

#### Elberta to celebrate sausage on March 25

Combine 7,200 pounds of sausage made from a secret recipe developed by the founding fathers of Elberta with 250 venders selling everything from custom belt buckles to french roasted peanuts. Throw in a few hundred kegs of beer – both domestic and German – served in the festival's own Bier Garten.

Add entertainment, a full fledged carnival and 40 years of tradition and you have it – The Bi-Annual Elberta Original German Sausage Festival, scheduled on Saturday, March 25 from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. in Elberta Town Park. The park is located just north of Elberta's only traffic light on Hwy. 98 (just follow the crowd).

Besides Elberta's famous German sausage & sauerkraut, the event will include continuous entertainment for adults and children. Other scrumptious foods will include German style filled cabbage, potato salad, goulash, red beans & rice, hamburgers, hot dogs, BBQ sandwiches, ice cream, popcorn and peanuts. There will be baked goods as well as arts & crafts for sale, and volunteers will serve plenty of other non-alcoholic beverages in addition to beer. The Bellview Stumpfiddle Band and the North End Stompers traditionally perform. Cloggers. Polka, country and German music are also part of the entertainment line-up.

The festival usually attracts close to 30,000 visitors. Public parking will be available and those with disabilities can get access from the west side of the festival, where volunteers with golf carts will be on hand to help them get into the festival grounds. The sausage festival is a town fund-raiser, first spearheaded by Elberta's Volunteer Fire Department in 1978. Proceeds are used for improving not only the fire department, but the town as well. Although the recipe has changed somewhat over the years, the original secret recipe for Elberta's famous sausage is credited to Alfred Stucki, who managed Elberta's Locker Plant from 1953 until his death in 1973. Local non-profits also benefit from the festival through booth sales and parking lot fees. The city's signature event is held the last Saturdays in March and October.

#### Fort Morgan resident runs her 100th marathon right here in Gulf Shores

Betty Holder has also run 50 milers, the Spirit Trail 100 Mile Ultra-Marathon and completed 10 Iron Mans

Fort Morgan resident Betty Holder had no particular desire to run a marathon back in 2001. She worked out at a gym a couple times a week and went skiing twice a year. But she didn't so much as jog around the block of her Atlanta home. So when her husband (Jerry) said he wanted to run a marathon and suggested that she join him, she was not enthusiastic. Betty was already 42 and content to drive a car or call a cab, if she wanted to take a 26.2 mile round trip.

"He said it was his goal to run a marathon and that I should do it too," Betty said. "I said, 'you can't be talking about me.' I thought he was crazy and said no way.' But Jerry persisted, and Betty relented. A friend, who was a former college runner, told her about the Gallaway marathon training group, which happened to be based in Atlanta.

A 1972 Olympian, Gallaway had just started his marathon training business. (He has since expanded to more than 100 U.S. cities and five other countries.).

Gallaway's program was already highly regarded among the Atlanta running community. So, Betty knew she would be given access to the tools to succeed.

"We had more than 100 participants and except for one man who had a groin injury and another who had to drop out due to a work committment, we all completed a marathon," she said.

As fate would have it, Betty's first marathon would be one of this country's most important ever - the first post 9/11 New York City Marathon. It was held just a few weeks after the attack, and it served as a cathartic expression of our country's resilience and solidarity in the face of that horrific tragedy.

Betty joined 30,000 runners - most of them in red, white and blue - and two million spectators to create a perfect metaphor for a city and nation determined to

By comparison, the first NYC Marathon in September of 1970 drew 127 participants and only 55 finishers. The only woman entrant in that first race dropped out after 15 miles due to illness.

For Betty's husband, completing that marathon was enough to quench his thirst for distance running, but Betty was just getting started. She immediately knew New York would not be her last test of will, and she kept on running to the point where she recently completed her 100th marathon about 26.2 miles from the place she has called home for the past five years.

"There is a saying that once you cross the finish line after completing a marathon, you will be changed for-ever. And that was true for me," Betty said. "In my case, when I crossed that finish line, I felt a great sense of accomplishment. It was something I never dreamed was possible. I thought it would be easier the next time. But there is no such thing as an easy marathon."

