Community Connect is a secure, easyto-use platform that allows residents to share critical information about their household in order to aid first responders and emergency service personnel to respond more efficiently and effectively, ultimately resulting in better incident outcomes. In addition to the residential portal, Community Connect also helps business owners and managers keep people at their commercial properties safe by giving

First Responders access to critical documents such as evacuation procedures, occupant rosters, hazardous material lists and more.

"I highly encourage our residents in Gulf Shores to create a Community Connect profile," said Gulf Shores Fire Chief, Mark Sealy. "The critical information provided may assist in saving your life, or the life of a family member."

Community Connect is completely voluntary, and residents are individually able to decide which information they are comfortable sharing.

Residents simply create a profile and enter critical property and occupant information which is then made available to public safety agencies at the time of dispatch. Data provided by residents within Community Connect is 100% secure and is used only for the purpose of better serving the resident during emergency situations.

During the Civil War, Fort Morgan experienced a heavy fire. While the Battle of Mobile Bay, the Union set the fort on fire. This historic battle resulted in many deaths. Construction began in 1819 and was completed in 1834. When Fort Morgan was built, it was considered the "finest example of military architecture in the New World."

Civil War munitions exposed on Perdido Key beach following Ida

Cannonballs detonated at Gulf Islands National Seashore

The effects of last month's Hurricane Ida exposed stockpiled Civil War era munitions on the beach in two different locations a half mile from Fort McRee on the southeastern end of Gulf Islands National Seashore on Perdido Key.

The remote area is only accessible by boat, foot or ATV and the 35-pound cannonballs, around 190 in all, were detonated, as it was believed there was a slight risk of them exploding, since there was no way of knowing if they may have still contained gunpowder.

The origin of the cannonballs is being investigated, according to Superintendent of the Gulf Islands National Seashore Darrel Echols.

"The park continues to monitor the area for newly discovered munitions and will secure the site should any be found in the future," said Echols. "Our goal is to ensure that the area is safe for the visitors and staff, and that cultural resources are protected."

The area where the munitions were found is closed and marked with signs. Park rangers will be monitoring and patrolling the area regularly in search of additional undiscovered munitions still buried.

"The park continues to monitor the area for newly discovered munitions and will secure the site should any be found in the future," said Echols. "Our goal is to ensure that the area is safe for the visitors and staff, and that cultural resources are protected."

More than 190 cannonballs were detonated within park boundaries with help from other federal agencies.

Munitions found within national park boundaries are considered cultural artifacts and are protected by law. It is illegal for the public to harm, deface, damage, or remove these items. The National Park Service, Southeast Archaeology Center, and Florida State University began a cultural survey of the eastern end of Perdido Key in 2019.

Created in 1971, Gulf Islands National Seashore stretches 160 miles along the northern coast of the Gulf of Mexico in Florida and Mississippi, and includes barrier islands, maritime forests, historic forts, bayous, and marine habitat. Info: nps.gov/

Freedom Fest is here to stay

Oct. 9 Shrimp Fest fill-in event at The Wharf will surely expand

Roger Strick and Flo Rivers, who along with drummer Steve Jacobs, and Patrick Smiterman on bass, make up the band (pictured) Strickly Rivers, didn't know he would be part of the answer to a trivia question when he booked his band to play the inaugural Freedom Fest on Saturday, Oct. 9 at 9 a.m. on the Main St. stage at The Wharf.

But with Orange Beach Mayor Tony

Orange Beach announced plans for the fest just one day after the Shrimp Fest dropped the bombshell that it was cancelling the fest due to continued Covid concerns. Kennon announcing that the Festival will be an annual event rather than just a oneoff response to the Coastal Alabama Business Chamber cancelling the National Shrimp Fest for the second consecutive year, Strickly Rivers can now always lay claim to being the first

ever band to play at the festival.

"The organizers originally reached out to some friends. They were not available and recommended me. We are delighted to be a part of the event," said Strick, who has been playing music on Pleasure Island since moving here from Birmingham nine years back.

"It's great that this is going to be an annual thing, and I know it means a lot to the people who will be participating and attending," he added. "I think it will be well attended and be a great event. I

know I speak for a lot of people when I say I am delighted that Orange Beach

stepped up."

"I wasn't sure it was going to be a continued every year, but that is fantastic," added Rivers, who was in the medical field before deciding to try to make making music her fulltime job.

