Papa Rocco's Sponsors Annual St. Patrick's Day Walking Pub Parade

It was way back in 1983 when Bill McGinnes brought the concept of "warm beer & lousy pizza" to downtown Gulf Shores. One year later, The Island's favorite Scotsman (by way of Michigan) assumed leadership of the annual St. Patrick's Day (March 17) Walking Parade in his new hometown. The concept is simple: A throng of revelers - young & old, local & snowbird - follow Papa sponsored bagpipers to most of the bars in downtown Gulf Shores. Grand Marshall McGinnes says he will not be walking the entire route this year. But the procession will still start from his business, located two blocks from the beach on Hwy. 59, somewhere around 9:30 a.m. "We'll March on the 17th and rest on the 18th," Papa said. Papa Rocco's St. Paddy's Walking Parade will roll again

Fun times back for Papa Bill McGinnes & company on March 17

Although a recent medical procedure will keep him from leading the green throng of soon-to-be good friends on its merry walk through downtown Gulf Shores in seach of alcohol laden beverages and good times, grand marshall Bill McGinnes will join the parade at a few of its stops, and he will be hanging at Papa Rocco's greeting old and new friends all day.

The occasion is the annual Papa Rocco's St. Patrick's Day Walking Parade, which will depart from that bistro's deck somewhere around 9:30

a.m. on Thursday, March 17.

"I just can't make the walk this year, but that is not going to take away from the fun," McGinnes said. "I'll get a lift to a few places and leave it to the bagpipers to handle things. This is not about me anyway. This is about people getting together and having fun."

This year's pied-pipers leading revelers to pub stops that will include The Flying Harpoon, Mudbugs, The Steamer, Desoto's, The Hangout, The Pink Pony, Gulf Island Grille and Hooters are Papa's nephew, Neil

McGinnes, and Malcolm McLean.

The crawl ends around 2 p.m. at Mikee's. But by then most of the crowd will have stopped along the way to eat a meal or sip an extra libation.

Sponsored by McGinnes, owner of Papa Rocco's (one block north of the beach on Hwy. 59), the parade of pubs has been a Gulf Shores tradition since the mid-1970's when then Pink Pony Pub owner Vince Murphy recruited the late bagpiper Jocko McLain and a few friends to visit a list of bars that mostly no longer exist.

Murphy passed the baton to local character John Kelliher, who led the swarm behind Jocko into Papa Rocco's just after McGinnes opened his restaurant in 1984. Kelliher, The Colonel to his friends, deemed

McGinnes worthy of the grand marshal's position in 1989.

"This started as a way to give the local restaurants a jump on the season," McGinnes said. "We really didn't have a spring break back then. It's gotten a lot bigger, obviously. I'm expecting the biggest crowd yet. People have missed it.

"People come from all over Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana. Our snowbirds love it. And we get some spring breakers. We even have grand-kids of some of the originals coming out with us," McGinnes added.

McGinnes applies for an official parade permit from Gulf Shores City Hall every year (ordinance 367. Section 5), and the Green Horde is easy

to find, as the crowd takes over the grounds at every stop.

This is just the fourth parade since the passing of the parade's original bagpiper, who died in August of 2017 at his home in Canada. But Jocko will always be a big part of the festivities and the heart and soul of the parade, according to McGinnes.

"I met Jocko at the American Legion and we immediately sat down and killed off a bottle of Irish whiskey between us," McGinnes said. "We started talking about Scotland and The Rangers (soccer team) and it was like we had known each other for years. There were a couple of years when we hitched a ride back to Papa Rocco's, but I can't do that anymore."

McGinnes said he thinks in addition to being an opportunity for grandchildren to spend a fun day with their adult children and adult grandchilden, the parade's allure is that it is often a reunion for old friends that know for sure they will see each other on St. Patrick's Day in downtown Gulf Shores

"We want to make sure that people are being safe when crossing public roads. But we are not sure what we are doing besides having fun," McGinnes said. "I do know that lots of people come up and tell me they look forward to this every year."

G.S. to borrow \$200 million to fund school's "Next Wave"

Gulf Shores is making plans to borrow almost \$200 million to help fund several capital projects the city hopes to complete within the next 10 years, including the extensive expansions planned for Gulf Shores City Schools presented to the community on March 8 at the Erie Meyer Civic Center. The "Next Wave" master plan will be available to stream on both the Gulf Shores City and Gulf Shores Schools' social media platforms. It includes a new Gulf Shores High School campus north of the Intracoastal Waterway, renovating and expanding Gulf Shores Elementary School and building a new home for Gulf Shores Middle School.

