O.B. Waterfront Park Pier repairs completed

After more than two years of being closed due to severe damage by Hurricane Sally, the pier at Orange Beach Waterfront Park is open. The 400-foot pier on Wolf Bay had to be completely rebuilt. Black Diamond Construction handled the work.

Diving into the history of the Waterfront Park, the property was first purchased from the Campbell family in late 1998. After that plans were drawn for the new park and construction began in early 1999. The park officially opened in July 2000.

The purchase of the property came the year after the Alabama Gulf Coast Area Chamber of Commerce (now known as Coastal Alabama Business Chamber) sponsored a weeklong fact-finding trip along the west coast of Florida to visit other Gulf Coast communities. The trip included city officials from Orange Beach and Gulf Shores, Baldwin County officials, business leaders and a representative of the state highway department.

The same question was posed to every community that was visited: "If you could go back 20 years in your existence, what would you do then that would impact today?"

Every community was very willing to share its growth and development plans. The one thing they all noted they would do differently was buy every piece of waterfront property they could in order control growth and also offer opportunities for residents and visitors to access the water in their communities. The construction of Waterfront Park allowed that access here in Orange Beach.

Over the years the Waterfront Park and Pier have allowed residents and visitors an opportunity to enjoy the beauty of Wolf Bay. In that time many weddings and family reunions have been hosted in the park. The first

wedding to be held on the pier was that of Randy and Lori Fitzgibbons on September 29, 2000. Mother of the groom, Jeanne Fitzgibbons, became a city employee in late 2002 and shortly thereafter became the contact person for events and gatherings at Waterfront Park.

"It has been my pleasure to have some wonderful conversations with people over the years and schedule their event," Fitzgibbons said. "I remember the planning that went into working out the details of using a 'public' place to hold a wedding. It is doable, you just have to realize the limitations and work within them."


The pier is also the backdrop to numerous weddings held each year at the adjacent Coastal Arts Center of Orange Beach.

Through the years, Waterfront Park has served many purposes, including being home to Sail Camp from 2001 to 2003 under the leadership of the Point Yacht Club. The city took over Sail Camp in 2004 and continued using Waterfront Park through 2011. After that the program was moved to its new home at the Wind & Water Learning Center, where it continues today.

The pier was destroyed by Hurricane Sally in September of 2020, exactly 20 years after its opening. The new pier is an exact replica of the original construction with a few minor modifications that will help maintenance personnel in maintaining the structure.

In 2002, the Alabama Recreation and Parks Association recognized Waterfront Park with the Outstanding Facility Award for cities with populations under 15,000. It is noteworthy that the opening of the new pier comes exactly 20 years from the time of that award

Life is a little better in Orange Beach now with the popular pier reopened.







Christmas trees can be recycled to create GSP dunes

Gulf State Park has established a Christmas tree drop off area at the Beach Pavilion (22250 East Beach Blvd.) in the southeast parking lot (please don't block the dumpsters). Trees are being collected now through

Remove all lights, ornaments, tags, plastic wraps, and stands from your tree before dropping them off. No trees with flocking powder are accepted, and no artificial trees. More info: 251-948-7275. Trees are only accepted from Baldwin County residents.

Orange Beach residents can dispose of Christmas trees for recycling by placing trees, completely stripped of decorations and tinsel, on their curbs for pickup by Public Works. In order to be recycled, trees must be stripped of all decorations and they cannot be flocked. Flocked trees are not recyclable and will not be picked up for recycling. The trees will be brought to the Gulf State Park Beach Pavilion to be used in ongoing dune restora-

For almost 40 years, the Gulf State Park-Alabama has hosted a Christmas tree recycling program that aids dune restoration. Donated clean, live trees are placed along the edges of dunes in groups of three, creating a "U" shape. When wind carries sand across the beach, the sand catches in the trees, building up over time and creating a new area of dune growth. In the spring, park staff and local volunteers plant native dune plants around the Christmas trees to further restore the natural habitat.

Trees free of decorations can also be brought to Baldwin County Central Annexat 22251 Palmer St. in Robertsdale, the Fairhope Satellite Courthouse: at 1100 Fairhope Ave., Magnolia Landfill at 15140 County Rd 49 in Summerdale and Foley Satellite Courthouse at 201 E. WFF hoping for another fatality free Alabama hunting season

More than 200,000 hunters will pursue the abundant game in Alabama this season, which means hunter safety should be at the forefront of any outdoors adventure. Captain Marisa Futral, Hunter Education Coordinator with the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources' (ADCNR) Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries (WFF) Division,

would love to see a repeat of the 2021-2022 season, when zero fatalities were reported for hunting accidents.

"Last year was a good year," Futral said. "Everybody needs to keep up the good work. There were no fatalities in firearms or treestand accidents. We had fewer treestand accidents than firearms incidents, which is unusual."

WFF Director Chuck Sykes hailed the milestone and recently emphasized the progress made in reducing accidents in the field.

"Hunter safety is a priority for us at WFF," Sykes said.

