

The Natural Resources Management department was awarded an \$10,450 grant from the Pensacola and Perdido Bays Estuary Program for the Perdido Key Coastal Demonstration Garden. The garden will showcase native plant species and demonstrate various landscaping techniques specific to the coastal environment. Signage will inform visitors about the plants species and techniques used for each area. The project includes development of a landscaping brochure to be distributed to area homeowners and property managers.

Due to the size of the garden, volunteer slots are limited to 25 and sign-ups are on a first-come, first-come basis. Volunteers under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

There has been considerable public interest in the Baldwin County Sewer Service (BCSS) on Fort Morgan Road and their application to increase their output of sewage at the plant. The meeting will be held from from 4:30 - 6 p.m. at the Gulf Shores Activity Center (260 Clubhouse Dr.).

Local men bicycling to Key West to raise prostate cancer funds, awareness

The starting point and the charity they are riding in support of are the same, but the Mull brothers (Andy and Chris) are traveling in the opposite direction 19 months after bicycling from Perdido Key to Cleveland to raise funds for prostate cancer awareness. And they have recruited friends Dustin Littledale, Kevin Castillo, Jonohon Berry and Ken Newman to join them on their latest adventure. Plus, Joe DeMartino has stepped up to assist Ken Krempin on the all-important support crew.

The Mulls' 2020 bike ride from the Gulf of Mexico to Lake Erie raised over \$22,000 for the local Simon Says non-profit. The goal is to raise \$25,000 this year. Pastor Mike Ellingsen of the Flora-Bama Central Church held a Blessing of the Wheels for the riders and their supporters at the state line on April 16. The men are traveling east along the Florida Panhandle before turning south on A1A to US Mile Marker 0 in Key West with a goal of arriving on April 30.

"This will be different. It is not as long, and there are bridges, but no mountains," Chris Mull said. "The biggest difference is we will be staying in relative luxury at hotels with swimming pools and jacuzzis rather than living out of a camper and staying at campgrounds.'

The riders hope that they have similar luck with the weather, as the Mulls experienced only three days of rain during the 2020 trip.

They timed that journey to coincide with their grandmother's 100th birthday party near Cleveland. This year they expect around 50 of their Perdido Key friends to be there waiting to party with them when they arrive in Key West after 14 days on the road.

A former school (sixth grade math) teacher at Jim Bailey School, Andy Mull also logged 20 years and as a Navy air traffic controller.

Chris left a solid job in manufacturing in Ohio to move to the Perdido Key in 2014, after visiting his brother here numerous times. He and his wife Tracy opened the Purple Parrot Tiki Bar & Grill, a business they recently sold.

The Mull brothers have always been close as their four year age difference would allow. Chris, the elder, played basketball at Western Reserve High School in their hometown of Berlin Center, Ohio. Andy played football for the Roughriders.

As the elder brother, Chris was able to dominate most competitions when they were younger. The relationship, of course, matured, when Andy caught up in size.

"Now the abuse is just mental," Andy joked before their first trip.

"I usually beat him in everything" is how Chris remembers it.

Simon Says is a local charity that promotes awareness and early testing for prostate cancer and it is a natural choice for a benefactor.

Chris said he almost died because of his own lack of awareness of the disease.

He was diagnosed with prostate cancer in 2018 during his routine 50 year old checkup. He said if he had waited much longer, he would have been in deep trouble, which is tragic since it is as easy as drawing blood to get checked for signs of prostate cancer.

"If I waited, things could be a lot different for me today. I went in for a PSA test and it was 6.5 or something like that. We took it a step further and my doctor could see that there was something going on," Chris said.

Chris chose an operation over radiation and that was the right choice as his cancer was accelerating when he went under the knife.

"Afterwards, the doctor said the cancer was a lot worse than he thought and it was a good thing I had the surgery," Chris said. "It pretty much saved my life. I am glad I did my 50 year old checkup. I feel firmly about guys getting checked. All it is a blood test for PSA's."

The men followed the Underground Railroad Trail that extends from Mobile to Canada on their cross country trip. That route is very historical and mostly off-road. They went 13 days without seeing anybody else biking cross country. But they know this is a much more dangerous ride. The challenge will be staying safe while on busy AIA and Hwy. 98 for much of the trip.

Still, they are optimistic and having too much fun not to consider a third fundraising bike trip.

"Oh yeah. We are already thinking about it," Chris said.