Betty earned her100th marathon at the recent We Run This Beach Marathon at Gulf State Park. The temperature was unseasonably warm, but Betty had friends to encourage her along the way.

"I do not tolerate heat very well. I am a profuse sweater and the temperature was more then I could really handle. I can't think of another one where I struggled like that," she said.

Being able to run her 100th marathon in her hometown was somewhat coincidental, but Betty was very happy that running friends from both the local L.A. Fleet Feet Running Club and her club in Chattanooga were there to share her milestone.

"I was really impressed with how many of my running buddies were there to support me," she said. "I was not expecting that. A lot of people did all sorts of nice things (pictured), bringing balloons and putting signs on the course with my name on them."

Many friends held up cut-outs of Betty's smiling face when she crossed the finish line wearing bib no. 100, and the L.A. Fleet Feet krewe threw a BBQ party for

"I was kind of stunned when I saw my bib number and thought what are the chances of that," Betty said. "Then I found out that Rob (Barnas) contacted the race director and he agreed to it. I was thrilled to get it in the books and behind me, but I especially liked that so many people came down to be there with me."

One of Betty's friends, George Southgate of Calhoun, Ga., came just for the day to give Betty a magnet that read "26.2 miles - 100" before driving back to Georgia that evening.

Another friend, Truman Smith from Chattanooga, was also there to greet her at the finish line. Truman has ran north of 200 marathons.

"I've enjoyed running many marathons with Truman because he is a wonderful story teller with great wit, and his stories make the miles go by quickly," Betty said. "George has run 528 marathons. He is the mon-

Both men are 76 years old.

With those two septuagenarians as living proof that there is no marathon running shelf life, Betty sees no reason to stop at 100. She will continue to make memories like she did running in the prestigious Boston Marathon.

"It was really a thrill," she said. "There are people all along the way cheering their heads off. The way people were reacting, you'd of thought I was winning the Olympics."

Betty has completed several marathons several times and she has run the Chickamauga Battlefield Marathon in Georgia 20 consecutive times officially. She even ran it when the event was cancelled in 2020 due to COVID just to keep her streak alive. She most certainly will be back there again this November.

The Big Sur, which is held on a traffic free Pacific Coast Hwy. and includes music along the way, is also among her favorites, as was the marathon she ran in Antarctica.

Betty's goal was not necessarily to run 100 marathons, but she would count her finisher medals from time to time and once she hit number 80 (The Atlanta Publix Marathon), she made a spread sheet and started her

Betty has also completed 10 full Ironman Triathlons (2.4 mile swim, 112 mile bike and 26.2 mile run), a sport she took up while learning to swim while recovering from a stress fracture on her foot.

"I did not know how to swim," she said. "I learned to swim out of a book and became an endless swimmer. I said I could do this forever. Swimming was the big holdback. I already was biking once a week with friends just for fun."

Once she realized the swimming part would be the least grueling, Betty set about Ironman training with one thought in mind - no short cuts.

"Doing an Ironman is all about training," she said. "You can muscle your way through and complete a marathon. But in an Ironman, that will not happen. There is no muscling through it. You have got to do the training."

Betty, who does strength training at the Bodenhamer Center once per week, will concentrate on marathon training until she has completed one in every state. She currently has 28 notches on that belt and will run a marathon in Indiana next month before starting a busy spring schedule that will see her run several marathons

Betty has also competed in a few 50 mile ultra marathons and completed the Prairie Spirit Trail 100 Mile Ultra-Marathon in Kansas, a race that saw her run for 25 grueling hours.

"I try to be careful and not get injured. I listen to my body and back off when enough is enough," she said. "I learned a valuable lesson the hard way from doing speed work. It's an easy way to get injured."

She also learned that even for her, competing in two Iron Mans and three marathons over a 14 week period was too much.

"I did not need to do that much that close together. But I felt good for all but the last one," she said.

"Running is definitely a lifestyle," she added. "I want to maintain my energy level and strength as I age, and I feel like if I stop putting races on the calendar, it will be all over and I will wind up slipping down the slippery slope of old age and feebleness.