Strickly Rivers, regulars at Papa Rocco's, Ginny Lane and the GT's/Cobalt /Cosmo's bistro group, expect to play its usual eclectic set at Freedom Fest.

"My roots are in classic rock and acoustic finger picking, but my influences I couldn't narrow down. They change all the time," Strick said.

Rivers met Strick when she worked with his wife Diane, a nurse, during her stint as the clinic coordinator at South Baldwin Clinic in Gulf Shores.

A native of McIntosh, she has been singing all her life, but it is just since joining Strickly Rivers three years ago that she has made it her primary job.

"My love for music has always been there," she said. "But since I've been working at it fulltime we've had an amazing run. The tourists and the hometown folks have been great and we are playing a lot of private parties."

Rivers attended Faulkner State on a performing arts scholarship and was part of the Sun Chiefs Sound. She said Strickly Rivers is working some original music into their sets, but do not expect them to limit any performance to one genre.

"We sing a little bit of everything from Patsy Cline to Elton John to Bill Withers," she said. "We're super excited to be playing the first fest. We are hearing that it's going to be a good event and I think the weather is going to be really nice."

Orange Beach announced plans for the fest just one day after the Shrimp Fest dropped the bombshell that it was cancelling the fest due to continued Covid concerns.

"A large number of volunteers have voiced legitimate concerns over their safety, equating to a reduced ability to adequately man-

age and man the event," the shrimp Fest committee stated in their release.

The local chamber did not make any attempt to recruit replacement or first time volunteers who were not part of their core group, which was a major complaint among naysayers.

The original intent of the Freedom Fest was to provide a venue for artists and guests who has already made plans to be on Pleasure Island for the weekend, but the Orange Beach community has since stepped up to provide support.

The response has been overwhelming, according to Mayor Kennon, who said Freedom Fest is here to say and will definitely be a yearly event during the traditional Shrimp Fest weekend.

"People can pick and choose what they want to do. But we are going to put together a festival every year without concern for what the Shrimp Fest is doing," he said. "We have the Event Center, The Port and the Amphitheater at The Wharf. We have the new Performing Arts Center. We have the new beachfront property. There are too many venues



here not to have something going on. And October is a beautiful month here."

Whether Freedom Fest expands to other locations has yet to be determined, but Mayor Kennon is certain that it is going to expand in some way.

"We could have different concerts day and night. We just don't know where it will go, but we have so much flexibility that we can really make it happen and put on something special," he said.

The response from vendors and artists has been as extraordinary as the support from the Orange Beach community, Mayor Kennon said.

"People are pumped up for this festival," he said. "So many businesses have been willing to jump in and help out. It's been eye opening. You can see how badly people want to return to their normal life."

A Brooks & Dunn concert and Orange Beach Expect Excellence production of The Addams Family Musical Comedy dinner theater at the Orange Beach Event Center (see page 12 story) were already on the books for that weekend.

"People have the right to choose what they wish to attend and decide the risk they are willing to take, just like sitting in a sold-out football stadium with a hundred thousand other folks. We know that it is late notice and we may not be able to pull this off, but we do need to make a statement that this virus will not dominate and control our lives," said Mayor Kennon.

Freedom Fest, which is being promoted

as "a fun annual arts weekend," will be held from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and include 100 artists covering a wide variety of mediums and crafts.

In addition to Strickly Rivers, the fest will feature shows by Brown Barnes Band, Cole Sitzlar and Tres Amigos.

Miss Alabama, Lauren Bradford from Gulf Shores, will also take the stage around lunchtime. A kids zone and the Singing for Scholarships student competition (see sidebar) are also attractions. Commemorative merchandise will be sold.

There will be cajun pistols, thanks to Bon Temps PoPoys, which will also serve jambalaya. Other menu items will include empanadas, BBQ, Hawaiian shaved ice and Acai fruit bowls. The Wharf's many restaurants will be also be open and offer dine in, al fresco and take-out options.

The Wharf has vast parking areas, but if there is a need for overflow parking, an off-site shuttle system will be initiated from the Orange Beach High School parking lot and then the Orange Beach

The local Mardi Gras Krew, The Marshals, will host the Let Freedom Roar Run and Rally at noon, leaving from the Orange Beach Event Center. Registration fee is \$20 per motorcycle/Jeep (all passengers are free). Proceeds benefit Youth-Reach Gulf Coast, a Christ-centered residential ministry for young men ages 18-22. Participants can register at the departure sight before the run.



