Gulf Shores St. Paddy's Walking Parade will roll from Papa Rocco's around 9:30 a.m.

The Irish do love their meloncholy. But maybe it is just an excuse to cry in our beer for a bit over friends gone by.

There will be some sadness remembering the longtime practicioners no longer alive to join us for the Gulf Shores St. Patrick's Day Walking Parade.

That is the nature of life and the nature of an event that traces its roots back for three generations.

But hose that came before will be celebrated and not mourned when the parade departs from the Papa Rocco's deck at around 9:30 a.m. on March 17, for its annual song filled stroll to various downtown Gulf Shores watering holes.

The Green Horde is easy to find, as there is not a stop on the tour that will not include crowds milling on its outside decks

Vince Murphy, who at that time owned The Pink Pony, started the walking parade and was first to carry the grand marshal baton. This was in the mid 1970's. Murphy passed the baton to local character John Kelliher, who led the swarm into Papa Rocco's just after Bill McGinnes opened his restaurant in 1984.

Kelliher, The Colonel to his friends, deemed McGinnes worthy of the grand marshal's position in 1989.

Leading the musical march from the very beginning was Jocko McLain, the parade's original bagpiper. and like McGinnes, a Scotsman.

Jocko participated in the parade right up until he passed in 2017.

"We met and we started talking about Scotland and The Rangers and it was like we had known each other for years," McGinnes said. "We were close for many years. Jock gave me my first kilt.

"He was the original," McGinnes added. "He was doing it way before my boys came down and played. Jocko will always be the soul of the parade."

"We met at the American Legion and we immediately sat down and killed off a bottle of Irish whiskey between us," he said back in 2015. "We went back to Papa's and had a few more. We've been bosom pals ever since. He's become very close to me."

The parade bagpipers will include Neil McGinnes (Bill's nephew). They will strike up the tune that starts the march to the Flying Harpoon, Mudbugs, The

Steamer, Desoto's, The Hangout, The Pink Pony, Gulf Island Grille and Hooters. The crawl ends around 2 p.m. at Mikee's. By then most of the crowd will have scattered around downtown.

"Our snowbirds love it. And we get some spring breakers. We even have grandkids of some of the originals coming out with us," McGinnes said.

Butch Nichols and Lindy Harris, the original parade flag carriers, will be toasted. Others hae stepped in to pick up the lead flags and carry on.

"It's been getting bigger every single year. So I don't see why that wouldn't continue," Papa McGinnes said. "It's hard to believe this started out with about 30 people."

McGinnes continues to proudly look ofer the parade by applying for an official parade permit from Gulf Shores City Hall every year.

"We want to make sure the police know what we are doing. But we are not sure what we are doing besides having fun," he said

Developers purchase historic Foley Bakery building

Plans include first floor restaurant with apartments above

Local developers have purchased the historic Foley Bakery building, located at 118 West Laurel Ave., from the City of Foley with plans to gut the inside down to the studs and eventually lease the bottom out to a restaurant and put apartments on the second floor.

The 10,000 square ft. two story building, which has sat empty since 2007, is the third oldest building in Foley and a contributing structure to the Foley National Register Historic District. It is located in historic downtown in the heart of the Foley Main Street District, it originally housed the Foley Bakery & Dumas Apothecary, but was most recently the Cactus Cafe.

The City of Foley purchased the building back in 2012 to save the historic building. The building was built in 1925 and housed the Foley Bakery and Dumas Apothecary for many years. It was most recently the Cactus Cafe.

The developers plan to do a full historic renovation to the building and put it back into service for multiple tenants. Katapult Properties and 4Wright Investments have joined forces to bring this building back to its glory. A completion date has not been set.

Restoring the Foley Bakery & Dumas Apothecary building to its full glory will create new economic vitality while honoring the historic integrity and character of the heart of Foley.

"The project will start taking shape in the next few weeks. A complete refitting of the interior and exterior will bring back the original architectural elements," said Mark Wright of 4Wright Investments.