"I like marathons because I can run slow and still compete. At these ultra distances, you don't have to be a speed demon," she added. "You can just run for your own benefit. Who cares if anybody else finishes ahead of you. Everybody is doing their own thing. It's more relaxed and more enjoyable."

Most importantly, she still feels the same as she did 22 years ago in NYC when she earns a medal.

"I still enjoy it when I cross the finish line," she said. "It's like 'wow, I did it again."





#### Lawsuit continues, as does construction on new Intracoastal Bridge

After a day of hearings, both sides in the lawsuit filed by the Baldwin County Bridge Company against the Alabama Department of Transportation, Montgomery County Circuit Judge Jimmy Pool continued the case until April 19 and also set aside April 21 if additional time is still needed.

The owner of the toll span in Orange Beach is asking for a temporary restraining order to halt the construction of a second free Gulf Shores bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway and cited several complaints about the state and ALDOT Director John Cooper about his actions in negotiations with the company.

Ultimately, the suit asks for an "injunction issue prohibiting constructing the proposed new bridge." It also asks for compensatory damages from the alleged abuses

by Cooper

Tony Harris, spokesman for the Alabama Department of Transportation, said work has started to clear property on the northside of the Intracoastal leading to the new bridge even while the lawsuit challenging the project proceeds

"Any delay will only exacerbate the traffic problems on the Gulf Coast and hurt the people of Baldwin County," Harris said. "Like the many Alabamians and visitors who are tired of sitting in traffic on Alabama's coast, we look forward to the completion of the free, public bridge.

"Our contractor, Scott Bridge, is doing his clearing," Harris added. "His preparation was to have access down to the shoreline to get started with construction.

That's part of his scope of his work, and he is working." Scott Bridge Company of Opelika was the low bidder on the project with a submission of \$51.56 million when proposals were opened Sept. 30. The budgeted price of the bridge was \$48 million to \$60 million, according to ALDOT reports. The project is scheduled to be completed by Jan. 1, 2026.

"It's got a set completion date," Harris said. "A lot of a lot of our projects have a number of working days. This one has an actual calendar date deadline."

"ALDOT Director John Cooper has been on a mission to destroy BCBC's contractual rights and to force BCBC out of business," the suit alleges. "Unfortunately, his tactics – carried out with taxpayer funds and from his position as an appointed state official in Montgomery – have caused and will continue to cause BCBC irreparable harm and damage."

ALDOT previously reported that the bridge company would have to prove a new two-lane span next to the current toll bridge would take 40 percent of the traffic currently going over the State Route 59 bridge in Gulf Shores. Negotiations failed after several deadlines for a

resolution were passed.

Part of the suit also alleges that the state has conducted no traffic studies to determine if the bridge is needed and would help alleviate traffic on the State Route 59 bridge. It also states Cooper and former ALDOT Southwest Engineer Vince Calametti admitted as much in other filings and in public meetings.

Harris said the lawsuit will waste taxpayer money to defend the lawsuit and could halt an important and needed infrastructure project to help with traffic in the resort area.

Ike Scott of Scott Bridge Company said the roadway leading up to the bridge had been cleared about a mile and a half to the bank of the Intracoastal Canal on the north side of the canal from Baldwin County Road 4, according to an Erica Thomas penned report in 1819news. com.

"We are under contract, we are under obligation, and the clock is running," said Scott. "We have a time certain to get this bridge finished and opened to traffic, and we are absolutely full steam ahead, working as quickly as the rain will let us. We're making really good progress, especially the last couple of weeks."

Parts of the deal BCBC was offering to the state, Orange Beach and Gulf Shores included \$60 million to Orange Beach over 50 years, after 50 years a state takeover of a new two-lane span the bridge company says it was willing to build, \$25 million for a spur road from the Beach Express south to Cotton Creek Drive in Gulf Shores. Also reportedly included were free tolls for Baldwin County residents.

Even with a new two-lane span at the tolls, Gulf Shores Mayor Robert Craft said 25 percent of the traffic on the Gulf Shores bridge would be bound for Orange Beach

"Another destination study is in process and we've got updates on the previous one that we did," Craft said in July. "The growth of the folks coming in from Orange Beach and coming over our bridge shows we've more got significant exit numbers now that we've not seen before and the number of people and going over that bridge from the Orange Beach area. It's a higher percentage than the people coming into town."

