Magnolia Springs VFD calendar sales benefit Stray Love

Stray Love Foundation, a nonprofit animal advocacy group, and Magnolia Springs Volunteer Fire Department, have partnered to create a delightfully engaging 2020 calendar featuring the firefighters/EMTs of Magnolia Springs VFD, alongside their pawsome pin-up partners (SL foster kittens).

So what do rescuers and volunteers, firehouses and felines, all have in common? The unique pairing was a fundraising idea of Stray Love founder and director, Gayle Guthrie. "Many fundraising calendars go with a 'beefcake' theme, and while there's nothing wrong with that, we have chosen 'cute and fun' with a twist," she said. Adding more detail would be a spoiler. Says Guthrie, "We promise, you have not seen a calendar like this one."

Since its formation almost 10 years ago, Stray Love has remained true to its mission to assist as many stray, injured, abandoned or 'left behind' cats and dogs (the occasional rabbit) with the resources available. To date, more than 1,400 animals have been placed in safe, loving homes. Supporting active TNR programs, advocacy, education and wellbeing assistance for the area's senior and vulnerable pet owners, round out Stray Love's big-picture cause. As it turns out, 2019 is the nonprofit's most active year, with approximately 178 intakes and a projected budget of \$145,000.

Organized in 1961, MSVFD responds to 35-square miles of residential, woodland and waterfront area, averaging 400 calls annually — spanning all variety of fires to medical and traumatic emergencies. During downtime, they provide community fire prevention education and host CPR classes. While the 40-member crew is trained to handle most events, their greatest concern is a fleet of aging apparatus, with ongoing maintenance costs.

Push for food trucks in Gulf Shores is back on the table City Council to vote Dec. 9 to allow 15 trucks on one year pilot program

An effort to allow food trucks to operate in Gulf Shores stalled in 2017 appears to be headed for a vote of the city council at the Dec. 9 meeting.

"We're going to have to make a decision and somebody's not going to like it," Mayor Robert Craft said. "That happens up here fairly regularly but we just need to be responsible in what we're

I was hoping we could do this by Monday but we've got two competing forces. We have the group that doesn't want it and I don't want to put us in a position where we delay it for the group that does want it."

Several restaurants and food truck operators were in attendance at the Dec. 2 meeting each presenting sides for and

against. Restaurant owners wanted more time to ask questions but Craft and the council seemed intent on having a vote on Dec. 9. He asked all the parties to get together before the next meeting to present any questions or suggestions they have on the one-year pilot program.

"I hope we can get it done by next Monday," Craft said. "That's my goal. And if we can't, and this will be up to the council to decide if we didn't and therefore, we're not going to take action on it."

Councilman Jason Dyken said since it is a temporary program to determine if food trucks work in Gulf Shores there's going to be questions and the yearlong study can provide those answers.

"I understand the need to make sure we look at all angles and answer as many questions as we can but I don't want to unduly delay this vote to get a perfect ordinance," Dyken said. "It is a pilot program and it's not going to be perfect and we're going to have to make some adjustments to the pilot program if we determine it's successful and decide to make it a permanent ordinance. I think there is a need to explore all opportunities and answer as many questions as we can but we're not going to be able to answer all the questions. I'm in favor of moving more rapidly than slower."

Economic Development Coordinator Blake Phelps said the test period will give the council the information it needs to decide if food trucks should be a part of the restaurant landscape in Gulf Shores.

"This is a pilot program to dip a toe in the water and see how this actually fits in our community," Phelps said. "The intent of this program is it serve as a feasibility study to provide the city with real data. Not perceptions or hearsay or anything else but real data to see how these mobile food units interact in our community, any positive or a negative impact it may have in our community and provide you with that data to determine if these uses are appropriate in our community on a longterm basis."

Longtime Hazel's Nook owner Richard Schwartz says food trucks would have an unfair advantage over businesses that have been in Gulf Shores for many years.

"The people that are here in the restaurants right now have invested in brick and mortar and in their lives and for somebody to come in here and drive in and take the cream off the top bothers me," Schwartz said. "And, that's the part that I don't like about it."

