



Suspect arrested in stabbing of jogger in Foley

Police have arrested a suspect in connection with the stabbing of a woman in Heritage Park on Wednesday. Bernard C. Abney, 40, of Mobile was arrested Saturday. He was being held in the Mobile Metro Jail on Sunday.

"We are relieved that he is in custody and appreciate all the hard work by the many agencies involved as well as the media and citizens of our local communities," Foley Police Chief Thurston Bullock said.

"I am very proud of our police force and the team effort to bring it to a close with an arrest," Mayor Ralph Hellmich said. "These types of crimes are extremely rare in our community but when they occur, they cause great anxiety. It is no surprise to me that our men and women closed this difficult case ouickly."

Foley police said earlier that Abney will charged with one felony count of second-degree assault – assault with a deadly weapon – and one felony count of first-degree attempted rape.

The woman was attacked on the Wilbourne Antique Rose Trail on Wednesday evening. Police received a 911 call at 5:40 p.m. The caller reported that a woman had run into a business and said that she had been stabbed.

Police arrived at the scene and found that the woman had been stabbed in the arm, torso and thigh. She was taken to University Hospital for treatment of injuries that were described as non-life threatening.

The woman has been released and is recovering at home. Bullock said the victim's strength and tenacity coupled with fighting back likely ended the attack and possibly saved her life.

Abney was believed to be homeless. Police said that he may

have been staying with people that he knew or in homeless encampments. He also frequented venues that assist the homeless.

Bullock said this case created a sense of fear within Foley citizens, and the investigation was an "all hands on deck" case. Through the team work of employees, diligent effort in the investigation by detectives and the assistance and tips generated by the public, police were able to identify a suspect and establish probable cause for arrest warrants in the case.

Abney spent 18 years in prison after being convicted on a rape charge, according to reports. Hellmich said the arrest is an indication that the defendant should not have been released.

"I am, however, disappointed in our state system for allowing an early release of a person who has not been rehabilitated into society," Hellmich said.



priced at a fraction of normal retail.







Foley to provide Navy services at Barin Field

Foley and the U.S.Navy are working to expand a cooperative arrangement more than 80 years old with an agreement for the city to provide services at Barin Field.

The Foley City Council approved a letter of intent with the Navy's Whiting Field in Pensacola. City Administrator Mike Thompson said the proposal would allow Foley to perform work at Barin Field, but does not obligate the city to any specific duties.

"What we're doing is entering into an arrangement with Whiting Field that would allow the city to perform some work that they might need to have done over at Barin Field," Thompson said.. "This is something that they've tested around the country with local governmental agencies, either municipalities or counties where they seek out a local government agency to try to manage some of the services that they might need over there."

Randy Roy, naval operational liaison officer with Whiting Field, said similar agreements in other areas have reduced costs for the Navy. He said local governments often have more resources available at lower prices than the Navy.

"You're talking about basic things that we normally pay for, roads, maybe some repairs, things that you typically have within your bandwidth which you already support," Roy said. "It's whether or not those things come to fruition. There's no dollars that are coming from your coffers to go to this."

Roy said Foley and South Alabama have a long tradition of supporting the Navy. Barin Field has been a training site for Navy aviators since the facility opened as a base in 1942. Today, the field is not an active base, but is still used for Whiting Field training flights. "The folks that live here in this area support the Navy,"

Roy said. "We talk to your senior leadership a lot about

the importance of what this area does for the Navy."

He said Foley's recent designation by the National Park Service as an American World War II Heritage City is one recognition of the city's long-time support for the military and national defense.

Roy said locations such as Barin Field and other sites in Alabama play a key part in military aviation training. "The ability to do what we do at Whiting Field cannot be done without Alabama," he said. "There are six of our airfields located in Alabama that we fly at. We've got two over here, Barin Field and Summerdale. We have others on the other side of Alabama."

Foley firefighters Snyder & Taylor complete intense training program

The city of Foley recently recognized firefighters David Snyder and Lee Taylor for completing the rigourous Alabama Fire College smoke diver training course and earning the Director's Awards. Foley Public Safety Director David Wilson said fewer than 1% of state firefighters have completed the intense 60hour training program.