"We are thankful that city leaders had the forethought and determination to step in and save such an important and contributing structure. We are pleased to move the project forward and put it back into service for generations to come," said Jeremy Friedman of Kata-

When the City took control of the building, its initial focus was to make sure it was saved, which involved getting a functioning roof on the structure and closing up exposed areas.

"Then we turned our attention to finding the right developer to purchase and renovate the building and have the building contribute to our historic downtown again," said Foley Mayor John Koniar.

Foley Main Street is committed to increasing the economic vibrancy of the Foley Main Street district by working on recruitment, facilitation, and the aid to businesses and investors interested in the downtown hub.



Irish Cocktail Cupcakes

- 1 c. Irish stout beer (such as Guinness)
- 9 Tbsp. unsalted butter, cut into 1-in. pieces
- 2 cups dark brown sugar
- 3/4 c. unsweetened cocoa powder
- 3/4 c. sour cream
- 2 eggs
- 1 Tbsp. vanilla extract
- 2 c. flour
- 2-1/2 tsp. baking soda
- Frosting:
- 1 stick unsalted butter, at room temp.
- 2 Tbsp. Irish cream liqueur (such as Baileys), or more to taste
- 2 tsp. Irish whiskey (such as Jameson), or to taste
- 3 c. confectioners' sugar

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Line a muffin tin with paper liners. Combine stout beer and butter in a large saucepan over low heat. Heat until butter melts, about 5 min. Remove from heat and whisk in brown sugar and cocoa. Whisk sour cream, eggs and vanilla extract in a bowl; pour into the saucepan and mix until a smooth batter forms. Stir flour and baking soda together. Fold into the batter. Divide batter evenly among the prepared muffin cups. Bake in the preheated oven until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 25 min. Leave in the tin for 10 min., then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Make frosting while the cupcakes cool. Place butter in a large mixing bowl and beat with an electric mixer on medium high speed for 2-3 min. Mix in Irish cream and whiskey on low speed. Gradually spoon in confectioners' sugar, mixing on low speed until frosting is smooth and creamy. Spread frosting over cupcakes. Serves 18. Enjoy!

Remembrance ceremony for NAS terrorist attack victims March 14

The Pensacola Navy League will host a remembrance Ceremony for the innocent victims of December's cowardly terrorist attack onboard NAS Pensacola on Saturday, March 14 at 11 a.m. at Veterans Memorial Park in downtown Pensacola (corner of 9th Ave. & Bayfront Pkwy.) Speakers include Pensacola Mayor Grover Robinson, Kyle Cozad, Commander Naval Education and Training Command, Timothy Kinsella, Commanding Officer of Naval Air Station Pensacola, and Vincent Segars, Commanding Officer, Naval Aviation Schools Command at NAS Pensacola.

On the morning of December 6, 2019, a cowardly aviation student from Saudi Arabia killed three people and injured eight others at NAS before he was killed by Escambia County sheriff deputies. In an audio recording, a Yemen-based terrorist group, Qasim al-Raymi, said that they directed the Saudi military national to carry out the attack.

The three Navy sailors murdered were Ensign Joshua Kaleb Watson, 23, of Enterprise; Airman Mohammed Sameh Haitham, 19, of St. Petersburg; and Airman Apprentice Cameron Scott Walters, 21, of Richmond Hill, Ga. Eight others sustained gunshot wounds, including two responding ECSD deputies who sustained gunshot wounds to their limbs.

The Navy on Saturday identified the three victims of the NAS Pensacola "The Sailors that lost their lives in the line of duty showed exceptional heroism and bravery in the face of evil," said the Navy in a statement. "When confronted, they didn't run from danger; they ran towards it and saved lives. If not for their actions, and the actions of the Naval Security Force that were the first responders on the scene, this incident could have been far worse."

"We feel the loss profoundly and grieve with the family and friends of the deceased," said Capt. Tim Kinsella, CO, at NAS Pensacola.