In a memo from city Administrator Steve Griffin and Finance Director Cindy King, the city plans to ask Truist Bank for a \$150 million tax-exempt loan and SouthState Bank for another \$47 million loan.

"These bank loan debts are intended to fund critical transportation, public safety, park and recreation and school improvements as was approved by the Council in the FY 2022 budget's 10-year capital improvement plan," the memo states.

"Gulf Shores has experienced exponential growth in tourism and full-time resident population over the last 10 years which has placed significant strain on the existing transportation network, public safety resources and quality of life for residents."

The city is leveraging a phased-in raise in lodging taxes to help secure the loans. An increase was voted to the lodging tax in December and the 3 percent hike will be phased in with a 2 percent increase on Sept. 1 and the final 1 percent raise will come on Sept. 1, 2023.

Lodging taxes will then be up to 16 percent in Gulf Shores compared to 13 percent in Orange Beach, 12 percent in Perdido Key and Pensacola.

Annual debt service for the Truist loan would be \$9.48 million with the first payment due in March of 2023. With the SouthState loan the debt would be \$3.2 million annually with interest paid only on principal drawn for the first two years.

The city is expecting new revenues of \$13.1 million to \$15.1 million to pay the projected debt of \$12.68 million to fund the improvements.

An additional \$81.1 million is planned for transportation improvements with \$38.7 million coming from state and federal grants and \$42.4 million funded by Gulf Shores.



More than 800 school-aged public school students alone in Baldwin County will benefit from the association and its amenities. Additionally, one of the main focuses of the Miracle League is to build self-esteem and encourage new friendships while being treated just as any other athlete. The Miracle League uses a "buddy" system - pairing each player with an able-bodied peer, which teaches many things beyond the sport itself.

"With generous donations like this, our development team just surpassed the \$1MM mark in funds raised to date. We are very thankful to The Wharf for their support," said Coastal AL Miracle League Chairman Bruce White.



Escambia County opens another free public beach on Perdido Key

Escambia County officials recently held a ceremony to officially open a new free public beach access on Perdido Key featuring a permeable concrete parking lot with 35 parking spots, an ADAcompliant AccessMat dune walkover and educational signage about protected wildlife.

The site will add an additional 300 feet of public beach access on the west side of Perdido Key, and is located adjacent to the Crab Trap restaurant at 16470 Perdido Key Dr.

"This new access point will allow us to more than double the existing amount of free public beach access on Perdido Key for all the citizens of Escambia County to enjoy. That in and of itself is a remarkable accomplishment," said Escambia County District 1 Commissioner Jeff Bergosh, who represents Perdido Key.

"This is only the beginning of the work our office plans to pursue to create more free access points on Perdido Key for our citizens' use in the years to come," he added. "And it will be open just in time for Spring Break. This is a great day for Es-

cambia County."

The 300 ft. public beach was the former site of the Sundowner Condominium, which was destroyed by Hurricane Ivan in 2004. The original concrete pad and building debris were removed in the summer of 2020 and the prior parking lot's shell base was used for the parking area at the new public access. Construction was paid for with county tourism development tax.

Escambia County acquired the parcel in 2014 in part with a grant from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to provide public beach access and conserve critical habitat for threatened and endangered species.

The site will be managed in accordance with the Perdido Key Habitat Conservation Plan, and fencing will prevent pedestrian and vehicular trespass into protected habitat areas, while signage will educate visitors about threatened and endangered species that utilize the site, including endangered beach mice, nesting shorebirds and sea turtles.

"Out of a tragedy of Hurricane Ivan that knocked down a condo that used to be here came an opportunity, so the commission at that time purchased this property and spent a little over \$3 million, and they purchased it so we could do what we're doing right now," Bergosh said at the opening ceremony.

Commissioner Doug Underhill, who until December's redistricting, represented District 1 and Perdido Key, objected to the public beach on the grounds that it would harm the Perdido Beach mouse habitat and it would be better to hold the land in conservation under the Habitat Management Plan. Underhill was also adamant that the county should aggressively persue other opportunities to purchase public beach access points.

Underhill is not running for re-election, but Bergosh, the Commission Chairman, said he will also push for more public beach access and parking access on Perdido Key.

