Elberta Sausage Fest March 27 in Town Park

The Elberta Sausage Festival returns to TownPark (13052 Main St. Elberta) on March 27 from 8 a.m. 'til 5 p.m. Admission is free. Held just north of the town's only stop light on Hwy. 98, the event attracts up to 20,000 revelers, according to organizers.

A 40-year tradition in the historic town, the festival is a major regional event that attracts a cross section of the community in what has become a reunion type atmosphere. It is also the main revenue source for the area's volunteer fire department.

Enjoy Elberta's famous German sausage and sauerkraut, plus continuous entertainment, and 200 arts & crafts booths. There will also be carnival rides.

Of course, there will also be a Bier Garten featuring a large selection of imported and domestic beers. Other scrumptious foods will include German-style filled cabbage, potato salad, goulash, red beans and rice, hamburgers, hot dogs, BBQ sandwiches, ice cream, popcorn, peanuts and homemade baked goods.

The Bellview Stumpfiddle Band will perform with the North End Stompers and other cloggers. There will also be polka, country and German music.

Spearheaded by Elberta's Volunteer Fire Department since 1978, festival proceeds are used for improving not only the fire department, but the town as well. Additionally, local non-profits benefit from the festival through proceeds from their booth sales and parking lot fees.

The festival is held twice a year – on the last Saturday of March and the last Saturday of October. Although it has been tweaked a bit over the years, the original secret recipe for Elberta's famous sausage is credited to Alfred Stucki, who managed Elberta's Locker Plant from 1953 until his death in 1973.



Non-profit group's plan to light up Perdido Pass Bridge meets resistance

A local group is making progress toward a project to luminate the Perdido Pass Bridge in Orange Beach.

"This is a volunteer, community-based project," Tom Clark, founder and CEO of the Perdido Pass Bridge Lighting Project, said. "There is a very small group that put this together and our

strategy is to use corporate and private donations to fund this project. We have filed as a 501(c)3 nonprofit and we're working very, very close with all the agencies necessary to make sure that we have a good project in the end."

One of the biggest concerns to come out of the effort is determin-

ing how the lights will affect nesting sea turtles. One option may be not lighting the south side of the bridge or turning those lights off during nesting season.

"I think that's the only choice you've got. I don't think you can win," Mayor Tony Kennon said. "The north side is one thing but you can't light the south side. I think you will lose that battle."

Clark said that is a decision yet to be made and will be made by working with state and federal wildlife agencies.

"We are also working closely with the US Fish and Wildlife Service, for turtle safety, and the Alabama Department of Transportation for bridge enhancement," Clark said. "We're turning that over to the design team and the agencies and we're going to do what's best by all the guidelines that we are going to work with to make sure that's the right thing to do. This project is going to be designed very much with that consideration."

Retired elementary school science teacher Joyce Freshwater who has a condo at Grand Point just west of the pass praised the council for its work in preserving the wildlife in Orange Beach.

"I want to thank you because I think it's a testament to you as a council that your priorities are to keep the beaches beautiful, that you care about the wildlife here and you always have," Freshwater told the council.

But she also expressed concerns

about the turtle population and the amount of bright lights already in the area surrounding the pass.

"One of my concerns about the bridge lighting project is our sea turtle population which is probably one of Orange Beach's most important residents," Freshwater said. "Last year or the year before I think at the end of Grand Point's boardwalk there was a turtle nest there on the beach and my grand-children sort of went crazy and since they have a science-oriented Nonna we learned a great deal about it."

Freshwater said the natural beauty of Orange Beach is evident enough without the bridge illumination.

"I just hate to see our focus on our gateway to the Gulf be manmade when you have all this natural beauty," Freshwater said.

Clark said the effort will be focused on more unintrusive lighting that would be more like background lighting rather than carnival lighting.

"This is adding soft illumination to the Perdido Pass bridge," Clark said. "We are working with an international company, they have several divisions. They are known as Phillips Lighting, they are internationally known as Signify. They are very well known for doing these types of projects. The most well-known is the Empire State Building, London Bridge, the Coronado Bridge in San Diego and many, many, many other bridges.