Video seems to prove golfer was the aggressor at Craft Farms

Air horn prank gone bad story picked up by national media

Thank goodness the incident was recorded on video, which was the idea behind the prank gone wrong in the first place.

Unfortunately, as of press time, only the original story was picked up by media from all over the country, including the Miami Herald and USA Today. Headlines included "Three golfers ambushed by camouflage-clad attackers" and "Jackass' Copycats Beat Up Golfers After Confrontation." The New York Post even featured the story, describing the victims as "the three elderly golfers." GSPD Lt. Jason Woodruff was contacted by TMZ.

The three golfers, who were definitely not elderly, were participating in a tourney at Craft Farms when someone hiding in the woods blew an air horn while each was attempting to hit their ball from the tee at the no. 3 hole during a tourney at Cotton

Creek at around 1 p.m. on Sept. 26.

I watched the video. I thought it was funny.

According to the original WKRG report that went viral, when the golfers confronted the honker, they were assaulted by a man and several other suspects who were hiding in the woods. The suspects were all wearing face paint and camouflage. One of the victims was hospitalized to be treated for a head cut and broken teeth, according to the report. Police were able to identify the accused from a picture a witness in a nearby neighborhood took of the car they left in and its license plate.

GSPD determined an assault had taken place and initiated an investigation. In response to the accusations, the pranksters released a video (currently available on the WKRG website) that they claim proves they were victimized after they admittedly purposely antagonized the golfers in order to gain hits on their

youtube channel.

"Do you need me to beat someone up here," said one of the golfers in the video while walking towards the direction from which the horn was blown.

"You don't need to keep taking pictures. I'm liable to slap you in the head," he added on video while approaching a man near the

"I'm with Auburn University. I'm trying to get pictures of red hawks in the area," the younger man being threatened said.

That did not sit well with the golfer.

"Know who you're messing with before you do that. I kill people

for a living," said the golfer on the video.

The pranksters claim a member of their video crew was tackled and beaten by a golfer. They posted a youtube of the incident titled, "Three Alabama Golfers Attack. The Truth Will Shock You."

"We did not attack anyone, we were attacked and it was a prank that led to violence," Seth Randall told WKRG.

"We find it fun. We weren't trespassing. We were at a homeowner's house who lived at Craft Farms," Seth Randall said.

"I'm going to say we were on the right side of it all which led to

a few men being very aggressive," Chaidy Mack added.

GSPD decided not to arrest anyone after reviewing the evidence. But the report that went viral is that three golfers were pranked, and then attacked. And one man then attempted to steal their golf cart. How one golfer reportedly ended up hospitalized with broken teeth is still not public knowledge.

What is clear in the video is that the golfer was a good 35 years older than the immature prankster he walked towards and

What is unfortunate for our national reputation at least during one 24 hour news cycle, is that the golfer's response to the prank was even less mature.

Luckily, mature adults, in the way of GSPD, did get involved. And they did not find enough evidence to file charges against any-

"I get that it may have been a prank. but it all could have just as easily been avoided. It was just unnecessary really," said Lt. Woodruff.

Washington Blvd. development goes back to planning commission

108 unit Terry Cove condo - marina complex & yet another Surf Style also on agenda

A group seeking to develop a parcel of land at the northeast corner of Washington Blvd. and Canal Rd. are going back before the Orange Beach Planning Commission after a second plan was rejected by the city council on June 15. The council expressed concerns about parking in the develop-

The plan presented in June called for 24 single-family lots but also asked for some variances from the zoning ordinance concerning setbacks, lot sizes and the percentage of land covered by the homes, among other things.

At the Oct. 11 Orange Beach Planning Board meeting at 4 p.m. in City Council chambers, the developers will come back with a plan that calls for 15 single-family lots and multi-family apartments containing 18 units. The apartments will be built on the Canal Road side. There will be a public hearing and a site plan review on the plans.

Also, during the meeting, the commission will hear about plans for a 108unit condo and marina complex just east of the Port Washington parcel on Terry Cove. And Surf Style is looking to build another store in Orange Beach just east of Cotton's Restaurant on the north side of beach road.

On Port Washington, the council rejected the June plan that called for using the street right-of-way to meet the number of parking spaces required.