"So, at the February 2020 Conservation Advisory Board meeting, I made a special PowerPoint slide out of our yearly hunting accidents showing that we had been slowly decreasing the numbers for the past several years.

"Zero fatalities during last season was a monumental occurrence. That's the first time since WFF began keeping records in 1973 that we have had zero hunting-related fatalities. I certainly hope we can carry this over to this upcoming season."

Futral said five treestand accidents and 10 firearms accidents were reported. Of the firearms accidents, four were self-inflicted.

"Those self-inflicted accidents include stumbling and falling, or the trigger got caught on an object," she said. "The key is that the muzzle is pointed in a safe direction. Be aware of where the muzzle is pointed just in case of an accidental discharge.

"Also, no dove hunting accidents were reported, which was good. We had two waterfowl hunting incidents. One was self-inflicted, and one happened when the victim was covered by a shooter swinging on game."

Two turkey hunting incidents were reported with the victims located behind the turkeys. One quail hunting incident and one hog hunting accident were reported, while four accidents occurred during deer hunts.

"The deer hunting incidents were basically careless handling of firearms," Futral said. "The hog hunter stumbled and fell."

Though not fatal last season, these accidents under-

score there's never a time to get complacent.

"Complacency will get you in trouble," Futral said.
"The number of treestand accidents are trending in the right direction. This is the lowest number of treestand accidents that we have had. We just need everyone to remain diligent about treestand safety. Most treestand accidents happen when you're going up or coming down the tree. Make sure you have a quality safety harness, and the rule to follow is to remain attached to the tree when your feet leave the ground until your feet are back on the ground. We also had one accident happen when a hunter was moving a treestand, so be diligent when putting stands up and taking them down.

"I do think word is getting out about our safety outreach, on both treestands and firearms. Hunter education definitely helps, and our PSAs (public service announcements) are helping. I do think hunters are more aware of being safe when they're hunting."

Futral urges all hunters to follow the 12 guidelines for using a treestand safely:

- Always wear a safety harness, also known as a fall-arrest system, when you are in a treestand, as well as when climbing into or out of a treestand. Statistics show that the majority of treestand incidents occur while climbing in and out of a stand.

- A safety strap should be attached to the tree to prevent you from falling more than 12 inches.

Always inspect the safety harness for signs of wear or damage before each use.

- Follow all manufacturer's instructions for use of a safety harness and stand.

- Follow the three-point rule of treestand safety. Always have three points of contact to the steps or ladder before moving. This could be two arms holding and one leg stepping on the ladder or one arm and two legs in contact with the ladder before moving. Be cautious that rain, frost, ice or snow can cause steps to become extremely slippery. Check the security of the step before placing your weight on it.

- Always hunt with a plan and, if possible, a buddy. Before you leave home, let others know your exact hunting location, when you plan to return and who is with you.

- Always carry emergency signal devices such as a cell phone, walkie-talkie, whistle, signal flare, PLD (personal locator device) and flashlight within reach even while you are suspended in your fall-arrest system. In the event of an incident, remain calm and seek help immediately.

- Watch for changing weather conditions.

- Always select the proper tree for use with your treestand. Select a live, straight tree that fits within the size limits recommended in your treestand's instructions. Do not climb or place a treestand against a leaning tree.

- Never leave a treestand installed for more than two weeks since damage could result from changing weather conditions and/or other factors not obvious with a visual inspection.



- Always use a haul line to pull up your gear and (unloaded) firearm or bow to your treestand once you have reached your desired hunting height. Never climb with anything in your hands or on your back. Prior to descending, lower your equipment on the opposite side of the tree.

- Always know your physical limitations. Don't take chances. Do not climb when impaired by drugs, alcohol or if you're sick or fatigued. If you start thinking about how high you are, stop climbing.

As for firearms safety, Futral stresses the 10 commandments of safe firearms use:

- Treat every firearm as if it is loaded.

- Control the muzzle of your firearm. Keep the barrel pointed in a safe direction. Never point a firearm at anything that you do not wish to shoot, and insist that shooting and hunting companions do the same.

- Be sure of your target and beyond. Positively identify your target before you fire, and make sure no people, livestock, roads or buildings are beyond the target.

- Never shoot at water or a hard, flat surface. A ricocheting bullet cannot be controlled.

- Don't use a scope for target identification; use binoculars.

- Never climb a tree, cross a fence or jump a ditch with a loaded firearm.

- Store guns and ammunition separately. Store firearms under lock and key, and use a gun case to transport firearms.

- Make sure your barrel and action are clear of all obstructions.

- Unload firearms when not in use. Never take someone else's word that a firearm is unloaded. Check yourself.

- Avoid drugs and alcohol when hunting or shooting. Even some over-the-counter medicines can cause impairment.





Private angler Red Snapper season closes on Dec. 31

The Marine Resources Division (MRD) of the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (ADCNR) will close the state's 2022 private angler red snapper fishing season at midnight on Saturday, December 31. Alabama's 2022 federal allocation of red snapper was 1.12 million pounds. Anglers harvested nearly 500,000 pounds during the 128-day season.

