


This year, Christmas in the Park is partnering with Toys for Tots, so there will be a box you may use to donate toys and books to the toy drive through Dec. 10.




The Pirates of Lost Treasure seek Secret Santa sponsors



GSHS hosts 5A semifinal Dec. 1; winner will play for state title in T-town

And then there were four.

The top ranked AHSAA Class 5A Gulf Shores High School football team took one step closer to an undefeated season and the school's first state championship with a 35-14 win over Headland at Headland's J.J. Yarbrough Stadium on Nov. 24.

The unbeaten Dolphins (13-0) host Eufaula on Dec. 1 at 7 pm. at Mickey Blackwell Stadium on County Rd. 6 for the right to travel to Tuscaloosa the following weekend for the state Class 5A championship game. Eufaula edged Demopolis 20-17 on Nov. 24 to earn their slot in the semis.

Guntersville (12-1) travels to Birmingham to play Ramsay (11-2) in the other semifinal. Ramsay defeated Moody 40-27, and Guntersville scored a 31-21 victory over Pleasant Grove in the quarterfinals.

The Super 7 State Championships will be played at Bryant-Denny Stadium in Tuscaloosa beginning Dec. 6 with the flag football girls' tournament finals. All state championship games will be broadcast live on Alabama Public Television.

Headland, like Gulf Shores, was also playing in the state quarterfinals for the first time in school history.

GSHS limited the Ram offense to 112 yards through three shutout quarters before the Rams rallied late to finish with 253 yards. The speedy Dolphin defense sacked Headland quarterback Jaxon Williams five times and forced two intentional grounding penalties.

The Dolphins took control of the game early, scoring on three of four first-half possessions to build a 21-0 halftime lead. Will Langston added the point after on each of the touchdown. The Dolphins drove 79 yards in 11 plays for their first score, with running back Kolin Wilson scoring on

a 6-yard run behind the left side of the line.

Headland's only threat before the game was decided came on a first quarter turnover that gave the home team the ball on the Dolphin 40. The Dolphins eventually took over on downs after the Rams advanced to the Gulf Shores 12 yard line.

Gulf Shores quarterback Jud Harris pitched the ball to North Carolina State commitment Ronnie Royal on a reverse for a 26-yard TD run for the second GSHS touchdown. Gulf Shores capitalized on a short field from the Headland 30 yard line after stuffing a 4th-and-2 fake punt for their third score. Receiver Braden Jackson stepped inside a defender and made a leaping catch in the end zone to complete a 30-yard TD pass from Harris 2:42 before halftime.

The Dolphins added another touchdown in the third quarter on a 2-yard Royal run up the middle that capped a five-play, 43-yard drive that included a 30-yard run to the 4 yard line by Royal. Soph Jamichael Garrett forced a fumble recovered by senior Isaiah Hammac to set up the score. The visitors increased their lead to 35-0 with 5:49 left in the game when Royal scored again on a 30-yard reverse.

The Rams scored twice in the final three minutes, including a TD with 17 seconds left.

Dolphin sophomore Landon Everett made nine tackles and senior Kingston Lowe had four sacks and five tackles for loss. Junior Carter Byrd contributed seven tackles. The Dolphin defense forced two intentional grounding penalties.

Wilson rushed for 153 yards on 14 carries and Royal 106 yards on 12 carries. It marked the 11th time this season that Wilson ran for more than 100 yards. Gulf Shores has scored at least 35 points in eight consecutive games.

OBHS football coach Jamey Dubose retires

Orange Beach High School head football coach Jamey DuBose is retiring after two years at Orange Beach, according to Orange Beach superintendent Randy Wilkes.

"Orange Beach City Schools appreciates coach Du-Bose and his efforts. He has demonstrated and emphasized character above all else. He has worked closely with parents and has successfully mentored present and post students and colleagues. His drive and determination are extraordinary as is his knowledge of the game, organization of practice and ability to motivate. He will always be welcome on the Mako sideline and in our schools," Wilkes stated.