"If you saw the Heisman Trophy celebration in New York on the Empire State Building (illuminated in red and white to commemorate Alabama's Devonta Smith's Heisman win) that's their work. This is beautiful work this company is known for and we're proud to have them helping us put together a package."

Besides Fish and Wildlife, Clark said his group is also working with the Coast Guard, who requested a way to turn off the lights in the case of emergencies or other incidences, and the local Share the Beach volunteer sea turtle group.

During the March 2 regular council meeting, the council:

- Approved a liquor license for Pier House Restaurant and Bar which is opening in the old Big Wave's Dave space on beach road west of Ron Jon Surf Shop.
- OK'd a resolution accepting Saint Lucia Drive located in the Harbor Ridge Subdivision as a publicly owned street and sanitary sewer system for maintenance by the city. It passed on a 3-2 vote with Kennon and councilmem-

bers Joni Blalock and Jerry Johnson voting for and councilmembers Jeff Silvers and Annette Mitchell voting against.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing the execution of a professional services agreement with Thompson Engineering for land surveying and engineering services.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing the execution of a contract Harbor Communications to connect fiber to the new Sewer Department office building.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing execution of change order no. 1 with M. W. Rogers Construction Co. for the Sewer Office Building in an amount not to exceed \$1,596.17.

- Postponed vote on a resolution authorizing the submittal of a FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program application and authorizing the execution of a professional services contract for grant writing.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing the execution of a task order with McCollough Architecture to provide professional services for Fire Station No. 5 in an amount not to exceed \$84,000. Planned is an 8,500 square-foot Fire Station No. 5 on Canal Road west near The Wharf. According to a proposal submitted by Thompson to the city it will use the prototype from the Ono Island Fire Station No. 4 as the basis of the design with modifications. It estimates the cost of construction will be about \$3.5 million.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing a franchise for Beach Express Taxi to operate a taxi service within the city limits and police jurisdiction of the City of Orange Beach.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing the purchase of two vehicles for the police department from state bid in the amount of \$74,392.80 to purchase for two 2021 Chevrolet Tahoe four-wheel drive SUVs.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing the purchase of a pickup truck for the Police Department through Sourcewell in the amount of \$59,676 for a new 2021 Ford F-450 Super Duty Crew Cab four-wheel drive pickup truck with eight-foot bed.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing the purchase of three vehicles for the Police Department from state bid in the amount of \$80,623.78 for three 2021 Dodge Durangos.

- OK'd a resolution authorizing the purchase of Ambulance Equipment for the Fire Department through the National Association of State Procurement Officials in the amount of

\$81,000.

During work session, the council discussed:

- A request for vacation of right-of-way located within the Giles Canal Pines Subdivision. The strip of land runs behind four business locations on the north side of Canal Road near Canal Road Animal Hospital. According to a proposal by applicants Thomas Gross, Richard Russell and Lester Boheme they "hope to improve the functionality of the current businesses operating adjacent to the undeveloped street."

- A resolution authorizing the execution of an automatic aid agreement with the City of Gulf Shores for fire response within the Alabama Gulf State Park.

- A resolution authorizing the execution of a Covenant of Purpose, Use and Ownership with the Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration Council for the widening of Canal Road between State Highway 161 and Wilson Boulevard. According to city documents.

- A resolution authorizing the execution of a Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Construction Agreement with the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) for funding of a sidewalk on Canal Road between Oak Street and William Silvers Park-

way. The estimated cost of the entire project of a complete sidewalk to The Wharf is \$900,000 to be paid out of capital line item.

TAP grant funds for the project are \$387,200.

- Resolutions authorizing a franchise renewals for Alabama Container Company, Baldwin Container Company, BFI Waste Serv-

ices, The Dumpster Guy, Waste Away Group and Waste Pro of Florida to remove and dispose of commercial solid waste and to remove and transport construction and demolition debris.