Fish will fly April 22-24 during Flora-Bama's 37th Mullet Toss

Flora-Bama's April 22-24 Mullet Toss weekend, which has rightfully been billed as the Gulf Coast's Greatest Beach Party, returns to the beautiful quartz crystal beach behind that famed roadhouse for the 37th time beginning with the kids' toss at 10 a.m. each day.

Adult tossers start at noon, with the fi-

nals set for 4 p.m. each day.

The \$15 per toss fee includes a tshirt (Proceeds go to local charities).

Cover charge to Flora-Bama begins at 9 a.m. each day from Friday through Sunday. Entry is \$10 per day for 21 and up and \$15 for 13-20 year olds, with 12 & under admitted free.

The party is open to all ages until 6 p.m., at which point the event is for those 21 and up. Membership cards are good for entry during Mullet Toss. Cards are available online or at the door for \$45 and are good for the entire event and the rest of the year. it is cash only for bar sales on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, with plenty of ATM's available.

Tens of thousands of folks from throughout the nation & all walks of life will descend upon the Lounge On The Line for the three day frenzy of food, fun and frivolity. And the event has grown into one of the busiest weekends on the Alabama-Florida Gulf Coast and raises well over \$25,000 for local schools and charities every year.

The attraction is not necessarily watching folks throwing a mullet, a mystical fish possessing a gizzard, out of a 10-foot circle, from Perdido Key, Florida towards Orange Beach, Alabama.

The attraction is the party itself, which is part frat reunion, part excuse to take a road trip to what some (including Playboy magazine) say is the best beach bar in the world.

But it is a legitimate competition. Overall winners earn bragging rights, trophies, and gift certificates to local es-

tablishments. And trophies are awarded 3-deep in 19 total age categories, male & female, for each day of toss.

Other Mullet Toss events include a Mr. Mullet **Hot Body Contest** at 1 p.m. on Friday and Saturday in the inside tent, and the Miss Mullet Toss bikini contest at 3 p.m. on

Friday & Saturday.

Music will be continuous on three stages throughout the weekend (see pages 28-29) and include the Big Earl Show on Friday and Saturday at 5:30 p.m..

The four eateries on the Flora-Bama campus - the Flora-Bama Yacht Club, Flora-Bama Ole River Grill and the original Flora-Bama Lounge and Oyster Bar will feature tacos, shrimp, oysters, bama burgers and crawfish.

There is no charge for parking and lots will be manned by local non-profits. But parking is severely limited. Take a taxi, a shuttle or call Uber or Lyft.

Although actually tossing a mullet is an afterthought to most attendees, the competition does attract serious competition, and there are strict rules for

Contestants must select a mullet from the water bucket themselves. No gloves,









no sand coating and no loading up a mullet with ballast before flinging is allowed.

All competitors must retrieve their own fish and return it to the water bucket. Stepping out of the circle before tossing or tossing the fish out of bounds are other no-nos. Tossers have only one chance to qualify for the finals each day.

Those who can manage a throw of more than 100 ft. have a good chance of plac-

Tossing techniques are as varied as the contestants themselves. For most, the best strategy is to fold the fish and pretend like you are trying to gun down a runner at the plate from center field.

Longtime competitor Wes Durham said at a past Toss that he likes to give his fish a pre-flight sip of beer. "Food for flight," he called it.

Many Mullet Toss patrons will make condo and hotel reservations for 2023 while in town this year.


"They could come here on July 4th or Memorial Day or Labor Day. But they decide that something we created was going to be their weekend to have a party, and they come back every year," said Flora-Bama co-owner Pat McClellan. "It's a tradition for a lot of people, and they respect that tradition and respect each other.

"We have less problems with crowds at the Mullet Toss than during the major holiday weekends," he added.

The Interstate Mullet Toss has been written up in the Wall Street Journal, The Washington Post and the New York Times. It's been covered by all three network morning shows.

It was also featured in Sports Illustrated, but McClellan's attempt to get the record toss listed in the Guiness Book of World Records was rejected.

Tickets on sale for May 4-8 NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship Draw increases to 16 schools; LSU is currently ranked sixth

Tickets are now on sale for the 2022 NCAA Beach Volleyball Championship set for May 4 and May 6-8 at the Gulf Place Public Beach in Gulf Shores. This year's championship will feature a new 16-team field playing in a knockout round on May 4, with the winners advancing to the eight team double elimination tourney May 6-8.