DuBose posted 8-3 and led the Makos to the play-offs in his first year. The team, with only three returning starters, posted a 1-8 record this past fall. DuBose began his head coaching career at Susan Moore where he was 10-11 in two seasons (2002-03). He then led the Prattville program for four seasons, going 45-10 in that time (2008-11) and winning state championships in 2008 and 2001.

From 2012-13 he was head coach at Florence, posting a 16-8 record, then took over at Central-Phenix City (2014-19) where he was 66-11, winning the state title in 2018, reaching the title game again in 2019 and reaching the state semifinals in 2015, 2016 and 2017. He wengt 20-5 as head coach at Lowndes, Ga., High School for two seasons (2020-21).







ORANGE BEACH CITY COUNCIL

2024 budget projects revenues to be \$66.4 million

Örange Beach is considering accepting an offer from CGI Digital to make showcase videos of the city to promote the town. And, the price, if the city council votes to accept the offer at the Dec. 5 meeting, is free.

"They will go out to the community businesses for sponsorships," Special Projects Coordinator Marc Anderson said. "They'll do like a welcome video and three other videos highlighting the city. I'm thinking quality of life, public safety, education are the big ones we support a lot."

After council approval, CGI will work with the city to schedule a time for doing the video work.

"We'll have a voice of all the editing and things like that and just kind of a positive thing," Anderson said. "They reached out to us based on our demographics and felt like we'd be a good fit. It fits the mold for them and it's a positive thing all around."

Anderson said the company has worked with more than 5,000 communities across the U.S.

During the Nov. 7 meeting Council finalized the budget for the 2024 fiscal year. The budget projects \$66.4 million in revenues from a variety of taxes or \$5 million more than projected in the 2022 budget. Council approved the budget to include the transfer of special revenue funds to the general fund for special revenue fund projects.

Council also authorized a contract with Socialize Your Bizness for social media consulting and marketing services for \$1,800 a month.

During regular session, the council:

- Awarded the bid for a fieldhouse for the high school softball and baseball teams to Rolin Construction for \$1.8 million.
- Passed a resolution authorizing an intergovernmental agreement with the South Alabama Purchasing Association.
- OK'd a resolution authorizing an amended implementation agreement with the Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for the Coastal Alabama Sea Turtle Triage Restoration Project. This amendment will make the project cost \$860,000 by adding \$80,000 for contingencies, according to the agenda.
- Established dates for the Municipal Court for 2024. Court will be in session every second Wednesday and fourth Tuesday of each month.
- Declared certain personal property owned by the City of Orange Beach as surplus and unneeded and authorized the Mayor and City Clerk to dispose of such property. The lot includes seven vehicles and two wave runners.
- Authorized a change order with R&B Contracting Company for the sewer force main from Canal Road to CR-12 Project in an amount not to exceed \$80.722.
- Authorized an employee assistance program agreement with New Directions Behavioral Health.
- Postponed approval of the fiscal year 2024 annual budget until the Dec. 5 council meeting.
- Authorized a mutual aid agreement with Med-Star EMS, for the Fire Department.

- Authorized the purchase of stop-loss insurance for the City of Orange Beach in 2024. If passed, this would put a cap on major medical claim exposure at \$200,000 per claim.
- Approved a one-time payment to employees for future services with different amounts for full-time and part-time employees and recent hires.
- Authorized the city to have community events during 2024 including the city Mardi Gras parade, the Art Festival, Seafood Fest at the Wharf, Freedom Fest at the Wharf, the City Christmas Tree Lighting at the Wharf and school community events.
- Appointed members to the city's employees' leave bank. Chandler Dick and Joe Brown will each serve two years starting on Jan. 1 and ending Dec. 31, 2025, replacing current members Jesse Hollingsworth and Nick Bryant. Permanent members are City Administrator Ford Handley and Human Resources Director Vicki Pishna.
- Signed the annual contract with Bob Riley and Associates for lobbying services in Montgomery for the city at a cost of \$10,000 per month plus expenses.
- Signing the annual contract with Van Socyoc Associates for lobbying services on federal issues involving the city at a cost of \$6,000 monthly plus expenses.
- Authorized a contract with the Baldwin County Economic Development Alliance to appropriate \$12,500 for 2024 to help with the group's work in south Baldwin County.
- Making a payment to the Gulf Shores Airport Authority of \$75,000 an increase from \$35,000.
- Signed a performance contract with Coastal Ballet Academy to provide a venue for performances at the Orange Beach Performing Arts Center.
- Extended the entertainment districts at The Wharf and SanRoc Cay Marina/Perdido Beach Resort until Dec. 31, 2024.