Schwartz's "cream off the top" argument was part of the reason food trucks weren't allowed in 2017 when the council voted to allow stand-alone food courts. None have been developed in the city since the ordinance was passed.

"We brought this up a year and a half ago and this part of the ordinance was tabled and we approved the food court but not the food truck," Councilman Philip Harris said. "Here we are a year and a half later and there's a reason we're still talking about this. The document presented today is significantly different than what was presented before."

Ryan Shamburger of Big Beach Brewing wants to have a food truck service in his parking lot to give his customers a food option.

His brewery only serves beers and coffee brewed on the premises but he doesn't want to operate a

"Instead of thinking of food trucks taking the cream off the top I think food trucks should be thought of as helping retain the cream off the top in our city."

If the ordinance is voted in, trucks would have to be on private property on a parcel where there is an established business. A food truck operator would have to have permission to be on the property and permission to use the bathrooms. Food can only be sold during the hours the established business is open and must leave the lot when those business hours are over.

Trucks cannot sit at businesses overnight but must return to a commissary kitchen. According to webrestaurantstore.com "commissary kitchens are established commercial kitchens where foodservice providers can go to prepare and store their food. Some commissary kitchens cater specifically to food trucks and mobile food businesses, but others may be businesses that just rent out their kitchen space for some extra income."

All trucks would have to have approval from the Baldwin County office of the Alabama Department of Public Health and follow its regulations on mobile food vendors.

A food truck could not set up shop within 100 feet of an existing restaurant. If a truck is permitted for a certain location and a restaurant later is built within 100 feet of the spot this rule would not apply. The truck must have a legal license plate from the state it is doing business from meaning out of state trucks would be allowed if meeting all the criteria.

Operators would have to buy a city business license for a minimum of \$135, a mobile food unit permit of \$100 and a \$25 fee to the city to inspect the proposed site to make sure it meets all the criteria set out in the ordinance. If a vendor gets permission for multiple sites around town he would have to pay the \$25 to have each site inspected. A total of 15 permits will be issued during the oneyear pilot program.

"We're not going to issue any speculative permits," Blake Phelps said. "We don't want someone squatting on a permit that is not using it. We will not issue the permits until they meet all the requirements of the ordinance and we are convinced they intend to use the permit before it is issued."





Orange Beach City Council Council thanks U.S. Navy pilots for flyover at middle school football game Air Wing Five makes first football game between G.S. and O.B. memorable

It's not every day a middle school football game gets a flyover during the pregame national anthem but Orange Beach wanted Oct. 24 to be a special day and game. And, it turned out to be just that.

"I don't have the words," Mayor Tony Kennon said. "It was a huge deal from just being our inaugural kickoff rivalry game."

Orange Beach Middle School squared off with Gulf Shores in the first meeting between the schools soon after two planes screamed by over the Orange Beach Sportsplex. U.S. Navy Training Air Wing 5 Training Squadron 2 and five of its pilots received certificates of recognition at the Nov. 19 city council meeting for coordinating the flyover. During the meeting, the council also heard a report on the annual Toys for Children fundraiser organized by Terri Long and Candice Duncan from Wildflowers Boutique.

There was still a buzz in the crowd over the flyover as the proclamation was read and stories told.

"I don't think there's ever been a flyover in Baldwin County and maybe not even in Mobile County," Kennon said. "It is beyond my comprehension how Chris (Litton) pulled it off and we got it done. I just want to recognize these pilots and the air wing that made it happen."

It wasn't without a hitch. There was a little excitement as Litton, the Logistics Coordinator for the city, scrambled to get the planes over the stadium at the right time.

"The national anthem was scheduled for the fly-by to be at the very last note of the national anthem and after all the coordination something happened and the singer started two minutes early, not by her fault," Litton said. "I radioed them and said 'oh my gosh, guys they started two minutes early. Can y'all get there on time?' They said they'd do everything we can even if we have to go full throttle. And they were smoking when they came

"They made it happen, they got it done and I was so appreciative of that.'