Ticket Prices: First Round (May 4): \$25; General Admission All-Session (May 6-8): \$55; General Admission Courtside Seating All-Session (May 6-8): \$85; NCAA Fan Experience All-Session (May 6-8): \$250. Purchase tickets at https://bit.ly/NCAABVB22.

All-session group tickets are also available. Single-day tickets will go on sale April 9. All duals taking place May 4-8 will be aired live on the ESPN family of networks.

LSU is ranked no. six in the AVCA current poll, despite having only two players returning from the 2021 team that finished fourth in the country. The Tigers lost to UCLA and Florida Atlantic and beat Grand Canyon, South Carolina and Georgia State during a round-robin tourney in Gulf Shores last month.

Other Southern schools ranked in the current AVCA poll's top 16 include 2nd ranked TCU and fourth ranked Florida State. Florida Atlantic is ranked 10th and Georgia State 11th. Stetson at no. 19 and Florida Gulf Coast at no. 20 are other Southern schools that could play their way into the 16 team tourney draw behind defending champion USC and top ranked UCLA. The tourney selection criteria will include conference automatic-qualifications, and at-large teams.

After a one year COVID-19 induced hiatus, the championship returned to Gulf Shores last May, with Southern Cal powering their way past UCLA in the final. Those two California schools combined to win the first four beach volleyball championships conducted as an NCAA fully sanctioned sport. All of the tourneys were held in Gulf Shores. Florida State was the runner-up in two of the four NCAA sanctioned championships.

Gulf Shores will also host the tourney in 2023 and 2024. It then moves to Huntington Beach in California for two years. Gulf Shores will surely put in a bid to host the tourney for as long as possible beginning in 2027.

California has made girls' beach volleyball a sanctioned high school sport, following in the footsteps of Arizona, the first state to do so.

Seven NCAA Division I conferences sponsor beach volleyball: Atlantic Sun (7 members), Big West (7 members), Coastal Collegiate Sports Assn. (12 members), Ohio Valley (6 members), Pac-12 (9 members), Southland (9 members), and West Coast (7 members). The minimum number of participating teams for a conference to qualify for an automatic bid to any NCAA championship tournaments is six.

Baldwin fire departments unite for county wide beach safety campaign

Gulf Shores and Orange Beach Tourism (GSOBT), Gulf Shores Fire Department, Orange Beach Fire Department, Fort Morgan Volunteer Fire Department, Baldwin County Emergency Management Agency, Baldwin County Commission and Baldwin County 9-1-1 have united behind a county-wide beach safety campaign, coined BEach SAFE: Know Before You Go.

Championed by both the Gulf Shores and Orange Beach fire chiefs, BEach SAFE aims to create awareness among locals and guests on topics including beach conditions, warning flag systems, rip current awareness, safe swimming practices and more. Recognizing that not all beach areas on Alabama's Gulf Coast have lifeguards, beach flags and patrols, BEach SAFE is designed to help individuals to stay informed and understand potential dangers. Core message points for the campaign include checking surf condititions daily, knowing your limitations, learning how to escape a rip current and swimming near lifeguards.



Pensacola Pass dredging replenishing Perdido Key

While the Pensacola Inlet Management Plan waits final adoption by Florida's Dept. of Environmental Quality, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is currently dredging the Pensacola Pass entrance channel and depositing the pumped sand onto the Perdido Key Area of Gulf Islands National Seashore (Johnson Beach).

The operation expected to continue until May 1. Because of the east to west migration of sand along the northwest Florida coast, the dredged sand should help both eroded National Seashore beaches and beaches on the rest of Perdido Key, the eastern portion of which has been critically eroded since 2004's Hurricane Ivan.

In the past, sand from the dredging process was dumped in the deep water instead of strategically placed where it would be carried to beaches west of Pensacola Pass.

Perdido Key beaches are privately owned to the water line. If the beaches are widened through a replenishment project, the state would own the extra width created by the project, and that concerns many beachfront property owners.



WHAT'S HAPPENING

PIER & SHORE FISHING OUTLOOK

Persistent winds through the past fortnight certainly confounded fishing efforts along the coast. Rough and dingy water conditions conspired to thwart a real 'breakout' spring bite. Surf and pier anglers struggled against the adverse conditions to catch primarily sheepshead, pompano and whiting.