- A reminder of a public hearing for the CoastAL Beach Development on April 20. The proposal is from two of the owners of the Flora-Bama to build a restaurant with a parking lot in partnership with the city on beachfront property east of the Hampton Inn.

- Resolutions authorizing franchise renewals for A Better Cab, Bayside Taxi, Beach Buggy Taxi, Coast Cab, Coastal Express Shuttle and A-1 Taxi Service.







Gateway Initiative partners with SBLC to place grads in jobs

The Gateway Initiative, a work development foundation that is a collaboration between local businesses, educational organizations, Chambers of Commerce and municipalities, is now working directly with the South Baldwin Literacy Council to match graduates with job opportunities.

Combining SBLC programs and job-ready graduates with our business placement services has proven very effective, according to Gateway Director for Business Innovation Sally Westendorf. "Currently, Baldwin County is back to around 3% unemployment which means that for anyone who wants a job should be able to work," she said.

The SBLC each year offers tutoring, preparation, GED preparation, English as a Second Language classes, and career development programs to 500 residents.

The Gateway Initiative's mission is to invest in employees and the skills training necessary to keep up with the demand in South Baldwin's burgeoning hospitality and tourism industry, which impacts every other sector in the local economy.

Brett-Robinson seeks permit to build 110 unit condo on East Beach Blvd.

On March 22, Gulf Shores heard Brett Robinson's request for a conditional use permit and site plan for a 24-story, 110-unit condo development, Phoenix Gulf Shores II, that will also provide a 24-foot public beach access on the Gulf on East Beach Boulevard on the east side of the Colonades.

According to the zoning ordinance, Brett Robinson could build 133 units on the site or 44 per acre. They are proposing 110 units or about 34.6 units per acre.

The condo will be across the street from a recently opened Comfort Inn and amenities will include indoor and outdoor pools, fitness room, a lazy river and slides. There will be 66 three-bedroom units and 44 two-bedroom units. Applicants are seeking two deviations from the zoning ordinance, a reduction in the west side yard setback from 35 feet to

24 feet and an extra story of habitable units above what is permitted by current zoning on the parcel.

According to the zoning ordinance, Brett Robinson could build 133 units on the site or 44 per acre. They are proposing 110 units or about 34.6 units per acre.

"They are below the maximum requirements for building coverage and impervious coverage in floor-area ratio," Planning and Zoning Director Lee Jones told the council. "They meet the requirement for parking spaces at 264 and there will be a five-story parking deck."

Jones told the council the plan complies with all the architecture requirements of the zoning ordinance.

"It will be stucco and painted shades of gray with gold trim," Jones said. "The zoning ordinance requires taller buildings to have a base, a middle and a cap. The architect went into great detail in creating that base with the parking deck, the center section and the ornamentation on the parapet with the Phoenix there

in the center."

This will be Brett Robinson's fifth development in Gulf Shores with Island Winds west of Gulf Place, Phoenix Gulf Shores I and Phoenix All Suites West on West Beach Boulevard, Phoenix All Suites North of the Pink Pony Pub and the proposed Phoenix Gulf Shores II on East Beach Boulevard. The company has one new development in Orange Beach nearing completion, Phoenix Orange Beach II, across Perdido Beach Boulevard from Zeke's Landing Marina, and Phoenix Gulf Towers is underway on the Gulf on the west side of Orange Beach.

Medical Village Access

During the meeting, the council also approved plans for a connector road from Cotton Creek Drive to the South Baldwin Hospital's freestanding emergency department which is under construction on State Route 59 near the airport and expected to open May 1.

The city opened bids for the Phase 1B project on March 9 for the improvements and McElhenney Construction was the lowest conforming bidder with a bid of \$1.8 million. McElhenney also won the bid for the Phase 1 project which includes a road from State Route 59 to the new facility and an improved intersection with a traffic signal at the west entrance.

