City takes steps to shape future of beach district Landscaping, travel lanes, enhanced street parking, sidewalks planned

During a city council meeting on Oct. 28, Gulf Shores officials gave details of how the \$424,000 they will pay Volkert will help shape the beach district for years to come.

"We need to start thinking about how we can begin turning streets back into places—into destinations for culture, creativity and community."

"We need to start thinking about how we can begin turning streets back into places—into destinations for culture, creativity and community," the report said. "(The goal is to create a sense of place and maximize the right-ofway for the greatest public benefit. Among the upgrades would be improvement to stormwater management in the district, better-defined travel lanes. in-

creased and enhanced on-street parking, improving landscaping and make sidewalks throughout the area wider.

"It is not sufficient to design and build streets that are merely functional and safe for automobiles," the report states. "We should align our greatest public asset with our economic goals because they are bound together. In an age when people are more mobile than ever, and cities and businesses compete to attract talent, residents, and tourists, great streets are essential to boosting economic development and tourism."

Gulf Shores is taking advantage of two grants and some cash from the Embassy Suites hotel partnership to pay for about \$2 million of the total project, Public Works Director Mark Acreman said.

"We've been awarded an \$800,000 TAP grant for the sidewalk components," Acreman said. "We received a \$60,000 ACAMP grant for the master planning for the stormwater system. Then there is the \$1.2 million payment for parking improvements that will be provided through the Embassy Suites development agreement."

The district (**pictured**) stretches from East Second Street to West Second Street and from the beach to East Second Avenue and West Second Avenue.

Also during the meeting the council: • Selected Skipper Consulting and authorizing the mayor to sign their proposal to perform a Traffic Circulation Study for the proposed realignment of Canal Road (State Route 180) in an amount not to exceed \$31,800. This includes the area along State Route 180 from about East 16th Avenue west to the Regency Road intersection.

Retired an old firetruck and donating it to the cancer charity group Guardians of the Ribbon Lower Alabama Chapter. The group is dedicated to spreading the "Cares Enough to Wear Pink" Campaign, and they help raise awareness for all women and their families in their fight against cancer of any kind. Money raised is kept local to help our families as they fight disease.
Authorized staff to pursue the Rebuild Alabama 2020 Grant to secure up to \$250,000 in grant monies to fund the construction of a new mast arm signal at East Second Street and State Route 182.

• Approved a change order in a contract with Bagby & Russell Electric for \$41,000 to include some additional work to the \$1.5 million original contract signed in 2017 for signal work on State Route 182 from East Fourth Street to West Sixth Street. The new work included adjusting signals at East First Street to improve the alignment of the bike lanes, installing aluminum bases for controller cabinets, performing directional bores and installing conduit to all of the median islands for irrigation and palm tree up lighting and signal upgrades at State Route 135 to accommodate the Gulf State Park Lodge traffic.

• Issued assembly permits for Gulf Shores United Methodist Church for an annual family event at Meyer Park on Nov. 11 and for the Bama Beach Pickleball Club's tournament Nov. 15-17 at the tennis center.





Public input opportunity for Canal Rd. corridor study

Informational meeting scheduled Nov. 7 at Adult Activity Center

The City of Gulf Shores will host a Public Involvement Meeting for the Canal Road Corridor Study on Thursday, November 7, from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m. at the Adult Activity Center, located at 260 Clubhouse Drive. The purpose of the meeting is to provide the public an opportunity to participate in the development of the proposed project.

The previously shown roadway build alignments have been revised/modified as more engineering information has become available and in response to comments received from stakeholders and the public during the public involvement meeting held for the project in May.

A brief presentation will be given at 6 p.m. After the presentation, representatives from the City of Gulf Shores will be available at displays to discuss the proposed project and answer any questions.

The purpose of the proposed project is to improve connectivity and provide a transportation corridor that will better accommodate the existing and projected east-west traffic volumes through the study area. The need for the project is derived from the increased traffic congestion along SR 180 (Canal Road) and along the existing neighborhood streets.

Comment sheets will also be made available for those who would like to submit written statements. 

Canal Rd. widening project should be complete by Dec. of 2020

The widening of Canal Rd. in Orange Beach between Foley Beach Express and Orange Beach Blvd. (HW. 161) in Orange Beach began in September and the anticipated completion date is December 2020.

When complete, this portion of roadway, which carried an annual average of over 18,000 vehicles daily in 2018, will be a fivelane highway including a designated two-way turn lane. While there will be periods of lane closures and congestion in the work zone, when completed, the much needed project will better accommodate the volume of traffic this roadway carries during the spring break and summer tourism seasons. Utility, drainage, and construction work is being performed simultaneously along the route. The final wearing surface and permanent stripe and markings are added upon completion of project.



O.B. forms complete count committee ahead of 2020 Census

Orange Beach, like many municipalities in Alabama, has a Complete Count Committee in place to help the statewide effort to educate the public in Alabama about the importance of being counted in the upcoming 2020 Census.