"Right-of-way parking cheapens the entire development," Councilman Jerry Johnson said at the June 15 meeting. "When you allow right-of-way parking that means you park in front of the house. That means it's just another Cypress Village. I like Cypress Village, I like the layouts but there was never enough parking. You're on a postage stamp lot. And that's what they are proposing here. Reducing the setbacks and reducing the square footage (of

An overflow crowd from the East Orange Beach neighborhood showed up for the June 14 Planning Commission meeting and 24 of those spoke against Port Washington. The commission gave it an unfavorable recommendation at that meeting, 3-4, and the council voted it down unanimously, 6-0 the next day.

Another plan was voted down in 2016 because of neighbors' concerns over driveways from the subdivision coming out on Washington Boulevard. The plan presented in June had two access points out of the subdivision unto the roadway.

BILLFISH BAY

Developer Ray Nestlehutt will seek approval for a site plan request for a mixed-unit development on the south end of Captain Trent Lane on land zoned marine resort. Plans call for 108 condos, 36 apartment units, marina with wet slips and dry storage, restaurants, retail and commercial space and a parking garage. It is directly east of the Walker Key development.

Also, on Oct. 11, the commission will consider a site plan for a new 23,000square-foot Surf Style store at the corner of Perdido Beach Boulevard and Russell Drive. Surf Style has two stores in Orange Beach, two in Gulf Shores including an Island Market on East Beach Boulevard, Trading Co. stores in Gulf Shores and Orange Beach and one Surf Style store in Perdido Key. They are owned by the owners of the Hangout Hospitality Group.

The commission will also conduct a public hearing for subdivision of property in East Orange Beach. Thomas and Rhonda Davidson seek to resubdivide Lot 7 of Emerald Point subdivision and lots 1-6 of East Orange Beach subdivision into four lots. They are located at 5411 and 5413 Magnolia Cir-





What's Happening

PIER & SHORE FISHING OUTLOOK

By David "The Pierpounder" Thornton

Intermittent drier and slightly cooler air should continue to infiltrate the lingering summer heat and humidity as we head deeper into October. This is our time of seasonal transition, though summer-like weather is only grudgingly, and



temporarily displaced. And we are still in the active part of hurricane season, though we have been spared the worst for a while. No time to let down our guard though, as tropical systems occasionally do spawn in the southwestern Gulf of Mexico this time of vear.

The drier weather has allowed the Perdido River to recede, and the tannin-stained waters released on each outgoing tide into the Gulf do seem to be easing. Most fish don't really care all that much, though mackerel and pompano prefer the clearer, saltier green water we are accustomed to.

The shorebound bite lately has been mostly centered around the abundance and movements of schools of small herring ("LYs"). Most everything that swims from flounder to mackerel relish these three inch long minnows. And they are key to getting in on the most active bites.

A 3/8 inch mesh castnet or LY ribbon is the easiest way to gather enough baits to fish with. And that may be a lot, because they tend to go quickly with all the bluefish, ladyfish, etc. around. Though throwing a one ounce silver or gold spoon is often a great imitation of the 'real thing', and plenty of mackerel and bluefish are caught on these lures.

Bubble rigs have been working well on the Gulf State Park Pier lately, and have accounted for many of the bluefish and ladyfish landed there. And some of the spanish mackerel too. At least the ones that could be muscled in between the numerous Blacktip sharks that seem to be constantly hanging around the pier looking for an easy meal. But far more fish have been hooked on the small live LYs.

Meanwhile, catches of large redfish ("bull reds") are becoming more common along the beaches, especially around Perdido Pass and Fort Morgan Point. That long walk out to the point has paid off for several groups of anglers lately with multiple catches of reds from shore. And the action should only get better this month as more menhaden ("pogies") move out of the bays with the inland waters cooling off. So it should not be long before large schools of redfish 'blitz' the surfzone in general. And that is a time of year many anglers look forward to. Heavy tackle is required for these surfzone 'brutes'.

Bottom fishing from the beach continues to improve as the waters become 'greener' and have a little chop on them. Reports are fairly common of a good number of pompano (mostly undersized)

being caught from shore. Though scattered catches of "whiting" (Gulf kingfish) with a few occasional limits of 'keeper-sized' pompano, mostly using ghost shrimp. Some days that is not easy, especially with calm surf. Persistence and perhaps even relocation are essential to catching some of these prized surf fish.

Speaking of 'prized', how about this recent permit catch by (pictured below) Nate Ferguson? While renting a house in west Gulf Shores with family from north Georgia, Nate hooked what he thought was a very nice pompano because he saw it jump a couple of times during the fight. As the battle persisted, with several blistering runs he realized this was no ordinary pompano. And once landed, he knew it was a "ridiculously special fish."