"This project will facilitate future medical opportunities for the citizens of Gulf Shores and relieve traffic congestion at the State Route 59 and Cotton Creek Drive intersection," City Engineer Mark Acreman said. "This project is expected to begin later this month and be completed by the end of the year."

This, access, Acreman said, will make the facility more readily accessible to emergency vehicles coming from Orange Beach and other points east of the Beach Express.

"Not only will this tie into the new infrastructure that's almost complete that's a direct connection from the FED to highway 59 it will connect that freestanding emergency department up to Cotton Creek Drive," Acreman said. "So, anybody coming from Orange Beach, any medical ambulance coming from the beach express coming from the Or-

ange Beach area will be able to access the FED directly off of Cotton Creek Drive. It will go north and south and connect to Phase 1."

The city owns several parcels of land containing more than 32 acres which could develop with more medical facilities in the future.

"The 32 acres that you see north from there divided by this road is available for future hospital potential," Mayor Robert Craft said. "I have to believe one day this island is going to require and need a hospital and in doing so we've acquired the property that can connect all that and have kind of a medical complex as we grow in the future. As well as the highway 59 side potential future commercial property. This roadway and connecting to this FED solves a lot of future questions to me about how do we continue to grow with the proper medical care, doctors in our community to provide a better medical opportunity for our people that live here but also our visitors."

The roadway itself will be a boulevard with two lanes of traffic and bike lanes, sidewalks and landscaping all of which are included in this bid package. There is \$2 million budgeted in 2021 for this project so it's about \$200,000 under budget, Acreman said. All expenditures will be part of the city's required matching costs for the \$14.4 million Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) grant the city received in November 2019.

"It is a potential location for a traffic signal," Acreman said of the Cot-

ton Creek Drive entrance. "That signal would be a city signal so if we see that it's warranted we would not have to permit it through another agency. It would just be coming back to the council and asking for the funding to make that signal happen."

During the meeting, the council:

- Passed a cooperative maintenance agreement with the Alabama Department of Transportation for a new traffic signal on State Route 182, or East Beach Boulevard, and East Second Street. This is at the entrance to the residents parking lot at East Gulf Place. The city will be responsible for maintenance of the signal after it is installed which is planned for late summer or early fall.
- Heard about an amendment change to the ordinance regarding rental motorcycles and motor-driven cycles. The renters must be 18 years of age, and they must have a motorcycle endorsement regardless of the state they are from. The most significant change, Deputy Police Chief Dan Netermeyer told the council is it eliminates the termination clause to businesses operating rentals.
- Heard from Building Official Brandon Franklin who recommended a resolution to adopt the 2020 Baldwin County Hazard Mitigation Plan after it has gone through the public hearing process. The comprehensive plan takes a unified approach of all Baldwin County Communities for dealing with hazards associated with hurricanes, flooding, tornadoes and wildfires. The city first signed on to the plan in 2011 and renewed it in 2016. FEMA requires the plan be updated every five years.



WHAT'S HAPPENING

PIER & SHORE FISHING OUTLOOK

Well, winter's grip is slowly loosening from our area. And the Gulf water temperature has rebounded into the middle to upper 60s. As a result, resident fish and other sealife are becoming more active even as other species stream into the warming near shore waters. Right on cue, the first Spanish mackerel arrived on scene at the Gulf State Park Pier, and Alabama Point jetty. That trend has been growing, and reports of more numerous catches of 12" to 18" mackerel are being mentioned to our east from the Florida Panhandle piers. Typically a 'flood' of lean and very hungry Spanish mackerel make their way along the Alabama coast through the end of March.

The Gulf State Park Pier (even with its reduced length) is a good place to intercept this migration. Recent catches have been getting more dependable, practically every day since they arrived. Of course rough water may curtail the bite for a few days until we get another break in the weather, which will allow the water to clear some. And lurking close behind the mackerel schools are the Spinner and Blacktip and Sandbar sharks that keep mackerel fishermen on their toes. At least the pier is no longer 'chumming' the water with hundreds of mackerel carcasses. But the sharks are at times still an issue to be dealt with.