During Nov. 7 work/regular sessions, Council:

- Awarded the bid for the interior build out of the Wildlife Center and Trail Maintenance Shop for \$720,000 to Rolin Construction. RESTORE Act funding will pay for \$624,450 of the cost.
- Awarded the bid for a blower package for the Utilities Department to Jim House & Associates in the amount of \$178,200.
- Approved a contract with Lexipol to update the Orange Beach Fire Department's policy manual for \$41,490.
- Authorized the purchase of a fortified lifeguard tower from Bausch Enterprises for \$88,810 to be used on east of Perdido Pass.
- Passed a resolution authorizing the purchase of an ambulance for the fire department through the H-GAC purchasing cooperative from Southern Emergency Consultants in the amount of \$405,954.
- Allowed an ordinance change in The Wharf's planned unit development to allow for the building of a Culver's Restaurant on the northwest corner of Canal Road and Wharf Parkway East.




MORE IMPROVEMENTS PLANNED FOR FOLEY'S KIDS PARK:

More improvements are planned Foley's Kids Park, which reopened in May after \$1.2-million in new construction. A new pavilion and restrooms are part of plans for improvements at Max Griffin Park. The city is going out for bids to rebuild the pavilion located next to the Kids Park site. The Kids Park reopened earlier this year after being rebuilt at a cost of \$1.2 million. The pavilion will provide shade and shelter for visitors to the site. The work includes minor grading, pouring a concrete pad and sidewalk, moving the existing pavilion to the new location and installing new support posts needed to meet building code requirements.

The new Kids Park opened May 27, replacing the facility that had been in place since 2001. After the reopening, the city replaced the fence around the site. The city is also adding new restrooms near the Kids Park site. The city plans to replace the municipal swimming pool near the Kids Park with a new facility by the 2025 fiscal year.

WHAT'S HAPPENING

PIER & SHORE FISHING OUTLOOK

As November comes an end we find ourselves deeper in the grip of fall like weather and fishing trends. More frequent and powerful cold fronts have brought more rain, though we remain in a severe drought.



Such strong systems are typically followed by a few chilly nights and days. Still no telling exactly when we will see the first freeze of the year along the coast, how long that will stick around, or how it will affect the fishing in the weeks ahead. The Gulf water temperature is flirting with 70 degrees, while inshore bay waters are almost entirely in the 60s. That means most of the menhaden and

a lot of the mullet have moved out of the bays and into the Gulf where they are being pursued by schools of hungry bull redfish. Consequently the action seen at the point near Fort Morgan is a bit less frequent now. Though bottom fishing action is still a viable option with more large red and black drum patrolling the surfzone. Here's a tip: those pesky speckled swimming crabs that eat your bait in the surf make fine bait for the drumfish, and they taste great too.

Pompano fishing, or rather catching has been hit or miss recently as is usually the case during the fall run. Some days are more productive than others due to weather and or water conditions including surf height and tide phase. Not only is the tide moving a factor that influences the beach bite on a day to day basis, but the amount and timing of the tide differential has a huge influence on fish movements and feeding patterns all over the vicinity. That tide differential will be least in the days preceding and following the next NEAP tide of December 6th.

Most anglers targeting pompano use double drop pompano rigs on long rods (9 to 12 feet) with 5000 to 6000 size reels and 20 to 30 pound braided line. Often the bait is fresh dead shrimp with or without Fishbites or Fishgum as a supplement. Sometimes just the synthetic bait strip is used because soft organic bait won't stay on the hook long and it perhaps cuts down on the casting distance. This is especially true when the surf is particularly rough, making heavier weights necessary. But when the Gulf is calm pompano tend to ignore such offerings. But they will fall for a more stealthy presentation on a single drop rig, Fishfinder rig or Carolina rig. In fact a ghost shrimp threaded onto a #4 kahle hook presented on the bottom is an ideal way to tempt wary pompano in calm, clear water. Just be sure to secure the ghost shrimp on the hook with a bit of Magic Thread, available at any local bait shop.