Oh, and the Makos won the game over Gulf Shores. City Council Also:

Gulf Shores increases employee pay and retirement benefits City Council to vote Dec. 9 to allow 15 trucks on one year pilot program

During the Nov. 25 regular council meeting Gulf Shores passed two measures to increase pay and retirement benefits for city employees.

The city paid Slavin Management Consultants to give recommendations on the city's pay scale "based on the salary market comparison for the

City of Gulf Shores using 43 of 118 City of Gulf Shores classifications to other jurisdictions in the Gulf Coast area that included Foley, Orange Beach, Baldwin County, Fairhope, Daphne, Mobile, Fort Meyers Beach, Destin, Gulf Breeze and others," according to city documents.

Also, during the meeting, the council voted to allow more employees to move from Tier 2 into Tier 1 in the Retirement Systems of Alabama pubemployees lic retirement system. Employees hired after

Jan. 1 2013 were considered Tier 2 employees meaning they could not retire after 25 years' service but had to wait until age 62 regardless of years of service.

Several of the Slavin recommendations included

downgrading some pay scales including some in the police and fire departments to bring them in line with what other cities were paying. City staff recommended and the council agreed that raises instead would be implemented and salaries would be upgraded including raising first responders pay to 110 percent of the current market pay.

Voted in were a 2 percent raise across the board for employees which would cost about \$318,000 annually and to make adjustments to current pay rates which will cost the city about \$279,000 a year. Both are included in the 2020 budget.

The report said cutting pay as recommended by Slavin would be a blow to morale and might even prompt some employees to look for other jobs.

"We certainly want them to stay with us and I was really surprised at Slavin's recommendations," Mayor Robert Craft said. "Knowing what a challenge we've had, particularly in policemen trying to find applicants that want to be a part of that and what we've done to recruit and retain the great people we have and keeping these salaries at a range that we keep the people we've got."

A state legislative action during the 2019 session allowed local governments a "one-time" chance to upgrade employees from Tier 2 to Tier 1 and also increasing the employees' contribution to the program. The 2 percent across the board raise will help those employees pay the extra contribution to their retirement account.

Police Chief Ed Delmore said that other cities and counties are also taking up this issue and not upgrading would hurt filling future job openings.

"I could go on and on about the difficulty recruiting and hiring," Delmore said. "We have a very high bar here, as you know, and it's not easy to become a Gulf Shores police officer. This gives that competitive edge that we need to attract these fantastic candidates that we want here, the caliber of people that we want in the police and fire department here that we demand here and I demand as your police chief. It also gives us the ability to retain people."

Delmore said he believes it will be beneficial in every city department not just first responders.

"Moving the city employees – not just the police and fire department but all city employees – from the Tier 2 system, which is flawed in my opinion, back to the Tier 1 gives the city a competitive edge when one compares us to other communities throughout the state," Delmore said. "Other communities are making that decision right now just like we are. Are you going to do this or are you not. If you don't those who do will have a significant edge in keeping good employees coming to us and staying with us.'

During the regular session, the council also: • Finalized the 2020 budget which is a total of \$85.1 million in revenues and \$84.2 million in expenses with the General Fund expecting \$48 million for revenues with expenses at \$47.7 million. Finance Director Cindy King also announced her department has received the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award from the Government Finance Officers Association the past consecutive nine years since 2011.

• Set new salaries for the mayor and council members to take effect after the 2020 elections. The mayor's salary will rise to \$85,000, the mayor pro tem will be paid \$25,000 and councilmembers will be paid \$20,000 per year. The mayor's current salary is \$50,000, pro tem pay is \$18,000 and \$15,000 for councilmembers.

Hangout Fest releases 2020 lineup before securing Gulf Shores permit

Gulf Shores and Hangout officials meet following each festival to gather information and address the city's concerns. And although the Hangout fest has a contract with Gulf Shores to use its public beach through 2025, the city also has the option annually to not renew the assembly permit for the festival, according to Gulf Shores Mayor Robert Craft.

Speaking during the Dec. 2 city council meeting, Mayor Craft said the city still has concerns about the festival's negative effect on residents, who have been complaining for the past 11 years about festival patrons' bad behavior. Another city concern is the fact that the fest will have less space to work with this year.