Most mackerel anglers from the pier throw lures on medium to medium heavy class 7 to 8 foot rods. The 'average' reel is a 3000 or 4000 series spooled with 150 to 250 yards of 10 or 12 pound monofilament line, or 15 to 20 pound braided line.

The added 'heaviness' of the rod and line are specifically to pull a hooked mackerel away from any pursuing sharks. There is another school of thought though, and that is to open the bail and allow the swift and agile mackerel to 'out-swim' the larger shark. This tactic works more often than not, and allows the angler to fish lighter line and gear for more enjoyment.

But IF your mackerel fish, get used to the idea some of your lures will be sacrificed to either mackerel or shark teeth. Most Spanish mackerel anglers simply use a foot long 'shock leader' of heavy, clear monofilament line (about 40 pound). Usually no swivel is added, because the mackerel often mistake that for a moving prey item and bite it. So good knot tying becomes critical to connect the heavy mono leader to the lighter main line with a less visible, small knot.

A Double Uni (aka Uni-to-Uni) knot works well, but I find a Surgeon's Knot faster and easier to tie, especially during a 'hot' mackerel bite. This time of year, the Spanish mackerel tend to stay deeper in the water column, so the 3/4 ounce Gotcha plug is a favorite lure, especially for 'beginners'. But this lure has a bad reputation of hooking anglers as well as fish with its dual swing treble hooks.

Be ever-mindful of your back swing when casting, or better yet, cast underhand. This tactic is much easier now with the new slanted railing on the pier which makes it more comfortable for most anglers to lean forward toward the water. Always be sure to compensate for the wind and current and cast perpendicular to the pier, so anglers' lines do not cross. That is inevitable to some degree when fishing a crowded pier, even with social distancing. But you will make friends faster if you do, and enemies faster if you don't!

The 5/8 and 3/4 ounce leadhead jigs with white or chartreuse paint and 'hair' (like the locally produced "Looney jigs") are much less expensive than other plugs or spoons, and at least as effective for catching mackerel. And they are safer with only a single, fixed hook to watch out for.

As the sheepshead bite winds down with the spawn centered on the full moon of March 28, anglers may be otherwise entertained with increasing numbers of pompano. Most pompano are caught in the 'surfzone' between the beach and longshore sandbar. This should help spread some fishing pressure away from the shortened 'end' of the pier when the Spanish mackerel are running. In fact this time of year it's not uncommon for anglers to catch a limit of mackerel, then switch location and tactics for a limit of pompano in the same day.

As with fishing from the beach, most pompano anglers use a set rig baited with pieces of shrimp and perhaps Fishbites or Fishgum. Just keep in mind the one-rod-in-use-at-a-time rule on the pier may make for some long waits between bites if the pompano are not near the pier. To remain more actively fishing, many savvy anglers prefer to jig for their pompano. This allows the angler to cover much more water, and not be locked down in a single location while waiting for the fish to come to them.

Surf anglers have been finding an increasing number of pompano, along with a fairly dependable whiting bite, and even a few smaller black drum, redfish, and sheepshead. All of these are excellent eating and add a bit of variety to the creel. But pompano will be getting more and more attention as we move farther into spring!

O.B.'s new fire boat can shoot 3,000 gallons of water per minute

The Orange Beach Fire Dept., thanks to a port security grant which funded 75 percent of the cost, has added a 38' fire boat to its fleet. Manufactured by Metal Shark in Jeanerette, Louisiana, the boat has twin 1,500 gallon per minute fire pumps capable of shooting 3,000 gallons of water per minute. It can be used for off-shore firefighting as well as supply water for land based firefighting operations. It is also rigged for advance life support medical emergencies, dive & rescue and search operations.

Nicole Davis Woerner wrote the grant application, and Battalion Chief Bruce Nelson, Lt. Jeremy L. White, Lt. James Kinkead, Firefighter Johnny Ray Harrison, Fire Chief Michael Beth Kimberling, Deputy Chief Jeff Smith, Mayor Tony Kennon and City Council also contributed to the effort to bring the boat to Pleasure Island.






