact, the school system we knew was going to have some upfront costs because their money comes in but lags behind. This is all expected and I think everything is within what we

anticipated."

On the lodging tax change, a bill passed in the 2019 legislative session changed how they are collected for a variety of spaces.

"We need to amend our city code to align with new state changes," Marcy Kichler of the Finance Department told the council. "Effective Oct. 1 the amendment exempts spaces that are supplied for tents, motorhomes, campers, boats and RVs from lodging tax when they are provided for 90 consecutive days or more. Prior to the passage of the act, they were only exempt after 180 days so we will lose some lodging tax because of that."

City administrator Steve Griffin said how much that will be is yet to be determined.

"We have no idea what our revenue impact is going to be on this because snow-birds get in that sweet spot of 90 days so how many of these I don't know," Griffin said. "We're going to be watching that closely."

During the meeting, the council also:

- Gave Southern Lights a three-year contract to provide 500 megabytes of internet service to city facilities at a rate of \$2,000 a month. Those facilities include city hall and the Public Works shop.
- Awarded the annual sod bid to two companies, Woerner Turf and Craft Turf Farms. The contract is for one year with an option to renew for two more after the first year.
- OK'd an assembly permit for PALS for the 32nd annual Alabama Coastal Cleanup. Over the course of the cleanups more than 1.6 million pounds of trash has been removed from coastal areas including 38,000 pounds in 2018 with more than 5,000 volunteers. Locations in Gulf Shores are Gulf Place at Second Street East and Mo's Landing on Fort Morgan Road.
- OK'd an assembly permit for Gulf Coast Regional Volleyball Series. The gatherings will begin at Gulf Place on Oct. 5 and run through November of 2020.
- OK'd an assembly permit for Springhill College's tournament at Gulf Place on Oct. 25-26.
- OK'd an assembly permit for the 12th annual Hangout Oyster Cook-Off, Craft Spirits and Beer weekend.
- Reappointed of David Mayfield to the Beautification Board to serve a full term of three years ending on Sept. 1, 2022.



State waiting for permit to start new G.S. Intracoastal Bridge

The traditionally slow process of procuring permitting from the Army Core of Engineers is slowing progress on the state's plan to build a span over the Intracoastal Waterway near Jack Edwards Airport in Gulf Shores.

Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) Assistant Southwest Engineer Brian Aaron thought there was an end in sight for the issuance of the permit, but the federal agency came back with more questions instead.

"We were hoping to get it," Aaron said. "There was some additional information requested after the fact and we had to go back and do a little bit of information gathering for the Corps. But it is in the works at this time. We're hopeful that we should be getting something from them in the next 30 days."

Then it goes to the Coast Guard, which in the past has been a little more efficient with its processing than the Corps.

"They typically get 30 days as well on their review," Aaron said. "We're in the process of doing a navigational study for the Coast Guard and they will wrap up soon. The good thing is there's no piers in the water, the bridge is actually higher than the bridges to the east and west of it, so I don't really anticipate any hurdles

The next letting for Sept. 27 is out and the only Baldwin work on it are handrail projects for the Styx River Bridge on County Road 87, Hoyle Bryars Road over Interstate 65 and on Scranage Road over Horseneck Creek.

As the delays mount, Aaron said the bid letting for the bridge and the northern part of the project — a road from the Foley Beach Express to County Road 4 — could possibly be in the same month.

"We were trying to get the bridge first, but it's possible that both of them happen simultaneously," Aaron said.


There is still some land acquisition going on in the northern section, but Aaron said it's likely to wrap up soon.

"We have everything ongoing except for one tract that we are trying to get resolved," Aaron said. "That right of way should be completely finished by the time we get through this Corps process and this Coast Guard process.







Walk-in memory loss testing in O.B., Foley & G.S. this fall

Free memory screenings and balance testing is being offered in Gulf Shores, Orange Beach, Fairhope, Foley and Daphne this fall. The program, with the help and guidance of the Alzheimer's Foundation of America, was started locally in 2015 when 60 volunteers based at GlenLakes Golf Club, organized and began offering TESTING 1, 2, 3 services to anyone who wishes to be tested. A discounted golf coupon (\$35 per round anytime for up to 4 players) at Glenlakes will be presented to each participant.

Over 93 percent of those tested have never had a memory test. When the vast majority finds out their memory loss is normal age related memory loss, they are relieved.

During balance testing, seniors are shown simple exercises they can

do at home to improve their balance. Volunteers are all are trained for and experienced in running vents.

A Steering Committee oversees every event.

In addition to holding major events in the Fall (primarily for locals) and in February (primarily for Snowbirds), TESTING 1, 2, 3 will come to any organization which works with seniors and offer its services.

There is never a cost associated with these events and if an organization wants to hold a private event for its residents, members, etc. TESTING 1, 2, 3 will be glad to work with them.