Orange Beach is the only city in Baldwin County with a class 6 rating and has the second-best rating in Alabama, as stated by Roberson. This program is estimated to save citizens of Orange Beach over \$250,000 in annual insurance premiums.


According to Roberson, the city's floodplain administrator, the new classification change will give Orange Beach property owners an additional 5% discount on flood insurance. Citizens within the city can now receive a discount of 20% on their flood insurance policy if they are within a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) and a 10% discount for non-SFHAs

The Community Rating System is a voluntary incentive program that recognizes and encourages community floodplain management practices that exceed the minimum requirements of the National Flood Insurance Program. More than 1,500 communities participate nationwide. The CRS assigns classifications to communities based on their CRS credit points obtained in 19 creditable activities.





#### Mudbugs will remain open after taking safety measures

Mudbugs Pub in Gulf Shores has agreed to stop selling alcohol at 1 a.m., close at 1:30 a.m., set up security cameras inside and outside and install a metal detector at the door to keep guns out of the bar to avoid litigation with the City of Gulf Shores, which had previously attempted to pull the bar's liquor license.

Also, anyone with drug convictions or facing court dates for drug convictions would not be allowed to be employed in the club and signs must be displayed stating that firearms are not allowed anywhere on Mudbugs' property.

GSPD Deputy Chief of Police Dan Netemeyer said there have been just shy of 480 calls for service to Mudbugs since 2017. As part of the agreement, Gulf Shores Police and a Mudbugs representative will meet for monthly reviews.

"I think we've reached a cooperative agreement to give them a chance to put in place policies which they believe will control some of the problems that we've had in the past," said Gulf Shores Mauor Robert Craft. "We're hopeful that works and the chief and his staff will be monitoring closely and making sure that we don't allow for them to create problems. Unfortunately, they are not a part of who we are."





# PIER & SHORE FISHING OUTLOOK

So typical of March as a transitional month, the weather continues to defy seasonal norms. Nature's pendulum swings both ways, and we are now experiencing a bit of below average temper-



atures. Many days begin in the 40s instead of the 50s we usually see. Also, recent afternoon high temps often do not reach the seasonal norms of the low 70s. As a result, the water temperatures in the shallow back bays and surfzone have actually fallen back into the upper 60s. Fortunately that is still a little above

average for late March. Consequently we have still been seeing good results from sheepshead herders cashing in on the spawn. These fish will remain hungry as most of them wrap up their amorous activity around the next full moon on April 6th.

This fortnight coincides with our lunar based tide cycle, so it begins (March 22) and ends (April 4-5) with NEAP tides. That means the difference between low and high tide will be less near those days, and tidal flow near the passes will not be as strong as during the week in between. That is when high tide will occur in the afternoon/evening hours.

Reports of spanish mackerel have been spotty the past couple of weeks. But that run should get cranked up as we get into true meteorological spring. Mackerel are warm water pelagic fish that winter over in the waters off southwest Florida. Notably, that region that has been wracked repeatedly by red tide outbreaks this winter. Not that it necessarily kills migrating fish outright, but it may well have interrupted their food supply as they travel through that region on their way here. Spanish mackerel have been reported to our east all along the Florida Panhandle, so more should trickle over our way through the coming weeks.

