

Everyone is and can be involved. This is also about bringing a community together to show love and hope for the women, their caregivers, and their families.



City to subsidize emergency transportation program Citizens can buy air-ground membership w. AirMedCare

The City of Gulf Shores is going to spend about \$163,000 in a public-private partnership to provide an air and ground emergency transportation membership program for residents starting in 2020.

Mayor Robert Craft said the plan is another way of giving Gulf Shores citizens advanced health care. Residents would be able to pay \$45 a year – \$35 for those 60 and older – in a membership with AirMedCare company. (Info: 800- 793-0010).

They would then receive no bills for transport in an emergency situation as long as one of the company's aircraft or ambulances respond to your home or accident scene. MedStar is part of the company and covers the entire county with

the exception of Orange Beach which has its own ambulance service.

AirMedCare operates two aircraft in the county and is the primary provider for emergency air service. Two other services owned by Air Methods have helicopters based in Semmes and Pensacola and back up AirMedCare if both of their helicopters are in service.

With passage of the resolution through an amendment to the 2020 budget the service will be available to residents on Oct. 1.

"They are the exclusive ground ambulance provider in Baldwin County, who also operates two medical helicopters," according to a city report.

"Together we have found a solution that we feel will greatly benefit the citizens of Gulf Shores who live within the corporate limits. Residents would be covered under an AirMedCare Network membership when transported by Medstar Air Care 1 and Medstar Emergency Medical services Global Medical Response."

It's not insurance but a membership AirMedCare's Wes McAden said. And the coverage is good for a Gulf Shores member anywhere in the county. It covers everyone living at the address where the membership is signed up for.

"The city was looking for a solution in

terms of how to help with the high cost of air ambulance service and that kind of rolled over into the cost associated with ground ambulance service as well," McAden told the council at a Sept. 16 work session. "The air side of it we've done numerous times. The ground component is something that relatively new in terms of combining it with the air membership."

McAden said two companies AirMedCare is a subsidiary of are Air Medical Group Holdings which is the largest air medical network in the world and American Medical Response is the largest ground ambulance provider in the United States.

Mayor Robert Craft said the plan is another way of giving Gulf Shores citizens advanced health care. The city is now working with South Baldwin Regional Medical Hospital to build a freestanding emergency room in Gulf Shores near the airport.

"This is an advantage for living in the City of Gulf Shores," Craft said. "We've made some significant strides for families with kids that live in Gulf Shores and opportunities that didn't exist previously. As our folks tend to grow more families and create a more family-friendly place to live this is a way to layer on that for families in the city limits that do not have kids."

During the meeting, the council also:

• OK'd changes in the city code concerning micro-breweries and brewpubs to align with changes in Alabama regulating the businesses. The definition is changed to manufacturer of liquor, beer and/or wine. It removes the requirement for brewpubs to be located in a historic district or in an economically distressed area. Lastly, it removes the size of equipment and production limitations.

• Amended city code to make it illegal for seaplanes to land on Little Lagoon.

• Passed a resolution allowing Sky Warriors Flight Training to provide flight instruction for the Navy Initial Flight School Program currently provided by others. The city will receive 2 percent of the gross revenues or a minimum of \$100 per month. The contract starts Oct. 1.

• Set the court dates for the Municipal Court of Gulf Shores for 2020.

• OK'd the assembly permit on Oct. 1 for the Gulf Shores Police Department's annual National Night Out at Pelican Place.

• OK'd the assembly permit for the 48th Annual National Shrimp Festival.

City will pursue adding commercial terminal to airport

The landing strip at Jack Edwards Airport in Gulf Shores has had the runway space to land planes as large as 737s for a few years.

"We've been able to since the last runway project we just didn't have any place to park them until we finished this apron," Airport Authority Manager Scott Fuller said.

On Sept. 12 the Gulf Shores Airport Authority began steps toward developing that apron into a terminal capable of parking and unloading two or three passenger airplanes. There's room for six but the initial phase is looking to plan, design and build two or three of the first gates. Gulf Shores Airport Authority Manager Scott Fuller says the facility is making plans for a passenger terminal. "What we can do now is we can accommodate charters with the existing facilities but for scheduled service, we don't have a terminal so that's the next phase," Fuller said. "I've been talking to the airlines for a couple of years. But the next step is to let them know when the terminal will be ready and try to get a letter of intent from them in order for us to get grant funds to help build this thing."

It's part of a whole program of exciting projects in and around the airport including continuing work on getting a \$4.6 million control tower built.