Alabama Counts is a program emphasizing the need to ensure Alabama's population is accurately and fully counted. The state is at risk of losing federal funding, a congressional seat, and an Electoral College vote. These outcomes are based on projected results of the 2020 Census. The 22nd decennial census, mandated by the U.S. Constitution, begins on April 1, 2020. The census counts every person living in the United States. Business, industry, nonprofits, researchers, and governments use this information to understand and serve the public.

Orange Beach Counts Census 2020 booths have already been displayed at the Orange Beach Town Hall on Oct. 1, the Orange Beach Middle School football game against Gulf Shores Middle on Oct. 24 and other city functions.

Starting in mid-March 2020, Alabama households will receive a letter from the U.S. Census Bureau with instructions on completing 2020 census forms. The Census Bureau is encouraging an online response but will have a toll-free number for households to complete their information over the phone or request a traditional paper form. Additionally, Census takers will be hired to work in their communities and go door to door to help collect responses. The information collected during the census is confidential and cannot be used against a person by any group or agency.

The 35th annual Frank Brown International Songwriters' Fest spreads 200 songwriters in venues along the Florida / Alabama Gulf Coast for 11 days of listening pleasure beginning Nov. 7.

"Most of the time you don't know the person you are going to see. But you know their no. 1 hit," said fest director Andy Haynes. "Even more fun is when you hear a song that is a no. 1 six months later. It's a unique experience rather than a run of the mill concert."

Haynes, a fest volunteer for 16 years before taking the director's job in 2016, tips his hat to the founder, Joe Gilchrist. "We are sure lucky having Joe in our community doing what he does," he said.

"We hope to simply showcase the people that create the music and the magic," Gilchrist said. We are respectful. We're glad to provide a listening environment where they can play, and it's not background music. It's living music that professes emotions and feelings that all of us have, but very few of us know how to

express."

"Stories In Rhyme" hits its mark

Lynn Rabren and I both moved here in 1990. He was building boats. I was doing this. We met right away. Lynn didn't necessarily strike me as the kind of guy who was quick with a cry. But I did notice his lack of cynicism. And that was cool.

He mentioned that I would have to be heartless, a zombie even, if I did not cry at the preview screening of his most recent documentary at Gulf State Park's spectacular new campus.

Lynn utilizes footage he shot in 1992 as well as interviews he conducted last year for his new documentary: "Stories in Rhyme: The Songwriters of the Flora-Bama Lounge." He told me he got all verklempt just listening to the playbacks of songs he featured in

his film. I did not get dewey. But I did get nostalgic.

The film ends with beautiful songs written and performed by Ken Lambert, the 'Bama's first entertainer, and Larry T. Wilson.

Kenny sings with only Joe Gilchrist, Connie Blum and the camera as audience. It was filmed in 2018 in the Flora-Bama main room that John McInnis so painstakingly brought back to life.

Larry T.'s footage was from back 1992 in the same room. Singing through a Prince Valiant haircut, he nailed "No More Chasing" Rainbows." Chris Penise and John Joiner were on the same stage and, as always, they were in peak form. Other footage in the movie showed Lou Wamble playing with Mickey Newbury. There is also a great old shot of J Hawkins on the main room stage kissing Jim Hutcheson during "Pucker Up Dixie." Most folks forget that Hutch co-wrote that with Rusty McHugh.

Some were just cameos. Others were featured prominently. But in the film, I saw Vic Saul, Leanne Creswell, Donna Slater, Gove Scrivenor, Chris Newbury, Larry Butler, Peggy Butler, Brittney Grimes, Alan Rhody, Beverly Jo Scott and Bo Roberts, Darrell Roberts. And those are just a few who know what it's like to be in that main room at the right time. Listed as the documentary's executive producer, Joe Gilchrist is portrayed as a man who has remained - for the 40 plus years supporting the craft - convinced that music makes the world a better place. Joe has never wavered. And this film captures that.

Foley hosts Sun Belt Women's Soccer Championship Nov. 6-10 Defending champ South Alabma is again seeded no. 1 going in

After earning its fifth Sun Belt Conference regular season championship in the last six seasons, South Alabama will be the No. 1 seed at the 2019 Sun Belt Women's Soccer Championship held at the Foley Sports Tourism Complex from Wednesday, November 6 through Sunday, November 10. Admission to all matches is free.

The Jaguars won the regular-season title with a conference record of 8-1-1 (25 points) and is the tournament's top seed for the fifth time in program history.

Coastal Carolina (7-8-2, 5-4-1) enters the tournament as the No. 4 seed and faces No. 5 Georgia State (8-8-2, 5-4-1) in Wednesday night's finale at 7 p.m. CT.

All seven matches of the 2019 Sun Belt Women's Soccer Championship will be broadcast live on ESPN+. Fans can also follow the action via Twitter (@SunBelt) or through live stats available on SunBeltSports.org. Four matches take place on Wednesday, Nov. 6, with the four winners meeting in the semifinals on Friday, Nov. 8, starting at 4 p.m. CT. The Sun Belt Women's Soccer Championship match takes place on Sunday, Nov. 10, at 1 p.m. CT.

Butterfly walks thru Nov. 16 at Bon Secour Refuge

Guided monarch butterfly walks continue at Bon Secour National Wildlife Refuge on Wednesdays and Saturdays through November 16. Walks begin at 10 a.m. at the Gator Lake Trailhead located off of Mobile St.