Pompano migrations are another species that may be affected by Florida red tides. More and more of these tasty jacks usually filter into our area through April, just off the beaches. A favorite target species for local and vacationing anglers alike, pompano fishing constitutes the backbone of the surf fishing industry along the coast. There is a subculture of locally based anglers who target pompano year round, but April is the best month to find them here. That is when pompano are gathering into large pre-spawn schools in the surf zone, just off our beaches. Look for sand bar drop offs creating a feeding station for hungry pompano within casting distance from shore. Breaking waves dislodge the invertebrate species pompano feed upon, and sweep these potential food items over the shoreward edge of the bar into the deeper trough. That is the precise spot you want to place your bait. It can be double dropper "pompano rigs" with fresh shrimp and Fishbites or Fishgum, or even fresh sandfleas or ghost shrimp. If you use ghost shrimp, wrap them with light bait keeper thread like Magic Thread (available at the local Bait & Tackle shops. Those are your best locations to get get the items like rigs, bait, other tackle and advice. Whiting which are Gulf or Northern kingfish are the most frequent by-catch for pompano fishermen. But sometimes, like at night or when the water is roiled and dingy all they may catch is catfish of the hardhead or gafftopsail varieties. These can pull hard, and are edible, but not nearly as desirable for anglers used to dining on delectable pompano. Redfish, black drum and bluefish are other frequent bycatch species, along with the ever present rays.

This time of year, I like to have a 7 to 8 foot rod with a jig or spoon tied on, ready, in my cart to cast for bluefish or mackerel or even "bonita". Often these fast-moving fish may show themselves near the beach but they do not stick around long. So timing is critical to grab the rod and get the lure to them before they disappear. Similarly, if you fish the Gulf State Park Pier, notice how many regular anglers have multiple rods on their carts rigged different ways despite the fish only one rod at a time rule. This is so they can quickly change target species simply by putting one rod down and grabbing another that is pre-rigged. Also many pier fishers carry a bait bucket with a bubbler and a landing net on a rope. Most are more that happy to lend it out or land a fish for you when needed. Simply ask for help if you need it, even for rigging advice or other tips. Overall, it is a very friendly fishing venue where folks are glad to help the less experienced fisherfolks.

This time of year, most pier fishers will concentrate on sheepshead. They usually fish vertically or near vertically along the pier, often dangling a live shrimp or fiddler crab next to the piling. This keeps anglers at regularly spaced intervals, though sometimes two anglers may fish either side of the same piling. Anglers targeting spanish mackerel will usually be casting from the outermost accessible part of the pier just south of the middle platform. Nicknamed "the nub", it extends southward just a little more than 100 feet from the platform. Soon schools of large jack crevalle will start showing up off the east side of the pier, and perhaps even a solitary cobia or two. These large fish (15 to 50 pounds) are usually targeted with three ounce jigs on heavy rods. So be aware what is going on around you when you hear a commotion or the call "COMING DOWN", as someone needs room to follow a big fish down the rail. Either crouch down to let them pass over you, or step back to let them pass under your rod and line so they can keep up with their big fish. Nobody wants to be the reason an angler looses a trophy sized fish, and it only takes a little cooperation to prevent that along with any subsequent disagreement.

Spring Break is a time when folks head to the beach for some sun and fun. There is plenty of room for everyone either on the pier or beaches. Especially in undeveloped areas away from the public access points. There are plenty of fishing options for shorebound anglers to explore.





# New \$1.2 million Foley Kids Park coming soon

A new Kids Park should be open in Foley by summer to replace the playground that has served a generation of children. The original park at Max Griffith Park closed Monday, Feb. 27 to allow work to begin, David Thompson, executive director of leisure services, said.

The new park is expected to cost about \$1.2 million. The city will receive about \$500,000 in grants to pay part of the cost.

"We're going to take as much of it apart as we can and put it to other uses," Thompson said. "The slides and swings will be taken down and used in other locations."

Thompson said the tubes that children have crawled through over the years will be sent to the Foley Fire Department. Firefighters will use the spaces to train for moving through enclosed areas during drills.

Thompson said the animal figures that now decorate the original park will be taken down, refurbished and moved to the Graham Creek Nature Preserve.

Mayor Ralph Hellmich said residents can follow the progress of work building the new park.

"We are going to have a live camera posted up there where people can watch the construction of the Kids Park," Hellmich said. "It will take about 90 days. We hope to be done before the kids get out of school, which I think will occur. Then we'll have a grand opening. We'll tell all the kids about it, but that's kind of fun."

The Foley Kids Park was built in 2001. Thompson said the wooden facility was intended to last about 15 years. Now, after more than two decades in the Gulf Coast weather, the new facility will be going up.

He said work will start in March on the new park and the facility is scheduled to be completed in about 12 weeks.