"Initiating the design of a new control tower and commercial airline terminal is an exciting step forward," Mayor Robert Craft said. "The continued growth of our airport is a critical factor in providing enhanced economic development opportunities for our entire community."

Gulf Shores has spent about \$1.2 million to improve roads at the airport and inside the Business and Aviation Park. City officials have their fingers crossed for a grant application through the Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Transportation Discretionary Grant Program that is dedicated to rail, transit and port projects. If approved the city would have to come up with about \$8 million of the total \$23 million estimated for the project.

"The others will be tying into the new Waterway District and the new expressway," Fuller said. "That's still under the federal BUILD program they are trying to get now. The \$1.2 million is just for the interior road which will go to the road to the terminal and to complete the loop around the Business and Aviation Park."

If the BUILD application is successful, it will give the airport access to the Foley Beach Express via the new road and bridge project the Alabama Department of Transportation is building due east of the airport.

Fuller said the cost of the new terminal is not determined yet but the authority is moving forward with preliminary plans that will give them an idea on price.

"We've done an agreement with Barge, which is our airport engineer, to go ahead and do a conceptual design of the terminal," Fuller said. "That's about a 60- to 90-day project. What we need to do based on the amount of passengers, the space, the needs of the TSA and everything else how big this thing should be, the layout, come up with a good budget for the facility."

The authority has had money set aside for years earmarked for terminal construction and finally is ready to move forward with those plans.

"We've had a placeholder on the capital improvement program for 20 years now of about \$3.5 million for the terminal," Fuller said. "We don't even know if that's anywhere near what we need right now based on today's numbers. We set up the terminal project in our capital fund, transferred some money over from reserves to start it.

"The main thing is now we're doing that conceptual design and as soon as we get that back it will say here's where it's going, here's what it's going to look like, here's how much it's going to cost. Our next step would be to go ahead and move forward with the design, the bid specs, get ready to bid and the actual construction."

Getting one or two airlines onboard will be a big help when the authority starts seeking funding for the terminal. Part of that plan, Fuller said, was sending info to the website, AviationPros.com.

"The minute we have a letter of intent from an airline we want to be ready, we want to be moving," Fuller said. "That will give us some ammunition to go to the FAA and say we need this much money to help. The next thing I expect to get is calls from who's coming in there and that starts the negotiations. That's basically getting the word out to the airlines that we're ready, come talk to us."

City denies request to change parcel from single family to PUD

Two weeks prior it was a moment of disagreement rarely seen between councilmembers at the Sept. 3 Orange Beach City Council work session meeting.

Developer Greg Kennedy was asking to combine two Gulf-front lots into one planned unit development at the west end of beach road for a phase 2 of his Hammock Dunes project. Kennedy bought the western of the two lots and added 11 cottages to the site which already had two homes on it.

His request was to add 12 more of the cottages on the east side which already has a 10-bedroom vacation rental home on the part closest to the water. The two lots would have been connected via a U-shaped one-way driveway with an en-

trance and exit on beach road. On Sept. 3 it appeared headed for a 4-2 vote for his request to rezone the parcel from single-family residential to become part of the planned unit development of Hammock Dunes. **Councilmembers** Jeff Silvers. Jerry Johnson and Jeff Boyd and Mayor Tony Kennon appeared poised to vote in favor. Councilmembers Joni Costo and Annette Mitchell

were adamantly opposed.

But on Sept. 17 the council and mayor voted against the project 4-1 with Silvers abstaining because Kennedy is a customer of Swift Supply where he is the sales manager.

Boyd was the only council member voting for the project with Kennon and council members Costo, Johnson and Mitchell voting against.

Problems arose because of a pledge councilmembers and Kennon made to never rezone or upzone any parcel zoned for single-family housing in Orange Beach. The property in question owned by the Kern family is an oasis of singlefamily housing.

"The Kern's property is the only RS-1 property amid higher-intensity zoning," City Planner Griffin Powell said. "To the east is the Phoenix West PUD condominium with 225 units. Hammock Dunes PUD (Phase I) and Nordic Village PUD are to the west, and across the street to the north is General Business zoning. The singlefamily detached dwellings in the Nordic Village PUD are primarily for vacation rentals. To my knowledge, there are no full-time residents living there." Kennon said on Sept. 17 he didn't feel he could go against the recommendation of the Planning Commission which unanimously gave an unfavorable recommendation on the project.