A 21 1/2" long (fork length) permit, which would easily weigh 5 to 7 pounds. He knew it would 'crush' the current Alabama record of 4 pounds and 12.8 ounces, caught in August 2020.

Nate has long been a "lover of fishing," but even more so, loves his family by putting them above it all. Even though he realized right away the significance of his catch as a likely state record, he also realized the efforts to have it weighed and certified would take "most special" vacation time away from his beloved wife, four children (ages 8 years to 8 months), and other family members in attendance.

So, being a "fan of conservation," Nate quickly made the decision to release his fish after a few quick photos. An outstanding act, and selfless act all us fishermen should applaud and appreciate. Nate stated catching this permit was a "culmination of doing things right."

And he most certainly did!

Edward Evans of Silverhill honored by Purple Heart project

U.S. Army Command Sergeant Major Edward Evans (Ret.) of Silverhill, a Korean War veteran and Purple Heart recipient, has been chosen to represent Alabama's Purple Heart Veterans as part of the 2021 Purple Heart Patriot Project. He recently traveled to the U.S. Military Academy

at West Point to be honored at the National Purple

Heart Hall of Honor.

Mr. Evans enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1948 and was wounded in Korea in 1950. Following his 20-year career in the military, Mr. Evans started a small business and spent 23 years as a missionary and church builder.

The Purple Heart Patriot Project is a program of the National Purple Heart Honor Mission. Evans' all-expense-paid trip included tours of historic Washington's Headquarters, and other tributes to service.

"Service is about a commitment to one's country. It was an honor to serve my country during times of war

and peace," Evans said.

A twenty-year veteran of the U.S. Army, former CSM Evans enlisted in September 1948. His career took him across the country and around the world. Evans earned his Purple Heart during his tour of duty in Korea in September 1950, when then-SGT Evans was acting as a forward observer with G-Company, 9th Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. Evans and his unit came under mortar fire. When the shelling stopped the men started advancing. When a new round

of shelling started, a mortar landed right behind him in his foxhole. Evans was evacuated to a Tokyo hospital.

In addition to his Purple Heart, Mr. Evans received numerous commendations and awards, including the Bronze Star with valor, Army Commendation Medal.

After retiring from the Army, Evans started his own swimming pool business. For 23 years, prior to the death of his wife, he also served with U.S. Missions, Assembly of God, as a U.S. church builder. Evans and his late wife, Mildred, had three children. He was nominated to take part in the mission by his daughters, Karla Dauzat and Marcia Evans.

The National Purple Heart Hall of Honor is located just north of West Point, New York, at the site where General George Washington first awarded the Medal for Military Merit in 1782 during the Revolutionary War. The badge, shaped like a purple heart was the forerunner of today's medal. In addition to creation of the museum, supporters of the National Purple Heart Honor Mission were instrumental in the creation of the Purple Heart Forever stamp now issued by the US Postal Service, and are leading the effort in Congress to pass the National Purple Heart Commemorative Coin Act.

Red Snapper season re-opens Oct. 15 for charter boats in federal waters


The 2021 Gulf of Mexico (Gulf) red snapper fishing season in federal waters for vessels with federal for-hire (charter/headboat) reef fish permits will reopen on Oct. 15 and remain open through Nov. 6, according toa press release from the NOAA Fisheries Council. The original 63 day season for charter boats ended on Aug. 3. But based on updated landings data, NOAA Fisheries determined that the red snapper recreational forhire sector's annual catch target was not reached during the open season, and is allowing Gulf for-hire fishermen opportunity to catch the remaining allocation. This reopening does not affect the recreational private angler season, which is determined by state agencies and is currently closed in Alabama and Florida state waters.

The red snapper total recreational quota is 7,399,000 pounds whole weight. The private angling component is allocated 57.7% and the for-hire component is allocated 42.3%. The annual catch target for the federal forhire component is 2,848,000 pounds whole weight, which is 91% of the quota. The estimated number of days for the federal for-hire component to harvest the remaining red snapper allocation was projected using recent catch rates and the average weight of harvested fish. Patrick Conley & Liam Bickham complete a maritime adventure for the ages

Swim For Alligator Lighthouse one of world's most challenging open water swims

They're Patrick Conley and Liam Bickham, Gulf Shores High School students not Moby Dick's Ishmael, and they already live in a "watery part of the world." The lure of ocean adventures beckoned, though, from

hundreds of miles away, and led them on the adventure of a lifetime.