Wave size is another factor influencing beach fishing as breaking waves help create feeding zones for target species like pompano, whiting, and drum (red or black) on the back side of sandbars.

Recent storms have changed the bottom structure in many locations forcing anglers to scout around for better fishing spots. Another factor influencing beach fishing has been the ongoing beach dredging operation in Gulf Shores. Some beach anglers in west and east Gulf Shores will be displaced by the "beach renourishment project" through this fortnight. Areas in the vicinity of active pumping are cordoned off and the extent of pipe laid along the beach may impede

egress to anglers pulling a cart. So it benefits those fishing affected areas to keep up on the latest progress of this project online at olsen-associates.com/gsob.

Fishing the Alabama Point seawall or jetty at Perdido Pass in Orange Beach is easier around NEAP tide days (Dec. 6th) because the current does not run near as strong as during the week before and or after. More structure loving sheepshead should be showing up around the pass as the water cools off, and that helps slow down the pinfish which terrorize fisherman's baits. Small to medium sized live shrimp drifted in the current with just a splitshot or two works well for sheepshead, plus other fish, in a slow current. Sight fishing sheepshead feeding on rocks with fiddler crabs can be quite effective then too. Whenever the current is running stronger, you will need to add more weight and that increases the risk of getting hung up in the rocks. Noting the location between the edge of the rocks and clear sand can help keep you out of trouble with a slowly creeping bottom presentation. Use a small single hook like a #6 All Purpose or Kahle for fewer hangups. And use leader material with slightly less breaking strength than your main line, so if your hook does get hung on a rock you can break the leader and save your weight and swivel. All you have to do is tie on a new hook or piece of leader line to get back in the game for a fraction of the time and expense. Everybody fishing there with weights gets hung up sooner or later. But like one old timer said "If you are sheepshead fishing and not getting hung up at times, you are fishing in the wrong place."

Sheepshead are one of our native fish species that tolerate well conditions of cooler water. In fact they thrive in the late fall and through the winter because they are one of the truly omnivorous fish in our area. Often seen grazing on rocks and barnacles, sheepshead supplement their diet with a large amount of vegetable material, mostly algae which grows on hard structures. The algae grows well in waters with at least fair visibility as that lets more sunlight in. Hidden amongst the algae are the small crustaceans sheepshead also feed upon. They routinely munch barnacles and young oysters, but seem to relish mussels. Mussels are much smaller than oysters and grow faster. They too provide a great food source that sustains the metabolism of sheepshead through the cooler months of the year. Some savvy anglers have learned to harvest mussels and barnacles, which unlike oysters are NOT REGULATED, and use them as chum or bait for sheepshead. They can be crushed up and placed in small mesh bags or piece of panty hose, then tied on a hook. Barnacles and mussels may be scraped from piling, seawalls and rocks exposed at low tide. Strong northerly winds help lower sealevel along the back bays and Intercoastal waterway and Passes exposing these crustaceans to the anglers. Low winter tides also expose more tidal flats along the Gulf beaches making "slurping" for ghost shrimp easier. These make great bait too, and just about any fish now active in our waters loves to eat them.

The work on Seawall Park under and north of the Perdido Pass Bridge should be wrapping up soon, much to the delight of anglers eagerly wanting to get back to fishing the structure there. The new boardwalk, railing and lighting north of the bridge should enhance the safety and "fishability" of that venue immensely. This will be timely, as there are already plenty of local anglers and snowbirds looking for an alternate fishing venue since the Gulf State Park Pier has closed for repair. Anglers used to fishing there are being told the tentative time frame to reopen the popular facility is mid-summer 2024. Let's hope for the best and keep fishing!

Orange Beach schools continue to rack up academic accolades