"I struggled with it last week," Kennon said. "It's as good a project as it gets and a good place to absolve this would be it but I just can't support it because it didn't get a recommendation from the planning commission and I value those guys."

On Sept. 3, Planning Commission member Bill Jeffries said the commission's vote was based on the pledge not to rezone any residential properties in the city. Both Costo and Mitchell said in the same meeting they made their pledge and would honor it. Both Silvers and Johnson spoke in favor of the project on Sept. 3 but only Ken-

non spoke on the project prior to the Sept. 17 vote.

"If there was ever a time I'd be willing to upzone it would be this because of what sits next to it on both sides," Boyd said on Sept. 3. "Not just one (parcel) but continuously. It just makes sense at this location."

Even though it is zoned residential now because it's in the beach overlay district vacation rentals are allowed.

"When we discussed it my only point was their option of where they sit, they could build a monstrosity of a home that would have a greater impact and would not be as near a value to the community and would not look as nice," Boyd said. "If I was going to do a PUD on the beach for that type of zoning that would be the only place I'd say it would work."

Kennedy told the council, also at the Sept. 3 meeting, that he would agree to denying a PUD for a residential lot if it was surrounded by other residential parcels.

"I live here and my business is here," Kennedy said. "I get not upzoning property especially as it relates to a conventional neighborhood. This is not a conventional neighborhood. You have extreme high density on one side, higher density on the other and commercial across the street and this property zoned single-family residential. If you consider this house the use has never been single-family residential but it's really a small hotel."

Costo said she didn't want to be a part of starting residential rezonings and would stand by her pledge to not rezone residential parcels in the city.

"Because we have said we are not going to upzone, I have to look at my residents that we've been saying this too for the last few years and say well this time it's OK but this time it's not," Costo said. "I can't do that. It's a slippery slope."

The last time the city council changed zoning from residential to a planned unit development was for 22-lot Harbor Ridge, Powell said. With the residential zoning the developer could have still put in 22 houses but the PUD was used to save trees for a common area. The subdivision is located north of the Terry Cove pool.

During the regular session, the council: • Entered into a coyote wildlife management plan agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture to address damage by the animals in certain parts of the city.

• Approved a beer and wine license for Murphy Oil Express in the Walmart shopping center parking lot.

• Held a public hearing for Cotton Bayou Cottages planned unit development on the north side of beach road across from the Admiral Quarters. The builders are proposing a total of 34 units with 14 three-bedroom units, 14 five-bedroom units and six six-bedroom units.

• Held a public hearing on the planning unit development for The Bluffs of Orange Beach for a 10-cottage development on the Gulf at the end of Alabama 161 at the main beach intersection in town. Planned are one one-bedroom unit, six four-bedroom units, two five-bedroom unit and one six-bedroom unit.

• Held a public hearing on the planned unit development for Robinson Grove on Walker Key Drive on Canal Road just south of the city's recreation complex. Owner Greg Kennedy plans to build a 14-lot single-family home subdivision l and boat access to Terry Cove.

• OK'd a resolution authorizing the mayor to sign a \$19,800 change order with Hughes Plumbing & Utility Contractors for the fire break force main project.

• OK'd a resolution authorizing the execution of an FY 2019 Port Security Program Grant award agreement for a CBRNE Maritime Response Vessel for the Fire Department. The total project cost is estimated at \$998,535 with the city's matching share of \$249,634 or 25 percent. During the work session, the council discussed:

• Adjustments to school zone speed limits on Wilson Boulevard and Canal Road.

• A business license application by Fins and Family Fishing for live bait sales from a floating platform.

• A resolution authorizing the execution of an auditing services agreement with RiverTree Systems.

• A resolution authorizing the execution of a nocost extension to the Fixed Price Research Agreement with Auburn University.

• Setting a public hearing date for an amendment to the Pandion Ridge RV park's planned unit development on Oct. 15.

Congress passes bipartisan bill to ban drilling in Florida Gulf

The USA Today Network reported that The U.S. House of Representatives passed a bipartisan bill, known as the Protecting and Securing Florida's Coastline Act that will permanently ban offshore drilling off of Florida's Gulf Coast.

The bill, co-sponsored by nine Republican and nine Democrat congressmen, would make permanent the moratorium put in place after the 2010 BP oil spill. The final vote tally was 248-180. The moratorium is currently set to expire in 2022.

The current moratorium was enacted by Republican President George W. Bush, with the bipartisan support of both United States senators from Florida, Mel Martinez and Bill Nelson, said bill sponsor, U.S. Rep. Francis Rooney of Venice.