The butterfly tours are free and reservations are required. Tours are limited to 12 people and each tour will consist of a two hour round trip walk down one of the refuge trails. Binoculars are helpful but not required to enjoy the tours. Restroom facilities are available at the refuge office and Pine Beach Trail.

Join refuge volunteer, Homer Singleton, as he leads participants along the Gator Lake Trail searching for this beautiful butterfly.

During the walk Homer will introduce you to the butterflies which pass through this area, their habitats and their life cycles. Participants will also be asked to help catch monarch butterflies so that they can receive tags that will allow scientists to track their migration. Participants should come prepared to walk over two miles in soft sand with minimal shade. Water and bug spray are highly suggested.

Impact 100 Baldwin presents \$101,000 in grants to non-profits

At its Annual Grant Awards on November 4, Impact 100 Baldwin County awarded over a half-a-million dollars to area nonprofits. Each of the five agencies received \$101,000 grants across Impact's five focus areas: Arts & Culture; Education; Environment, Preservation and Recreation; Family; and Health and Wellness.

The five nonprofit organizations were selected from a very competitive field of applicants and were vetted by a rigorous review process including site visits, financial analysis and in-depth discussions within the respective Focus Group. The ten finalists made a 5-minute presentation about their project at the Awards gala and members voted for their favorites. Following the on-site vote count, the 2019 recipients were announced. They are:

• Eastern Shore Repertory Theater, Inc.: The nonprofits mission is to educate and train local students in innovative, high-quality theatre experiences. The Impact grant will contribute to the transformation of a new venue, the Nicholson Center in Daphne. This will provide a state-of-the-art rehearsal studio and performance space with plenty of parking.

• Baldwin County Education Coalition, Inc.: The Baldwin County Education Coalition (BCEC) mobilizes both financial and volunteer resources in support of Baldwin County Schools. The grant will provide Scholastic's 'The 7 Strengths Libraries,' a total of 31,100 books, teacher's guides and book bins for classroom libraries in every kindergarten through third grade class throughout Baldwin County Public Schools.

• The Baldwin County Humane Society: Improving the lives of animals and residents in Baldwin County for over 40 years, this is a no-kill pet adoption agency. The 'Trap, Neuter, Release' program is designed to help manage the growing number of feral cats in the county. Impact grant will fund one parttime employee who will manage the program; the purchase of humane traps, 800 spay/neuter vouchers and rabies vaccinations; plus supplies and a small vehicle for transportation.

• Prodisee Pantry, Inc.: Prodisee Pantry is a nonprofit community ministry that provides emergency food and disaster relief for clients in need. The grant will provide the Pantry with siding replacement for the building, lighting improvements, two air conditioners, one cooler condensing unit and an ice maker, as well as technology upgrades to 6 desktops and laptops, and improvements to the sound system and a parking lot fence.

• Jennifer Claire Moore Foundation, Inc.: The Jennifer Claire Moore Foundation provides youth with knowledge, resources and confidence to successfully navigate and recognize the signs of depression and suicide. Their project is two-fold: "Reaching" is an awareness campaign to educate the public about mental health issues. "Equipping" is a Youth Mental Health First Aid training program. Impact funds will be used for the awareness campaign, personnel training and training materials.

This is the 12th year Impact 100 Baldwin County has awarded grants to nonprofits with programs in our county. Since its inception in 2008, Impact 100 Baldwin County has awarded 32 grants totaling \$3.1 million. The 2019 awards will bring the total awarded to \$3.6 million. Impact 100 is a philanthropic organization comprised of women coming together to make high-impact grants to improve the lives of people in Baldwin County.

Six Baldwin County private schools receive defibrillators

"AEDs save lives." That phrase has been repeated over and over at meetings that a committee of Baldwin County folks have had over the past few months. They met with one purpose – to put Automatic External Defibrillators in area schools that otherwise might not be able to obtain them.

The committee recently presented AEDs to representatives from Bayshore Christian School, Fairhope; Central Christian School, Christ the King Catholic School, Snook Christian Academy, South Baldwin Christian Academy, and St. Benedict Catholic School.

AED Committee member Amy Cockrell with Heart for Athletes has been an advocate for AEDs ever since one saved her then 16 year old son's life in 2013. Robert P. Robichaux, Jr., M.D., an electrophysiologist with Cardiology Associates, frequently hears stories of how AEDs in schools and churches have been used to save lives.

"Incidents happen more often than most people realize, and there have been multiple AED saves of children, coaches, parents, and faculty at schools," said Dr. Robichaux.

When he heard about Amy's nonprofit group, he knew that they were a great match. "Here's a group that is committed to educating school staff on how to save lives, and we already knew that AEDs, when available and used properly, can do just that." So when the Cardiac STAT program of Baldwin County held an EKG training class for health professionals earlier this year, Dr. Robichaux asked for donations to Heart for Athletes.

"Not every private school can afford them," said David Godfrey, RN, manager of the Heart Center at South Baldwin Regional Medical Center, "and that's where this committee comes in."