Nutria season in Perdido?

A large nutria was found dead near the Theo Baars Bridge earlier this year and others have been spotted from time to time in marshy areas of Perdido Key.

If you see nutria, please contact Rick O'Connor, Escambia County's Sea Grant Representative at roc1@ufl.edu or enter the sighting into the data base at EDDMapS.org (contact Rick for assistance with the data base if needed).

Nutria (Myocastor coypus) are large rodents resembling beaver but with round tails. They are an invasive species introduced into the United States from South America perhaps a hundred years ago, generally for their fur. In the wild, they live near fresh or brackish water and can devastate large areas of marshland because of their rapid reproduction and voracious appetite for aquatic vegetation. They may also host a variety of pathogens. The nutria population in Louisiana reportedly went from 20 individuals to 20 million in just two decades; they are also present along the Mobile Bay watershed, but seem controlled in fresh water areas by alligators.

Navy Cove Oyster Co. will bring its famed bivalves to the party

Bell-E's Bacon. Books. Craft Beer. Music. Navy Cove Oysters. Football on TV. What is not to like about a book signing by Chef Irv Miller of Jackson's in Pensacola on Saturday, September 14 beginning at 4 p.m. at Page & Pallette Book Store in downtown Fairhope.

It's been said Gulf Coast oysters have the cleanest taste of any oyster, that they taste of the sea and not much else, and for that reason they should be the oysters against which all others should be meas-

Gulf Coast Oysters: Classic & Modern Recipes for a Southern Renaissance is the latest cookbook from Miller. Beautifully photographed and replete with mouth-watering recipes, th book is a joyful and thorough exploration of Gulf oyster culture while also putting a fresh, modern spin on preparing "panhandle pearls."

Gulf Coast Oysters also focuses on preserving the Gulf's cross-cultural, Southern traditions and a goal of creating new interest in seafood-sustainable products. Miller's years of hands-on experience of modernizing the way the Florida Panhandle thinks about food, as well as his support of sustainable food-producing practices, has provided him a unique perspective for telling the story of the ever-changing food scene along the Gulf Coast.

Also served at the event will be Navy Cove Oysters, a company founded in 2011 out of a long-term friendship and working relationship between marine science researchers Dr. John Supan and Dr.

Charles Wilson.

Eric Bradley, raised on a crawfish farm in south Louisiana, joined the partnership in 2016. The partners sought to join a growing movement along the coastal regions of the Southern US and Gulf of Mexico to produce boutique, prized oysters for the half-shell market.

The Navy Cove Oyster Farm is located along the northern shore of Fort Morgan near its namesake body of water, which was frequented by Indians, an anchorage for pirates, and then the U.S. Navy during

the War of 1812 and WWII.

The site rests at the intersection of the productive waters of Mobile Bay and the salty waters of the Gulf of Mexico. So, Navy Cove Oysters are constantly bathed by tidal exchanges between the gulf and bay. Its oysters are characterized by an umami of moderate brine, a rich, creamy, buttery texture and sweet, cucumber-like finish. Our oysters carry the signature of a prominent "racing stripe" across the shell surface. They are easy to shuck with a bill or hinge oyster knife.

The company targets the production of a medium-size oyster of moderate salinity. But smaller and larger sizes and higher or lower salt content are available. Oysters can be ordered through Bon Secour Fisheries in Bon Secour. Info: Navycoveoysters.com.

Al. state parks offer adventures from Tensaw Delta to Pinhoti Trail

From a shaded retreat on John's Bay in the Mobile-Tensaw Delta to the boardwalk atop the highest mountain in the state, the Alabama State Parks System offers an incredible diversity of nature's wonders to explore.

Just north of the point where the Mobile-Tensaw Delta and Mobile Bay converge, Meaher State Park offers a respite from the hustle and bustle that can be seen in the distance on the Bayway crowded with frustrated travelers. Tall pine trees blanket the 1,300-acre park that borders the Delta's biologically rich John's Bay to the south and Ducker Bay to the east.

According to Anna Bryant, Meaher's park superin-

tendent, visitors head to the park with their travel trailers in tow, attracted to the shade on the water's edge.

A native of Auburn, Bryant came to love the area while teaching environmental education for two conservation organizations and jumped at the Meaher job about a year ago.

^aI enjoy being in the outdoors," Bryant said. "I love the water. I didn't grow up near the beach. But the water and flora and fauna here at Meaher is a very therapeutic place for me. That is a bonus of this job for me."

Callie Thornton, the assistant park superintend-

ent at Cheaha State Park, finds her therapy in the mountains, and Cheaha, completely surrounded by the Talladega National Forest in northeast Alabama, is the perfect location for her.

Already a dedicated backpacker before she took the job at Cheaha a year ago, Thornton now gets to share her love of hiking with an abundance of park visitors and fellow hikers.