McMillan sponsors bill allowing pet dogs in outdoor dining areas

A bill sponsored by Rep. Steve McMillan (R – Foley) to allow pet dogs in outdoor dining areas at restaurants recently passed the Alabama House now heads to the Senate.

McMillan said he was inspired to create the bill, HB-235, after receiving a lot of feedback from constituents that wanted to be able to dine with their dogs in appropriate venues.

“Here in Baldwin County, and especially in my district, we’ve got a lot of restaurants that offer outdoor dining, so it just makes sense that we allow folks to bring their furry friends with them.”

“Everybody loves their dogs and often want to bring them with them when they go places,” McMillan said. “Here in Baldwin County, and especially in my district, we’ve got a lot of restaurants that offer outdoor dining, so it just makes sense that we amend the current law to allow folks to bring their furry friends with them and enjoy the great views and good food together.”

McMillan’s bill is a statewide bill that would affect not only his district in Baldwin County, but food service establishments around the state. He said he had also received backing from the Alabama Restaurant Association.

“This was not just a Baldwin County issue, though that’s who I heard the most from,” McMillan said. “If a restaurant has an outdoor area and wants to allow people to bring their dogs with them, they ought to be able to do so.”

McMillan introduced the same bill last session, which passed the House, but got delayed in the Senate due to the pandemic.

“The bill was making good progress before all of this COVID-19 mess happened, so I thought it would be something we’d want to continue in another session to get it through and get it signed,” McMillan said. “I haven’t seen any major opposition come out against it, last session or this session. Hopefully, we’ll be able to get it over the line this session.”

Under the proposed bill, the owners of food service establishments would decide whether to allow pet dogs in their outdoor dining areas. If they chose to do so, the owner would file for a waiver with the State Health Department and agree to follow prescribed rules. Signage stating the designated outdoor dining area would be available for patrons with pet dogs would also be required, as would a separate outdoor entrance for the pet dogs to enter without going through the food service area. The pet dogs would not be allowed on the chairs, benches, seats or other fixtures of the outdoor dining area.

“I’m going to keep pushing this bill, and, based on the large number of statewide dog owners, I think we’ll see positive results for all Alabamians on this, including our four-legged canine friends,” McMillan said.



CACC & Auburn team up to offer culinary science degree

Coastal Alabama Community College and Auburn University have signed a culinary science agreement that will allow CACC students to take courses toward a new Bachelor of Culinary Science Degree at Auburn. ORANGE BEACH PUBLIC WORKS BUILDING FOR A RIBBON CUTTING: Just over a year after the site was only dirt, the ribbon was cut to open the new Orange Beach Public Works building. Public Works had to move from its old location off Williams Silvers Parkway after the city donated 40 acres to the Baldwin County Board of Education for what is now home to Orange Beach Middle / High School. The new Public Works building is located on Roscoe Road, off the Beach Express, near Columbia Southern and Baldwin EMC. Public Works Director Tim Tucker and his department saved the city nearly \$1 million in the construction of the new facility by acting as the general contractor and also using city crews to handle many tasks, such as site work, formwork for concrete, irrigation and landscaping, and interior work. Sun Coast Builders constructed the main metal building under a low-bid contract of \$1.18 million. The total cost of the project, after the land purchase, came in at \$2.8 million. The building has 9,500 square feet of office space, 27,000 square feet of warehouse space, 1,800 square feet of building maintenance shop space, four mechanic bays covering 8,000 square feet with two lifts and one pit, new fuel dock, and a total of 60,000 square feet of space under one roof. The building was built to withstand winds up to 160 mph. The site will also include two fully functional greenhouses.

Landing a great white shark from the beach is rare

Mullet Wrapper Fishing Columnist David Thornton said the great white shark landed by a surf fisherman earlier this month on Pensacola Beach was notable because great whites are not common in these waters and even less commonly encountered from anglers fishing from the shore.