"Deepwater Horizon may be the most infamous disaster that spewed oil into our Gulf, however there are many occurrences of leaks still happening, such as the Taylor Energy spill, which has dumped over one million gallons of oil over 14 years," Rep. Rooney said.

Rep. Matt Gaetz, who represents the western Florida Panhandle, said is incomprehensible that a drilling moratorium would not be imposed in an area where experimental missiles are tested and launched.

"Our military has no better location to carry out these exercises and there is no compelling reason to place drilling interests ahead of military necessities," Rep. Rooney added.

President Donald Trump signed an executive order in 2017 to begin the five year process to open drilling back up in the Gulf of Mexico.

În January 2018, Trump administration officials said that the waters off Florida's Gulf coast would be excluded from the plan, but no definitive policy was ever issued, according to the USA Today Network story penned by Jim Little.

"The November 2018 ballot contained a ban on offshore drilling, Amendment 9, which won with more than 68 percent voting in favor of the measure," Rep. Rooney said. "This widespread support should indicate to the entire Florida delegation, and members of both parties and both chambers, that voters overwhelmingly support making the current moratorium permanent."

Rooney's bill now goes to the Senate, where Florida Republican Sen. Marco Rubio is sponsoring a similar bill. Rubio's bill would only extend the ban until 2027.

"Hopefully, Florida Senators Marco Rubio and Rick Scott can lead this legislation to a successful Senate vote and President Trump will fulfill his commitment to protect Florida's environment and make HR 205 law," Rep. Rooney said. "The 21 million Floridians are depending on them. We must act now to safeguard the Eastern Gulf and our way of life in Florida."





The possession limit is two fish per person with a minimum size limit of 16 inches total length. Anglers are reminded that as of September 1, 2019, any angler age 16 and older must have a Reef Fish Endorsement to possess any species of Gulf reef fish. Landing estimates are derived from mandatory angler reports submitted through Alabama's Snapper Check Program. Anglers are reminded that greater amberjack is available for voluntary reporting through the Snapper Check app.

The walks will start at the Gator Lake trailhead located off of Mobile Street. Come prepared to walk over 2 miles, in the soft sand, with minimal shade. Water and bug spray are highly suggested.

The refuge is also hostin an Oct. 15 Ask a Naturalist evnt from 2:30-3:30 p.m. at the Mobile Street boardwalk. Ask one of the refuge naturalists questions you may have about the native habitats, flora, and fauna at the refuge.

State Highway 135 to close for three months for repairs Road through Gulf State Park will be open during Shrimp Fest

State Highway 135 through Gulf State Park will undergo necessary improvements and repairs from Sept. 24 until Christmas Eve. The road will be closed to all vehicles, hikers and bikers beginning Sept. 24, but will reopen Oct. 9-14 during the 48th Annual National Shrimp Festival.

The work being done during the closure will include a shift of the center line, re-striping, and installing a federally approved railing system, and repairs to the bridge. When the road reopens, users will see a further separation of vehicles from pedestrian and bike lanes.

"We are pleased that the contractors and project managers for these improvements worked with us to make the road accessible during the Shrimp Festival," said Gulf Shores Mayor Robert Craft "And, we have been assured that the time frame for the closure of the road is a 'worst-case scenario,' and with good weather the road should reopen sooner than Christmas Eve.'

With the closure, all through traffic will be detoured via Highway 59 to East Beach Boulevard (Highway 182). Gulf State Park campground visitors must access the campground via Highway 59 to East Beach Boulevard and enter from the south. Orange Beach traffic should consider using East Canal Drive to Highway 161 as an alternate route.

All Gulf State Park facilities will remain open and accessible throughout the construction period including trailheads to the Hugh S. Branyon Backcountry Trail and The Lodge at Gulf State Park. 





ALDOT begins next phase of road widening project on Canal Rd.

The eastboound portion of major road widening project on Canal Rd. from The Foley Express to Orange Beach Blvd. (Hwy. 161) has started. The scope of the project includes installing an additional 2.3 miles of roadway. Work consists of utility relocations as well as clearing, placing drainage, paving, and striping. When complete this stretch of Canal Rd. will be a five-lane highway with a designated two-way center turn lane. Motorists can expect occasional, nightly and daytime restricted lane closures during this project.