"Mo pretty much said, 'I'm not going to swim this with him and you need to', so I agreed."

The challenge: Swim for Alligator Lighthouse, according to Tom Ward of RedBull.com "one of the eight most challenging swims in the world", eight miles of open water to Alligator Light off the coast of Islamorada in the Florida Keys, sit-

orada in the Florida Keys, sitting equidistant between Key
West and the mainland. Two
years ago, Liam swam a onemile leg when the course was
shortened by a hurricane. Sometimes nature wins. This
time, he and Patrick planned to take turns and swim

time, he and Patrick planned to take turns and swim the entire eight miles, four out and around the lighthouse and four returning, taking turns paddling a kayak in support, a task in itself that provided little true rest for the person not swimming.

Lighthouse Larry, a world-renowned local artist, founded the feat of skill and endurance almost a decade ago after completing the swim and telling friends he thought everyone should try it. Proceeds sponsor scholarships for high school students and go toward restoring the dormant Alligator Lighthouse, named for U.S. Navy schooner Alligator which went aground on coral reef (now also known as Alligator Reef) in 1822 while serving as part of a Navy Anti-Piracy unit in 1822.

Liam was the first person Patrick met on the bus to swim practice a year ago after Patrick moved from Alaska to Gulf Shores. It's pretty easy to imagine Liam with his big grin welcoming the new young man. They became friends, and as this year's challenge approached, Liam's mom Mo, who is an accomplished swimmer in her own right, told Patrick he needed to do the swim with Liam.

Patrick remembered the conversation. "Mo pretty much said, 'I'm not going to swim this with him and you need to', so I agreed."

Liam had already been to Florida's Islamorada Key, where the curious and enchanted can discover warm ocean breezes and views, quaint shops, and art galleries filled with landscape paintings and sculptures of sportfish. His first journey had been tame in comparison to

this undertaking. The same area that tempted Hemingway, creating Santiago's "salao", the worst form of unlucky, greeted Liam's friend Patrick upon their arrival.

"Iguanas everywhere," Patrick recounted, thinking back to his first impressions. "The smell." Cars and iguanas don't coexist well. The ocean breezes dawned hot and sultry on September 11, 2021, not a good mix for an adventure, even if you're considered some of the top endurance athletes in the world.

For what it's worth, no albatross was slain, but Patrick and Liam couldn't help but sense an ominous foreboding as they began. The current battered Patrick on his first twenty-minute leg as he struggled to see through the murky depths, usually pristine and clearer than

"You have to embrace the suck. "You know, make the best of the situation. It was so hot." bath water but now clouded with seaweed and jelly fish, which stung him mercilessly. When Liam's turn came, the pair swamped their kayak and dumped their support supplies into the Atlantic's depths.

"I never found out how others managed to prevent that," Patrick said with his characteristic wry smile. Luckily, they salvaged some of the Gu, snacks, and water bottles intended for nourishment and sustenance on the trek.

Even though Liam and Patrick began after almost all the other swimmers due to the staggered start, Liam passed every other team during that second leg. They found themselves charting the course for everyone else.

Buoyed by the fact that officials floated in boats and jet skis along the route, their quest took a turn for the better about half-way out when the water began to miraculously clear, providing a spectacular view of the seabed and the coral. Patrick wasn't as appreciative of the scene, though, when on his second leg he saw a barracuda dash into view to devour a smaller fish, bringing the swimmer to a halt for a moment before continuing.

Luckily, when they rounded the rusty lighthouse, the current changed to give them a push. Unfortunately, it wouldn't last as the waves managed to not only obscure the marker buoys each 400 meters but also push them off course and add distance and fatigue that only Odysseus could have appreciated.

"You have to embrace the suck," Liam says, "you know, make the best of the situation. It was so hot."

Late in the swim, Patrick thought, "Everyone else is

doing it. It would be a shame if I gave up." But almost everyone else labored behind them at this point as the pair was clocking almost thirty-minute miles under stark conditions. Patrick had grown dehydrated due to the limited drinking water, and his lips were parched and salty.

Beach.

Liam put the finishing touches on the swim, and as he approached for the homestretch, he still had enough energy to break into a strong butterfly stroke, to the delight of the announcer and fans. They finished in four hours and nine minutes, and the adventure was complete.

So how do you top that?

"Next time, we're each going to do the whole thing," Liam said.