"There are many more tigers and hammerheads, dusks, bulls and other large shark species around that can get even larger than that specimen," Thornton said. "But all apex sharks are important predators that keep the smaller coastal shark species (blacktip, spinner and sandbar sharks) in check."

The great white shark, estimated to be about 12 ft. long and weigh 1200 lbs., was landed after a 35 minute fight by an angler from Idaho fishing with Big John Shark Fishing Adventures.

"You just caught a great white," Big John McLean (pictured) tells the fisherman in a YouTube video. "This is the rarest thing ever. Dude that is something you will never see."

"It is rare to catch one from the beach, that's a fact. It's not particularly rare that they are in the area. It's cool but it's not rare," said Dr. Marcus Drymon of the Mississippi State Coastal Extension and Research Center. "I'll say the anglers did a good job of getting the fish released as quickly as possible and you could tell they had the fish's best interest in mind. They should be commended for that for sure."

"Apex sharks are important predators that keep the smaller coastal shark species in check (blacktip, spinner, and sandbar sharks). It's good they (and many other large sharks) are protected though, to help maintain a healthy balance in the Gulf waters," added Thornton.

Asst. principal & daughter accused of fixing homecoming queen election at Pensacola Tate High School

Laura Rose Carroll, 50, an assistant principal at Bellview Elementary School in Pensacola, and her 17 year-old daughter, Emily Rose Grover, were both arrested by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement for allegedly using the mother's access to the Escambia County School District's internal system to cast fraudulent votes for Grover in Tate High School's 2020 Homecoming Court vote. FDLE agents discovered that the fraudulent votes originated from the IP addresses

tied to Carroll and Grover's computer usage. The daughter won the vote and was named homecoming queen. According to a FDLE press release, Carroll had district-level access to its student information system and in October 2020, hundreds of votes for Tate High School's Homecoming Court were flagged as fraudulent. Also, multiple students reported that the daughter described using her mother's account to cast votes, according to the release.

The investigation also found that beginning August 2019, Carroll's FOCUS account accessed 372 high school records and 339 of those were of Tate High School students. Carroll was released on a \$6,000 bond. Carroll's daughter was taken into custody and transferred to the Escambia Regional Juvenile Detention Center. The mother is also accused of allowing her daughter to use her access to FOCUS to access hundreds of students' personal files, including their test scores.

4-laning of Canal Rd. expected to be completed by May 25

Expect delays on certain sections of road right up until then

Orange Beach's Canal Road widening project is scheduled to be complete before Memorial Day, weather permitting, as the project contractor is on the final stretch of widening construction on the south side. Paving is scheduled to take place on the expanded south side of Canal Road between William Silvers Parkway and Oak Street March 21-25. This will complete the entire 2.3 miles of resurfacing the roadway between Hwy. 161 (Doc's) and William Silvers Pkwy. The placement of temporary and permanent striping on the road is the next step towards the end of May completion date.

The contractor is scheduled to resurface the roadway April 5-23, with crews working two weekends during that period. The resurfacing and the associated lane closures will impact both eastbound and westbound traffic. Unlike past weekends, significant traffic congestion will not be considered, as it is necessary to complete scheduled paving for each day. There is a two-week asphalt curing period following resurfacing before work can begin on permanent striping. Expect delays through the end of March and the week of April 4 when Baldwin schools are on spring break.

No construction is scheduled to occur on Easter Sunday or April 23-25 (Mullet Toss at Flora-Bama, Bama Coast Cruisin' at The Wharf). But the contractor will work weekends. The schedule is tentative and subject to change due to weather conditions and unforeseen issues.

Perdido Pass fishing wall will be open for summer tourist season

Options for Waterfront Park Pier repairs are still to be determined

Going on six months since Sally roared across the Alabama Gulf Coast things are still being put back together both for private residents and local governments.