"What attracted me to Cheaha was the mountain and the Pinhoti Trail," said Thornton, the former Town Clerk at Rockford, Ala. "I wanted to be able to teach others how to backpack, the importance of being outdoors and inspiring others to love the outdoors.

"I've been backpacking for about 12 years now, doing anything and everything adventurous. I've done more than 1,000 miles backpacking, so now I teach backpacking courses. And a lot of people are scared of camping. My goal is to teach people to not be afraid of being in the outdoors."

Thornton's instructions include camp cooking, first aid, what's needed in your backpack and, possibly more important, what's not.

"I've been able to get my backpack down to 27 pounds for a seven-day trip," she said. "If people will bring me their backpack, I will go through it and divide and conquer, as I say. I advise them on what kind of gear they need as far as shoes and clothing. A lot of people think they need to take multiple days of clothes. If you pick the right gear, you might need an extra pair of socks, but you don't need anything else.

"I had a friend with me on one trip who had 60 pounds in her backpack. She was really suffering. While we were on the trip I went through her bag. When we got to the next station, I told her to take this and that out and put it in the hiker box or mail it home. I've learned through experience about a lot of things, like blisters and how to deal with them and how to protect your feet. A lot of it is simple stuff that I want to pass on to make the person's trip a lot better the next time around."

At one time, Cheaha was the southern terminus of Thornton's beloved Pinhoti Trail. That terminus has since been moved about 60 miles south to Flagg Mountain. The Pinhoti Trail covers about 170 miles in Alabama and 166 miles in Georgia before it connects with the Appalachian Trail. Hikers can also gain access to the Eastern Continental Trail that transits the entire eastern U.S.

Thornton, also president of the Alabama Pinhoti Trail Association, hopes to bring more exposure to Alabama's Pinhoti segment.

"We don't get a lot of publicity on the Alabama Pinhoti Trail," she said. "Georgia's trail gets a lot, but Alabama's doesn't. It could be a big tourism booster for Alabama.

"My goal is to raise the awareness of the Alabama section of the trail. People don't know that it also is a connector from Key West (Fla.) all the way to Maine."

On a hot summer day, a bonus of being at Cheaha is the weather.

"It's about 10 degrees cooler on the mountain," Thornton said. "Sometimes it's more than that, depending on the wind. When I got here last May (2017), I was freezing to death. We can sit in the restaurant and see the weather around us. If I see a storm coming and we've got people in the pool, I can go get them out. The good thing is, most of the time, the bad stuff goes around us."

Another attraction for Cheaha visitors is the solitude of the mountain, which is 2,407 feet above sea level, the highest in the state. A variety of accommodations await, from cabins and chalets to improved and primitive camping.

"A lot of people come to Cheaha to disconnect," Thornton said. "If you want to get away from it all, if you want to get away from your telephone, your Wi-Fi, this is where you come. Once you come around the curves on (Hwy.) 281, you lose your connections. I just got a call

from a man who said he was ready to get away from work. People disconnect and they go hiking, swimming and enjoy the restaurant. They come to hike. They come to see the wildlife, the deer and turkeys. We have a lot of birdwatchers who come to the park. We have gemmining for the kids and a lot of interpretive nature programs for the whole family."

Now hop in your vehicle, come down the mountain and head south about 260 miles to Meaher State Park to experience Alabama's coastal plains and the expansive Mobile-Tensaw Delta.

Meaher offers 61 improved campsites, 10 improved tent sites, a couple of primitive tent sites and four cabins. Two more cabins will be available later this year.

Bryant said Meaher appeals to campers in a couple of different ways.

"We're kind of a quiet park," she said. "We don't have a pool or tennis courts or facilities that some of the bigger parks have. The fact that people can come and relax, see the sunsets and see the water is a big attraction for our overnight guests. But we also have a lot of day visitors who love to fish. We have a fishing pier and a boat launch. They can canoe and kayak or take their motor boat into the Delta or Mobile Bay. We have the Gateway to the Delta boardwalk that allows visitors to see the Delta from a different perspective.

Because of its size, Meaher doesn't have a park naturalist, but Bryant has been able to utilize the environmental programs from Gulf State Park and 5 Rivers – Alabama Delta Resource Center, which is located directly across the Mobile Causeway from Meaher.

"The last program we had was a reptile show that 5 Rivers conducted," Bryant said. "They brought native snakes and turtles to show our guests."

Bryant will soon be involved in a park expansion, thanks to a \$3.5 million award from the Deepwater Horizon's oil spill through the RESTORE Act.

"Our hope is to expand not only RV sites but add a couple more cabins and possibly another fishing pier," she said. "We're still in the process of finalizing our plans. We want to offer our visitors a gamut of options from just relaxing to enjoying the Delta."