"I'm a beach guy," Bergosh said. "I love the beach, and I love going out to the beach to fish. And I love the idea of having public beach access for people on the west side of Pensacola."

The owners association from Seafarer Condos, located directly east of the new public beach access, filed suit against Escambia County to try to stop development of the access site in 2018 on the grounds that it violated the county's land development code. That lawsuit is still ongoing in Escambia Circuit Court.



Eighteen other states have enacted legislation or passed resolutions that would make daylight saving time permanent, but Congress would have to change federal law to allow that, according to the National Conference of State Legis-



OBHS football coach takes same position at Spanish Fort

Chase Smith led Makos to play-offs in program's 2nd season

Chase Smith, the first ever football coach/athletic director at Orange Beach High School, was approved for those same positions at state power Spanish Fort during the Baldwin County

Board of Education's March 4 meeting.

Smith was hired as Orange Beach High School's first football coach and athletic director on April 1, 2019, four months before OBHS opened to 9th and 10th grade

"Starting a program from scratch can seem like an impossible task, but through Mako grit we all were able to make history with the success that our studentathletes achieved in just the program's infancy," Smith wrote in a farewell letter to Mako Nation.

The Makos debuted as a varsity program in 2020 with a lopside non-conference win against Shields on

Aug. 20 and finished with a 3-6 record.

The team followed with a nine win season and a home play-off game in 2021. One of the team's two losses was a COVID related

Smith returns to a familiar place, having coached at Spanish Fort for four years. He worked with running backs in 2007, defensive linemen from 2008 to 2009 and the offensive line in 2010.

Before leaving to build the program at OBHS, Smith was the Robertsdale High School head coach for one year.

A graduate of Shades Valley High School in Birmingham and player at Jacksonville State, he coached at Spain Park and Hoover before heading to Spanish Fort. From 2011-2017, Smith coached at the University of South Alabama, first as a graduate assistant, then as director of football operations, and tight ends and offensive linemen coach.

Smith's is the third coach that Spanish Fort has poached from Pleasure Island, as he replaces former Gulf Shores High School coach Ben Blackmon, who made the play-offs every year, earned four regional championships and a 6A state championship in his

seven seasons there. The Toros finished 10-2 in 2021.

Mark Freeman left GSHS in 2014 to take a position at Spanish Fort after leading the Dolphins to a 13-9 record and one play-off berth in his two seasons on Pleasure Island. Freeman would go on to win two Class 5A state championships in his four seasons at Spanish Fort.

A class act by all accounts, Smith thanked the OBHS teachers, administration, and student-athletes that helped OBHS earn unprecedented success in its first five semesters. PIER & SHORE FISHING OUTLOOK

Right on cue it seems winter's chilly grip has been slipping a bit the past couple of weeks. In fact, we could experience one of the year's most dramatic transformations during this current fortnight. Spring is quickly making inroads along the north central gulf coast, with air and water temperatures nudging consistently



through the 60s. We may not be quite done with cool weather completely, but it is definitely on the way out as the Vernal Equinox is upon us March 20. So hours of daylight are getting longer now, and the change to Daylight Savings Time (on

March 13) will extend the appearance of that even more.

Fish in the surf zone are already becoming more active as sheepshead are gathering to spawn in the Gulf with the moon becoming full on March 18th, which coincides with a NEAP tide period. More pompano have been caught during the past two weeks than the through the previous two months. And we can expect that trend to increase as many more move into the surfzone while water temperatures climb through the middle to upper 60s.

Another sure sign of spring, is the arrival of Spring Breakers and spanish mackerel from middle to late March. These true pelagic mackerel migrate into our waters from southwest Florida this month. They arrive lean and hungry from their long journey, so catching a limit (15 per angler, per day) is often not all that difficult once you find them and set on the pattern. The first spanish of the year are often landed from the south end of the Alabama Point west jetty during the first or second week in March. Soon after that some begin showing up at the Gulf State Park Pier just outside the longshore sandbar. Gotcha plugs are favored lures for catching these fast striking mackerel. But medium sized spoons and especially ½ to ¾ ounce white and yellow leadhead jigs can be quite effective early in the season. In this cooler water, the spanish seem to hang close to the bottom.

So a fast sinking lure worked quickly up a few feet off the bottom is often the best way to get their attention. Plus the single hook or lone treble hook are much safer for anglers, which may line up elbow to elbow when the action gets fast and furious and word or "the mackerel run" spreads. Be sure to tie on a foot or so of heavy (30-40 pound), clear monofilament line as protection from those razor sharp mackerel teeth. And pack some needle-nosed pliers to make hook removals less perilous.