In Orange Beach, two iconic locations are still awaiting repairs from storm damage, Waterfront Park Pier and the Perdido Pass fishing wall (pictured)

and the city will likely take a different approach on bringing each back on line. With the pier, a popular fishing spot and gathering spot at sunset, officials are looking at a process that will take more time. But they hope to get the fishing wall repairs done much more quickly with an eye on summer-time crowds who gather there. “It’s not a quick fix,” City Administrator Ken Grimes said of the pier. “The damage is fairly extensive in the middle and the outer section as far as the pilings and how it was washed. At this point, there are four or five different ways it could go and unfortunately none of them are fast. It’s going to be an expensive venture no matter what we do on the pier.”

When it goes out for bid, Grimes said the city is asking for two different proposals to compare the two to see how the city will proceed.

“The bid will be a full redo of the pier as it sits today and how it looks with the length of it and everything,” Grimes said. “Then we’ll have another option that would be a pier but a shorter pier from a standpoint of still a place to go as far as the public park so we can see what is the difference of the full pier versus half the pier. We don’t really know what that extent will be and what that cost will be.”

To apply for FEMA help with the replacement also adds time to the

process and that will play a role in the future of the Waterfront Park Pier.

“We do have some insurance coverage on the structure itself,” Grimes said. “We can apply the insurance toward what we want to do and then we will apply through FEMA because it’s a public facility for potential reimbursement and be able to rebuild depending. If we chose that route it would take longer to get it back in place but it would be heavily funded by some of the dollars that would be available for public facilities reimbursements.”

Grimes said hopefully bids on the pier options will go out within a month or so. The biggest problem will likely be finding a company available to get to the pier given the other waterfront damage all over the city and the island.

“The reality is everybody that’s in the pier reconstruction business, pilings, dock repair, everybody is slammed,” Grimes said. “And will probably be slammed for two years. That means pricing is going to be high just by the nature of demand. That’s the unfortunate side of that project but we’re going to definitely get something back at the public facility which they enjoy going out over the water.”

The new seawall/boardwalk at Waterfront Park also sustained some damage from the storm and is in need of repairs. Some of it remains open to the public.

Also, at Waterfront Park, Grimes said the city is making plans to put new

equipment at the playground there and hopes it can be complete by summer. Most of it was torn down before Sally due to rot but swings and a pirate ship apparatus both are still intact and available for public use.

PERDIDO PASS FISHING WALL

This area was damaged years ago and basically abandoned by the state because of the prohibitive cost of having it repaired. Orange Beach stepped in and asked for permission to pay for the repairs to keep this unique and popular spot open to the public.

“Do we want to try to fix under FEMA, do we want to scale back some of them?” Coastal Resources Director Phillip West asked. “If we fix them under FEMA it’s going to take a lot longer. Then there will be questions are you going to mitigate like Waterfront Park Pier. Are you going to try to ask for a mitigation grant to elevate it or put in bigger pilings next time? There’s just a lot to consider because all that takes time. Some people are OK with that – I would be. Other people aren’t.

“The seawall park, I want to fix that as soon as we can. I don’t want to wait to go through some sort of mitigation program for that we just want to get it fixed. Hopefully we’ll be moving forward on that pretty soon.”

Grimes says no decisions have been made on how to proceed with the repairs but he also is hopeful it can be open for the summer season.

“The land is owned by the state and the city has funded the improvements



that were there,” Grimes said. “I don’t have specific details yet but we’re going to try to get that one open by summer to where the boardwalk’s back in place, the benches. I think there’s been some decisions as to working with the state and trying to figure out what’s the best way and quickest way. The city will probably tackle that in getting it back open. Every time I go down you can see the sections that are open and how many people are starting to show up and we’re not even to the busy season.”

BACK COUNTRY TRAIL

Most of the trail is usable with two small exceptions, Sawgrass Grass Trail that runs west of the campground storage area and had some boardwalk burned. The cabin trail that connects to the cabins on Lake Shelby is also closed because none of the cabins are usable.

In Orange Beach, the gravel trail south of the Sportsplex that is a connector from the trailhead there to the 10-foot sidewalk is the only trail closed there.