"We've told him (festival founder Shaul Zislin) in writing that we will not approve a permit until he satisfies us that he's made significant progress toward controlling the noise and vulgarity permeating outside the festival site and into residential areas," Mayor Craft said. "The negative impacts to the area are overnight parking and parking on the street.

"There's a loss of 4.28 acres that he currently utilizes. He's got to have a site plan that shows that he can survive. He's got to prove it to us without question."

The Hangout has until 60 days before the event to secure its permit.

"He does not have a permit. He hasn't even submitted a permit application yet. But we've told him if he can meet these things for 2020 then we'll give it to him. But then he's got to prove that those work." Craft said.

"You will see a statement in the paper or somewhere advertising where he's releasing a lineup. He doesn't have a permit to operate that. But that's Shaul taking the steps necessary to proceed assuming that he gets permitted. And he's committed that he can answer these questions. That remains to be seen. There are still boxes to be checked before he gets the permit."

The 2019 NAIA Women's Soccer National Championship Tourney, which started Monday at the Orange Beach Sportsplex, culminates with the NAIA National Championship match on Saturday, December 7 at 6 p.m. The semifinals are a day earlier at 3 p.m.and 6 p.m.



Fans may purchase daily passes for \$15 and tournament passes for \$35 at the gate. Children 10 and under will be admitted free.

This season for the first time, 45 teams played for the opportunity to join host institution Mobile College in Orange Beach. In the end, 12 of the 15 opening round hosts advanced as three upsets occurred. Rocky Mountain read to advance and ioined

(Mont.) was the lone No. 3-seed to advance and joined Eastern Oregon and Grace (Ind.) in upsets at their respective sites. The NAIA Network will broadcast all 15 matches live.

Soccer action is not the only thing that draws the NAIA to the Alabama Gulf Coast. Brad Cygan, director of athletics communications for the NAIA, shares how student-athletes work hard to get to the championship and are rewarded with a retreat along Alabama's beaches.

"One of the biggest reasons we love both our women's soccer and track and field championships in Orange Beach and Gulf Shores is the emphasis the region puts on the student-athlete experience," said Cygan. "These are memories our student-athletes will carry with them for the rest of their lives, and the time and effort that the region puts in to make these events special is fantastic."

Likewise, NAIA's impact on the coastal communities

transcends beyond economic impact. Each NAIA championship features a Teaming Up for Character Event as part of its Champions of Character initiative, and during the week, student-athletes conduct soccer clinics at local schools. Additionally, the NAIA encourages Gulf Shores and Orange Beach residents to bring new toys to the Orange Beach Sportsplex to benefit local children through the Christian Service Center.

"Each year, the NAIA shows up and shows out in our beach communities, leaving behind tourism dollars and a lasting personal impact through the Champions of Character Program," said Beth Gendler, vice president of sales for the Gulf Shores & Orange Beach Sports Commission. "We hope to give the student-athletes a destination experience of a lifetime and welcome them back for future family vacations."

Seven of the 16 qualifiers for the 2019 final site were also there a season ago. Mobile (Ala.), Keiser (Fla.), Southeastern (Fla.), William Carey (Miss.), Eastern Oregon, Lindsey Wilson (Ky.) and Martin Methodist (Tenn.) all repeat in 2019.

The Crossroads League and the Southern States Athletic Conference lead all leagues with three qualifiers in the final site field. Westmont's five national titles are the most among the 2019 final site qualifiers and the most in NAIA history.

Lindsey Wilson (K_y) has an opportunity to tie Westmont for the most red banners in history. The Blue Raiders are tied with former member Lee (Tenn.) with four.

William Carey (Miss.) will attempt to become the first team since 2011 to win back-to-back national championships. Former member institution Lee (Tenn.) won four-in-a-row from 2008 through 2011. Central Methodist (Mo.) lead all teams with 22 wins on the season. The Eagles are the lone undefeated team in the field. William Carey will try to become the first back-toback NAIA National Champion since former member Lee (Tenn.) claimed four-straight red banners from 2008-11.