Bleeding your mackerel by cutting or breaking the gill rakers will make them even tastier when cooked. I dunk my still kicking fish head first into a 5 gallon bucket halfway filled with water. After the fish stops wiggling it can be placed in a cooler without near as much bloody mess.

But spanish aren't the only game in town, because the sheepshead bite is usually at its peak during this period too. Plus the pompano action is getting more dependable with every day the water temp rises. Add to that more activity from whiting, in addition to occasional slot sized redfish. Live shrimp work great for all these fish, but supplies sometimes lag behind demand. So check with the baitshops and adjust your plans accordingly. Fiddler crabs are still a dependable backup bait for sheepshead. And bull minnows work great for flounder, and even slot sized redfish. Yes, some flounder are already showing up along the beaches and in the passes. So we can expect to see some of them too.

In fact beach fishing should be picking up more in general now too. With more pompano and whiting being reported, along with some redfish and black drum. Ghost shrimp is still the best bait overall, but as the water warms more fish may be taken on fresh dead shrimp, Fishbites or Fishgum. The pier has been a bit more productive recently, and we can expect that to improve even more once the spanish mackerel show up, as long as the sharks don't take over. Little Lagoon Pass can still provide good fishing at times, though the dredging operation is about to resume (Monday through Friday 8am to 4pm). Remember paying to park at the venues in Gulf Shores has resumed (March 1 through November 30), so be prepared for that as well. But check out the newly opened free parking facility just over the Florida State Line called Perdido Key Access #4.

Day to day weather, and how the amount of sunlight, wind and waves affects the fish feeding habits due to water clarity plays a huge factor in the characteristics of what is biting and when. And of course, the tide movement has a role in that equation as well. So solving the riddle of being in the right place at the right time and rigged up the right way become the keys to angling success.

Communication among anglers helps disseminate pertinent information that lends toward more overall success for all. So be observant of any patterns of fish behavior that may help you anticipate and participate in the action. Remarks from others that begin with "You should have been here an hour ago." Or "We tore them up here yesterday, last week, etc.)" are commonplace, and should be taken with the same 'grain of salt' the weatherman provides in relation to our rapidly changing conditions.

The old adage about March "coming in like a lamb, and out like a lion" holds a lot of truth because we are in the midst of dynamic seasonal fluctuation. That can be frustrating for the unprepared, and even experienced anglers may be fooled at times. But overall, we should be seeing more 'catching' through this month.





COOKIN' WITH CAROLYN

Cabbage Roll Casserole

2 pounds ground beef

1 large onion, chopped

3 garlic cloves, minced

2 cans (15 oz. each) tomato sauce, divided

1 tsp. dried thyme

1/2 tsp. dill weed

1/2 tsp. rubbed sage

1/4 tsp. salt

1/4 tsp. pepper

1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper (or less)

2 cups cooked rice

4 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled

1 medium head cabbage (2 pounds), shredded

1 cup (4 oz.) shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese

In a large skillet, cook the beef, onion and garlic over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Stir in one can of tomato sauce and seasonings. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 5 minutes. Stir in rice and bacon: heat through. Remove from the heat. Laver a third of the cabbage in a greased 13-in. x 9-in. x 2-in. baking dish. Top with half of the meat mixture. Repeat layers; top with remaining cabbage. Pour remaining tomato sauce over top. Cover and bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes. Uncover, sprinkle with cheese. Bake 10 minutes longer or until cheese is melted. Let stand for 5 minutes before serving. Yield: 12 servings.

Alabama Audubon biologist finds rare owl in Gulf State Park dunes

A very rare burrowing owl was observed in the dunes at Gulf State Park earlier this month by Olivia Morpeth, an Alabama Audubon Coastal biologist, while she was conducting a permitted survey. This is the the first sighting that's been reported at Gulf State Park in over 20 years of bird monitoring, according to a GSP post. Alabama Audubon biologists and volunteers survey and monitor the coastal birds at GSP year

The owls live in grassland or dune habitats. Typically, their range is through the western portion of the United States and south of Florida's panhandle. The owls live in the dunes and dig out burrows to make their nests.

This sighting is a testament to the dune restoration efforts of GSP staff and volunteers, including the recent Christmas tree recycling program and native dune planting held in conjunction with Gulf Shores City Schools.