"This achievement is worthy and the recipient is most deserving of the directors award," Wilson said.

Robert Rowland, Gulf Shores Fire Department chief of operations, worked with Foley on the program. He said many firefighters begin preparing for the course a year in advance, long before they know if their application will be approved. He said that in the five-day course, firefighters have to learn to deal with challenging conditions that are beyond ordinary situations.

"What this class is best for is preparing you for when that call isn't routine. It pushes you to where you probably didn't know you could go," Rowland said. "David and Lee did a tremendous job representing the Foley Fire Department,

city of Foley."
"The effort that our guys go through to make sure that they train and equip themselves mentally and physically. I appreciate what they do and what we're able to do to equip them to do that," Fire Chief Joey Darby said. "Last year, we had a major increase in our training budget and that is already paying dividends with a lot of classes, so I appreciate the support in doing that," Darby said. "We're continuing that in this budget year and that's something we're going to continue for years to come to focus on equipping these folks mentally and physically, so thank you for that."

The smoke diver training course is designed to help firefighters sharpen their skills and learn techniques through realistic training.

The Alabama Fire College's course includes multiple aspects of firefighting. Students participate in physically and mentally taxing exercises in multiple environments. Each day begins with a fitness event, which is followed by drills, field evolutions and scenarios that include heat, smoke and live fire training. Most of the course takes place on the drill field in full protective gear.

Foley strategic plan public meetings slated Feb. 7-8 City's population has almost tripled since 2010 census

Foley continues to work on infrastructure and other projects to deal with the challenges of one of the area's fastest growing cities. Foley has grown from a population of 8,727 to about 25,000 since the 2020 census.

"That growth is something that is on all of our minds on how we address it," Mayor Ralph Hellmich said, "We've upped a lot of standards for our infrastructure. We have better developments now coming in, but some of these things that people see that are being built right now were approved four or five years ago. It takes a lot of development time for some of these things to take place."

The mayor said the city is also working to develop a strategic plan to guide growth in upcoming years. Residents can take a survey on the city website – cityoffoley.org – to share their thoughts and opinions about plans for Foley in the future. The city will also hold three public meetings in February to discuss the plan.

• The first meeting will be at the Graham Creek Nature Preserve Interpretive Center at 23030 Wolf Bay Drive on Wednesday, Feb. 7 from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

• The second meeting is scheduled at the Foley Senior Center at 304 East Rose Ave. on Thursday, Feb. 8 from 11:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.

• The third meeting will also be on Feb. 8 at the Foley United Methodist Church at 915 North Pine Street from 6 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. That meeting will be at the church's center The Well.

Foley has budgeted \$72.8 million for capital projects in the 2024 fiscal year. Improving traffic flow by extending city streets to provide alternate routes for north-south traffic is one priority. One project recently approved by the state is the improvement at the intersection of Baldwin County 12 and Alabama 59. The city is also waiting on state approval to add a safety shoulder and repave the entire Foley Beach Express route through Foley. The city has also increased its sidewalk construction program to add more pedestrian walkways around the city and plans are in the works for an indoor aquatics center to replace the swimming pool at Max Griffin Park.



WHAT'S HAPPENING

PIER & SHORE FISHING OUTLOOK

Between rough surf, cold weather and water, the Gulf State Park Pier closure, Little Lagoon Pass being shoaled up, ongoing construction at Perdido Pass Seawall Park, and the expansive beach



dredging, anglers have been hard pressed to have much good luck fishing or especially catching lately. But yes Virginia, there still are some nice fish to be caught even from shore in Alabama in mid winter! Hopefully we have seen the worst of this winter, and some things look to slowly improve as January winds down. Then we will just have to see what

trends lie ahead for February. El Nino years often bring us some crazy weather though, so remain vigilant.