That trend however, seems to be giving way to a more pleasant weather pattern through this period. A bit less wind and clearer water would be nice. The water temperature has been up and down a couple of degrees either side of 70. Once that sustains above 70, fishing

should generally improve with more typical catches of spanish mackerel, pompano and

Although the sheepshead bite is winding down, pompano and spanish mackerel should be picking up. Also, speckled trout should be showing up in the surf, especially west of Little Lagoon Pass. Dredging continues there, which may detrimentally affect the bite on 'work days'. But the pass really needs to be deepened periodically in order to help the Lagoon maintain a healthy water exchange overall.

On a positive note, the recent bout of rough surf has created some nice sandbar points and troughs. These are scattered all along the coast, and offer great feeding spots for fish in the surfzone. Look for shallow sandbars within casting distance from the beach with deeper water nearby. Pompano, whiting and other fish like to patrol the drop off, looking for prey items like ghost shrimp, sandfleas and coquina that may be pushed off the bar by the rolling waves. This time of year they are often joined by post-spawn sheepshead seeking refuge and looking to replenish their strength before returning to the





bays for the summer. These are good locations to find flounder, speckled trout, redfish and drum too. As they all move into these beach "holes" seeking food and protection from sharks and dolphin.

The popular double drop "pompano rigs" come into their own this time of year. And they account for a large number of pompano taken by surf casters. These work best when tipped with an inch long piece of fresh shrimp and/or Fishbites or Fishgum. The popular synthetic bait strips come in a variety of flavors and colors. It stays on the hook longer than just shrimp, and is formulated to dissolve slowly in seawater, leaving a scent trail back to your hooks. They are so effective, that at times no natural bait is needed. Another trick is to use a bit of Magic Thread (thin elastic) to wrap around soft baits like shrimp or ghost shrimp around your hook. This makes it harder to cast off, or a fish to tear off from the hook. Most of the local bait and tackle shops carry this and other specialized surf fishing items.

Use just enough weight to hold your bait in the current or cast out to reach the edge of the bar, then place the rod in the rod holder to wait for a bite. That is often a smashing strike,. So set the drag light enough to allow a hard running fish to take some line. This help prevent the hook from tearing from the fish's mouth, line breaking, or sand spike from being pulled over. The last is a distinct possibility as a cownose ray, bull redfish, large black drum, or shark may be on the other end of your line.

Catches from the Gulf State Park Pier have been hard earned lately. And very few spanish mackerel have been landed there so far this year. Rough, dingy water is the most likely culprit, though the sandbar east of the pier has gotten much shallower and wider recently. Most of the sheepshead have been landed close to the pier house in a trough along the beach. Some pompano, a few nice flounder, and even a rather large speckled trout were caught there too. Most all with live shrimp on the bottom in dingy water. But once the water calms and gets clearer, the fish (and fishermen) will probably spread out a bit more, providing more opportunities for all. Especially when the spanish mackerel show up.

The west jetty and seawall at Perdido Pass usually see good numbers of spanish mackerel this time of year too. Except for the NEAP tide period (April 27-29), we will experience some strong incoming tides. This brings clearer, green Gulf water into the Pass. And the mackerel often move in with it. Spoons and diving plugs are popular, but the old standby white "Looney Jig" is hard to beat when the mackerel are running. Just be sure to use some heavy monofilament or light wire as leader protection from sharp mackerel teeth. And carry some needle-nose pliers for safer hook removal.

Escambia adds \$500K to complete Perdido Key roundabout

The Escambia County Board of County Commissioners voted 4 to 1 to add \$500,000 to the \$850,000 already pledged by Commissioner Doug Underhill to construct the Perdido Key Drive/Johnson Beach Road roundabout at its April 7 meeting. The additional \$500,000 was pledged by District 2 Commissioner Doug Underhill from District 2 discretionary fund in the local option sales tax fund to District 1. Underhill supported the project before Perdido Key was shifted to District 1 in December 2021.

Each district has discretionary funds in the county's local option sales tax fund for projects that are a priority for each commissioner. The \$850,000 originally pledged for the project was also pledged by Underhill, who is not running for re-election.

Underhill said he had pledged his discretionary funds for the project and was holding to that pledge and added the extra cost. Construction is scheduled to begin in August.

The roundabout will be an important safety improvement for Perdido Key. Exiting Johnson Beach Road with any kind of traffic, particularly to make a left turn, is a challenge the roundabout will help mitigate. Respondents to the 2020 Perdido Key Owners Survey and attendees at the April 2021 informational meeting at the Lost Key Golf Club on the issue favored the roundabout over "no action" or a "traffic signal."