During the first phase of construction, a portion of the westbound, outside lane between ACE Hardware and Cosmo's will be closed from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays beginning September 23, for roughly two weeks as drainage installation is performed. Afterwards, motorists can expect nightly lane closures for the westbound outside lane from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. as crews perform several pipe crossing installations.

The \$7.9 million-dollar contract was awarded to John G Walton Construction Co., Inc. and is expected to be complete by December 2020.

- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 4 skinned and boned chicken breast halves
- 1 cup whipping cream
- 1-2 tsp. stone-ground mustard
- 1/4 tsp. ground red pepper

Combine champagne and broth in a large heavy skillet; bring to a boil. Add chicken; cover, reduce heat, and simmer 10 to 12 min. or until tender. Remove chicken from skillet; set aside. Stir whipping cream, mustard, and pepper into skillet. Cook over medium heat 8-10 min. or until thickened, stirring occasionally. Add chicken to skillet, and cook until thoroughly heated. Yield: 4 servings.



Wild & Scenic Film Fest Sept. 29 at Five Rivers Delta Resource Center

The Alabama Coastal Foundation and Our Coastal South will jointly host a Sunday-Funday Wild & Scenic Film Festival on September 29 from 1-4 p.m. at the Five Rivers Delta Resource Center's Tensaw The fest's selected environmental films were produced to not only raise awareness and awe of the natural world around us, but evoke activism and inspire people to submit their own film to the festival. Just off the coast of Gulf Shores, an ancient forest swarms with sea life. How did it get there?

The Underwater Forest, a locally filmed and produced short documentary by Ben Raines, is not a part of the Wild & Scenic Film Library, and is presented by This is Alabama.

The documentary details the discovery and exploration of an ancient cypress forest found sixty feet underwater in the Gulf of Mexico, just 10 miles due south of Gulf Shores.

The forest dates to an ice age more than 60,000 years ago, when sea levels were about 400 feet lower than they are today. The forest appears to be a wholly unique relic of our planet's past, the only known site where a coastal ice age forest this old has been preserved in place.

It is considered a treasure trove of information, providing new insights into everything from climate in the region to annual rainfall, insect populations, and the types of plants that inhabited the Gulf Coast before humans arrived in the new world. Scientific analysis of the site is ongoing.

The documentary follows the work of the team investigating the site, both underwater and in the laboratory. The film was written and directed by AL.com's Raines, who also filmed the underwater sequences and organized the first scientific missions to the site.

The scientists believe the forest was buried beneath the Gulf sediments for eons, until giant waves driven by Hurricane Ivan in 2004 uncovered it.

Raines and AL.com collected the first samples from the site, and participated in every scientific mission to the site, beginning in 2012. Dropping 10 fathoms down, below the green waves of the Gulf and back in time to this prehistoric world amounts to a sort of time traveler's journey.

Nothing like the forest, in terms of age or scale, has ever been found. The oxygen-free underwater environment has hermetically sealed the trees in a sort of natural time capsule.

Join the first scientists and film crew to visit the site as they unlock the secrets of the past beneath the Gulf of Mexico.

An investigative reporter for AL.com, Raines has covered environmental issues and natural wonders in Alabama for nearly two decades. He wrote and produced the documentary America's Amazon, which has been distributed to public schools across Alabama and is airing on PBS stations around the country. His underwater film work has appeared in documentaries on the Discovery Channel and National Geographic TV. He is a graduate of New York University's Tisch School of the Arts with a degree in filmmaking, and is a U.S. Coast Guard-licensed captain. He and his wife and son live in Fairhope.

Census 2020 outreach begins in Orange Beach

Mayor Tony Kennon and the Orange Beach City Council recently proclaimed their partnership with the U.S. Census Bureau to ensure a full and accurate count in 2020.

"Residents are strongly encouraged to participate in order to help the city receive state and federal benefits that are commensurate with the true population of Orange Beach," the city stated in a proclamation.

Jean E. Hogue, U.S. Census representative for Baldwin County, noted that the \$400 billion per year in federal and state funding quoted in the proclamation has actually gone up to over \$674 billion and said Alabama is in jeopardy of losing not just one but two U.S. House seats.

"That will be the least amount of representation that we've had since 1970," Hogue said. "So it's crucial that we have people in the community take the Census."

Orange Beach, as well as other municipalities, has formed its own committee to help spread the word about Census participation.

Some Čensus workers are currently canvasing neighborhoods to verify addresses but the actually count will not begin until early in 2020 with a deadline of April 1, 2020 to submit census forms.