In the wake of the recent arctic weather outbreak temperatures have moderated a bit, and the forecast for this fortnight trends more toward seasonal temperatures. Yippee! That means more tolerable morning lows averaging in the 40s or 50s with pleasant afternoon highs into the 60s to near 70 perhaps. But the catch is, with warmer weather comes an increasing chance of rain every few days. Winter cold fronts battle it out with warmer, moist air out over the deep Gulf of Mexico. That is where the surface water temperature remains 70 or higher. Meanwhile shallower water within 10 miles of shore is in the lower 60s, and the inland bays and creeks water temp has plummeted into the 40s. Quite a contrast.

That's about as cold as the water usually gets here in lower Alabama during a typically active winter. But this is also close to the limit of endurance for many fish species native to our area. Anglers need to remember that fish are coldblooded, meaning they react in kind with the environment around them. So when the water temperature plummets more than 5 degrees behind these strong cold fronts, that creates a thermal shock to them. It can take days for some species to adjust to the extreme change in conditions, and they may not feed during that period. Their metabolism has evolved so they don't need to eat but once a week or so in extreme weather such as this. Their typical prey items may not be as active or available during these low activity periods either. So native bait like fiddler crabs and shrimp becomes scarcer and harder to find.

Once the environment begins to warm back up even a few degrees, we should see more activity. Surf zones temperatures vary several degrees depending on how far the location is from these sources of colder water are. Generally expect the water in the surf to be in the upper 50s now.

Catches may begin to improve slowly as the air temp is predicted to be closer to average through the end of the month. But we are still locked into winter, so just about anything can happen for the next couple of months. Especially if we get too much rain which could introduce salinity issues.

Many of the recently reported catches included trophy fish like bull redfish or large black drum. Both are solitary feeders this time of year which prowl the surfzone and nearshore waters, picking up any morsel of food they come across. That is why persistent pompano or whiting fishers on the beach seem to encounter them more often this time of year as their only bite of the day. Though not great table fare, these large drum are a fine pull and good candidates to catch, photograph and release in cooler waters.

But sheepshead are traditionally the most consistent species to target inshore this time of year, while pompano remain the surf-side favorite target, even though they have been scarce.

Look for sheepshead around piers, docks and especially rock jetties including the seawall at Perdido Pass. Construction under and north of the bridge continues intermittently as weather allows. Reopening that part of the park is pending soon, so once you see them painting the parking stripes it should occur shortly after. Sheepshead, along with occasional redfish, bluefish, and even pompano are a distinct possibility for able anglers from the jetties of Perdido Pass where live shrimp is a go-to bait.

Some years sheepshead remain in the Intracoastal Waterway through much of the winter, so they and large black drum may be caught along the rock lined banks of the canal. Live shrimp is the historical bait for sheepshead there, though fiddler crabs are often the bait of choice for anglers in the know. Of course using either is dependent upon availability. The large "loner" black drum may be targeted with pieces of fresh blue crab, cut into halves or quarters. Patience and persistence are keys to successful wintertime fishing

Beach ghost shrimp seem to plentiful in Gulf Shores this year, surprisingly even in areas that have been filled from the beach restoration. Ghost shrimp are without a doubt the best bait in winter for anglers intrepid enough to brave chilly conditions to slurp enough to fish with (two to three dozen) with a ghost shrimp pump available at most local bait and tackle stores. Usually the results of fish caught makes gathering bait well worth the effort. This is made much more tolerable by donning insulated chest waders. These come in handy while fishing the beach too, giving the angler more range by wading out to cast farther into deeper water if need be. The use of waders also helps standing on the cold, windswept beach more tolerable, even when the sun isn't shining. Layering clothing is your best bet to adjust to conditions changing from day to day, or even during the course of a single day.

Work on the Beach Restoration Project continues eastward through Orange Beach toward Perdido Pass this month before jumping eastward of The Shell Public Parking Access, and concluding near the Alabama-Florida State Line sometime in February. You can keep up with the latest progress of this project online at olsen-associates.com. Fishermen have already noticed changes in the bottom contours around and to the west of filled in areas along the beach due to the natural natural geologic process known as littoral drift. Farther west, successful surf fishing from Fort Morgan beaches has been quite spotty this winter, with some anglers complaining of beach erosion almost to the dune line, making egress along the shoreline more difficult in some spots.