"Every year a variety of factors impact the effort in this fishery," said Scott Bannon, MRD Director. "Those factors influence the number of days Alabama is open to fishing for red snapper. Good weather throughout the summer and fall provided anglers with more opportunities to participate this year. We also want to thank anglers for reporting their red snapper harvests through Snapper Check. It is an important tool in providing increased access to this fishery."

MRD will announce the 2023 season dates in the coming months once the 2023 quota is finalized by NOAA Fisheries.

"It has been a good, long red snapper season in Alabama this year," said Chris Blankenship, ADCNR Commissioner. "Under Alabama state management, we were able to provide maximum access in 2022. This is the sixth successful red snapper season under state management. It was good to see anglers reeling in red snapper throughout the summer and fall. ADCNR will continue fighting to ensure our citizens and visitors have access to the incredible red snapper fishery off the coast of Al-







PIER & SHORE FISHING OUTLOOK

Coastal water temperatures will probably rebound only slowly in the wake of the recent Arctic blast as we enter a milder, more seasonal period. Typically we would expect the





off for a while, with just a few exceptions until the water warms a little.

Sheepshead seem to be one of the local species more tolerant of cold water. They frequently take advantage of slightly warmer days and sunny afternoons to feed. Bluefish gather into tight schools in colder weather, feeding with regularity around the rocks at Perdido Pass. Medium sized spoons and plugs seem to get their attention especially when a pause is introduced into the retrieve cadence.

Also, large solitary black drum roam the surf zone looking for any tidbit of food to sustain their bulk. It is not uncommon for big drum (well over 30 inches long) to consume a tiny piece of shrimp intended for pompano or whiting. But pompano will likely not be near as active in the relatively shallow super cool surfzone which had been yielding a few of them up until the freeze. Even some good catches of small permit were noted along the eastern Baldwin beaches prior to the cold weather.

Whiting tend to bunch up under the Gulf State Park Pier during cold weather, particularly when the water gets clear and calm. They are joined occasionally by lone redfish or black drum that entertain pier fishermen too. Schools of whiting are often chased up and down the beach by groups of Common loons, which can eat any fish less than 12 inches long. Even the larger whiting get skittish when harassed by these diving birds in addition to Bottlenose dolphins which cruise by the pier almost every day. Small pieces of shrimp are commonly fished on bottom with a Carolina rig (Fishfinder rig) on light tackle to target these whiting. Though fresh dead shrimp usually works better, and ghost shrimp is often the best bait of all.

Plus some sheepshead may be active under the pier during the day as they graze on whatever algae or barnacles is growing on the pilings. But they often eat any small crabs or shrimp they venture across in the process. That is why they can be caught on fiddler crabs or small shrimp fished close to the piling. But finding live bait at the local tackle stores is often an exercise of futility during the holidays and inclement winter weather periods.

Sheepshead are probably the most common target species for fishermen using live bait along the seawall or west jetty at Alabama Point (Perdido Pass). They may be caught all along these structures though the most popular spots are under the bridge and the south end of the jetty. Depending upon the speed and direction of tidal currents and wind, the most productive spot varies at any given time.

Water temperature, clarity (turbidity), salinity and time of day (amount of sunlight) are other factors that influence the movements of fish in and around the pass. Even more so at Little Lagoon Pass where the water is much shallower. On top of that, anglers need a near perfect presentation to entice these wary fish to bite under such wintry conditions.

Little things like hook size and style, or precise amount of weight to deal with the conditions often come into play as well to make an angler successful or simply frustrated. Getting hung up on the rocks in the pass is the most common downfall for fishermen. So being able to visualize what is going on at the terminal end of your rig may help prevent that. Treble hooks are most likely to get hung up, as are pyramid shaped weights.

Use these from the beach, or when casting far out from the hard structures over sandy bottom. Small circle and kahle hooks are much less likely to snag on the rocks. And small egg sinkers, bass casting or even splitshots are shaped better to bounce off rocks. Often a single dropper rig with a teardrop shape bass casting or even a bank sinker suspended on slightly lighter line than that tied to the hook work great when vertical fishing along the sea-

If the weight does become caught in the rocks, it can often be dislodged by simply lowering the rod and shaking the tip repeatedly. The slightly slack line may allow the weight to drop free of the obstruction and be retrieved intact. Even if you have to break off, most often you will only need to replace the weight. So you are back to fishing sooner.

We can expect this fortnight to start off with a NEAP tide period through the end of December. The first week of January will provide much stronger tidal flow with the typical winter time morning low tides. The incoming tide each afternoon often brings slightly warmer water from the deeper Gulf closer to shore. Depending on how much of a warm up we get should help determine how active the surf zone fishing gets in early January.

Look for relatively deeper holes within casting distance from the beach and fish around the edges where breaking waves and rip currents may create a feeding zone. Dress warmly and keep adjusting your fishing tactics to suit the conditions.
